COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

Bill No. 216-31 (COR) – “An act to amend (C), (D), (E), and to add a new Item (F) to Appendix A, to amend (A)(1), (B), and (C) of Appendix B, to amend (B), (D), (E), and add a new (F) to Appendix C, to amend (B) of Appendix D, to amend (D) of Appendix D, to amend (D) of Appendix E of Chapter 67 of Title 9, to add a new §3106.1 to Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to updating the Guam Uniform Controlled Substance Act based on the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration schedule listing.” – sponsored by Vice Speaker Benjamin J.F. Cruz.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary convened the public hearing on June 15, 2011 at 9:06 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill 216-31 (COR) – “An act to amend (C), (D), (E), and to add a new Item (F) to Appendix A, to amend (A)(1), (B), and (C) of Appendix B, to amend (B), (D), (E), and add a new (F) to Appendix C, to amend (B) of Appendix D, to amend (D) of Appendix D, to amend (D) of Appendix E of Chapter 67 of Title 9, to add a new §3106.1 to Article 1 of Chapter 3 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to updating the Guam Uniform Controlled Substance Act based on the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration schedule listing,” sponsored by Vice Speaker Benjamin J.F. Cruz.

Public Hearing Requirements:

Notices of the hearing were disseminated via facsimile and email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on June 8, 2011 (5-day Notice) and on June 13, 2011 (48-Hour notice), pursuant to meeting the requirements of the Open Government Law. Notice of the hearing was also posted on the Guam Legislature's website.

Rosanne Rabago, Environmental Health Supervisor, Department of Public Health and Social Services, read the written testimony of Director James W. Gillan and provided oral testimony in support of the Bill.

Fred Bordallo, Jr., Chief of Police, Guam Police Department, provided oral testimony in support of the Bill.

James W. Gillan, Director, Department of Public Health and Social Services, provided written testimony in support of the Bill.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr. convened the public hearing for the Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary at 9:06 a.m., read the agenda, recognized the Senators present, read the title of the Bill and deferred to the author to provide an overview. Chairman Palacios called the panel of Chief Deputy Attorney General Phil Tydingco, Rosanne Rabago and Chief Fred Bordallo.

Vice Speaker Benjamin J.F. Cruz stated that the issue was first raised when they were concerned about the drug known as "spice." He found that there are federally controlled substances that are lacking from the local schedules of controlled substances. He has worked to update the schedules of controlled substances. He related a story of how closely his office has worked with the Environmental Health Division of the Department of Public Health and Social Services.

Chief Deputy Attorney General Phil Tydingco stated that the Attorney General's Office supports the Bill's intent to update the Uniform Controlled Substances Act. He suggested that the updates should be made permissive so that the failure to update the Uniform Controlled Substances Act will not result in a challenge of the Uniform Controlled Substances Act.

Rosanne Rabago agreed with Mr. Tydingco about the suggestion about using permissive language. She read the written testimony of James W. Gillan, Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services. Director James W. Gillan stated that the Department supports the Bill. He states that the controlled schedule listing has not been updated since its enactment on March 25, 1998. The Bill intends to update the existing schedules to conform to current listing of the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration. The Office of the Attorney General has sometimes been unable to prosecute a local case because a specific controlled substance is not listed in the local

statute. There are numerous typographical errors in the current schedule that may undermine cases. For example, the term “powered opium” is listed where it should be “powdered opium.” Every number, letter, hyphen, comma, bracket and parenthesis used in a chemical name has meaning, so minor errors negate those listing with errors. Additionally, two controlled substances have been relocated from one schedule to another. The Department thanks Vice Speaker Cruz and Chairman Palacios for this important Bill. (*See attached written testimony.*) She added that sixty-three (63) substances were added to the various schedules.

Chief Fred E. Bordallo, Jr., stated that he supports the Bill. He told a story about the person that he assigned to review the Bill.

Senator Mana Silva Taijeron asked if the updates would result in public notice. Ms. Rabago stated that the Department would provide public notice upon any update.

Mr. Tydingco stated that the updating would be through the Administrative Adjudication Act, which requires a hearing and public notice.

Senator Frank F. Blas, Jr., asked if the Drug Enforcement Agency assists the Department of Public Health and Social Services in the review of controlled substances. Ms. Rabago stated that the Agency does not. She stated that they will work closely with GPD to inform officers about diversion. Senator Blas is concerned that even the DEA may not be up-to-date.

