### II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: The next bill on the agenda in Bill 191, the Youth Educational Training, Cultural Enhancement and Sports Opportunities Act. The bill was introduced by Vice Speaker Cruz. We will give him an opportunity for a short summary of the bill.

### (a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Vice Speaker Benjamin Cruz: Two summers ago I had a young man work in my office for the summer. He was on the Saint Thomas mock trial team and he got to compete nationally. When his school won the local competition and was told it would cost 30,000 to go to the national competition, they were trying to figure how they were to raise that money. Fortunately, they came from a school where most of the parents could afford for their trip. There were some cases where the local winner could not afford to go to the national level. Our kids perform very well in the national level but the problem is we really don't have a place where we can assist them. I thought if we take 200,000 from the Healthy Futures Fund and put it into a fund for cultural activities and educational activities, to under write the cost of travel. Also another 200,000 to send sport teams that promote a healthy life style rather than being in drugs and alcohol. We would have CAHA write the rules and regulations on how these groups can apply and how much money they can match. I would like to thank my colleagues that co-sponsored this with me.

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: Thank you Mr. Vice Speaker. We have signed up to testify Zina San Nicolas Ruiz. Please join us at the witness table.

### **Panel Comments and Questions**

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: Under the Sports Fund §77124 we might want to take out ROTC drill teams because all of that is funded by the reimbursements of the ROTC instructors salaries. They are covered in terms of their off-island trips with other funding sources already.

Vice Speaker Benjamin Cruz: I do want to make that amendment.

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan: Ok. Are there any other comments for the witness? There being no additional testimony or comments Bill 191 has been publicly heard.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 3. § 85110 of Chapter 85 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* as follows:

"§ 85110. Off-Island Educational Training and Cultural Enhancement Fund - Program Goals Legislative Intent. (a) Fund Purpose. Educational and performing art enhancement opportunities for island residents each year progressively increase as more organizations, schools and individuals with interests in the performing arts, venture beyond Guam's shores to stage performances for invitational events or engage in competitions not offered locally. The Legislature finds such participation as beneficial in the development of performing art skills and for broadening the education of resident participants. Such off-island events, however attractive or beneficial they may be, are often not within the financial reach of eligible participants, given the costs of airfare and accommodations. The Legislature recognizes the benefits of such events as arts and humanities competitions including international cultural festivals and exchanges, the Junior Statesman Foundation, National Science Fair, Mock Trial, Forensic League and Close Up, among others and is compelled to protect the opportunities they present by extending financial support. Any off-island event in which performances of organizations or individuals from Guam are featured, generates favorable attention to the island and promotes efforts to boost the island's visitor rates. Youth shall be given preference in the awarding of grants.

### (b) Integration of Drug, Tobacco and Alcohol Prevention and

1	Cessation Programs. The Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and

**Section 6.** A new §85112.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 85 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

"§ 85112.1. Grant Award Notices. The Director shall give adequate public notice as to the availability of funds for travel awards including application submission periods.

**Section 7.** §77124 of Chapter 77 of Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

## "§ 77124. Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel: Establishment: Management.

- (a) There is established in the Treasury of Guam the Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel (the Fund). Beginning on October 1, 2012 and for each year thereafter, Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) shall be annually appropriated from the Health Futures Fund to the Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel. The fund shall be managed by the Director. The Department's Certifying Officer shall be the Certifying Officer for the fund. I Maga'lahen Guåhan may transfer funds as may be appropriate to supplement the Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel. No portion of the Fund, including principal and interest, shall be transferred to any other fund, or used, or appropriated, except as provided for under this Article.
- (b) The Fund is to be expended to provide grants for transportation expenses for off-island travel by civilian sports organizations and individuals who engage in athletic competition and ROTC Drill Teams. The Commission is authorized to accept on behalf of, and in the name of the government of Guam, from any government or agency thereof, or any person, natural or legal, advisory services, donations and gifts for the Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel provided, however, that any grant-in-aid or other form of assistance involving an obligation on the part of the Department or the government of Guam shall require the prior approval of the Governor and a determination by the Department's certifying officer of the availability of funds.
- (c) The grants shall be used for a maximum of fifty percent (50%) of transportation expenses of team members and coaches for competitions in sport events such as regional, national and international tournaments.
- (d) Youth organizations shall be given preference in the awarding of grants.

