COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 23-31 (COR) was introduced on January 10, 2011 by Senator Mana Silva Taijeron, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs on January 12, 2011.

The Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs convened a public hearing on Bill 23-31 (COR) on April 8, 2011 at 9:05 am in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room, during which the subject of establishing a project plan of action for the reconstruction of Bile and Pigua Bay Bridges was discussed.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Thursday, March 31, 2011 (5-Day Notice), and again on Wednesday, April 6, 2011 (48-Hour Notice).

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:05 am.

Senator Silva Taijeron: Provides overview of Bill 23-31. States that the intent of bill was to mandate the Government of Guam to commit to a deadline for a completion of longstanding road projects in the south. Informs that the introduction of bill was to raise public discussion and bring it to the forefront. Relays that frustration of residents arose because proper information was not communicated well to them and that their questions were not answered.

States that she met with Department of Public Works (DPW), and now understands the obstacles they face with regard to the Malesso bridges, and the Agat/Umatac road projects. States that according to DPW, the Agat/Umatac road is expected to be complete by this year; the Malesso bridges are more complicated since there environmental concerns that must be taken care of. Is assured that plans are in place and just awaiting execution. Announces that DPW produced an

informational brochure with updates on projects; brochures were distributed to mayors' offices in Umatac and Malesso, and then were handed out to village residents.

Makes the following recommendations for consideration: 1) that any references to the Agat/Umatac road be removed; 2) timeline in Section 2 be removed or extended. Agat/Umatac road construction slated to be completed by the end of this year. Understands that from DPW perspective, imposed timelines are not always feasible, and thus realizes that DPW needs flexibility when certain unforeseen problems arise. Hopes that through the introduction of the bill, residents are better able to receive the proper information due to them.

Mr. Dominguez: Mr. Dominguez is Deputy Director of DPW. States appreciation for the removal of timeline for these projects. Relays that DPW met with bonding company for the Agat/Umatac project, and fired contractor working on the project, and now awaiting on the bonding company to rectify the situation. Anticipates completion of project by end of third quarter if all goes well. In the case of Bile Bay & Pigua bridges, states that timeline is set for early 2013, with funding coming from Federal Highway Administration. Hopes for continued patience from residents of the southern villages.

Senator Silva Taijeron: States that the issues with regard to this related to the lack of information being passed on to the residents of the south. Believes that the Department has really stepped up the release of information, and that this has become a priority for the Department. Acknowledges that it's good for the residents to see and hear this.

Mr. Dominguez: States that it's as high a priority as the tri-intersection project.

Senator Silva Taijeron: Asks if the switch over will take place today.

Mr. Dominguez: Responds 'Yes...scheduled...anyway'.

Senator Tony Ada: Asks if there are any anticipated delays with the bridges in the south.

Ms. Brown: Ms. Brown is Director of DPW. States that, given the timing and funding, DPW is fully aware of the two bridges and that it remains at the top of their list of priorities. Reminds senators that the issue with Bile and Pigua bridges has to do with rights-of-way acquisition—a complicated issue particularly as it pertains to inherited land, which involves tracing who the current owner is and who has legal authority over a piece of property. States that this is research that needs to be done, parties need to be contacted and hopefully an agreeable price can be agreed upon for the piece of property, rather than pursuing condemnation.

Recommends that senators confer with DPW on bills to be introduced, and that DPW is certainly open to discussing what bills may be helpful. States that bills on the agenda today were not conferred with the Department, and suggests that if senators want to assist DPW in moving forward, it might be best to discuss with them directly.

States that DPW is in opposition to Bill 23-31.

Senator Silva Taijeron: Recaps to Director Brown the removal of the timeline, which will allow for more flexibility, and the removal of the Agat/Umatac reference from the bill.

Ms. Brown: States that DPW's preference is that the legislature offer resources rather than more mandates dictating how to use federal funds that already have strict compliance requirements. Realizes the importance of passing legislation, but urges that mandates on how DPW operates and makes its schedules impedes in their ability to work efficiently. Believes that DPW is on top of the road construction happening, including the issues, limitations, and challenges with private contractors on these projects.

Senator Tony Ada: Asks how developed is research on the rights-of-way acquisition.