Senator Aline A. Yamashita, Ph.D., asked if the updated schedule could be posted on the website. She also suggested that the street names be used. She talked about collaboration with businesses so that they know what should and should not be on their shelves.

Mr. Tydingco stated that he believes it would be best if permissive language were used. Furthermore, he suggested that perhaps an update every two (2) years would be more practical to allow for a lead-in.

Chairman Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., thanked the panel for their testimony and declared that Bill No. 216-31(COR) is duly heard. The Chairman concluded the hearing and requested that written testimony be submitted within the next five (5) days. He adjourned the hearing at 1:32 p.m.

Wilfred G. Aflague, Director, Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse.

Director Aflague stated that the Department supports the Bill. (*See attached written testimony.*)

Rosanna Y. Rabago, Department of Public Health and Social Services. Ms. Rabago thanked Mr. Lidia from the Vice Speaker's office for his assistance with Bill 216. She recounted a meeting with Mr. Jonathan Luke from the Attorney General's Office on the Bill. He discussed the possibility of including Salvia in the Bill. She stated that the Department is open to the suggestion of further amendment to Bill 216. Mr. Nadeau recommended the inclusion of carisoprodol, also known as Soma. (*See attached written testimony.*)

No further written testimony received within the five (5) day period after the public hearing.

IV. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Substitute Bill 216-31 (COR)

The Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary has created a substitute Bill 216-31 (COR). The Bill had to be amended to accurately reflect the correct names of various controlled substances listed in the Bill, to use permissive language in Section 19 (in the substitute version) and to make technical changes, including renumbering the sections of the Bill.

The title had to be amended to reflect changes in the Bill and correctly reflect the title of the Act it amends.

Throughout the sections of the Bill, the phrase "as follows" was removed because it was unnecessary.

In Section 1, some of the Subitems in Subitem (C) had to be renumbered.

In Section 5, three (3) substantive amendments were made from the original to the substitute. In Item (A)(1), the term "opium derivative" was deleted to eliminate

redundancy. In Item (A)(1)(D), the name “powered opium” was changed to “powdered opium.” In Item (A)(1)(I), the misspelling of hydrochloride was corrected.

In Section 6, an “I” was deleted from Item (B)(16) and in Item (B)(26) a redundant “and” was deleted.

The amendment from Section 9 was added to Section 8, requiring an adjustment of the language amending Section 8.

The rest of the Sections following Section 8 had to be renumbered.

In Section 9, Item (B)(5) and the following Items had to be renumbered starting at (B)(8)

In Section 14, Item (B)(1) had to be changed to correct the spelling of alprazolam.

Section 15 was amended to correct the language of the amended Item (C).

Section 19 was amended to change the language in §67.301(f) to reflect permissive language, by changing “shall” to “may” in the first line of the amendment.



Testimony on Bill 216-31

Hafa Adai, Chairman Palacios, and members of the Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement, and Judiciary. My Name is Rosanna Rabago, Environmental Health Specialist Supervisor, of the Division of Environmental Health (DEH), of the Department of Public Health and Social Services. Our Director, Mr. James W. Gillan, prefers to have DEH staff available to answer technical questions that might arise during the public hearing, so I am presenting this testimony on his behalf. Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to testify on Bill 216-31, an act to amend and add to certain sections of Appendices A through E and Section 67.301(f) of Chapter 67 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated (known as the Guam Uniform Controlled Substances Act).

The Department of Public Health and Social Services is responsible for administering the Guam Uniform Controlled Substances Act (hereafter, identified as the "Act"), and mandated to update the controlled substances schedules as necessary, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, §9100, *et seq.*

We are requesting to update the current controlled substances schedule listing which has not been updated since its enactment on March 25, 1998. It is our intention to update our existing schedules by adopting the current schedule listing of the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) (Title 21 Code of Federal Regulations Section 1308).


There is adverse impact in not adopting legislation to update the schedule listing. In the past, it was brought to our attention by the Office of the Attorney General of a case that could not be prosecuted locally because the specific controlled substance was not listed in the Act.

During our research of Bill 216, we discovered that there were numerous typographical errors in the current schedule listing of the Act that may prove detrimental in terms of enforcement and prosecution of cases in court. For example, "powered opium" should have been indicated as "powdered opium." The listing of scheduled controlled substances is presented in both brand name, trade name, and the more technical, yet specific, chemical designated name. Every number, letter, hyphen, comma, bracket and parenthesis used in a chemical name has meaning on how the chemical structure of the drug is identified. We used this opportunity to correct these errors.

