3 **WHEREAS,** Community Policing is a public safety philosophy based on
4 partnership and cooperation between law enforcement agencies and the community that

1 they are sworn to protect and serve. The basis of Community Policing is the idea that
2 all members of the community, both law enforcement officers and civilians, have a
3 claim in the safety of their neighborhoods where they live and work; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Community Policing recognizes that law enforcement agencies
5 cannot solve public safety problems alone, and encourages interactive partnerships with
6 relevant stakeholders, which includes our government agencies, businesses, nonprofit
7 and civic organizations, and various community groups; and

8 **WHEREAS**, this active collaboration can improve public trust and reinforce
9 relationships while advancing public safety, and also expanding social connectivity and
10 creating long lasting solutions to the challenging problems we face daily. In practice,
11 Community Policing encourages law enforcement officers and citizens to communicate
12 regularly, and above all, to get to know one another as people rather than stereotypes;
13 and

14 **WHEREAS**, through significant efforts to strengthen Community Policing, we
15 can meet these challenges, restore critical relationships, and make real and lasting
16 progress; and

17 **WHEREAS**, together, we can take productive steps to support our men and
18 women in law enforcement while instilling belief in the fairness of the justice system
19 for everybody and ensuring that law enforcement officers discharge their duties
20 impartially; and

21 **WHEREAS**, every citizen has the privilege to make changes in their community;
22 and by working together to improve law enforcement practices and ensure we give the
23 community and law enforcement the respect that they deserve, we can fulfill this
24 substantial endeavor. Let us rededicate ourselves to building a future in which law
25 enforcement agencies are honored for their sacrifices and supported by our communities
26 who feel they are being fairly and justly served; now therefore, be it

1 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na*
2 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people
3 of Guam, recognize the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Districts of Guam and the
4 Northern Mariana Islands, and the Guam Police Department (GPD) on the first-ever
5 designation of "National Community Policing Week" from October 2 to October 8,
6 2016; and does further commend them for advocating stronger bonds and building trust
7 between our local law enforcement agencies and the community they dedicate their
