- WHEREAS, subsequent to years of war and occupation, the people of Guam
- 4 have persevered through growth and prosperity, and have transformed a once war-torn
- 5 island into a modern hub of American democracy in the western Pacific; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam stand ready and confident to maintain this 1 2 progress as partners and beneficiaries of American democracy in the western Pacific 3 region as our nation ushers in a new era of leadership under President-elect Donald J. Trump Sr.; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the people of Guam look forward to the continuity of judicial leadership in the western Pacific under the guidance of the Honorable Frances 6 7 Tydingco-Gatewood as Chief Judge of the U.S. District Court of Guam; and 8 WHEREAS, the members of I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, on 9 behalf of the people of Guam, take note of the education, professionalism, and numerous 10 achievements of the Honorable Frances Tydingco-Gatewood; and WHEREAS, the Honorable Frances Tydingco-Gatewood earned her Bachelor 11 12 of Arts degree in Political Science in 1980, and a Juris Doctorate degree in 1983, 13 becoming the first *Chamorro* woman to serve as Assistant Attorney General for Guam in 1984, and also the first Chamorro woman to serve as Guam's Chief Prosecutor; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Honorable Frances Tydingco-Gatewood's extensive work both 16 in Guam and in the United States serving in various capacities, such as trial team leader in charge of the Sex Crimes Unit, as prosecutor for numerous homicide and drug-related 17 18 cases, and as supervisor for numerous attorneys, earned her the esteemed reputation as 19 a tough and impartial prosecutor steadfast in the administration of justice, which in turn 20 garnered her a nomination and confirmation as the first *Chamorro* woman to serve the 21 people of Guam as a trial judge of the Superior Court of Guam in 1994; and 22 WHEREAS, the Honorable Frances Tydingco-Gatewood's commitment to 23 sound jurisprudence propelled this distinguished daughter of Guam to further serve her 24 island as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam in 1991 - a pivotal point

in her career. Additionally, she was appointed by the Honorable Chief Justice Miguel

Demapan of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands to serve as a

designated Associate Justice for the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands in

2 cases of conflict; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Frances Tydingco-Gatewood's leadership of the Judiciary has set for our community a strong sense of the rule of law and justice for the island, which has been a deterrent for crimes; and she has extended her service beyond the bench through her work on the Family Violence Task Force, as well as various Supreme Court of Guam subcommittees that have been instrumental in the administration of justice; and

WHEREAS, with more than two (2) decades of service to ensuring justice for Guam, the Honorable Frances Tydingco-Gatewood once again achieved a first for Guam's *Chamorro* women with her 2006 appointment by President George H.W. Bush to serve as Chief Judge for the U.S. District Court of Guam; and

WHEREAS, her decade-long service on the federal bench has been the impetus for critical advancements for Guam, such as the closure of the *Ordot* landfill, a highly controversial ruling that despite its cost to the Government of Guam was crucial to maintaining the health, safety, and well-being of the island community; and her presiding over the two (2)-decades-long Department of Corrections Stipulated Order and Consent Decree was crucial to maintaining justice for society's incarcerated community; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Frances Tydingco-Gatewood exemplifies a distinguished belief in and adherence to the Constitution of the United States of America, and the federal regulations that govern our island's well-being and role as our nation's partner in the western Pacific; and

**WHEREAS**, the Honorable Justice Frances Tydingco-Gatewood's firsthand experience and work with those affected by the devastation of drugs and violence is a driving force behind her commitments beyond the bench as a vocal advocate for policies
