COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 503-31 (COR) — "An act to add a new §34105.2 to Chapter 34 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to the termination of child support." - sponsored by Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary convened the public hearing on September 12, 2012 at 9:00 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 503-31 (COR) — "An act to add a new §34105.2 to Chapter 34 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to the termination of child support" sponsored by Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr.

Public Hearing Requirements:

Notices of the hearing were disseminated via facsimile and email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on September 4, 2012 (5-day Notice) and on September 10, 2012 (48-Hour notice) pursuant to meeting the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature's website.

Barbara P. Cepeda, Deputy Attorney General, Child Support Enforcement, Office of the Attorney General of Guam, provided oral and written testimony in support of the Bill.

I. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., convened the public hearing at 9:05 a.m., read the agenda, recognized the Senators present, explained the procedures of the hearing, provided an overview of the Bill and called those signed up to testify.

Chairman Palacios provided an overview of the bill. He said that the current law terminates child support when the child turns eighteen (18) years old. He noted that this bill proposes to extend child support to children who are in high school at age nineteen (19) or when the child graduates from high school, which ever comes first. He mentioned that there are forty (40) states that currently have this law. He then mentioned a written testimony which was submitted by Ms. Michelle C. Dudkiewicz and that this bill would not only be for the children of Ms. Dudkiewicz, but for anyone here forth who rely to this extent for child support.

Barbara P. Cepeda, Deputy Attorney General, Child Support Enforcement, Office of the Attorney General of Guam, provided oral testimony in support of the Bill. She thanked the committee for the opportunity to provide testimony on behalf of the Attorney General's Office, which supports the intent of Bill No. 503-31 (COR). However, she stated that there are a few recommendations, which they would like to offer. She stated that they support proposed Section 34105.2(a). She stated that if passed, it would mandate child support to terminate when the child marries, becomes emancipated, or reaches the age of nineteen (19). She mentioned that they've had situations where the child turns eighteen (18) but is still in high school and the custodial parent requires financial assistance. Also, she mentioned that with regard to Section 34105.2(b), they respectfully oppose it as redundant, confusing and vague. She noted that when a court transfers custody in a case where child support is ordered, they normally will address the issue of child support at the same time. In addition, she mentioned that even if the court fails to address child support along with the custody issue, ether party can request the court for a modification upon showing of substantial and material change of circumstance such as change of custody. She noted they question the significance of the use of the words "all children" and "obligated parent" because what if custody transfers to a grandparent, relative or foster case. Deputy AG Cepeda noted that they respectfully oppose as redundant and superfluous Section 34105.2 (c) and supports the intent of Bill No. 503-31 (COR) with the recommendations she had mentioned.

Senator Palacios then opened up the floor for questions.

Vice-Chairman Thomas Ada wanted to clarify on Section (b) and asked AG Cepeda if she was suggesting that whole area be stricken or amended? Deputy Attorney General Cepeda suggested that it be stricken.

Vice-Chairman Ada asked Deputy AG Cepeda if there is a need to include in the law that outside voluntary agreements between the parents should be registered with the courts. Deputy AG Cepeda said she would agree to that and said she would need to review the law because it sounds like something that might already be in the law.

Vice-Chairman Ada asked who determines what dues are paid off. Deputy AG Cepeda said with regard to child support, it would be through her office and that they provide a financial history and balance sheet showing all the payments that came in and all the payments that went out. She noted that Vice-Chairman Ada's concern is already covered and that she also suggests that Section (c) should be stricken out.

Senator Rory J. Respicio commended Deputy AG Cepeda and her division for advocating for the child and approaching the Legislature and the oversight chairman to do certain things to try and mirror what happens in other jurisdictions and to take advantage of the technologies. He noted that Section 3 states that this shall take place upon enactment and apply prospectively. He also asked what happens if the child is eighteen (18) now but still in high school, and is the parent going to figure out how they are going to pay another year worth of child support if this becomes law until the child turns nineteen (19). Deputy AG Cepeda said once the child turns eighteen (18) the child support stops continuing to accrue on their APASI System and technically that case is closed except in instances where arrears are owed. This law would only apply to the children who are seventeen (17) and not eighteen (18) years old.