Ms. Brown: Responds that it is ongoing. States that it is not going to change the schedule, but that rights-of-way is a priority given that this must be done in order to proceed with any type of construction. Informs that preliminary designs for both bridge projects have been reviewed, and they are the scheduled on the list for construction. Restates they will be completed, and will be paid for with federal resources.

Senator Blas: Asks about the impact of the roadway construction where these two bridges are located, particularly, how the projects for the road expansion on the eastern side, Route 4, will be coordinated with the Haul Road Network plans. Asks will these bridges hold through until early 2013, considering the continued use of these roads in their current state by residents and truckers with heavy loads.

Ms. Brown: Responds that DPW recognizes the bridges have to be monitored, especially given that the bridges were quickly fixed to address an already deteriorated situation. States that if resources are made available sooner, if land acquisition can be addressed sooner, if full design plans can be addressed sooner bridgework will certainly be expedited. Reminds that DPW's resources are focused on the court-ordered construction of Ylig, Togcha and Talofofo bridges. Recognizes that other bridges in the south, including a couple in Santa Rita need to be assessed. States that some of the bridges are not on routed roads and therefore are not federally funded. However, if bridges are not sound, DPW will dialogue with legislature to see what resources are available to address concerns.

Senator Blas: Asks Deputy Director how he came to date of 2013.

Mr. Dominguez: Responds the timeline was developed from consultants in early February, but is unsure of details, particularly because the federal government will fund this bridge construction.

Ms. Brown: Emphasizes again of such a process. Reminds that Hagåtña bridge will be the most significant bridgework to be undertaken by DPW. Assures once again their awareness of the situation in the south, and that if federal funding can be aligned with the funding for the acquisition of property, then that would help to best move the efforts forward.

Senator Blas: States that he is open to discussions with DPW to address issues that may concern legislation. Believes that while DPW opposes legislation, this issue must still a priority to the department, and that positive public relations is necessary between both the legislature and DPW.

Ms. Brown: States that there is no argument. Reminds that key staff from DPW met early on with Senator Silva Taijeron to discuss issues; DPW has worked with oversight Chair to update on concerns. Further encourages dialogue between DPW and legislature, not necessarily in the form of public hearings, so as to move things along more efficiently. Believes that with consultation from DPW, the legislature can be very helpful and instrumental in getting out legislation that would best benefit the larger public. Sees this type of legislation as administrative oversight—if DPW was derelict and irresponsible in its duties then believes there may be grounds for this type of legislation. But does not believe this is the case; rather, argues that DPW has been forward and forthcoming with the public in providing the information.

Senator Blas: Asks for shared appreciation from Director Brown that legislation was necessary to address years of waiting from southern residents regarding repair of bridges. States that it is important for the public to see this discussed openly, that there is value in such a discussion.

Ms. Brown: Appreciates the intent, but also wants to ensure that DPW is not accused of not addressing the issue. States that DPW would like to see more support from the legislature that's productive, proactive and helpful. DPW is neither immune to the issues, nor unenlightened, and would rather work proactively with legislature.

Sen. Palacios: Asks if DPW expects any problems completing bridges in timely manner, particularly with regard to acquisition of private property.

Ms. Brown: Responds that process is ongoing now, but reiterates that inherited lands make things more complicated.

Sen. Palacios: Asks when this might be resolved.

Ms. Brown: States that she cannot respond at this time, since DPW does not have the appropriate answers. Assures that DPW will update the legislature when the information is received.

Senator Duenas: States that for the purposes of public safety, he is willing to introduce legislation that sets a timeline for when eminent domain will be exercised. States that under eminent domain, payment of fair market value is still required for the acquisition of private property. Asks if this is the stumbling block. Believes if this route will speed things up then legislature should take this up.

Ms. Brown: Stresses that this is worth discussion, however, reminds that there is a process and that funds must be available to exercise eminent domain. Recognizes two bridges would have been her priority, if it weren't for the court ordered bridge repair work. Assures Senator Duenas

that if there are any hold-ups regarding land issues, he'll be the first she contacts. Appreciates his recommendation.

Senator Duenas: States that land in the south, once research is completed, would be useful for people to know so that perhaps negotiations can begin.

