Committee Report

Bill No. 120 (COR) - B.J.F. Cruz / T.C. Ada / R.J. Respicio An act to add a new § 10312 to 5 GCA; relative to requiring the Guam Energy Office to post Government of Guam electrical meter information on the internet.

I. Overview

The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works, and Veterans Affairs convened on June 23, 2009 at 1:00 p.m. to hold a public hearing that included Bill No. 120 (COR). Notice of the hearing was disseminated to all local media outlets via facsimile and email on June 16, 2009 and June 20, 2009, thus meeting the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted to the Guam Legislature's website.

II. Summary of Testimonies

Paul Tobiason:

Provided oral and written testimony (written testimony attached)

Mr. Tobiason, with the Recycling Association of Guam, is in support of Bill No. 120. He states that the intent of the bill is very good. Mr. Tobiason read his testimony as oral testimony. He supports Bill No. 120 offers some suggestions from the perspective of a resident: 1) the information regarding the exact amount of electricity consumed should be made easily available (i.e., not requiring special request letters or office visits) to the taxpayer; 2) aside from power meters, there should be another way to indicate the power consumed at rental and/or shared power units; 3) the Guam Energy Office should provide a "benchmark" consumption number for each power meter or GovGuam office. Such a benchmark would be an estimated kwh consumption assuming that energy conservation efforts are in effect; this number would help direct where savings can be achieved. Mr. Tobiason provided a detailed example of how a benchmark number would be used (see written testimony). Mr. Tobiason also provided a number of questions regarding the details of Bill No. 120: Is it possible that there are meters that are not registered? Are there GovGuam locations that are not being billed? How many actual working meters are

there in the entire GovGuam? Does a GPA employee drive to each meter to record the consumption each and every month? Mr. Tobiason also suggested that a monthly meter reading be provided for residents. In conclusion, Mr. Tobiason thanked the senators for the creation of Bill 120 and efforts to make government of Guam operations more transparent. Mr. Tobiason believes Bill No. 120 will serve to reduce electrical power waste and reduce the financial burden on taxpayers.

Eloy Hara:

Provided oral testimony

Mr. Hara testified in favor of Bill No. 120. As former assistant General Manager of GPA for over six years and now a CCU member, Mr. Hara helped establish the ITI Power Savers, where he along with Mr. John Benavente served as energy management consultants. In his past position as assistant GM for GPA, he was tasked to oversee GovGuam power bills and to collect power bills at an above 95% collection ratio during any three given months. Mr. Hara worked with Guam Energy directors, and offered suggestions on how to conserve power. He stated that GovGuam was still, however, the biggest power consumers because agencies tended to leave lights and air conditioners on throughout the night. Mr. Hara, as an energy management consultant, supports Mr. Tobiason's recommendations, and believes that the Guam Energy Office would be able to perform and incorporate such recommendations. He suggested to Senator Cruz that Mr. Tobiason's recommendations be included in Bill 120 to achieve energy conservation. Mr. Hara provided examples of government agencies spending in excess: notably GPSS spending \$1.3-\$1.4 million a month. Mr. Hara noted that Bill No. 120 will allow the Guam Energy Office to monitor power consumption, and he reiterates Mr. Tobiason's suggestion that the government of Guam needs to have a standard to measure if a particular facility is consuming more or less than they should be. Mr. Hara concludes by thanking Senator Cruz for introducing this Bill.

Trini Torres:

Provided oral testimony

Ms. Torres is in support of Bill No. 120, but recommends additional amendments. She values the intent of the bill to make public power use, but questions the lack of incentives or oversight to reduce power usage. She also notes that there are no existing mechanisms to check if air-conditioning units, and other power heavy appliances, are overused on Government of Guam properties. Ms. Torres voices her concern that wasteful power use contributes significantly to global warming, as well as costing lots of taxpayer money.

III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works, and Veterans Affairs finds that promoting energy conservation throughout the government of Guam is an important step toward preserving our environment and saving taxpayer money through the reduction of operational costs. Additionally, the transparency of such conservation efforts is important in order to better inform the public of the progress made by the government. To this end, the Committee recognizes the value of posting online the meter

usage of all entities within the government of Guam, and as such, supports the intent of Bill No. 120 to post energy usage information to the website of the Guam Energy Office.

The Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works, and Veterans Affairs, to which was referred Bill No. 120, hereby submits its findings and recommendation to *I Mina' Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* **TO PASS** Bill No. 120 as introduced.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 10312 TO 5 GCA; RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THE GUAM ENERGY OFFICE TO POST GOVERNMENT OF GUAM ELECTRICAL METER INFORMATION ON THE INTERNET.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new § 10312 is hereby added to 5 GCA to read:

"§ 10312. Special Requirement for Government of Guam accounts with the Guam Power Authority. Within six (6) calendar months of the enactment hereof, the Guam Energy Office shall publish on its website a listing of all Government of Guam meters registered with the Guam Power Authority and the corresponding fiscal quarterly account information that shall include kilowatt hours billed to, amounts billed to, amounts paid from, and amounts due from each department, office or agency of the Executive Branch of the government of Guam, inclusive of all autonomous agencies, the Guam Public School System, the University of Guam, the Guam Community Guam Visitors Bureau, Guam Economic the the Development and Commerce Authority, the Guam Waterworks Authority and the Guam Power Authority. The Guam Power

Authority shall provide all necessary information to the Guam Energy
Officer for purposes of this section.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this
Act is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction,
such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, provision, or portion of this
Chapter which is not of itself invalid or unconstitutional.

Greeting Senator Ada:

I would like to express my support of Bill # 120 for the Guam Energy Office to publish electrical power meter information for the entire Government of Guam. However I would like to offer some points that as a resident I feel are important.

As it is the taxpayer that ends up paying for every kilowatt of electricity consumed, it seems only right that such information should be easily available and not require special request letters or office visits.

Besides power meters, there should be some way to show the power consumed by locations that are rented or have shared power.

However, a number does not have much meaning unless it can be compared with some standard. A power meter may indicate that 2300 kwh was consumed and that the bill was \$450.00. But to what is this compared?


That is why I would like to suggest that the Guam Energy Office provide a "benchmark" consumption number for each power meter or GovGuam office. This benchmark would be an estimated kwh consumption assuming that energy consumption practices and devices were in place.

Finally, a benchmark number would help a director see where savings can be achieved.

An example might be as follows:

A single building of 2400 sq. ft. may consume 3,500 kwh of power today. But, the same building may actually only need 2,000 kwh with conservation. Some conservation practices would be a very clean, white roof, air conditioner coils and filters kept clean of mold and dust, freon pressure being correct, fluorescent lighting, windows shaded, insulation on interior ceilings and walls, room temperature not colder than 25°C/77°F, air conditioner thermostat set no lower than 25°C/77°F, equipment powered down at the end of the day and on weekends, and the use of fans to assist cooling.

Bill # 120 states that "registered" meters would be listed. Is it possible that there are meters that are not registered? Are there GovGuam locations that are not being billed? How many actual working meters are there in the entire GovGuam? Does a GPA employee drive to each meter to record the consumption each and every month? I understand that many places in the continental US read meters remotely. While a consumption figure every three (3) months is good, most residents could relate to a monthly reading more easily as we all get billed monthly.
