COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 425-31 (COR) was introduced on February 17, 2012 by Senator Adolpho B. Palacios, Sr., and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs on February 22, 2012.

The Committee on Public Works, Transportation, Utilities and Veterans Affairs convened a public hearing on Bill 425-31 (COR) on March 29, 2012 at 9:05 am in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on the measure.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on March 22, 2012 (5-Day Notice), and again on March 27, 2012 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:05 am.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chair Ada: Offers Senator Palacios opportunity to provide overview of bill.

Senator Palacios: Provides overview of bill, stating that Bill 425 came about after a recommendation and meeting with the Director of the Department of Public Works (DPW). The common occurrence of non-structured encroachment of containers or abandoned vehicles left on the easement or government property was raised. An amendment was proposed to address fines but also to amend the definition of "encroachment." As it is now, "encroachment" refers only to a structure. States that the law is forty-three (43) years old, and that the daily fine is \$10. A layer of fines is proposed in this bill, and Public Works is present to describe what it is they experience with regard to encroachment.

Mr. Carl Dominguez: Mr. Dominguez is the Deputy Director of DPW. States that DPW is in support of bill. Provides examples of encroachments on Government rights-of-way—private and commercial trash bins, abandoned vehicles, metal/junk. Believes that \$10/day fine after a five-day notice is a weak incentive to get violator to comply. States that finding the violation, issuing notice of violation, following up with violator, and so forth is costly. The law allows for DPW to remove the encroachment and charge the violator for the cost of removal. The cost is so minimal, stating that for some it might even be worth it to continue paying \$10/day, or even \$300/month.

Offers changes in language of bill: 1) The language "not to exceed" be deleted from the section on fines, Section 53108. States that the fines should not vary for second or third offense; 2) Monies collected be deposited to a DPW Highway Encroachment Fund, to be used for purchasing equipment and supplies, as well as, in some cases, to contract land surveyors to mark rights-of-way areas. DPW depends on Department of Land Management 100% to assist in land surveying and relocation of points to establish rights-of-way boundaries. Equipment and supplies would include cameras, measuring equipment, safety vests, and possibly another vehicle, since DPW has only vehicle (10-year old pick-up truck) for inspectors; and, 3) Definition of "encroachment" be revised to include, "refuse, trash, vehicles" or any "other item or" structure or utility infrastructure not particularly mentioned, which is placed in, under or over any portion of a highway. Thanks the Senators. And states that Director Brown has joined them.

Atty. Fred Horecky: Atty. Horecky states that the Guam Association of Realtors (GAR) is in support of legislation. Acknowledges that it is time to revise fines and penalties. Notes similar recommended changes including the definition of encroachment, whether what is included needs to be further revised. States that initially, GAR had concerns with the penalty section, but agrees that removing the "not to exceed" language does make it clearer, and less burdensome administratively. States GAR's support of the bill with the changes already recommended.

Joanne Brown, Director, Department of Public Works (written testimony attached)
DPW agrees with the intent and spirit of Bill 425-31, and outlines the following concerns: 1) The language "not to exceed" be stricken from Section 53108 so as to ensure that fine for the second and third offense is not at the discretion of DPW, and that the same fine be applicable to all persons; 2) Broaden the definition of encroachment to include non-structures that have become encroachments, including "refuse, trash, vehicles" or any "other item or" structure or utility infrastructure not particularly mentioned, which is placed in, under or over any portion of a highway.

Monte Mafnas, Director, Department of Land Management (*written testimony attached*) DOLM supports intent of Bill 425-31. Recommends that bill should contain direction and intent regarding the use & deposit of encroachment violation fines. Includes language, "Any funds collected under §53108 shall be deposited in the Highway Territorial Fund as specified in §53105."

Question & Answer

Senator Palacios: Agrees with the recommendation to remove language "not to exceed." Asks if amount is reasonable, however, at \$100/day for first offense, and so forth.

Mr. Dominguez: Responds that the increase from \$10/day to \$100/day is an incentive for the violator to comply. Agrees.

Senator Palacios: Regarding recommendation to broaden definition of encroachment, asks for clarification of DPW's authority to remove non-structures as encroachments, if indeed this is the only section of law that allows DPW to remove such non-structures.

Mr. Dominguez: States that he is unaware.

Senator Palacios: Agrees that broadening definition is a way to ensure that non-structures are also included as encroachment. Asks if there is a simpler way to issue citations, for first offenses, and so forth, and to collect fines.

Mr. Dominguez: States that a Notice of Violation (NOV) is issued, and then fines accrue five days after NOV is issued and encroachment has not been moved. States that since he has been at DPW, they have not collected fines for such encroachments. States however that NOV would be issued, then possibly DPW would go through the Small Claims Court process.

Director Brown: Provides example of encroachments in the road in Dededo, wherein school buses are unable to pick up students from bus shelters because roads are blocked. DPW has limited ability to address encroachments, thus recommends that language be amended to allow DPW the ability to issue written citations directly, rather than going through the lengthy process of Small Claims Court. Provides another example of shipping containers that are adjacent to people's property, oftentimes becoming a road hazard and blocking off access to roads. Reiterates Mr. Dominguez's earlier point of fines being deposited back into encroachment division to support operations, rather than into the General Fund.

Senator Palacios: Asks DPW to submit language regarding citation process.

Director Brown: Responds that they will provide language.

Senator Palacios: Requests for a mark-up after public hearing.

Senator pangelinan: Asks if encroachment can refer to government property more generally and not just on highways.

