The Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Hagåtña Restoration & Redevelopment Authority convened a public hearing on Bill No. 159-32 (COR) on Wednesday, August 7, 2013 at 2:00 PM at the Legislature's Public Hearing Room in Hagåtña.

II. INTRODUCTION, SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The Public Hearing was Called-to-Order at 2:05 p .m.

Public Hearing Bill 157/159- August 7, 2013

Senator Barnes: This session is called it's 12:05...I mean 2:05 (laughs) back in PI time, it's 2:05 in the afternoon, and I'd like to thank my colleagues for joining me. My vice chair, the honorable Vice Speaker BJ Cruz, thank you. To his right is Senator Tommy Morrison. And to my left thank you for being here today Senator Brant McCreadie. We are here to hear testimony on two bills Bill 156-32 COR and Bills 159-32 COR. I'll just go ahead and mention the bills right now. Bill 156-32 COR is an act to create the Guam trademark commission for the development of a

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cultural trademark statute for the protection and the preservation of Guam's cultural arts. Its sponsors were Speaker Judith Won Pat, Vice Speaker Cruz, myself, Sen. Chris Duenas, and others. Bill 159-32 is an act to amend Subsection 2 of Ch. 1 and to add a new section 19 to Ch. 10 both public laws 31-233 from G Appropriations Act of 2013 making an appropriation from TAS to GVB for Humatak Community Foundation Inc. also known as HCF for the purpose of developing the Humatak Heritage Village Museum. It was sponsored by Senator Tommy Morrison, VSp Cruz, and myself. Ladies and gentlemen, I'm going to be doing some switching on the agenda. Since we have a lot of folks and the good mayor from Humatak who have joined us and the directors from the agencies, I'm going to switch the bills if it's okay with my colleagues Vice Speaker thank you. We'll go ahead and hear testimony on Bill 159-32. I do have to testify from the mayor's office Mayor Quinta, also Joe Quinata from the HHF Board of Directors, we also have Mr. Monte mesa who signed up first, Mr. Gofigan, Jess Gofigan, and Auntie Chilang Morrison, former Mayor of Humatak. You're more than welcome to come to the table. Mr. Mesa. Before you guys speak I'll like to have my good colleague Senator Morrison who is from Humatak and author of the legislation go ahead and speak briefly and share the intent and we'll proceed.

Senator Morrison: Thank you madame chair, I want to thank you and your staff for bring the Humatak com foundation, the Umatac Mayor's Office, and GVB in this process, our community partners for moving this legislation forward. I know Madame chair you already pointed out the title or the intent of this bill and is relative to making an appropriation to GVB for the Humatak community foundation to develop the Humatac Heritage Museum. I'm just glad the legislature can be involved in this process to assist along with the foundation, to push this idea forward. I know this idea was founded many years, with the community coming together and one of it was to establish the Humatak heritage foundation. And of course there is, Mr. Quinata will point to the missions over there. The big issue is the process, and throughout the years, the mayor has been putting on a display, the exhibition has been expanding and it's great to not only see our community has been involved and value where they came from and understand who they are. Importantly to continue the discovery day event. So, and what also has been showcased is our visitors who come to Humatak have participated in this process and we see the development in small increments. Now the legislature with your help Madame chair and the community has taken this idea to help in the mission to develop this heritage museum and expanding it daily to showcasing daily not only to our visitors but to enrich our children to help them understand who they are and they can value their community much more. And take care of it much more. I like to mention we had a good hearing from the GVB, and one of their many goals to enhance the destinations on Guam. One thing that was pointed out was that we need to invest more in our culture. That's great to hear but I also want to point out to an idea I didn't

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mention yesterday, but we should also look into more investment in our history. I see progress in that area, but history and culture work hand in hand. To see this effort to showcase not just Humatak, but also the southern end of the island brings about a valued treasure in the southern end, an important history to the island, to that Madame Chair thank you for assisting in this process. I look forward to hearing the testimony by our community. Thank you.

Senator Barnes: Saina ma'ase senator Morrison. Before we start with the panel members, I want to recognize couple of the board of directors. Ms. Salas and Mr. Gofigan, you're more than welcome to sign up and come up and speak some of your remarks in support of this bill. I can, there's four gentlemen but one beautiful row, if you don't mind Mayor, the lady in the table, former Mayor Morrison.

