

REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan convened a public hearing on Tuesday, March 15, 2011 at 9:00 am in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. On the agenda was Resolution 12-31 (COR) – “Resolution No. 12-31 (COR), “Relative to expressing the sense of *I Liheslaturan Guahan's* expenditure priority of Compact Impact Funds for Fiscal Year 2012 to *I Maga'lahen Guahan* and to the Secretary of Interior to support capital improvement projects and operations of various impacted government agencies and departments”, sponsored by Senator Vicente (ben) Cabrera Pangelinan.

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via hand-delivery and e-mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on March 8 (5-Day Notice), and again on March 13 (48 Hour Notice).

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The public hearing was called to Order at 9:00 a.m.

Senator Pangelinan: We have Resolution 12-31, a resolution introduced by Senator Vicente Pangelinan, “Relative to expressing the sense of *I Liheslaturan Guahan's* Expenditure priority of Compact Impact funds for fiscal year 2012 to *I Maga'lahen Guahan* and to the Secretary of the Interior to support capital improvement projects and operations of various impacted government agencies and departments”.

We did not receive any testimony on Resolution 12. We however did receive an email testimony from Derek Sablan in support of the resolution.

Basically the resolution was drafted in response to several years of conversation with regards to compact impact funding and how it should be applied. We recognize that the US statute that passed compact impact funding requires that the Governor submit a list of projects for funding to the Secretary of Interior who then approves those funding. In my many years of conversations with Mr. Stayman, Mr. Cohen and of course the current

Assistant Secretary Babauta for consideration, we presented two options; (1) either amend the statute to allow appropriation by the Legislature to direct expenditures of this fund or (2) if that cannot be accomplished, perhaps a resolution expressing the sense of the priority of the Legislature who has to deal with the impact of these FSM residents on Guam.

This resolution would basically allocate the expenditures of the money to the Guam Memorial Hospital, the Guam Police Department and the other agencies. Sixteen million dollars in grants is available each year. The Guam Memorial Hospital would receive a portion of the grant. The Department of Public Health would also receive grants. The Guam Police Department, the Office of the Attorney General, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the Department of Administration would receive these grants. Currently the compact impact has been obligated by the previous administration in the amount of \$7.1M for the school lease back program and that would continue. \$5M of the next year FY 2012 compact impact fund, it is the sense of the Legislature that \$5M is dedicated to the pharmaceutical supplies at the Guam Memorial Hospital. \$1M to the nurses and physician salaries and pharmaceutical supplies for the Guam Community Health Centers.

This would bridge budget shortfall created by the expiration of AARA funding for the Guam Community Health Centers. Seven hundred fifty thousand dollars would go to the Guam Police Department. Seven hundred fifty thousand dollars would be for the purchase of new ambulances for the Guam Fire Department. The sum of \$1M is available for expenses related to satisfying the Guam Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse amended permanent injunction. Seven hundred fifty thousand dollars to purchase of a new transactional data base system for tracking child support payments for the Attorney General. The sum of \$500,000 would be made available for the purchase of a point of sale system to receive payments for taxes and fees for the Department of Administration.

The resolution expresses the sense of the Legislature for the allocation of the expenditure of these funds. We sent letters requesting testimony on Resolution 12 to the Governor and the Lt. Governor's Office, the Attorney General's Office, BBMR, the Department of Administration, GEDA, OPA, the village mayors, Guam Memorial Hospital, the Department of Public Health & Social Services, GPD, GFD and the Department of Mental Health DISID. We also requested testimony from Assistant Secretary Babauta, our Congresswoman and the business community via the Chamber of Commerce.

We have no individuals signed up to provide testimony at this time. The record will remain until the resolution is ready to be presented on the floor.

I would like to give opportunity to the rest of the panel to make any comments on the resolution.

There were none.