Senator Respicio asked what about in the case it is active and there are arrears pending. Deputy AG Cepeda said there should not be a problem with the cut off date but there is with knowing the graduation date. This bill stops when they graduate but no later than age nineteen (19).

Senator Respicio asked if that is how it is done in other jurisdictions. Deputy AG Cepeda responded saying some jurisdictions allow for an extension of child support, and she noted that some jurisdictions go up to nineteen (19), twenty (20) or twenty-one (21) years of age.

Senator Respicio inquired about what if the child graduates when they are seventeen (17)? Deputy AG Cepeda responded saying that they still get child support until they are eighteen (18).

Senator Aline Y. Yamashita noted that there are 10% of our children who are identified as special needs and typically go on to the age of twenty-two (22) and who are still in school. She then asked Deputy AG Cepeda if she would be open to some kind of language that would allow child support to continue on however long it takes for the child to finish high school because she thinks the idea here is to support that child by what is truly the responsibility of the paying parent to the custodial parent. Deputy AG Cepeda responded that there is a law in the books, Title 19 Section 2105.1 regarding payments for disabled children. She noted that it states that if a child is residing on Guam and is disabled, before the age of 18, the court may require that both parents have a mutual obligation to support that child beyond the age of majority, and based on findings, might be required to pay for continuing benefits for the child. She stated that they have had people approach them on this just as long as they go back to court before the child turns age twenty-one (21) and the disability had to happen before the child turns eighteen (18), then both parents are responsible for child support for the rest of the child's life.

Senator Yamashita noted that while they are helping parents understand legal guardianship, many of them do not understand how to become a legal guardian. She would like to find out how to ensure financial support continues. She noted that what Deputy AG Cepeda just read is a little different from what 503 reports. Senator Yamashita also said that families need to be responsible on finding out the graduation dates of their children.

Senator Mana Silva-Taijeron asked how the child is considered a candidate for graduation. She said that they have to advocate for custodial non-paying parents. She noted that at eighteen (18) years old, they are no longer kids and they should be ready to get a job.

Chairman Palacios stated that there needs to be a mechanism to find out when the child is going to graduate.

Deputy AG Cepeda said that parents will know and be responsible to know when their children will graduate.

Senator Silva-Taijeron noted that she can almost guarantee that the paying parent will be the one with the information.

Vice-Chairman Ada mentioned that he is wondering if the language in Section (a), needs further tightening.

Chairman Palacios stated for the mark up, he requests for more research on what states have different ages for child support to continue to the age of twenty (20) or twenty-one (21). He noted he wants an idea of the acceptance of this in other jurisdictions and an idea on how many will be affected. Chairman Palacios also noted that he wants to balance this out with the custodial and absent parent.

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., declared that Bill 503-31 (COR) has been duly heard and that the Committee would continue to receive written testimony following the hearing. The hearing was adjourned at 12:00 p.m.

III. WRITTEN TESTIMONIES

Barbara P. Cepeda, Deputy Attorney General, Child Support Enforcement, Office of the Attorney General of Guam, provided oral and written testimony in support of the Bill. (Summarized in Section II.)

Michelle C. Dudkiewicz, provided written testimony in support of the Bill.

Ms. Dudkiewicz stated in her testimony that she has three (3) children who were all born after July 31st and that the current child support law is sending a message to the child that the parents will not support them once they are considered an adult and that they will need to support themselves. She stated that she thinks that the educational law and the currently child support law are conflicting with each other instead of complementing each other as it should. She stated that if the education law is making it so that child is still in high school when they turn eighteen (18) years of age, then the child support law should cover the support of the child until they earn their high school diploma. She noted that she wants her children to stay in school, concentrate in school and graduate with decent grades. For Ms. Dudkiewicz, she said that she would need to support her children while they are in high school noting that if custodial parents still have to support their children when they are eighteen (18) years of age and still in school, then the absent parents should also be obligated to support their children. She said that this law will do good for a lot of people who are in her position and that it is only right for the children to continue being supported so they can finish school, graduate and have a decent future. No further written testimony was received within the ten- (10-) day period following the public hearing of Bill 503-31 (COR).

