COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 196-31 (COR) was introduced on May 12, 2011 by Senator Mana Silva Taijeron, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs on May 13, 2011.

The Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs convened a public hearing on Bill 196-31 (COR) on June 24, 2011 at 2:03 pm in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room, during which the subject of the feasibility of the Department of Public Works (DPW) to consider and perform, night time construction work on Guam's roads was discussed.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Friday, June 17, 2011 (5-Day Notice), and again on Wednesday, June 22, 2011 (48-Hour Notice).

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 2:03 pm.

Senator Silva Taijeron: Provides overview of Bill 196-31. States that the intent of the bill is to require the Department of Public Works to consider and perform, when deemed feasible, nighttime construction on Guam's roads and to include quotations or estimates for the cost of nighttime construction when soliciting for contracts on road construction projects. She also

states that the people of Guam are growing frustrated with the delays caused by the number of construction projects and offers the idea to have DPW consider nighttime road construction to speed up the process.

Mr. Dominguez: Mr. Dominguez is the Deputy Director at the Department of Public Works. Reads testimony on behalf of DPW Director Joanne Brown. He states that nighttime work is not as safe as daytime work because workers have reduced visibility and construction lights that are set up may blind motorists passing through. He goes on to state that workers, drivers, and pedestrians are less alert at night. Mr. Dominguez also states that nighttime work reduces the quality of construction. He further states that nighttime work would have an impact on the quality of life of residents and local businesses that are open through the night. Mr. Dominguez states that cost implications are difficult to estimate because of the lack of comparative data on Guam. Lastly, he states that the Department believes that it is not necessary to mandate something that it is already doing.

Question & Answer

Senator Silva Taijeron: Informs DPW that this bill does not mandate nighttime road construction, but mandates an additional bid proposal to be submitted along with a quotation.

Ms. Brown: States that DPW is already taking these things into consideration. Ms. Brown further states that DPW does not appreciate the Legislature telling them to consider options that they are already considering.

Senator Tony Ada: Mentions that GPA works on underground power lines during the night, and asks if DPW was a part of that project.

Ms. Brown: States that if the autonomous agencies are doing those things independently, DPW would just need to require an approved encroachment permit.

Senator Tony Ada: Asks if DPW had the capability to do so, would they be able to find the same type of contractors that are able to carry out nighttime or 24-hour construction.

Ms. Brown: States that it depends on cost not capacity, and that laying a power line is different from excavating an entire roadway. Ms. Brown further states that Federal Highway will ultimately determine how much money per project it will grant DPW and that DPW does not have the unlimited funds to begin with.

Senator Mabini: Asks if DPW sees any potential projects that could be looked at for nighttime construction.

Ms. Brown: States that one potential project is the Hagåtña Bridge Project. States, however, that this would be a luxury and DPW does not have the unlimited funds to carry this out.

To conclude, she states that DPW is making sure that its contractors are doing the job. If they are not meeting the timelines they will be paying DPW damages for not beginning the projects. Ms. Brown further states that if DPW was not doing things right, then the Legislature can by all means call them in. Lastly, Ms. Brown states that these are things DPW takes in to consideration already.

Senator Tom Ada: The public hearing is deemed publicly heard and is adjourned at 4:40 pm.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs has substituted Bill No. 196-31 (COR) with the following change:

Adds language "§54106 to Article 1, Chapter 54, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated"

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Many of these 4 construction projects are a result of various factors including the impending 5 population increase and the need to address and repair long-standing issues with our island infrastructure. Consequently, the road construction projects have led to traffic 6 7 congestion and delays which have become a daily burden to drivers who traverse 8 Guam's roads. These projects have affected our island's economy and has impeded 9 the ability of drivers to travel to and from work.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that night time construction is a viable alternative to the current practice of daytime construction. If done correctly, night

time construction is efficient for roads and reduces heavy traffic volumes. It further
 reduces congestion and may allow for the quicker completion of projects.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to require the Department of Public Works to consider the option of night time construction for road projects in Guam, and to further require the inclusion of quotes or estimates for the cost of night time construction when soliciting for road project contracts.

Section 2. Consideration of Night Time Work on Major Road Construction Projects. For every major road construction project initiated by the Department of Public Works (DPW) on and after October 1, 2011, DPW shall consider and, where feasible in its judgment, ensure that such construction work is performed no earlier than eight o'clock post meridiem (8:00 p.m.) and no later than six o'clock anti meridiem (6:00 a.m.). For the purposes of determining whether to engage in night time construction, DPW shall review the following: existing traffic volumes, congestion, traffic control measures and motorist safety; project cost, project quality, inspection obligations, highway user costs, workforce availability and availability of materials; work area lighting and worker safety; and other factors that DPW may deem necessary in the consideration of night time construction.