We also noted that two controlled substances were re-scheduled from one schedule to another by DEA. Specifically, Dronabinol was moved from Schedule II to Schedule III and Buprenorphine was moved from Schedule V to Schedule III. For your information, controlled substances are categorized from Schedules I through V based on their level of potential abuse, physical or psychological dependence from abuse, and accepted medical use in treatment. The lower the number, the higher potential for abuse.

Our Department has worked with Senator B.J. Cruz's staff to make significant changes to Bill 216 reflecting the updates listed in DEA's listing of schedules and correcting the typographical errors in the current Act. We would like to thank Senator B.J. Cruz and his staff as well as Senator Adolpho Palacios, Chairman of this Committee, for this important legislation.


Hafa Adai Senator Palacios,

Hi Mike

Thanks again for the work you did with us in getting the bill ready for public hearing. As you know, we had a meeting with the prosecutor from AG's Office regarding certain controlled substance cases that we are wanting to pursue enforcement action. In speaking with the prosecutor, Mr. Jonathan Luke, we spoke of the public hearing on Bill 216. He mentioned that he would like to conduct research to determine whether it would be ideal to list Salvia as a scheduled drug. As it stands, Salvia was added to 9 GCA 67 as a new Article 8 (P.L. 30-174) which makes it illegal to possess it and has penalty provisions applicable to such violations. Interestingly, it is not listed as a scheduled drug. Considering the recent raid against a retail store selling Salvia here on island, we are open to Mr. Luke's recommendation for further amending Bill 216, if possible. Tom Nadeau even recommended inclusion of carisoprodol (trade name: Soma), a prescription drug (classified as a muscle relaxant and CNS depressant) that is escalating in terms of abuse in the last decade in the U.S. Can you please advise us on how best to proceed to have further revision to Bill 216 if supported by Senators Cruz and Palacios? Thanks.

Code of Federal Regulations

Section 1300.01 Definitions relating to controlled substances.

(a) Any term not defined in this part shall have the definition set forth in section 102 of the Act (21 U.S.C. 802), except that certain terms used in part 1316 of this chapter are defined at the beginning of eachsubpart of that part.

(b) As used in parts 1301 through 1308 and part 1312 of this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings specified:

(1) The term *Act* means the Controlled Substances Act, as amended (84 Stat. 1242; 21 U.S.C. 801) and/or the Controlled Substances Import and Export Act, as amended (84 Stat. 1285; 21 U.S.C. 951).

(2) The term *Administration* means the Drug Enforcement Administration.

(3) The term *Administrator* means the Administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration. The Administrator has been delegated authority under the Act by the Attorney General (28 CFR 0.100).

(4) The term *anabolic steroid* means any drug or hormonal substance, chemically and pharmacologically related to testosterone (other than estrogens, progestins, corticosteroids, and dehydroepiandrosterone), and includes:

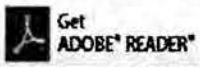

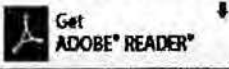

Section 1308.15 Schedule V.

(a) Schedule V shall consist of the drugs and other substances, by whatever official name, common or usual name, chemical name, or brand name designated, listed in this section.

(b) *Narcotic drugs.* Unless specifically excepted or unless listed in another schedule, any material, compound, mixture, or preparation containing any of the following narcotic drugs and their salts, as set forth below:

(c) *Narcotic drugs containing non-narcotic active medicinal ingredients.* Any compound, mixture, or preparation containing any of the following narcotic drugs, or their salts calculated as the free anhydrous base or alkaloid, in limited quantities as set forth below, which shall include one or more non-narcotic active medicinal ingredients in sufficient proportion to confer upon the compound, mixture, or preparation valuable medicinal qualities other than those possessed by narcotic drugs alone:

(1) Not more than 200 milligrams of codeine per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams.

(2) Not more than 100 milligrams of dihydrocodeine per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams.

(3) Not more than 100 milligrams of ethylmorphine per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams.

(4) Not more than 2.5 milligrams of diphenoxylate and not less than 25 micrograms of atropine sulfate per dosage unit.

(5) Not more than 100 milligrams of opium per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams.

(6) Not more than 0.5 milligram of difenoxin and not less than 25 micrograms of atropine sulfate per dosage unit.


