1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I MINA'***
2 ***TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS,** Mrs. Rosella Soto Campos was born on March 28, 1947, in
4 Manaoag, Pangasinan, Republic of the Philippines; and she grew up in a humble
5 household she shared with her three (3) sisters and six (6) brothers; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Mrs. Campos’ father, Celestino Saltivan Soto, was the sole
2 breadwinner for his family, spending most of his days working for a gold mining
3 company in Benguet Province. Her mother, Rosita Castro Soto, was a full time
4 caregiver who used every opportunity she had to raise her children with positive,
5 loving, and faith-filled discipline; and

6 **WHEREAS**, for Mrs. Campos, growing up in her native home was
7 economically tough. However, she and her siblings and parents were able to enjoy the
8 blessings God had given them – especially the many simple yet wonderful memories
9 as a family; and

10 **WHEREAS**, despite a lack of school supplies and other realities of a humble
11 life, Mrs. Campos excelled academically from grade school through high school.
12 With little to no means to afford a college education, Mrs. Campos worked hard to
13 enroll in college; and she eventually earned an undergraduate degree in psychology,
14 sociology, and education from the University of the Philippines in Baguio City; and
15 she was the first in her family to earn a college degree; and

16 **WHEREAS**, Mrs. Campos’ first job involved selling encyclopedias door-to-
17 door, until she was hired to work with the registrar’s office at the same university she
18 graduated from. She was later hired to work as a psychology and sociology instructor
19 with the University’s College of Liberal Arts, serving from 1970 to 1975; and

20 **WHEREAS**, on April 6, 1975, Mrs. Campos married her husband of nearly
21 forty (40) years, Benny Nauta Campos Jr. They moved to Guam on October 6, 1975,
22 and she gave birth to their first child and only daughter, Stephanie Joy, on September
23 6, 1976; and

24 **WHEREAS**, in 1980, Mrs. Campos began her government of Guam career as
25 an educator, working as a social studies teacher with the Guam Community College’s

1 Vocational High School. She concurrently taught human relations and sociology
2 courses as a part-time college instructor; and

3 **WHEREAS**, from 1991 to 1994, Mrs. Campos taught social studies courses at
4 George Washington High School (GWHS); and then served as an Assistant Principal,
5 from 1994 to 1997. It was during her teaching tenure at GWHS when she managed to
6 earn her Master's Degree in Education, with a specialization in Administration and
7 Supervision, from the University of Guam; and

8 **WHEREAS**, as a teacher, Mrs. Campos was actively involved with different
9 student clubs and organizations, including faculty and parent organizations. She was
10 an advisor for the Mock Trial team, the Close-Up Club, and the Student Body
11 Association; and was a coach for the Academic Challenge Bowl. Mrs. Campos was
12 also an officer with GWHS's Parent-Teacher Organization; and she was a member of
13 other school organizations, to include its accreditation team; and

14 **WHEREAS**, from 1997 to 2007, Mrs. Campos served as the Assistant
15 Principal of Agueda Johnston Middle School in her hometown of *Ordot*. From 2007
16 to 2014, Mrs. Campos continued to serve Guam's children and their families as an
17 Administrator at other public schools, including John F. Kennedy High School, J.Q.
18 San Miguel Elementary School, and B.P. Carbuillo Elementary School, until her
19 retirement from government of Guam service in 2014; and

20 **WHEREAS**, after dedicating thirty-seven (37) years of her time, talent, and
21 personal treasure to the benefit of Guam's children, Mrs. Campos retired from
22 government of Guam service as a public school educator and administrator on August
23 8, 2014; and

24 **WHEREAS**, in addition to her exceptional public service record, Mrs. Campos
25 continues to honor her Christian faith as a volunteer with the San Juan Bautista
26 Catholic Church in *Ordot*. For the last twenty-five (25) years, she served as a

1 Christian Confraternity Doctrine (CCD) teacher, and is currently the CCD program
2 coordinator. Mrs. Campos is also the current Vice-President of the San Juan Bautista
3 Catholic Church Parish Council, and is a member of the Church's Christian Mothers
4 group; and

5 **WHEREAS**, the impact Mrs. Campos has had upon the thousands of students
6 she, in one way or another, taught, helped, advised, counseled, and supported can be
7 seen through the success stories of her former students who are actively engaged in
8 their respective communities as teachers, police officers, soldiers, managers, and as
9 countless other professionals; and

10 **WHEREAS**, among her long list of achievements as a public school teacher
11 and administrator is the most important accomplishment of Mrs. Campos's life - the
12 blessing of having brought into this world, with the help of her loving husband, their
13 three (3) wonderful children: Stephanie Joy, Benny Russell III (JR), and Julius Ryan.
14 Stephanie followed in her mother's footsteps in serving as a teacher at *Finegayan*
15 Elementary School. She and her husband, Senator Thomas A. Morrison, are the proud
16 parents of Gage, Jewel, and Thomas Aaron II. Russ is currently serving active duty in
17 the U.S. Air Force, and JR is a soccer aficionado and is a member of Guam's tourism
18 workforce; and

19 **WHEREAS**, in her thirty-seven (37) years of service as a public school
20 educator and administrator, Mrs. Campos helped to inspire generations of Guam's
21 children to believe in the combined power of education and hard work. It is without
22 question that she has helped to shape their future – and the future of our entire island
23 community; now therefore, be it

24 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na*
25 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of
26 Guam, honor, commend, and express a sincere *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to

1 Mrs. Rosella Soto Campos on the occasion of her retirement from the Guam
2 Department of Education; and further recognize her for dedicating thirty-seven (37)
3 years of her life to building futures of the people of Guam through education; and be it
4 further

5 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
6 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of
7 the same be thereafter transmitted to Mrs. Rosella Soto Campos; and to the Honorable
8 Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*.