(e) The Commission shall promulgate regulations to establish procedures for application for grants, priorities of funding, limitations by type of sport and event on the number of team members or coaches supported by the grant and other necessary procedures for making the grants. administer the fund pursuant to Chapter 5, Division 1 of Title 21 of the Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations for Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel. The Director shall give adequate public notice as to the availability of funds for travel awards including application submission periods.

- (f) The Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation shall develop an appropriate drug, tobacco and alcohol prevention and cessation program strategy that includes individuals, groups or organizations that receive any awards from the Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel. Such drug, tobacco and alcohol prevention and cessation program strategies shall be developed in collaboration with the Prevention and Early Intervention Advisory Community Empowerment (P.E.A.C.E) Advisory Council or the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and shall focus on the following:
- (1) To prevent/reduce alcohol, tobacco and other drug use, including underage drinking;
- (2) To promote alcohol-free, tobacco-free and other drug-free, tobacco-free and other drug-free lifestyles;
- (3) To reduce the harmful outcomes associated with alcohol, tobacco and other drug use.
- (4) At the very minimum, the program shall include a mentoring and leadership program.
- (fg) The Commission shall review all applications and make the grants and may impose conditions for expenditure. The Director shall then disburse the

grant to a representative of the organization prior to the departure of the grantees.

- (gh) The representative of the recipient organization shall provide the Director with an accurate accounting of expenditure of all funds for air transportation within thirty (30) days of returning to Guam. If the report is not completed and filed within thirty (30) days or if there is a misuse of funds in the opinion of the Commission, the organization shall not receive further grants from the fund and shall reimburse the fund in an amount determined by the Commission.
- (hi) The Director shall make an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature on June 30th of each year, which shall include the information, number of applications, number and amounts of grants actually made and other data concerning the management of the fund.
- (ij) Any person who willfully misuses a grant received under this Section shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor and subject to a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500)."

Section 8. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment into law.

government of Guam shall require the prior approval of the Governor and a determination by the Department's certifying officer of the availability of funds. Gifts and donations authorized shall be consistent with the PEACE Council's position on not receiving funds, promotional items or donations from alcohol and tobacco industries, no beneficiaries will be sponsored by such industries.

- (c) The grants shall be used for a maximum of fifty percent (50%) of transportation expenses of team members and coaches for competitions in sport events such as regional, national and international tournaments.
- (d) Youth organizations shall be given preference in the awarding of grants.
- (e) The Commission shall promulgate regulations to establish procedures for application for grants, priorities of funding, limitations by type of sport and event on the number of team members or coaches supported by the grant and other necessary procedures for making the grants. administer the fund pursuant to Chapter 5, Division 1 of Title 21 of the Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations for Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel. The Director shall give adequate public notice as to the availability of funds for travel awards including application submission periods.
- (f) The Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency and the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation shall work in collaboration with the members of the Governor's Prevention and Early Intervention Advisory Community Empowerment (P.E.A.C.E) Advisory Council such as the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the Department of Public Health and Social Services to identify effective prevention and early intervention programs and strategies that will directly benefit youth and adult recipients of the Off-Island Educational Training and Cultural Enhancement and the Sports Fundand shall focus on the following:

(1) To prevent/reduce alcohol, tobacco and other drug use, including 1 underage drinking; 2 (2) To promote alcohol-free, tobacco-free and other drug-free, 3 tobacco-free and other drug-free lifestyles; 4 (3) To reduce the harmful outcomes associated with alcohol, tobacco 5 and other drug use. 6 (4) At the very minimum, the program shall include a mentoring and 7 leadership program. 8 (fg) The Commission shall review all applications and make the grants and 9 may impose conditions for expenditure. The Director shall then disburse the 10 grant to a representative of the organization prior to the departure of the 11 12 grantees. This is in response to your letter of September 6, 2011 requesting testimony regarding amendments to the Youth Educational Training Cultural Enhancement and Sports Opportunities Act. Pa'a Taotao Tano' is pleased to offer testimony in favor of the proposed amendments in particular paragraphs relating to the creation of the Off Island Educational Training and Cultural Enhancement Fund.