IV. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary hereby reports out **Bill No. 503-31** (COR), as Amended by the Committee, with the recommendation TO PASS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan
- 3 Guåhan finds that under current Guam law, the obligation to child
- 4 support ends when the child marries, becomes emancipated or
- 5 reaches the age of majority, which is eighteen (18) years old. Forty-
- 6 three (43) of the states allow for an extension of obligations for the
- 7 completion of high school, although often a timeline is imposed,
- 8 usually reaching nineteen (19) years of age.
- 9 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that in relatively advanced
- economies, like the United States and Guam, the potential livelihoods
- of workers are deeply affected by educational attainments, like
- 12 graduating from high school, earning a GED, completing a vocational
- internship or attending a post-secondary institution.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that given the large impact that education has upon young workers, the termination of child support before the child has graduated or received an equivalent attainment could have serious ramifications to the life of the child. Thus it is clearly in the best interest of the custodial parent and child receiving support that the child continue to receive support in the event that the child is still attending high school or an equivalent program for up to another year.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to require that child support be provided until the latter of reaching the age of majority or graduating from high school or equivalent, but not to exceed nineteen (19) years of age, by adding a *new* §34105.2 to Chapter 34 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated.

Section 2. Termination of Child Support. A *new* §34105.2 is hereby added to Chapter 34 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§34105.2. Termination of Child Support.

(a) An order of current child support entered by a Court or tribunal shall terminate by operation of law when the child on whose behalf the support is owed marries, becomes emancipated, or the latter of reaching the age of majority or graduating from high school or equivalent, but not to exceed nineteen (19) years of age.

(b) An order of current child support entered by a Court or tribunal shall terminate if custody of all children who are the subject of said order is transferred to the obligated parent pursuant to an order of a court of competent jurisdiction or the written voluntary agreement of the parents.

- 6 (c) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b) of this
 7 Section, the obligation for payment of arrears or past due
 8 support shall terminate by operation of law when all arrears or
 9 past due support have been paid."
 - **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Act shall take effect upon enactment and apply prospectively.
 - Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

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(b) The provisions contained in §34105.2(a) *shall not* apply to child support cases where a different arrangement has been agreed to by the custodial parent and non-custodial parent, extending child support obligations beyond eighteen (18) years of age, and which agreements have been duly approved by a Court or tribunal.

(b) An order of current child support entered by a Court or tribunal shall terminate if custody of all children who are the subject of said order is transferred to the obligated parent pursuant to an order of a court of competent jurisdiction or the written voluntary agreement of the parents.

(c) Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b) of this Section, the obligation for payment of arrears or past due support shall terminate by operation of law when all arrears or past due support have been paid."

Section 3. Effective Date and Implementation. This Act shall take effect upon enactment and apply prospectively. The Office of the Attorney General's Child Enforcement Division, within thirty (30) calendar days following passage of this Act, shall inform custodial parents and non-custodial concerning the provisions of this Act. The Office of the Attorney General's Child Enforcement Division shall further coordinate with the Superintendent of Education, or his authorized designee, to ensure appropriate support is extended by the Guam Department of Education concerning attendance certifications required in Section 2 of this Act.

In the event a child turns eighteen (18) years of age within thirty (30) calendar days following enactment of this Act, the custodial parent shall submit information required by Section 2 of this Act, to the Office of the Attorney General's Child Support

Greetings, Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement & Judiciary.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony on behalf of the Attorney General's Office, which supports the intent of Bill No. 503-31 (COR), An Act to Add a New §34105.2 to Chapter 34 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to the Termination of Child Support.