Cecilia Morrison: Thank you very much Madame chair. My name is Ceceila F. Q. Morrison, former Mayor of Umatac, and I'm here to testify on Bill 159-32. Good afternoon thank you Senator Morrison for introducing this bill and Chair Tina Barnes and Vice chair BJ Cruz, and other co-sponsors. Several things come to mind preparing this testimony. One of these was bringing back painful memories of the recent closure of F.Q. Sanchez Elementary School. That fact has risen on every one in our village. I'm sorry. I remember thinking one element, our school that supports the wellbeing of our people and community development in our community is gone forever. One question is how our villages, our family, relatives, and friends, will help our future offspring, with all the basic support, many communities still run into trouble so return home with heavy hearts. By contrast to the above episode and experience, I'm uplifted today and can express a glimmer of hopefulness of the aspirations to the past leaders of our villages. Hopefully some of their visions addressed can be passed in Bill 159. I'm not privy to the intricacies to the Humatak Community Foundation or it's purposes in the development of the HHM, for certain I can say we support in support of the Umatac Mayor's Office, Mr. Quinata. Passage of this bill would be great sort. Our village is one of the most historic villages and I echo the statements of the sponsors of bill 159-32. It's important to safeguard and perpetuate the natural and cultural resources of Umatac. The appropriation of \$50,000 is a good start, and I'm in full support of bill 159-32, and I hope you will succeed in getting this bill passed. Si yu'os ma'ase.

Senator Barnes: Buen pubetsu Auntie Chilang, thank you very much for presenting your testimony and support this afternoon. Mayor Quinata...

Mayor Quinata: Thank you sen tom Morrison. This bill we spoke about, the museum. We've been talking about it. Senator B.J. Cruz, Chair, Senator Tina Barnes, Senator Brant McCreadie

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and all senators who support this bill. I've been working with the foundation to try and do something with that school because nothing has been done. The senator has been talking with me. I've been here working to making something happen. I want to thank Sen. Morrison for giving me this opportunity and Senator Barnes for calling me up. I know there's a lot of comments about the school like the former Mayor was talking about. People are still mad. We have to move on, but we have to get that school repaired and build the museum. So we know FQ Sanchez is not just to stay there. We need to get moving. I'm ready to work with the foundation. Thank you. I got a list of people. Who support.

Senator Barnes: Thank you. Mr. Quinata.

Mr. Quinata: Thank you chair, senators. Thank you for giving us the opportunity for being here. My name is Joe Quinata, chairman HHF. I've prepared a written testimony and I will like to read it to you. The HCF submits this testimony in support of Bill 159-32. The museum is the component of the component mission HHC, a division of HHF, in partnership with the Mayor's office. With your support, the museum will be located in the FQ Sanchez facilities and will be managed by the HCF and community volunteers. The HCF is a community based non-profit public corporation created in September 2011 with a three prong mission: heritage, education, and enterprise, all-encompassing our land, waters, and tradition. In November 2011 our first initiative was to develop Humatak by the sea exhibition. It was important to teach and learn about our people and our heritage. It is currently at the CAHA gallery until August 2013. It can be viewed at www.humatak.org. It is only the introduction to the planned Humatak Heritage Museum. The goals is to develop a museum showcase the people and history of Humatak in its natural and cultural environments, to establish positive youth development activities that would enhance traditional and cultural preservation and conservation of natural resources. And also to help our youth gain teamwork, leadership and employment skills. Third, to work with the community and partners to rehabilitate the natural and cultural resources of Humatak. Fourth, develop and promote a strong preservation ethics in the village through business enterprise driven by natural and cultural resources. Our outcomes are to develop a static and virtual village museum showcasing the people and history of the village of Humatak and establishment of a youth development program focus on preservation and conservation of cultural and natural resources of the village. Since our inception, we have been working on a year to year plan with initiatives with volunteer based management successfully. We intend to continue our volunteer concepts until we develop a long range plan to sustain our mission. We are working with university graduate students to assist in a 5 year development plan for the Humatak community foundation and a long range plan to sustain our natural resources. We have been engaging with our people and have developed initiatives for our

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youth and conservation practices. We are able to sustain our initiatives with our local, regional, and national partner associations and continue to develop our enterprise strategies to address the future sustainability of our initiatives. We are grateful and appreciate your efforts to support our mission. Dankolo na si yu'os ma'ase for recognizing the importance of our mission for our people and island.