Director Brown: States that that could be possible, but DPW has not had the ability to do this or effectively enforce. Agrees that if encroachment is clearly on public easement then they will need mechanisms in place to carry out citations.

Senator Yamashita: Asks about encroachments on sidewalks, for example, poles, that obstruct the way for walkers, bikers, and people on wheelchairs.

Director Brown: Responds that she doesn't disagree with comment. Acknowledges that this is a much bigger issue that has to do with accessibility, and how this will be funded. Refers to big

power poles on sidewalks near the Micronesia Mall, stating that this is a significant issue to deal with. But in the meantime, DPW hopes to address those things that can be moved.

Chair Ada: There are no further questions. Bill 425-31 has been duly heard.

The public hearing was adjourned at 10:35 am.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Public Works, Utilities, Transportation, and Veterans Affairs has substituted Bill 425-31 (COR) with the following significant changes:

- On page 1, lines 15 and 16, "per day" was added after the amounts of the fines. This addition does not change the intent of the original language, as it was already implied by an earlier portion of the same sentence; nevertheless, the new language was added in order to ensure that there is no misinterpretation of the fine amount in the future.
- On page 2, line 9, the section of GCA being amended was clarified as §53101(d) of Title 5.
- Expands definition of Encroachment to include refuse, trash and vehicles
- Deletes language regarding limits on the amount violators are fined per offense
- Requires all encroachment fines be deposited into the Territorial Highway Fund
- Authorizes the DPW Director to use collected revenues to purchase equipment and supplies, and to procure the services required to enforce public compliance with applicable highway care and maintenance laws.



Relative to Daily Fines for Encroachment Violations

Hafa Adai Sen. Palacios:

Thank you for giving the Department of Public Works (DPW) an opportunity to review and submit this testimony on Bill No. 425-31, *An Act to Amend to §53108 of 5 GCA, Relative to Daily Fines for Encroachment Violations*.

DPW agrees with the intent and spirit of Bill 425-31 to amend 5 G.C.A. Section 53108 so as to update and increase the amount of the daily fine for highway encroachments. Much has changed in the 43 years since the original enactment of Section 53108, including the standards for constructing and maintaining today's roads and highways. The importance of being able to travel safely on Guam's roads cannot be overstressed.

In order to clarify the good intent of Bill 425-31, DPW respectfully suggests that the language of the amendment to Section 53108 be modified so as to make the various amounts of the fine clearer. Specifically, the use of the phrase "not to exceed" in the proposed language appears to grant DPW the discretion to vary the amount of the fine for a second or third offense. In honest fairness, however, the same amount of fine should be applicable to all persons. For example, as written, it is possible that a second offense violator could receive a \$100 fine, while another might receive a \$500 fine for the same type of encroachment violation.

In order to remedy this, DPW suggests that the "not to exceed" language contained in Section 53108 be stricken out as indicated below:

§ 53108. Removal by Department. The Department may remove any encroachment on the failure of the owner to comply with the notice provided for in this Chapter. The owner shall be liable for all expenses of such removal and, in addition thereto, the sum of shall pay a fine of One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$100.00) for the first (1st) offense, and not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the second (2nd) offense, and not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the third (3rd) and subsequent offenses for each day such encroachment remains after the expiration of five (5) days from the service of the notice.

The bill is silent on where the monies collected from the fines are deposited. The DPW recommends verbiage be added to this bill which creates a DPW Highway Encroachment Fund which will be used by DPW to purchase equipment and supplies that will be used by its Highway Encroachment section to continually improve the care and protection of our highways.

Finally, DPW also suggests that the opportunity be taken at this time to broaden the definition of encroachment as stated in 5 G.C.A. Section 53101(d) to include anything that does not belong in the right-of-way. As Section 53101(d) is presently written, a highway "encroachment" only includes structures such as poles, fences, buildings, etcetera. However, there have been many instances were non-structures can and have become encroachments. Some examples of non-structures that DPW has found encroaching in the right-of-way include items such as trash, scrap metals, and abandoned vehicles.


In order to correct this, DPW requests that *i Liheslaturan* consider amending the definition of Section 53101(d) to add non-structures as encroachments. A suggested amendment is as follows:

§ 53101. Definitions.

JOHN HOUSE

(d) Encroachment means any tower, pole, poleline, pipe, pipeline, fence, billboard, stand or building, <u>refuse, trash, vehicles</u>, or any <u>other item or</u> structure or utility infrastructure <u>not</u> particularly mentioned, which is placed in, under or over any portion of a highway.

1/ Currently, highway encroachment fees are at \$10 for each day in which such encroachment remains after the expiration of five days from the initial service of notice, per §53109, Chapter 53 of 5 GCA. The AS400 record reflects a collection of \$17,955 (at 1,795.5 days) for Highway Encroachment Fees; \$850,556.28 (at 85,055.63 days) for Bond Highway Encroachment; and \$18,300 (at 1,830 days) for Bond Political Signs; or a combined total of \$886,811.28 for the period ending September 30, 2011. This represents about 88,681 days at \$10 per day. Should the proposed increase in fines go into effect, just based on \$100 per day for the first (1st) offense, an estimated \$179,550 for Highway Encroachment Fees; \$8,505,563 for Bond Highway Encroachment; and \$183,000 for Bond Political Signs, or a combined total of \$8,868,113 would be collected. Information on the number served notice for second (2nd) offense, third (3rd) offense, or higher are not available at this time, for which specified fines are included the proposed legislation (i.e. not to exceed \$500 per day for 2nd offense, and not to exceed \$1,000 per day for 3rd offense and subsequent offenses).




