COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 131-32 (COR) was introduced on May 31, 2013 by Senator T.C. Ada and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation on June 3, 2013.

The Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation convened a Public Hearing on Bill 131-32 (COR) on October 9, 2013 at 3:00pm in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on the measure.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on October 2, 2013 (5-Day Notice), and again on October 7, 2013 (48-Hour Notice).

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 3:22 pm.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada opens by introducing the Bill. He states that the law currently gives the authority to establish speed limits to the Chief of Police and the Bill proposes to give that authority to the Department of Public Works Director.

Mr. Carl Dominguez

Director, Department of Public Works

Oral and Written Testimony (see attached)

Director Dominguez reads his written testimony. He states the department of Public Works is in support of the Bill. He further states, "*While we acknowledge and commend the Guam Police Department and their efforts in this area, we believe that the Department of Public Works is the most appropriate Government Agency to set speed limits based on our roadway design capacities and throughput requirements...*" He states in closing that he urges the members to positively consider and pass the bill into law.

Mayor Jesse Gogue

Mayor, Village of Ordot/Chalan Pago

Oral Testimony

Mayor Gogue states that he is not trying to make the processes that DPW oversees bureaucratic, however there needs to be inclusion to allow the mayor to have input and more importantly concurrence on when a speed limit needs to be changed. He further states that as Director Dominguez states, DPW has oversight over routed roads, but the mayors have oversight over secondary and tertiary roads. He continues by stating that allowing DPW to change the limits changes the roles mayors should be playing in the speed limits of the secondary and tertiary roads. He further states the Bill needs to recognize the role that mayors have over these roads and more importantly the safety issues that would result should a speed limit change occur on a road in their oversight.

Discussion, Question and Answer

Director Dominguez asks if the mayor's council would object to the DPW having control of the speed limits for the routed roads, that is soul discretion on the routed roads as opposed to the secondary and tertiary roads?

Mayor Gogue responds that when the public hearing was scheduled, it was between regular meetings and he could not address with the body as a whole. He further states that Director Dominguez would probably get nineteen different answers to that question. He states that for himself, he would want concurrence with any change because he and his staff, and that of the mayors are the ones who drive those roads everyday. He closes by stating that he tracks all the accidents that occur on the roads in his district. He cites the example of recent construction of a Supermarket and Bank in Mangilao, and the area becoming a place prone to accidents and asks Director Dominguez whether or not it would get to a point where a form of traffic control would be placed at that intersection.

Chairperson Ada states that the point Mayor Gogue raised is certainly common sense and that there has to be that dialogue, but he questions what the regulations or process would be to change a speed limit. He further states that long standing speed limits being changed would certainly need a dialogue with the community and closes by thanking the mayor for making that point. He adds the Bill will see further work to address this issue.

Senator Morrison asks what the current process is for changing a speed limit?

Director Dominguez states that having been at DPW for not quite three years, the only speed limit change he recalls is from the Port Authority to passed Polaris Main Gate from 45mph to 35mph. He further states he recalls that it was close to the time a cyclist was killed in the South bound lane.

Mayor Gogue interjects that his recollection is the speed limit was changed prior to the accident and that it was a unilateral decision where for whatever reason the Chief of Police decided that the speed limit needed to be brought down. He further states that he does not think the mayor's

office or the DPW was consulted about that change. He adds that when you take a look at the law, there is no governance of the process of changing speed limits and by all rights the Chief of Police can make a decision and simply order the DPW to change the signage (Director Dominguez adds: “that’s right”). He closes by stating that there is no process to involve or notify the public of the process and the changes change from leader to leader, and personality to personality. Before closing, he adds that he would like to see some sort of concurrence for the posting and changing of speed limits.

Director Dominguez states he did some research in the fifty states. He states that in most of the fifty states, speed limits fall under their departments of transportation. He further states the closest thing to a department of transportation on Guam is the DPW. He states that he recently experienced in San Diego, a similar road to Marine Drive, with good distance between traffic signals that the speed limit was 50mph. He further states he believes that engineers set those limits with safety as paramount and he found it very interesting that rural roads, one lane in each direction with no median were also 50mph.