By way of testimony Pa'a Taotao Tano' strongly supports the amendment creating the Educational Training and Cultural Enhancement Fund that will provide travel assistance to youth to enable them to participate in off island festivals. Pa'a Taotao Tano' believes that affording its young members the opportunity to perform nationally and internationally serves to greatly enhance the importance of the Chamorro culture to them as participants as well as provide them with the opportunity to demonstrate to others that Guam truly is unique and different. Traveling to festivals provides motivation and pride in Guam's Chamorro culture. Being introduced to other cultural groups in sum makes attending off-island festivals an extremely rich and truly great learning experience.

Pa'a Taotao Tano' representative **Zina San Nicolas Ruiz** will read and submit my written testimony on behalf of Pa'a Taotao Tano' and answer any questions posed to her at the Public Hearing on Amendments to Bill 191-31. Mrs. Ruiz has been a cultural practitioner for over 25 years with the Taotao Tano' dancers under Master of Chamorro Dance Frank Rabon and has traveled to festivals with Master Rabon extensively. Over the last 30 years we have having been participating in the majority of the

national and international festivals and we can testify to the importance and impact of these events on the attending youth and the impact they have had in furthering their identification with the Chamorro culture and exposing others to our unique cultural traditions through song, dance and chant, language and weaving.

In our experience the norm for attendance to international and national festivals and events requires the host organization will pay for room and board and the attending cultural groups pay the all travel expenses to and from the event/festival. Since most of Pa'a Taotao Tano's over 600 young members and group leaders that might be selected to attend festivals cannot afford the transportation required puts a very significant financial burden on the sponsoring organization such as Pa'a Taotao Tano' organize and raise the funds needed to for dance groups to participate. Pa'a Taotao Tano' is a non-profit organization largely supported through the provision of funding through competitively awarded Federal Grants and Legislative appropriations whose fund uses tend to be circumscribed and are not available for festival support with the exception of FESTPAC.

The proposed Fund will provide a great future source for supporting Pa'a Taotao Tano's ability to engage itself and its members in off-island festivals. I am certain that other Chamorro cultural practioners, the visual folk arts, also have great difficulty raising funds to attend off island cultural events and festivals and will welcome these opportunities to be part of a delegation that showcases Chamorro cultural traditions.

Pa'a Taotao Tano' would like to suggest that to effectively implement youth participation in of island festivals and events, they will **need supervision of creative directors and coordinators** and we would stress that the implementing agency for the fund, Guam CAHA, be instructed that the use of the funds include provisions for proper accompaniment and supervision.

Hafa Adai Thank you for allowing me to testify in support of Bill 191-31, The Youth Educational Training Cultural Enhancement and Sports Opportunities Act.

This bill will allow our children of Guam to travel for educational training and to enhance their cultural knowledge. This will also develop lifelong stepping stones of friendship, camaraderie, and mentorship amongst our students whether it is with our neighboring islands or beyond the Pacific. This is also a great learning tool for leadership!

As for the sports opportunities portion of the bill; this will also provide our young athletes with insurmountable educational tools in training and competition in their sport discipline. It will also encourage the athletes to lead a drug & alcohol-free life.

My main concern is that the Government of Guam receives approximately \$9,443,296.00 for the Healthy Futures Fund. The Department of Education receives approximately 9% of this fund, \$899,754.00. In DOE, it is broken down into 2 programs; one being for Health and Physical Education Activities, which receives \$279,754.00. The other program is the Interscholastic Sports Fund which receives \$520,000.00 for Athletic Directors, Coaches, and Officiating services and \$92,000.00 for bussing, provided by the Department of Public Works.

Respectfully, I would like to be explicit in our hope that the appropriated amount of \$400,000.00 identified in this bill will not result in the reduction of the Department of Education's allotment for our two programs funded under the Healthy Futures Fund. Our department's funding for the above aforementioned programs has been exhausted for this fiscal year and we anticipate the need for either the same or even increased funding.