When soliciting formal competition on public contracts for road construction projects, DPW shall require that any quotation or estimation for service be inclusive of the cost of night time construction. DPW may also consider any recommendations and comments submitted from *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, other government of Guam entities and the general public regarding night time construction. DPW shall prepare a written report of its analysis of each project setting forth such decisions and the reasons therefore, and such report shall be available to the public.

Beginning January 31, 2012, and every two (2) years thereafter, DPW shall submit a status report of the night time construction projects to *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Such report shall include, but not be limited to, a description of each project in which night time construction was authorized; the success or failure, as determined by DPW, of the efforts to reduce traffic congestion using night time construction; a general comparison of project quality and overall costs against similar daytime construction projects; and the safety record for night time construction projects.

Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.



Buenas yan Hafa Adai Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to submit our testimony on the above referenced bill. The Department of Public Works acknowledges that there are significant traffic impacts with any road construction project. This, of course is unavoidable as safe work zones must be set up to complete the project, which often includes excavation, paving, or other work directly within one or more travel lanes.

While I appreciate the intent of the Bill, there are a number of factors that must be taken into consideration when considering night time work including:

1. Reduced visibility in and around the work site: Studies have shown that night-time work is not as safe as day-time work even for well planned and maintained work zones for one main reason — motorists and workers simply cannot see as well as in the daytime. There are two types of artificial lighting: stationery — a light array connected to a generator; and equipment mounted — lights mounted on motor graders, steam rollers and other equipment. These lights are extremely bright and can be difficult to position or control on a linear project, such as a roadway, in a way that they are not a distraction or blinding to a motorist's eyes traveling in one direction or the other. Furthermore,

workers and inspectors often cross the open travel lanes in the work area and may not be seen as well by motorists at night. The lights and construction activity is more distracting at night, focusing the driver's attention away from the road. These studies further indicate that reduced lighting not only makes driving and work tasks more difficult, but drivers, pedestrians and workers are generally all less alert.

2. Impacts to Construction Quality: Productivity and quality are two of the areas that are apt to be compromised with night-time work. Even with multiple lighting units, shadows are a significant problem and quality construction work is more difficult to achieve, even with experienced night time workers. Night work is also dependent on where the lights are located, so workflows are different than daytime operations, and the construction duration can be typically longer for projects that specify night time work. Moreover, there is the additional requirement of set up and take down of times for increased and enhanced traffic controls as well as lighting equipment.

There are numerous incidental considerations beyond the contractor simply working at night. Pavement and concrete suppliers must create a second shift to deliver materials at night. Utility companies, subcontractors, DPW inspectors, material testing firms and other supporting vendors must be willing and able to support the night-time work.

Most of Guam's contractors have more than one project on-going at a particular time. They are generally able to shift workers from one project to another to handle the peaks and valleys of production on multiple projects. With some day time and some night time projects, shifting workers between projects on short notice would be more difficult and require sophisticated planning and execution to deliver all projects on time.

The type of work is also an important consideration. Most roadway work elements require multiple days to complete. Concrete paving and curbs require form work, pouring and cure time before the road can be opened to traffic. Any excavation greater than two feet deep requires a concrete barrier for safety. Pavement is done in a linear fashion and built up from the bottom base layer – compacted in lifts. A pavement section is typically about 2-3 feet deep, including base and sub-base materials. As such, road projects that include pavement replacement or excavations deeper than two feet will have entire lanes closed for multiple days or weeks at a time. The cones and barriers cannot simply be removed and the lane opened to traffic at the end of a shift.

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- 3. Quality of life and environmental concerns: Much of our road improvements occur on roadways and intersections that are directly adjacent to or within close proximity to residences and businesses that are open beyond 8:00 PM. Jack hammering and pavement milling machines ripping up the roadway, excavators, pile driving activities, paving operations, large equipment including dump trucks hauling material to and from the site, concrete trucks delivering concrete, back-up alarms and gasoline powered generators to power the lighting arrays are all very loud. In the daytime hours, this noise is somewhat drowned out by life's general activity, but at night it all seems magnified because general background noise drops. Residents within a half-mile will most likely hear night time construction activity; within a quarter-mile the noise will be uncomfortable for sleeping, and within an eighth of a mile sleep could be next to impossible for some. Of course, the noise level will vary depending on the particular operations being performed at any given time. Construction noise generated by heavy equipment and the artificial lighting required for night time construction activities will cause disruption and could negatively affect the quality of life for residents in and
- 4. Cost implications: Cost implications are difficult to estimate at this time mainly because of the lack of comparative data on Guam. However, it is anticipated that requiring a project to be completed at night would add about 15-25% to the total cost of a project. As you know, our roadway needs are much larger than our ability to fund improvements, and this would mean that fewer projects get constructed.

