COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education and Public Libraries convened a public hearing on November 22, 2011 at 8:30 a.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 315-31 (COR) - An act to add a new Chapter 14 to Division 2 of Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, to require the Guam Department of Education to continually update a 10-year capital improvement project plan and to identify funding sources for the projects; and, citing this act as the "Teaching and Learning Communities Act."

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D. convened the public hearing to order at 2:00 p.m., and announced the agenda of the public hearing. Bill No. 315-31 (COR) was announced as one of the items on the agenda to be heard by the Committee.

- Senator Aline Yamashita, Ph.D. stated that Bill No. 315 provides the Department of Education and the Board of Education a tool to review its facility and structural needs on a continual basis, and it gives them time to plan and identify resources. She added that the last DOE 10-year capitol improvement plan has expired. Putting the requirement for a updated 10 year CIP into statute will ensure continuity despite changes in DOE leadership or board of education. The CIP will allow the community to plan for needs and will be subject to the approval of the Board of Education.

- Mr. Barry Mead testified in support of the legislation, but recommended changes to the bill. His written testimony is appended to the committee report

There being no individuals present to testify on the legislation, Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. concluded the hearing for Bill No. 315-31 (COR).

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

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TESTIMONY ON BILL 315-31 BARRY L. MEAD, GEB MEMBER

Good Afternoon, my name is Barry Mead and I a member of the Guam Education Board.

I am here today to speak somewhat in favor of Bill 315-31 in so much that there is a need for an ongoing Capital Improvement Plan, though I am not sure that providing for such a plan is necessary or best served in Public Law.

It would seem that such a requirement would more fit into a Policy of the Guam Education Board, and as well serve better were it to be an Institutional Strategic Master Plan that encompassed not only the area of Capital Improvement but all areas of the operation of the Guam Department of Education including but not limited to those provisions found in §14104 #1 of the bill.

This Strategic plan would take into account curriculum, changes to curriculum and the effect curriculum has on classroom needs, and staffing. It would identify anticipated student population growth, resulting in identifying the need for new schools and where those buildings would need to be located as well as increases in the need for textbooks and staff. It would also establish a plan with how to as a Department deal with the current over crowding issues that GDOE now faces.

In addition the plan could include the schedule for all school accreditation visits and the expense of those visits. It would also take into account current grants and the need for renewal of the grants and the need for additional grants.

§14104 #2a calls for the plan to be updated annually and determine if revisions are required, I believe this section should also state that revisions shall be made as determined. In 2b there is a call for the Superintendent and Board to implement a mid-range planning process every 5 years and begin the planning phase for the subsequent ten-year plan to begin in the last year of the current plan. It would seem that with an annual review of the plan, and with revisions made as needed the need for the mid-range planning process would be moot. In addition where in #4 of the section(Reporting) the bill calls for the transmission of the CIP plan to I Maga Lahen Guahan and I Liheslaturan Guahan a copy of each 10 year CIP a year prior to the implementation, as well as updates. This provision would be hard pressed to be met as the time lines set forth in #2 (Review process) calls for the planning phase for the next 10 year plan to begin at the same time it is due to the above mention entities.

As with any plan there needs to be identified objectives, which allow for attainable goals along the way to insure the success of the plan. As well, any Policy or Legislation mandating such a plan needs to have defined objectives that allow for the outlining and planning of each goal to insure the success of the plan.

I would ask that before this committee reports this bill to the entire legislative body that meetings be held between the Committee, the Guam Education Board and the Office of the Governor to establish how best to join this bill with the current GDOE District Action Plan and to determine if whether a Public Law or Board Policy would best serve what I believe is the intended purpose of this bill.