Senator Barnes: Mr. Gofigan.

Mr. Gofigan: My name is Jesse Gofigan, retired US Army for 20 years. I am the Administrative Assistant for the Umatac Mayor's office. I'm confident the HCF with the leadership of Joe Quinata can take care of whatever foundation we start in Umatac. I hope we improve our community with the museum at FQ Sanchez. Thank you Senator Morrison for the \$50,000 to start the museum. Our mission to make sure the village is clean and that's how we show our visitors what beautiful clean village. We'll continue to do that. The motivation, dedication, and determination of our maintenance people down there. We always take care of our village to showcase visitors from all over the world to show how beautiful village down there. Not only that, we have a lot of sights that are historical, most beautiful area visitors can come down and see the culture in our village. I support Bill 159-32. Thank you.

Senator Barnes: Before we have Mr. Mesa speak, I'd like to recognize the GVB Directory Karl Pangelinan and from CAHA Chairwoman Monica Guzman and Denise Mendiola Herslett. Mr. Mesa.

Mr. Mesa: Thank you Madame chair. I am here in three parts, as GEDA Board member, GVB member, and a private citizen and advocate for our tourism industry development. First, I commend the village of Humatak, for coming together in this venture starting what I hope with the initial funding from GVB from the hotel occupancy tax that it is a wise investment from my perspective as a business approach, but again getting the people of Guam to embrace our culture, history, and display it in a way everybody will be proud of. I'm confident with the HCF will be able to execute this. I see this as they mention a 5 year strategy. It fits in what they are doing to market Guam but in association that we are continuing to develop and support by GVB funds. Example is the Pa'a TaoTao Tano Group that we support, cultural performance group, that we see if it is not already participating, but it will enhance the attraction in Umatac. Like it was in the 70s and 80s was an attraction for a lot of our Japanese tourists where 80% of them would go on a southern island tour. Today, we only have tours going there 3 times a week. I ask why the tour groups don't do it like in the 70s and 80's. They say there's a lot of return visitors, but there needs to be attractions and enhanced and improved attractions. This is

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a demonstration of that initiative. I commend the Humatak community to come up with this idea to turn a not popular event and turning it into a positive and enhancing our visitor attraction as well. One thing I see is to one day brings not just plane loads, but ship loads. I can see a cruise ship coming into Umatac Bay. I support this bill; these are building blocks to enhance the attractions and cultural elements for attractions in the southern area. The funding source is the right source.

Senator Barnes: Thank you Mr. Mesa. I would like to ask this panel we have other speakers, I call several of them up. Mr. Quinata?

Mr. Quinata: I would like to acknowledge one of our grad students helping us in our long range plan, I'd like to introduce Marvin Manibusan, I would also like to provide you a token of the potential of Humatak. Our kids did some handmade bracelets, they wanted to participate in a learning exchange in Pohnpei, and this is what they made. This is the potential of the enterprise down in Umatac. They signed on to the bracelets they made (bracelets passed to panel).

Senator Barnes: For the listening audience, the note says Umatac by the sea, made by youth of Umatac Coral Reef Ambassadors. On the back it says the name of who made the bracelet. Thank you. I would like to recognize Dr. Michael Lujan Bevaqua and GVB Gen. Manager Karl Pangelinan. For the record, an invitation was sent to the Chamorro Affairs President. Dr. Lujan.

Mr. Pangelinan: Si yu'os ma'ase. I apologize for the testimony we had addressed it with the acting chairman. I just want to paraphrase the key takeaways that GVB supports preserving the intent artifacts for future generations to enjoy and creating attractions on Guam for tourists. This project will go to the need of developing the new attractions, especially in the south where the story of our people is best told. It would also promote economic activity in the south. We have recognize the increase in the TAF projections, we thank Sen. Barnes for recognizing that in previous legislation to adjust the revenue estimates. I also indicated as presented in the budget hearing that the excess TAF revenues; we love to support all of these cultural endeavors on Guam. We prioritize for safety and destination projects in Tumon and on Guam. Si yu'osma'ase.