The Attorney General's Office supports the intent of Bill 503-31 (COR). However, there are a few recommendations which we would like to offer.

We support proposed Section 34105.2(a). If passed, it would mandate child support to terminate when the child marries, becomes emancipated, or reaches the age of majority or graduation from high school or equivalent, but no later than age 19. We've had situations where the child turned 18 but is still in high school and the custodial parent continues to need financial assistance.

With regard to proposed Section 34105.2(b), we respectfully oppose it as redundant, confusing and vague. When a court transfers custody in a case where child support is ordered, they normally will address the issue of child support at the same time. In addition, even if the court fails to address child support along with the custody issue, either party can move the court for a modification upon a showing of substantial and material change of circumstances such as change of custody. We question the significance of the use of the words "all children". Also, the word "obligated parent" is confusing because what if custody transfers to a grandparent, relative or foster care?

We respectfully oppose as redundant and superfluous Section 34105.2(c).

We support the intent of Bill No. 503-31 (COR) with the above-mentioned recommendations.

As per our many telephone conversations regarding child support laws, I am happy that a revision is finally being sought. I regret that I cannot attend the hearing on Wednesday September 12, due to I just started a new job. However, I would still want to have my say, as this Bill affects myself as well.

I have three children who were all born after July 31st. As the education law states, children who turn 5 years of age after July 31st must wait until the following school year to enter into public elementary school. This means that when these children turn 18 years of age, they will just be starting their senior year in high school. The current child support law states that child support will stop when the child turns 18 years of age. So we are sending a message to the child that we parents will not support them no more once they are considered an adult, so they will need to support themselves. I think that the education law and the current child support law are conflicting each other instead of complementing each other, as it should. If the education law is making it so the child is still in high school when they turn 18 years of age, then the child support law should cover the support of the child until that child has earned their high school diploma. Just because they turn 18 years of age doesn't mean that they will be self supporting, especially if they are still in school and working towards earning a diploma. We always stress how important education is, especially in this day in age when it is hard to even get a minimum wage job without a diploma or equivalent. I want my children to stay in school, concentrate on school, and graduate with decent grades. In order to do this, I must still support them while they are in high school. So if custodial parents still have to support their children when they are 18 years of age and still in school, then the absent parents should also be obligated to support their children. I first realize this during my own child support hearing last year in November. When the referee judge told my son's father that my son will be turning 18 years of age in 10 months anyways and child support will no longer be in effect, that concerned me. I started thinking that my son will just be starting his senior year in high school. Then I was like, wait a minute, he is still in school, high school to be exact, shouldn't he still be supported by his parents. So I called the child support office to inquire on this matter. I was told that the only ones who can change the laws are the senators. That's what prompted me to call Senator Palacios' office and I explained my situation to Jason, who informed me that they needed to discuss this with the Senator. I was informed by someone in the child support office that maybe Senator Taijeron was working on a bill to amend this child support law that I was concerned about. I know I've been constantly calling both offices to check if there was any progress on such a bill. I am grateful for all their patience with my constant nagging. I was very elated to finally hear, that indeed, they were able to come up with a bill that will be considered. I know I'm not the first to recognize this situation and it will not only affect me. This law will do good for a lot of people who are in my position. It's only right for the children to continue being supported so they can finish school. It is in their best interest to stay in school and graduate so they can have a shot at a decent future. We are, after all, looking out for the best interest of the children, right!!

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Bills aide island child support

Guam - As August has been declared Child Support Enforcement Month, Bill 503 has been introduced. The legislation would extend child support past the age of 18. According to the measure a child would still receive child support up until 19 years of age. Also introduced is Bill 504, which would authorize unclaimed and undistributed child support payments to be reallocated to the Attorney General's Child Support Enforcement Division to update and enhance its vital services including the procurement and maintenance of a new child support computer system. Currently an estimated \$5 million worth of undistributed child support checks remain in an interest bearing bank account.
