I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education and Public Libraries convened a public hearing on November 22, 2011 at 8:30 a.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 262-31 (COR) - "An act amend § 15A402 of Article 4A of Chapter 15 of Title 17 and § 15201 of Article 2 of Chapter 15 Guam Code Annotated relative to increasing the Professional and Technical Award amount for medical students."

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D. convened the public hearing to order at 8:30 a.m. and announced the agenda of the public hearing. Bill No. 262-31 (COR) was announced as one of the items on the agenda to be heard by the Committee.

- **Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D.** read Vice Speaker Cruz's statement of the legislation. The Vice Speaker's written statement is appended to the committee report

There being no individuals present to testify on the legislation, Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. concluded the hearing for Bill No. 262-31 (COR).

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Education and Public Libraries finds that Bill No. 262-31 would increase the Professional and Technical Award amount from Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) to Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000), this increase will help relieve some of the financial burden placed on our students and families. Additionally, the original measure expanded the eligibility residency requirement to receive the Professional and Technical Award to individuals who have graduated from a Guam high school after at least three years of attendance, or attended an elementary or middle school. However, the Committee recommends deleting the word “continuous” to broaden the existing pool of applicants to be eligible to receive the Professional and Technical Award. The Committee incorporated the recommendation made by Vice Speaker B.J.F. Cruz to allow students attending a foreign medical school to benefit from the Professional and Technical Award. The Committee recommends utilizing the language in section 11101 of 25 GAR which deals with the requirement for applicants who possess a medical degree from a non U.S. medical school to practice on Guam

Amendments to the language of the introduced bill are indicated by double underlines or double strikeouts in the substitute version of Bill No. 262-31 (COR) included in this report.

The Committee on Education and Public Libraries which was referred Bill No. 262-31 (COR), hereby submits these findings to *I Mina' Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guahan* and reports out Substitute Bill No. 262-31 (COR), with the recommendation TO REPORT OUT ONLY.

Dear Speaker Won Pat,

Buenas yan Hafa Adai. I want to thank you for allowing me to provide a brief statement on Bill 262-31 (COR) - AN ACT AMEND § 15A402 OF ARTICLE 4A OF CHAPTER 15 OF TITLE 17 AND § 15201 OF ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER 15 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO INCREASING THE PROFESSIONAL AND TECHNICAL AWARD AMOUNT FOR MEDICAL STUDENTS.

Madame Chair prior to the introduction of bill 262, I received several e-mails from present and former students of Guam, each intending to earn a medical degree but requiring a little more help to accomplish that goal. Under present law, the maximum "Pro-Tech" award for a student in medical school is \$20,000 annually. This, in spite of the fact, that medical school tuition has inflated by more than 133% between 1990 and 2010.

Though our government's existing financial position demands that we be more efficient with every tax dollar, we cannot ignore the value of investing in qualified medical physicians rooted in Guam. To this end, bill 262 increases the maximum award for medical school students under Pro-Tech by \$15,000 to a total of \$35,000 annually. While this change, in many instances, will not defray the total cost of tuition, it will substantially limit the financial burden on our students and their families.

The measure also expands the existing residency requirement contained within the present statute; allowing those who have graduated from a Guam high school after at least three years of attendance, or attended elementary or middle school on Guam to receive the Pro-Tech award if they are otherwise eligible.

At the urging of several individuals presently away at medical school in equivalent non-US institutions, I respectfully ask this committee to consider an additional amendment which would allow for them and those like them to receive the benefits of this program.

By increasing the Pro-Tech award amount relative to medical school and expanding the existing residency requirement to those students who have a firm connection to Guam, we renew our commitment to the goals intended by this program. We will increase treatment options for our sick, bring our best and brightest home, and inspire a new generation of local physicians.

Full Medical Licensure

§11101. Requirements for full medical licensure (all candidates) in the Territory of Guam. The Guam Board of Medical Examiners (Board) shall insure that all applicants meet the Medical Licensure Requirements:

(a) All applicants on Guam shall possess the degree of Doctor of Medicine from a medical college or school located in foreign medical schools as listed in the World Health Organization (WHO) listing of medical schools, which was approved by the Board of Medical Examiners or the Council on Medical Education and hospitals of the American Medical Association (or by a private non-profit accrediting body approved by the Board) at the time the degree was conferred. No person who graduated from a medical school which was not so approved at the time of graduation shall be examined for licensure or be licensed in Guam based on credentials or documentation from that school nor shall that person be licensed by endorsement or reciprocity.

(b) The applicant shall have successfully completed the educational requirements necessary to become American board certified, or hold current American Board certification, in one of the specialties recognized by the American Board of Medical Specialties. These educational requirements shall be those in effect by the American Specialties Board at the time the applicant completed his post graduate training. Such educational requirements shall have been successfully completed in an institution in the