Thank you very much and *Si Yu'os Ma'åse* ladies and gentlemen. That concludes the *Tareha* and therefore concludes this public hearing and adjourns. Testimonies on all of the



RELATIVE TO EXPRESSING THE SENSE OF *I LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN'S* EXPENDITURE PRIORITY OF COMPACT IMPACT ACT FUNDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012 TO I MAGA'LÅHEN GUÅHAN AND TO THE SECRETARY OF INTERIOR TO SUPPORT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND OPERATIONS OF VARIOUS IMPACTED GOVERNMENT AGENCIES AND DEPARTMENTS.

Be it resolved by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*:

1 **Whereas**, the Amended Compact of Free Association between the
2 Republic of Belau, Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Federated States of
3 Micronesia and the United States authorizes financial assistance to Hawaii, Guam,
4 American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; and

5 **Whereas**, the goal of this assistance is to provide (through the year 2023)
6 Thirty Million Dollars (**\$30,000,000**) in annual grants for the purpose of aiding in
7 defraying costs incurred as a result of increased demands placed on health, educational,
8 social, or public safety services as well as infrastructure related to such services to
9 jurisdictions in which qualified nonimmigrants from the Republic of the Marshall Islands,
10 the Federated States of Micronesia, or the Republic of Palau have claimed residence; and

11 **Whereas**, the Guam Memorial Hospital, the Department of Public Health
12 and Social Services, the Guam Police Department, the Guam Fire Department, the Office
13 of the Attorney General (Department of Law), the Department of Mental Health and
14 Substance Abuse and the Department of Administration are seeking funding relief to
15 meet the increased demand in services provided to the public; and

1 **Whereas**, each jurisdiction is to provide a program plan to the Office of
2 Insular Affairs for the use of the funds prior to the awarding of the grant; and

3 **Whereas**, based on the population of qualified immigrants, Guam may
4 apply for and be awarded Sixteen Million Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
5 (\$16,850,000) in grant funds; and

6 **Whereas**, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (Hospital) continues to
7 experience financial crises and seeks relief to pay for medical and pharmaceutical
8 supplies vital to the health and well-being of patients, and

9 **Whereas**, the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS)
10 and its Community Health Centers have made several requests for assistance with
11 continuing programs funded by ARRA grants which hired doctors and nurses to meet the
12 increasing demand for services to residents; and

13 **Whereas**, the Guam Police Department headquarters lease expires on
14 September 30, 2011, and a new facility is needed to ensure public safety continuity; and

15 **Whereas**, the Guam Fire Department suffers from the lack of working
16 equipment and ambulances; and

17 **Whereas**, the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Law
18 continue to struggle to account and distribute child support payments and need to upgrade
19 their computer system (APASI) which will enhance efficiency for accounting and finance
20 handling; and

21 **Whereas**, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the
22 Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities must fulfill the
23 requirements set forth in the Amended Permanent Injunction as ordered by the U.S.
24 District Court of Guam; and

25 **Whereas**, the Department of Administration has put forth a Request for
26 Information on Solutions for their current Point-of-Sales (POS) system, because they
27 must pursue the acquisition of said system as a solution to reduce costs associated with
28 leasing and credit card transaction fees with issuing banks. The POS is vital to ensuring
29 an unqualified clean government wide audit; and

1 **Whereas, I Liheslaturan Guåhan** continues to explore opportunities of
2 relieving the General Fund which has been severely overstretched to subsidize projects
3 and services that qualify for other funding sources, and

4 **Whereas, I Maga'låhen Guåhan** holds the highest authority and position
5 charged with finding alternative solutions for improving systems, programs and services
6 to improve the quality of life for the people he has been elected to serve; and

7 **Whereas,** it would only prove just and fit for *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* to
8 consider the matters mentioned above; and now, therefore, be it