Senator Barnes: Buen prubetsu. Dr. Bavaqua. Consigue pot fabot.

Dr. Bevaqua: Michael Lujan Bevaqua, Professor at UOG in Chamorro Studies and History. I want to support this bill. Over the summer I had the chance to paint a mural in Umatac. It was nice spending every weekend in Umatac and seeing different from the village. Some would

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paint for a couple hours, some would bring food, some would drive from Agat to bring food. You really saw the potential which for a long time people on Guam don't want to see. You don't want to recognize the strength already there. So Umatac has a very interesting story in Guam's history. For a long time it was thought of as the backwards place on island. It's nice the people want to tell their story. Their story is that in ancient times it was one of the most important places in our history. It was close to the cradle of life. During the Spanish period, it was for the first half of the Spanish period the ships stop there. Chamorros would go to Umatac to sell things. All of that history was forgotten when the port was moved to Apra. It is wonderful for Umatac to take this on. Hopefully more villages take this on. There are so many stories this island has, and unfortunately these stories would never make it in history books. This is a chance for a village to take pride in itself. As a final note, the story of Guam was told by everyone else. We would like to represent our self. I'm very supportive of this. Si yu'osma'ase.

Senator Barnes: Anyone else would like to speak? Before that, for records sake, the submission of Humatac by the Sea will be attached to our journal when we address it on the floor. Vice Speaker.

Vice Speaker Cruz: I'm at loss for words. I want to thank whoever made it. We're fully in support of this and glad GVB said what they said. This will be the first of many; hopefully other villages in the south understand they have the opportunity Dr. Bevaqua to tell their story and being very proud of that fact. With Quidachay roots in Umatac I can be proud too.

Senator Barnes: I want to recognize the presence of my colleague Sen. Tony Ada. Senator Morrison.

Senator Morrison: Thank you madame chair. I want to thank my colleagues. Thank you Mr. Pangelinan, Dr., my mother and former mayor for making sure I grew up in Umatac. Joe, Mayor, Mr. Mesa, and those who gave testimony and other family members here as well and our community partners. I believe it's already a success. It's living and breathing with the past exhibits in taking part in it. The idea and mission is in place, I felt the mission was alive and to see it evolve to where we are at today with the chair's help and the committee, I'm glad the legislature can be a part of this, to help especially in our southern communities. I know there are mentions of the Guam Museum, and I feel it's a complement. I see all the restorations going on. To what Mr. Quinata said to make the village a living and breathing museum. I took that statement to heart as we come out with the Guam Museum next year, we hope as our visitors and our own people come out to witness the physical area of the historical landmarks but the

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people who are telling the stories. It is our hope we can take this model into the other communities who can share their rich cultures and traditions. Thank you for your testimonies.

Mr. Quinata: Again, one of the outcomes of this initiative is to establish a heritage youth. What it is taking what we're doing today? School age children come out every Saturday to teach them our heritage with mentors. Once they get to develop their skills in learning and presenting the historical areas, they are able to present to their visitors. So that's when we look into developing the enterprise after that. How can we harness this and make it a good enterprise that is driven by commercial stuff, but by culture. We intend to stay focused on that. We want to stay focused on that with our local, national, and international partners that have been helping us since last year. There is much more than a static display at FQ Sanchez School. It's taking it to Ft. Soledad, Fouha Rock, just the whole bay, Cetti Bay, and Fouha Bay. There's more to it than just history. There's the kids that's ready. I invite the Senators to come down every Saturday and they're hungry to learn about conservation and heritage. Thank you for recognizing our mission.

