BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

3 WHEREAS, autism is a complex developmental disability that typically

appears during the first three years of a child's life and affects their ability to

1 communicate and interact with others; and there is no known single cause for autism,

but increased awareness and funding can help families today; and

WHEREAS, autism is defined by a certain set of behaviors and is a "spectrum disorder" that affects individuals differently, to varying degrees; and knows no racial, ethnic, or social boundaries. In 2014, the Centers for Disease Control's Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring (ADDM) Network data showed that the estimated number of children identified with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) continues to rise. The ADDM Network found that about one in sixty-eight children were identified with ASD based on tracking across multiple areas of the United States. This same data revealed that some characteristics of children with ASD have remained the same – boys were almost five times more likely to be identified with ASD than girls; and

WHEREAS, caring for a child with ASD can place a heavy economic burden on families and communities. The ADDM Network estimates that it costs at least 17,000 dollars more per year to care for a child with ASD, as compared to a child without ASD. Costs include health care, education, ASD-related therapy, family-coordinated services, and caregiver time. Taken together, it is estimated that the total societal costs of caring for children with ASD was more than 11.5 billion dollars in 2011; and

WHEREAS, through the increased awareness, and the services available to individuals with autism, the lives of our friends and families with autism can be made easier, while those without autism can expand their understanding of the needs and challenges that individuals with autism experience; and

WHEREAS, parents and family members, support groups, researchers, and professionals have dedicated years of service in their ongoing efforts to advocate for the rights, respect, dignity, humane treatment, and appropriate education of all persons

with autism; and in order to highlight the growing need for concern and awareness about autism, the Autism Society has celebrated "National Autism Awareness Month"

since the 1970s in the United States, recognizing the month of April as a time of

special opportunity to educate the public about autism, and the issues within the

autism community; and

WHEREAS, Autism Community Together (ACT), which was formed in January 2004, has continued to spearhead an awareness effort in order to educate parents, professionals, and the general public about autism and its effects; and various activities are being coordinated throughout the month of April 2015 to further these goals, including, a fair at the *Agaña* Shopping Center, where approximately thirty vendors will participate in featuring informational displays to disseminate and spread autism awareness relative to education, employment, career, and many related service agencies; garner support for our families who participated in the Special Olympics this year; and feature fun-filled days of activities such as bowling, a duck ride, and a river cruise for the families affected by autism; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize, celebrate and acknowledge those individuals who are affected by autism, and commend and acknowledge their families for their unconditional love and their dedication to bettering the lives of their children, grandchildren, and family members; and does further commend Autism Community Together (ACT) for its efforts to promote autism awareness and support to families during the observance of the month of April 2015 as "Autism Awareness Month"; and be it further