Ms. Brown: Reminds that footprint being discussed is not acres of land, and that huge segments of the southern road system on Route 4 that are not owned by the people of Guam. States that federal funds will not be accessible in the future for road repair if they sit on private property.

Senator Tom Ada: Asks where DPW is in the design work. At the 30%, 60% or 90% completion mark?

Ms. Brown: Replies that they are more than halfway completed, based on her assessment in January.

Senator Tom Ada: Asks if the design is continuing based on assumption that right-of-way will be acquired.

Ms. Brown: Answers that is optimistically what DPW hopes for, "yes." Further states that DPW wants to replace existing bridge, but also ensure that future bridges accommodate increased water flow, etc., and ensure that it is stable.

Senator Tom Ada: Asks if, based on right-of-way acquisition, we are at Step 2 of Step 5.

Ms. Brown: Responds that it depends on how we look at it – there are some parcels that have no clear owner, but further research and contact needs to happen...which is a challenge of what happens with land issues on Guam.

Senator Tom Ada: States that, in reference to legislation exercising eminent domain, he is not convinced that things will necessarily be expedited because the process is then put on someone else's timeline. When the process for condemnation is sought, approval from the legislature is required, as well as further approval from the judiciary—all which can be part of a lengthy procedure. Encourages DPW to exhaust all of its options with right-of-way acquisitions before exercising eminent domain.

Senator Silva Taijeron: Extends appreciation that DPW came out to testify. Makes the point that regardless of whether or not DPW supports the measure, the legislation does bring to the forefront information that the residents of the south had not been getting; they had been waiting six years. States that now there is dialogue, there is information that's being put out to the public so that they're aware of what is going on and where DPW stands in addressing their concerns. Appreciates DPW for putting these issues at the top of their priorities is important.

Senator Tom Ada: Mentions that notice of hearing was transmitted to the Mayors Council, which is relied on to disseminate to the respective mayors around the island. Remains uncertain as to why there is no mayoral representation today.

Continues with Bills 28 & 114.

The public hearing was adjourned at 11:10 am.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs has substituted Bill No. 23-31 (COR) with the following changes:

- References to the Agat/Umatac Road have been removed;
- Department of Public Works must submit a project plan of action each for Bile and Pigua Bay Bridges within sixty (60) days upon enactment of bill.

The Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs hereby reports out Bill 23-31 (COR), As Substituted by the Committee, with the recommendation To PASS.

AN ACT TO EXPEDITE ESTABLISH A PROJECT PLAN OF ACTION FOR THE REPAIR RECONSTRUCTION OF SOUTHERN BILE AND PIGUA BAY BRIDGES IN MALESSO TO ALLOW FOR REASONABLE TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM SOUTHERN VILLAGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
 that transportation to and from southern villages has been inhibited for an
 unreasonable amount of time impeded by two road bridge projects. On Agat Umatae
 Road below Mt. Jumullong Manglo, erosion continues to reduce the width of the road
 from four usable lanes to two. In Malesso, the two temporary bridges in Bile and
 Pigua continue to reduce the width of the road from two lanes to one, allowing only
 for one-way traffic, and requiring the use of stop signs.
- The reduction of usable road width in these three construction two sites results in an increase in transportation time to and from southern villages, and forces drivers to encounter potentially-challenging situations.
- Section 2. Establishment of a <u>Plan of Action</u> Deadline for Project

 Completion. It is hereby mandated that the directors of the Department of Public

- 1 Works and the Department of Land Management commit, in writing, to a project plan
- 2 of action and timeline final deadline of one hundred and twenty (120) sixty (60) days

AN TO **EXPEDITE** THE REPAIR OF BRIDGES **SOUTHERN** TO **ALLOW** FOR REASONABLE TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM SOUTHERN VILLAGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that transportation to and from southern villages has been inhibited for an 3 unreasonable amount of time by two road projects. On Agat – Umatac Road below 4 Mt. Jumullong Manglo, erosion continues to reduce the width of the road from four 5 usable lanes to two. In Malesso, the two temporary bridges continue reduce the width 6 of the road from two lanes to one, allowing only for one-way traffic, and requiring the 7 8 use of stop signs.