Lastly, because all of our federal funding flows through FHWA all premium costs, including night work, is subject to FHWA concurrence. FHWA recognizes that all construction projects are disruptive. It would have to be demonstrated that the additional cost to require night work on a particular project offered significant relief in mitigating traffic or some other impact directly caused by the project. And frankly, we would be irresponsible if we weren't doing this to begin with.

Currently, the DPW has two projects - Route 1 and 8 intersection improvements and replacement of Agana Bridges project and the Route 11 projects; both projects are in the procurement stage as Best-Value Design-Build projects. The DPW intends to award these contracts to the best-value proposer, not simply the lowest bidder. Both projects include very specific traffic control requirements for lane closures, workflows, property access and public outreach.

Due to the critical nature of the Route 1 and 8 intersection and Agana Bridges project and the Route 11 project, both these projects promote night-work as an option to the contractor to increase productivity when possible and when safety factors can be adequately addressed as both projects will require traffic shifts and/or lane closures that will last more than one night. Both projects have short design/construction durations to put pressure on the contractor to complete the project as quickly as possible, which will likely lead to night and weekend work during different phases. All these issues were taken into consideration by DPW, including the increased cost that will be incurred to meet the desired timelines. However, DPW does not have unlimited funding resources for this type of additional cost for all other road projects. With this in mind, we more than welcome funding appropriations from the Guam Legislature to pay for additional mandated cost that is imposed upon us.

In conclusion, although we certainly appreciate and commend the author of this bill and it's consideration by the committee, we do not believe that it is necessary to mandate something that we are already doing – analyzing the feasibility of night work where appropriate, engaging in a more rigorous program of traffic management on every project, ensuring the safety of our motoring public, pedestrians and construction workers, and maximizing the use of our precious federal funding resources to accomplish as many road improvements as is possible for the benefit of the people of Guam.

The autopsy of Medical Examiner Dr. Aurelio Espinola was raised in Cunliffe's closing arguments, wherein the defense attorney said there were different opinions on how Taylor died. Up to six doctors indicated Taylor

died a natural death, but Espinola testified that Taylor died from the injuries she sustained several days earlier.

Meanwhile, Chief Prosecutor Basil O'Mallan said Taylor was "savagely beaten." With regard to her drinking, he said people drink when they're in pain and that Taylor's

pain was "caused by Anthony Flores."

Following the closing arguments, jurors were given their instructions before being excused to deliberate and come up with a verdict on the case.

Manglona also said that under the bill, the supervisor of an employee who fails to submit a report to the Attorney General's Office could be held criminally liable. However, she said a supervisor may not be aware of such sexual harassment events but still be held criminally liable if it is

Federal employment opportunity law defines what sexual harassment is; however, Guam law does not protect unclassified and contractual employees from sexual harassment complaints.

Current Guam law also does not provide a means to effectively audit the handling of such complaints.

Deputy Attorney General Phil Tydingco said he supports the measure but also wants to ensure that technical adjustments are made to the policy and procedures that DOA has in place for classified employees, and how to annly them to non-placeified

Won Pat eyeing more doctors through medical student loans

SPEAKER Judi Won Pat is proposing a measure that would help recruit and retain more physicians on-island through a debt repayment program.

Bill 236, or the Physician Recruitment and Retention Act, seeks to offer a medical school debt repayment to eligible physicians to attract them to practice or continue practicing on Guam.

The bill states that while there is a need for medical specialists on Guart, the island's current economic shortfall hampers the ability to attract and recruit medical specialists to the island.

"The government cannot afford to pay close to the national average of medical specialists. American College of Emergency Physicians reports that physician incomes are higher than most occupations in order to allow for the repayment of high levels of debt," the bill states.

The bill cites a steady increase in medical school expenses, climbing 6 percent annually in school

tuition and other expenses. This has resulted in medical students seeking high paying medical jobs elsewhere to help repay educational losses.

offering a debt repayment program for eligible medical specialists, Won Pat hopes to entice residents and former residents of Guam who have left the island to pursue

a medical degree to come back home and serve the community.

Eligible specialists accepted into the program will receive up to \$300,000 to pay for expenses and loan indebtedness incurred during medical education and training.

The physician must agree to a contract of practicing for two years on Guam for every \$50,000 awarded to the physician and must begin practicing within three months of being accepted into the program.

program through the Healthy Futures Fund (HFF) by transferring \$2 million annually from

HFF to a separate account, entitled the "Physician Education Debt Repayment Fund.

In addition, the Economic Guam Development

Authority board of directors will be required to administer the program,

while an evaluation committee will determine areas of medical specialty the island needs due to shortages.

The committee will- be comprised of the directors of Department of Public Health and Social Services and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse; the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority administrator; a doctor selected by the GMHA board; and a member selected through community-at-large by committee.
