Relative to recognizing and congratulating the American Medical Center (AMC) on the special occasion of its Tenth  $(10^{th})$  Year Anniversary; and to further extending *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to the AMC for the tremendous health care services it provides to the island community.

# 1BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I2MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, the American Medical Center (AMC) is one of the largest 4 providers of medical services on Guam, the westernmost region of the United States, and home to approximately one hundred seventy-five thousand residents. Guam is
 federally recognized as a medically underserved rural community with a population
 predominantly comprised of disadvantaged minority residents; and

WHEREAS, the American Medical Center has a staff of seven Doctors of
Medicine, and more than sixty nurses, X-ray technicians, and other support staff
trained to provide a wide range of medical care; and

WHEREAS, the AMC was founded in 2005 by primary care physicians Dr.
Hoa Van Nguyen and Dr. Vincent Taijeron Akimoto, who wanted to bring world class
medical care to the hard-working people of Guam; and

10 WHEREAS, Dr. Hoa Van Nguyen came to Guam in 1975 at the age of twelve 11 from a battle-torn Vietnam. As Vietnam War refugees evacuated during Operation 12 New Life, Dr. Nguyen's mother, an older brother, and two younger sisters spent their first days in America sheltered at Camp Asan. Dr. Nguyen received an Air Force 13 14 scholarship and completed his medical degree at the University of South Alabama. After the completion of his Family Practice Residency at Eglin Air Force Base in 15 16 Florida, he served as a flight surgeon in the United States Air Force at Anderson Air 17 Force Base, and as a State Air Surgeon in the Guam Air National Guard, until he He is a certified Medical Review Officer for the American 18 retired in 2013. Association of Medical Review Officers. In his desire for community involvement, 19 Dr. Nguyen is currently serving as the Chief of Medical Staff at the Guam Memorial 20 21 Hospital, which is an elected position by his peers; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Vincent Taijeron Akimoto is a 1984 graduate of Father Dueñas Memorial School, and he completed his Family Medicine residency training at the world famous Mayo Clinic. He has been an outspoken advocate for improving Guam's medical care, and has been a featured newspaper columnist, talk show radio host, and television medical consultant. Dr. Akimoto is the Medical Director of the Guam Community College of Allied Health, and past President of the Guam Medical
 Society; and

3 WHEREAS, Dr. Hieu Campus is U.S. Board Certified in Family Medicine and 4 an active member of the American Academy of Family Physicians, and holds medical 5 licenses in Guam and the state of Washington. Raised on Guam, Dr. Campus joined 6 the American Medical Center, LLC as a new partner to provide the people of Guam with world-class medical care. Dr. Campus grew up in Yigo and graduated from 7 Simon Sanchez High School in 1989. He received his medical degree from the 8 9 University of Washington School of Medicine and completed his residency training in Family Medicine at the Swedish Medical Center in Seattle, Washington. 10 After completing medical research and publication in the Journal of Endocrinology, Dr. 11 12 Campus joined Group Health Cooperative, one of the largest healthcare organizations in the United States. In 2013, Dr. Campus moved back home to Guam and joined the 13 14 American Medical Center as the Urgent Care Department Director. An active member of the Guam Medical Association, he is one of only a handful of members 15 16 who volunteered in all three medical missions to Tacloban, Philippines for the Typhoon Yolanda relief efforts. Dr. Campus is also a board certified Medical Review 17 18 Officer and is building a prospering occupational medicine practice on Guam; and

WHEREAS, in anticipation of Guam's growing health care needs, the American Medical Center is building a second clinic in the village of *Mangilao*. An additional four Doctors of Medicine, approximately twenty allied health and nursing staff, and four occupational medicine and physical therapy specialists are expected to be employed there; and

24 WHEREAS, Guam's newest state-of-the-art medical facility will be completed 25 in *Mangilao* this spring, and the AMC *Mangilao* will open just in time to receive an influx of new island doctors, many who are returning home after years of rigorous
 medical training; and

WHEREAS, the AMC *Mangilao* features two on-site medical laboratories, a full service pharmacy with a drive-thru window, and sophisticated x-ray diagnostics facilities. The high tech *Mangilao* clinic will provide elite medical services to the nearly forty-four thousand residents of central and southern Guam. Surgical capabilities for skin laceration repair and wound infection control have all been designed into the facility. Orthopedic casting and expert nursing services, including intravenous medicine infusion services, will also be provided; and

WHEREAS, the AMC *Mangilao* has been artistically designed and engineered by a local architect, John Setiadi. The AMC *Mangilao* campus is integrated into the beautiful village landscape amid water gardens and indigenous medicinal plants. Taking full advantage of our island's place in the sun, the new clinic will be powered by solar panels and will be fortified with the latest in energy-efficient building technology; and

WHEREAS, the American Medical Center provides excellent and compassionate healthcare to the people of Guam and the neighboring islands of Micronesia, their families and their guests. The AMC diligently labors to provide health care services that will allow the people of our islands to earn an honest living for their families, and to provide exceptional medical care for our children and the *manamko*; and

WHEREAS, the AMC is a Guam grown focal point of excellence in patient care, health education and community service. The American Medical Center's Vision Statement is: "Our mission is to heal, our promise is to care"; now therefore, be it