Senator McCreadie: Thank you madame chair. When I first moved to Guam, I was so impressed that I stayed and take advantage of college here. I took Chamorro history, which was the most interesting class I took. From where I come from there are many history. But you can learn from it here. With what the Dr. said earlier, sometimes its best told from the people who live here. 20 years is not a long time, but just learning the importance of the history,there's no other importance to learn to where we get to today. Here we are today. I want to say thank you Sen. Morrison for your leadership and forward thinking. I know it costs a lot of money and we will sustain it. Thank you for the bracelets. Could you get me one that fits though? I support this 100%. Senator, Chairwoman. Thank you very much.

Senator Barnes: Thank you sen.McCreadie. Sen. Ada?

Senator Ada: Thank you Madame Chair. I'm just glad that there will be a use to the facility for history Humatak. Where else can you show your village in your own little museum? It will be a showcase the people of Guam will be proud of. You're people are making great strides. Thank you for Mr. Pangelinan for testifying. The Vice Speaker said it best: show off what you're doing to perpetuate our culture to our community. I thank you Mr. Pangelinan for supporting the projects ongoing especially our local culture. I look forward to voting on this in session bill. Hopefully we get a unanimous vote and thank you madame chair and colleague, Sen. Morrison for allowing me to cosponsor the bill.

Some of their dreams about the future of our village can hopefully be addressed with passage of Bill 159-32. I'm not privy of the intricacies of the Humatak Community Foundation (HCF), Inc. or its purpose(s) in the development of the Humatak Heritage Village Museum (HHVM). For certain, I can say that -- with support of and input from the community, in partnership with the Umatac Mayor's Office, passage of this bill would be a great start.

Our village is probably one of the most historic village and I echo the statements of the sponsors of Bill 159-32. I believe it is importance to "safeguard and perpetuate" the natural and cultural resources of Umatac. The appropriation of \$50,000 is a good start.

I am in full in support of Bill 159-32. I hope you will succeed in getting this bill passed.

3. To work with communities and partners to enhance, restore, rehabilitate, and sustainably develop the natural and cultural resources in the village of Humåtak;
4. To develop and promote a strong conservation and preservation ethics in the village of Humåtak, through business enterprises that are driven by our cultural and natural resources.

Our outcomes are to develop a static and virtual village museum showcasing the people and history of the village of Humåtak in its natural and cultural environment; and the establishment of a youth development program focused on the preservation and conservation of cultural and natural resources of the Humåtak village.

Comments on Legislative Bill No. 159-32

This proposed legislation is seeking to amend the Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) adopted revenues from \$25,500,082 to \$26,507,329, an increase of \$1,007,247. Additionally, it proposes to add a New Section 19 to Chapter X of Public Law 31-233.

The proposed increase in the TAF is supported by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research's (BBMR) FY 2013 Special Revenue Tracking Report dated June 7, 2013 for the period ending April 30, 2013. This report reflects a positive tracking of the TAF, showing the amount of \$1,007,247 over the adopted revenues.

The proposed New Section 19 is proposing a new appropriation of \$50,000 to the Guam Visitors Bureau for the Humåtak Community Foundation (HCF) for the purpose of developing the Humåtak Heritage Museum. Given the proposed change in the adopted level of the TAF, funding will be available to cover this proposed appropriation.