9 **RESOLVED,** that *I Mina'trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does
10 hereby present to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*, and to the
11 Honorable Anthony M Babauta, Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Insular Areas and
12 requests funding of the costs for the aforementioned Capital Improvement Projects and
13 Program Support across those specific government of Guam agencies and departments
14 from the annual allocation of the Fiscal Year 2012 Compact Impact Aid Funds; and be it
15 further

16 **RESOLVED,** that the sum of Seven Million One Hundred Thousand
17 Dollars (**\$7,100,000**) is hereby earmarked to cover the School Leaseback Program for the
18 Guam Department of Education; and be it further

19 **RESOLVED,** that the sum of Five Million Dollars (**\$5,000,000**) is hereby
20 earmarked to cover the Pharmaceutical Supplies for the Guam Memorial Hospital; and be
21 it further

22 **RESOLVED,** that the sum of One Million Dollars (**\$1,000,000**) is hereby
23 available to cover Physician and Nursing Salaries and Pharmaceutical Supplies for the
24 Guam Community Health Centers; and be it further

25 **RESOLVED,** that the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
26 (**\$750,000**) is hereby available to cover the lease or construction of facilities for the
27 Guam Police Department; and be it further

28 **RESOLVED,** that the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
29 (**\$750,000**) is hereby available to cover the purchase of new ambulances for the Guam
30 Fire Department; and be it further

1 **RESOLVED**, that the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
2 (\$750,000) is hereby available to cover the lease or purchase of a new transactional
3 database system for tracking child support payments for the Office of the Attorney
4 General of Guam; and be it further

5 **RESOLVED**, that the sum of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) is hereby
6 available to cover the expenses related to satisfying the Guam Department of Mental
7 Health and Substance Abuse Amended Permanent Injunction; and be it further

8 **RESOLVED**, that the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000)
9 is hereby available to cover the lease or purchase of a Point-of-Sale system to receive
10 payments of taxes and fees for the Department of Administration (Treasurer of Guam);
11 and be it further

12 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify and the Legislative Secretary attests
13 to, the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Mr.
14 Anthony M. Babauta, Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Insular Areas; the Honorable
15 Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam's Congressional Delegate, U.S. House of Representatives;
16 and the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*.

Buenas yan Hafa Adai! My name is Derek Sablan, a long time resident of the Municipality of Dededo and former elected member of the Guam Youth Congress for four years. I am writing in support of Resolution 12-31 and commend the author of the resolution for putting down in writing what the government of Guam should be prioritizing when it comes to the limited amount of compensation given to the island under the Compact-Impact agreement. Overall I support the entirety of Resolution 12-31, but in particular I strongly support two provisions.

During my term, one of the concerns that the youth brought to my attention was the state of affairs at our

only public hospital, especially the availability of pharmaceutical supplies. It is good to see that this area of concern is being addressed in the resolution.

I also strongly support the \$750,000 that would be allocated for the purchase of new ambulances for the Guam Fire Department. With the military buildup, the island's population will only continue to grow, and having less than ten ambulances servicing the entire island will be inadequate. Having a limited number of working ambulances in the era of the buildup would not be a positive thing for our residents, especially our youth. Our only solution to this problem shouldn't be limited to having private companies or schools donate their time and resources towards a public service and that is why I am supporting this provision.



Hundreds of Canterbury University students are being shipped to Australia to finish their studies while thousands of schoolchildren have enrolled elsewhere, some as far away as Auckland, after some local schools warned they could be closed for a year.

The quake, an aftershock of a 7.0-magnitude shudder on Sept. 4 which caused damage but no deaths, has left city businesses scrambling for office space in the suburbs, setting up in warehouses and homes.

Some companies had moved their servers into bunkers after the earlier quake, meaning staff can log in from home while the city remains in lockdown, but others have lost everything.

Meanwhile tens of thousands of residences are still without power or water, and a quarter of all homes will need some sort of repair work.

About 10,000 will need to be demolished – entire streets in some suburbs – and the rush is on to find parks and other land for temporary housing before the punishing southern winter sets in.