The reduction of usable road width in these three construction sites results in an increase in transportation time to and from southern villages, and forces drivers to encounter potentially-challenging situations.

Section 2. Establishment of a Deadline for Project Completion. It is hereby mandated that directors of the Department of Public Works and the Department of Land Management commit, in writing, to a final deadline of one hundred and twenty (120) days upon enactment of this bill, for completion of the relevant projects.

Section 3. Resolution of Barriers to Project Completion. Should directors of the above-mentioned agencies determine that any barriers exist to project completion, and that said barriers have the potential to impede upon the completion deadline, the agency directors must communicate in writing to the Chairperson of the Committee on Utilities, Transportation, Public Works and Veterans' Affairs, specifying the barriers, and an action plan to resolve each prior to the deadline.

Section 4. Change of Deadline. Should the directors determine that the completion deadline is impractical, they are required to show cause to *I Liheslatura* the additional time needed for resolution, and are required to propose to *I Liheslatura* a revised timeline for project completion.

Section 5. Severability. If any of the provisions of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.



Re: Bill No. 23-31 (COR), An act to expedite the repair of southern bridges to allow for reasonable transportation to and from southern bridges.

Dear Senator Ada:

The Department of Public Works (DPW) respectfully submits the following testimony in opposition to the above referenced Bill.

On March 9, 2011, the DPW in partnership with the Committee on Transportation, Public Works and Veterans Affairs participated in an informational public briefing on the status of the various southern bridges here at the legislative public hearing room. At that time the DPW and its consultants provided an update on the specific issues related to the Agat-Umatac Road culvert repair project and the Bile and Pigua bridge projects in Malesso. The status, challenges and timelines of these projects were very clearly laid out.

As you may recall, the contractor on the Route 2 Agat-Umatac Road culvert repair project has been terminated and the contractor's bonding company is now charged with completion of the project, which is now moving forward. At that same briefing, the issues related to the delays in replacing the two Malesso bridges were also very clearly outlined, including the history of the projects and our current efforts to move the replacement of those bridges forward as expeditiously as possible.

As you are aware, the Federal Highway Administration provides the funding for these projects and the DPW is required to meet strict standards of federal compliance, otherwise these projects would have to

be funded locally or not be considered at all. These standards are exhaustive, but designed to ensure the safety our motoring public and the structural integrity of the bridges and culverts over an extended life.

While I appreciate the concerns that served as the nexus for Senator Taijeron's creation of this Bill, legislating a deadline for the completion of the projects as mandated in Section 3 of the Bill is neither warranted nor practical. All road projects must follow a prescribed process designed to ensure that the designer's and contractor's efforts result in a project that is safe, economical, professionally managed and properly executed in accordance with all federal and local regulations and requirements. This includes ensuring that private property rights are protected when acquiring rights-of-way which was the primary reason for the delays of the bridge replacements in the first place.

Section 3 of the proposed Bill infers that the DPW has not been forthcoming or cooperative in providing updates on our various road projects to the Committee. I respectfully take exception to this Section and submit that we have been more than forthcoming in providing regular updates and have been very responsive to concerns raised by the legislature or the general public when required. This includes updates on changes to deadlines as well as any on-going efforts to resolve delays as referenced in Section 4.

Although it has been a little over three months since I have taken over the Directorship of DPW, I take my responsibilities on behalf of the people of Guam very seriously. As I have already demonstrated, I am not hesitant to hold our consultants, designers, contractors or my own staff accountable or take decisive action when warranted. I personally take the time to physically visit our current road projects, along with my Deputy Director Carl Dominguez, on a weekly basis and we are constantly responding to numerous constituent concerns related to road construction issues on a daily basis.

The refurbishment, resurfacing and replacement of many of our roads, intersections and bridges is quite an undertaking and does indeed create a number of inconveniences to our motoring public during construction. However, we are working very hard to improve the quality and safety of our island roads including the rebuilding of the Bile and Pigua Bridges. These projects require careful planning, the highest degree of professional execution and diligent oversight that I am charged with providing. To this end, I need the support of the legislature in providing me with the ways and means necessary for the DPW to be as effective and efficient in the execution of these projects rather than attempting to manage them through legislation.