Prevention funding to support positive alternatives to alcohol, tobacco and other drug use and other risk-taking and self-harming behavior will directly benefit Guam's children, youth and families. Bill No. 191-31 presents real opportunities for interested artists and athletes to engage in healthy, competitive events that serve to be educational, personally rewarding and constructive for the island community.

On behalf of the Prevention and Training Branch staff of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, we submit this letter in support of the intent of Bill No. 191-31. However, we request that this Bill, as currently written, be modified to describe more clearly the select prevention and early intervention strategies and activities that will demonstrate effectively that the children, youth and adults supported by this Bill to participate in off-island educational training, cultural enhancement and sports events are in fact not using alcohol, tobacco and other drugs, and where warranted, they would be required to undergo intervention and treatment services as a condition of receiving funding.

More specifically, we request the following:

Section 2 to read/include "(G) to support educational training, cultural enhancement and sports opportunities and identify drug-free adult and youth leaders who will mentor other adolescents to live alcohol, tobacco and other drug-free lifestyles."

Section 3 to read/include (a) Fund Purpose. "... The Legislature finds such participation as beneficial in the development of performing art skills, for broadening the education of resident participants, and for encouraging youth involvement and leadership activities that promote healthy, drug-free lifestyles..."

To read (b) Integration of Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Prevention and Early Intervention Program. "The Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency . . . and the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation shall work in

collaboration with the members of the Governor's PEACE (Prevention Education and Community Empowerment) Council such as the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the Department of Public Health and Social Services to identify effective prevention and early intervention programs and strategies that will directly benefit youth and adult recipients of the Off-Island Educational Training and Cultural Enhancement and the Sports Fund. <u>Guam Telephone Authority Privatization Proceeds Fund</u> – This fund was created by Public Law 26-70 to account for the proceeds realized from the sale of the Guam Telephone Authority.

<u>Health and Human Services Fund</u> - This fund was created by Public Law 24-174 to account for 10% of proceeds from the sale and securitization of the allocation under the Master Settlement Agreement for settlements received from the tobacco industry.

Healthy Futures Fund – This fund was created by Public Law 27-05 to account for 50% of proceeds received on alcoholic beverages excise taxes and all tobacco-related taxes to be expended for health and education programs relating to tobacco and alcohol prevention, cessation, treatment and control, and to improving overall health and well-being.

<u>Health Professional Licensure Fund</u> - This fund was created by Public Law 21-33 to defray the cost of obtaining standardized examination materials and services for the healing arts and cosmetology licensor and the cost of proctoring examination at the testing site.

Health and Security Trust Fund - This fund was created by Public Law 24-174 to account for 50% of proceeds from the sale and securitization of the allocation under the Master Settlement Agreement to be expended for the operations and capital expenditures of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority.

<u>Housing Revolving Fund</u> - This fund is maintained to account for the leasing of Government of Guam housing units to both private individuals and public organizations. Funding of this program is provided by both rental fees and Government contributions.

<u>Human Resource Services Revolving Fund</u> – This fund was created by Executive Order No. 2002-01 for administrative costs and supplies and equipment costs associated within the areas of classification and pay, recruitment, records, employee benefits, test development, employee management relations, training and development, as well as the Drug-Free Workplace Program of the Human Resources Division.

<u>Income Tax Refund Reserve Fund</u> - This fund was created by Public Law 22-140 for the purpose of receiving General Fund revenues reserved for income tax refund payments. This fund is not subject to any transfer authority of the Governor of Guam.

Income Tax Efficiency Payment Fund – This fund was created by Public Law 26-74 for the purpose of improving the efficiency of tax refund payments by hiring temporary income tax return processors, training of Department of Revenue and Taxation employees, and the purchase of computer and other equipment to quickly process income tax returns.

Indirect Cost Fund - This fund was created by Public Law 29-113 to account for appropriations for the following purposes: (a) training such as Continuing Professional Education Credits, CPE; (b) negotiating and administering GovGuam's indirect cost rate; (c) purchasing of supplies and equipment associated with negotiating and administering GovGuam's indirect cost rate; and (d) automated budget development and maintenance.

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
