Committee Report Digest

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Youth, Cultural Affairs, Procurement, General Government Operations and Public Broadcasting convened a public hearing on Wednesday, January 19, 2011 at 10:00 a.m. in the Public Hearing Room of I Liheslatura. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 58-31(COR) – "An Act To Add A New §4128 To Chapter 4 Of 4GCA Relative To Authorizing The Granting Of Administrative Leave For Volunteer Sign Language And Foreign Language Interpreters."

Bill No. 58-31(COR) would allow for personal leave for any qualified interpreter of sign language of a foreign language for any official government meetings, functions, or public hearings therefore allowing the government to save money on hiring these interpreters.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all senators on February 9 and 15th via email. Notices of the hearing were published in the Marianas Variety Guam edition on February 10 and February 15. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

The public hearing was called to order at 9:02 a.m.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Vice Chairman Tina Rose Muna Barnes called the public hearing to order at 9:02 a.m. and announced the morning's agenda. Senator Tom Ada objected to a change in schedule requested by Senator Guthertz and accepted by Senator Tina Muna Barnes acting Chairperson for the Committee. Senator Muna Barnes acknowledged the objection and agreed to accept testimony on

all bills throughout the course of both the morning and afternoon sessions.

Testimony was provided in favor of Bill 58-31(COR) by Benito Servino Director of the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities. He does however recommend that a typographical error in line 4 be corrected. That the definition of "qualified foreign language or sign language interpreter" is more clearly defined, that the proper number of interpreters is provided for should a meeting require more than one interpreter, and that the impact on any agency or department be kept to a minimum.

A sponsor statement was also provided for by Senator Tony Ada's Office and is included in this Report.

III.FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Youth, Cultural Affairs, Procurement, General Government Operations and Public Broadcasting to which was referred Bill No. 58-31 (COR) finds that this legislation will aid the Government by allowing its employees with special qualifications use them in their capacity of a Government employee. Having employees take personal leave to aid an agency or the legislature in a public hearing meet its open government qualifications is an antiquated idea that should be stopped.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new section 4128 is *added* to Chapter 4 of 4GCA to read as follows:

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§4127. Sign Language And Foreign Language Interpreters' Leave. (a) Any

- qualified foreign language or sign language interpreter employed by an agency,
- 6 instrumentality or branch of the Government of Guam may be granted administrative
- 7 leave for the purpose of volunteering as a sign language or foreign language interpreter
- 8 for official government meetings, functions or public hearings.
- 9 (b) The approving authority may require up to five (5) days notice, from the volunteer,
- prior the date of the event. The employee shall furnish written certification from the
- agency sponsoring the official government meeting, function or public hearing of the
- number hours the employee's services where utilized.

The Bill will grant administrative leave for Gov Guam employees that serve as interpreters for other Gov Guam functions.

- (1) Although most agencies that have employees with foreign language and sign language skills to assist other departments and agencies, some supervisors have forced their subordinates to use their annual or personal leave to perform these services.
- (2) Although there are three branches and many agencies, Gov Guam is still one government. Cost savings can be realized if agencies could share their expertise and skill with each other.
- (3) The bill requires reasonable advance notice to supervisors so that preparations can be made for an employee's temporary absence.

Buenas and Hafa Adai Senator Cruz and Members of the Committee on Youth, Cultural Affairs, Procurement, General Government Operations and Public Broadcasting.

My name is Ben S. Servino, and I am newly appointed by Governor Calvo to serve as the Director for the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID).

I have had an opportunity to review Bill 58-31 (COR). I assume that the intent of the bill is to increase the availability of the interpreting services, reduce the government's costs of providing these services, and to ensure that effective communication is provided for foreigners and individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing. If this assumption is accurate, I support the intent of the bill, but wish to share some concerns for your consideration:

- Shouldn't Line 4 reference the new §4128 instead of §4127 (Blood Donors)?
- 2. The term "qualified foreign language or sign language interpreter" is vague and should be clearly defined:

"The ADA specifically recognizes the request for a sign language interpreter as an auxiliary aid and defines a "qualified interpreter" as an interpreter who is able to interpret effectively, accurately, and impartially both receptively and expressively using any necessary specialized vocabulary."

The interpreting service can be provided through an **On-site appearance** or via a Video Remote Interpreting (VRI) service. Video remote interpreting (VRI) service is an interpreting service that uses video conference technology over dedicated lines or wireless technology of offering high-speed, wide-bandwidth video connection that delivers high-quality video images.

- 3. Please also be aware that when an official government meeting, training, function, or public hearing is expected to run longer than the typical one or two hour time period, or will have complicated requirements in terms of the level of interpretation required, two or more volunteer interpreters will need to be provided.
- 4. Who will be responsible for coordinating the provision of these services and assessing the qualifications of the interpreters? State and national certification does not necessarily imply that the interpreter is competent. Many hold credentials but still need to be evaluated to see if they have the experience and skills to satisfy the definition of "qualified interpreter." By the same token, there may be interpreters who have adequate skills but lack the credentials. A process is needed to identify and assess these individuals. There are many characteristics that need to be assessed when evaluating the interpreting/transliterating skills of the provider including stamina, flexibility, attitude, interpersonal skills, and knowledge.
- 5. My last concern is that if an individual who is vital to their agency volunteers to serve as a sign language interpreter for an official government meeting, training, function, or public hearing, it may adversely impact and compromise the efficiency and operations of their agency.
