- WHEREAS, Dr. Margaret Torres Artero, also known as Marge, is the daughter of

1 WHEREAS, Marge is blessed to be one (1) of twelve (12) siblings who were 2 supportive of her throughout her career; and she is proud to have a daughter, Jesika Artero 3 Taitano, who is a University of Guam (UOG) alumna who earned both her Bachelor's 4 (BBA Summa Cum Laude) and her Master's (PMBA) degrees, and is currently an 5 Assistant Vice President at First Hawaiian Bank; and 6 WHEREAS, Marge has three (3) wonderful grandchildren, namely Keana and 7 twins Lauryn and Giovanni, with whom she will celebrate her service and 8 accomplishments; and she will add another UOG alumnus to her family with her 9 granddaughter Keana, who is majoring in Psychology; and 10 WHEREAS, Dr. Artero pursued her education and earned her high school diploma 11 from St. Mary's Academy in Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin. She received her Bachelor of 12 Science Degree in Psychology and Music from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse; 13 and a Master of Science Degree in Student Personnel Services, with a concentration in 14 counseling, from the same University. She then went on to receive her Doctorate Degree 15 (Ph.D.) in School of Counseling/Curriculum and Development from the University of 16 Oregon; and 17 WHEREAS, throughout her educational pursuits, Dr. Artero was awarded with the 18 following distinctions: a Graduate Teacher Fellowship from the University of Oregon, 19 1987-1989; a Professional Technical Award from the Government of Guam, 1985-1989; 20 and recognition from the John Hay Whitney Foundation in 1981; and 21 WHEREAS, Dr. Artero has pursued teaching and counseling for most of her career. 22 Her experiences include serving as a Counselor for the Counseling and Assistant Center 23 (CAAC) at the U.S. Naval Station in Rota, Spain, as early as 1973; Site Director of the 24 Community College of Chicago (CCC) Overseas, U.S. Naval Station - Rota, Spain; 25 Department Chairperson of the Career and Counseling Center at the Guam Community 26 College (GCC); and the Coordinator and Instructor for Central Texas College-Overseas, 27 U.S. Naval Communications Station on Guam; and

1 WHEREAS, while serving at UOG, Dr. Artero held the following positions: 2 Counselor at the UOG Counseling Center; Director of Student Activities; Chairperson of 3 numerous committees; Faculty Senator; Editor for the Micronesian Educator; and Equal 4 Opportunity Counselor and Investigator; and 5 WHEREAS, in the local community, Marge extended her services to various 6 organizations such as *Inafa Maolek*, a non-profit organization for Alternative Dispute 7 Resolution, where she was a board member, mediator, and facilitator for restorative justice; 8 Catholic Social Service, where she also served as a board member; the Guam Department 9 of Education (GDOE), where she was a liaison to the Counselors; and she was also a liaison 10 to numerous agencies for counseling internship placements; and Saint Lourdes Catholic 11 Church in Yigo, where she serves as a liturgical volunteer; and 12 WHEREAS, during this time, Marge also forged a highly successful career in the 13 Guam Army National Guard, where she enlisted in 1981 at the rank of Private. She received 14 her direct commission in 1986 as a Military Intelligence Officer with a rank of Second 15 Lieutenant. She was trained as an Equal Opportunity Advisor (EOA) for the National 16 Guard's Generals, and she was an adjunct faculty for the Defense Equal Opportunity 17 Management Institute (DEOMI) at Patrick Air Force Base in Florida. After twenty-five 18 (25) years serving in the military, Marge retired as a Lieutenant Colonel in 2008; and 19 WHEREAS, Dr. Artero's government of Guam service includes: UOG Instructor 20 in 1977; Assistant Professor in Counseling at the GCC from 1978 to 1981; Counselor at 21 Simon Sanchez High School in Yigo from 1982 to 1984; an appointment to serve as 22 Instructor/Director of Student Activities in 1984; UOG reappointment in 1987; she 23 transferred from UOG Student Affairs to the UOG College of Education in 1989; she was 24 promoted to Assistant Professor in 1990; she earned her Tenure in 1991; and she was later 25 promoted to Associate Professor in 1994; and 26 WHEREAS, Marge has also conducted presentations at the Annual Social Work 27 Conference and workshops for GDOE on Suicide Prevention.