Chairperson Ada asks if there are more questions and with none adjourns the public hearing at 4:45pm.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

On October 9, 2013, the Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation held a public hearing on Bill 131-32 “An Act to amend Subsection (f) and add a new subsection (g) to §to 3301 of Chapter 3 of Title 16, relative to establishing speed limits.” Authored by Senator Tom Ada.

- The intent of Bill 131-32 is to transfer the authority to set speed limits on Guam’s roads from the Chief of Police to the Director of the Department of Public Works. This is aligning Guam with the standards used elsewhere where the branch responsible for designing and constructing roadways sets the limits at which motorists can safely operate their vehicles on such roadways.
- This change is due in large part to the immense amount of planning the Department of Public Works puts into the design and upgrading of the island’s roadways. The engineers at the Department consider motorist safety as a significant factor when designing and constructing roadways, therefore the DPW is in the best position to determine the appropriate and safe speed limit that motorists can operate their vehicles on such roadways.

Following input provided during the Public Hearing on Bill 131-32 by Mayor Jesse Gogue (Ordot / Chalan Pago), Language was added to Section 3 (three) allowing Mayors to submit comments to the Director of the DPW for any planned speed limit changes on secondary roads in their districts. In addition, the language to describe roadways was changed from “numbered highways and village streets,” to “primary and secondary roadways as defined in...” to remain

consistent with the definition of roadways in the Guam Code. In addition to minor formative and grammar edits, the following substantive changes were made:


- Line 7, Page 2 the following language as deleted: “numbered highways and village streets”
- Line 7, Page 2 the following language replaced the deleted language: “primary and secondary roadways as defined in Chapter 5 of this Title. For any change to a secondary roadway, the Director of the Department of Public Works shall request the input of the Mayor(s) of the municipality or village where the secondary roadway affected by the proposed speed limit change is located. The Mayor(s) may provide a response to the Director of the Department of Public Works within ten (10) calendar days from the date of receipt of the request for input. The Director of the Department of Public Works shall keep on record, copies of all submitted requests for input and all responses to such requests.”

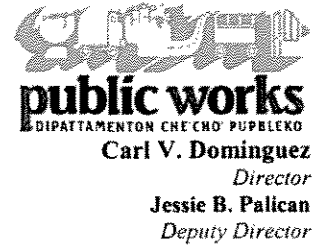

The Department of Public Works is in support of Bill No. 131-32. This Bill seeks to grant the DPW the authority to establish and post speed limits on our federal and local roadways.

As you are well aware, the DPW in partnership with the Federal Highway Administration, has invested millions of dollars on improvements to our federally routed roads. These roads are carefully engineered to maximize the mobility and safety of our motorists and pedestrians. Once again, and in closing, let me state for the record that the DPW stands in support of this Bill and urges the members of the 32nd Guam Legislature to positively consider and enact it into law.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

1 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the
2 Department of Public Works is responsible for the design and construction of the island's
3 roadways, and should therefore be responsible for establishing and posting speed limits
4 that promote safety for vehicles, bicyclist and pedestrians that traverse the island's
5 roadways.

6 **Section 2. Subsection (f) of §3301, Chapter 3, Title 16 GCA is hereby *amended* to**
7 **read:**

8 (f) The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to designate as may be reasonably
9 necessary, and on a ~~permanent~~, temporary or intermittent basis, certain areas as limited
10 speed areas and to mark such areas with appropriate warning signs. No vehicle shall be
11 operated in such areas in excess of the maximum speeds as may be indicated by such
12 signs.

13 **Section 3. A subsection (g) is hereby *added* to §3301 of Chapter 3, Title 16 Guam**
14 **Code Annotated to read:**

1 (g) The Director of the Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to
2 establish and post permanent speed limits on Guam's numbered highways and village
3 streets.

4 **Section 3. Severability.** *If any provision of this Law or its application to any*
5 *person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall*
6 *not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect*
7 *without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this*
8 *Law are severable.*
