## TESTIMONY BEFORE THE COMMITTEE ON UTILITIES, PUBLIC WORKS AND VETERAN AFFAIRS BY THE BUREAU OF STATISTICS AND PLANS

Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room
July 1, 2011

Honorable Chairman and Committee Members:

This testimony is provided on behalf of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans in regards to the Bill No. 234-31(COR). We have reviewed the said bill and offer the following comments and concerns:

The Bureau believes that our natural resources should be protected and preserved before they reach an irreversible point of no return. With all the development Guam is experiencing, the Bureau strongly agrees that we must diligently protect and preserve what remains of our natural and native habitat.

We fully support the inclusion of the Department of Agriculture as a signatory on permits for clearing, grading and construction. This will complement the Guam Environmental Protection Agency's and the Department of Parks and Recreation's involvement in the permitting process. The Department of Agriculture's presence will undoubtedly ensure that Guam's native forest and terrestrial resources and habitat will be considered prior to permitting clearing and grading. It is our view that if all the entities listed were to thoroughly review the clearing and grading applications, our mandated concerns are covered.

The Bureau anticipates however that this proposal may have some drawbacks. The Bureau has observed that the Department of Agriculture is experiencing a lack of manpower that prevents them from being represented in various committee meetings. This additional responsibility will add additional stress to an already strained department. Therefore, we recommend that you consider the additional strain this bill may place on the department.

The Bureau recommends that the reference to the Guam Telephone Authority be deleted from the bill as it no longer exists.

We hope that our recommendation will assist you in the formulation of Bill No. 234-31(COR).