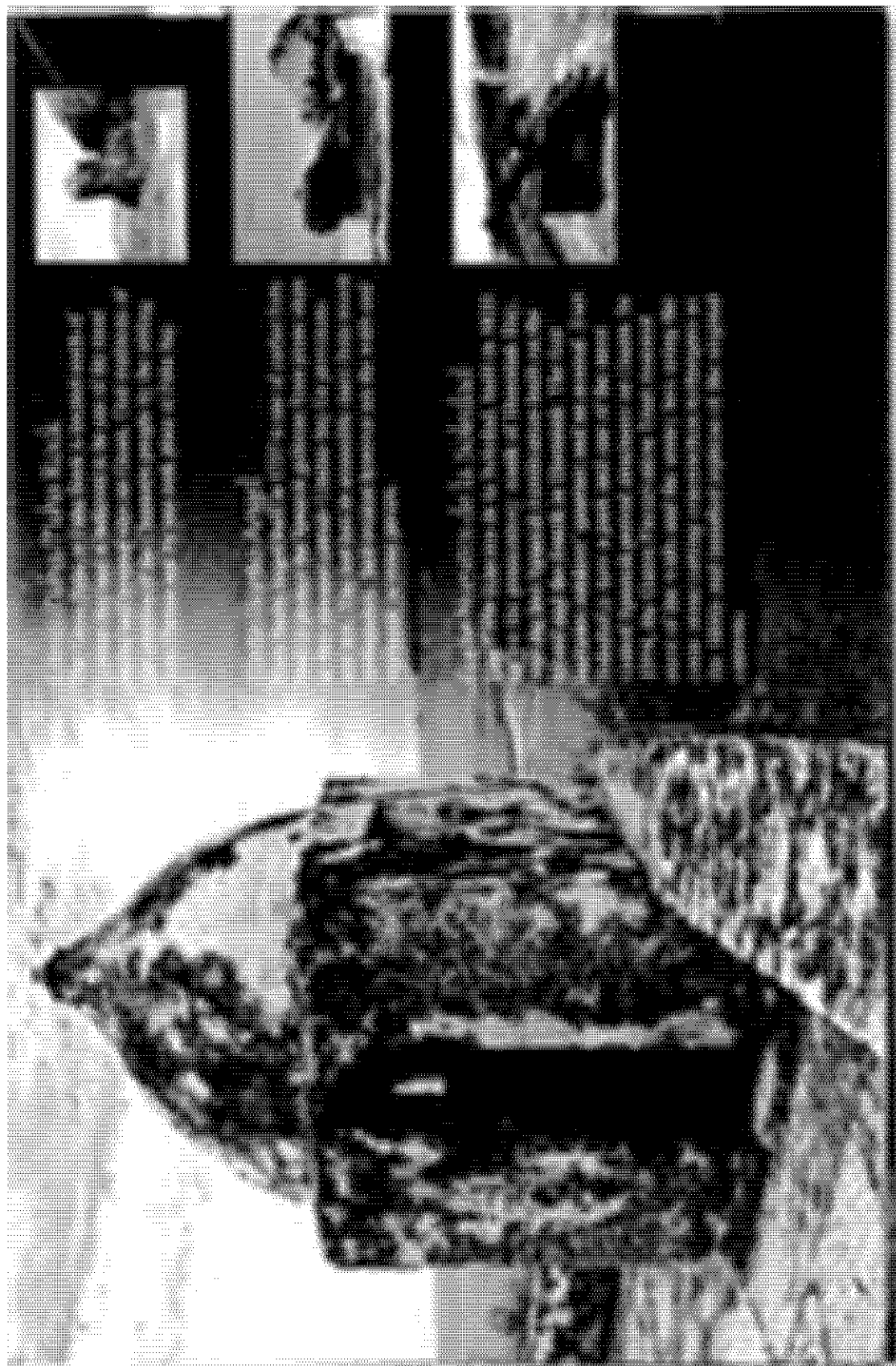
The Village of Humatak (Umatac) in southern Guam is central to the story of Guam and the Chamorro people. The village lies between gentle mountains and Humatak Bay near the sacred pilgrimage site of Lasso Fuha. It is here that Chamorro legends place the creation of the world and its people.

The early inhabitants of this coastline built their homes on *latte* foundations made of dense volcanic basalt and left behind some of the oldest pottery found on Guam.

In 1521, Ferdinand Magellan was met by Chamorro outrigger sailing canoes when his expedition made landfall on Guam at a coastal settlement that Chamorro oral history says was Humatak. When the Spanish returned some four decades later, in 1565, it was at Humatak that the island was officially claimed for Spain and Catholic mass was celebrated. At this time Miguel López de Legazpi noted that Humatak's large communal house, supported by *latte* construction, was large enough to accommodate 200 people along with large canoes.

Even, as today, the people of the village built their homes along the protected shores of Humatak Bay and the banks of a fresh water river that flows from the confluence the Laelae and Madog Rivers. During the next three centuries Humatak became Spain's primary port in Guam for the galleon ships carrying out the Empire's Manila-Acapulco trade. Designating Humatak as the seat of government during part of the year, the Spanish built a succession of churches, a governor's palace compound, forts and other buildings. The remains of several Spanish colonial structures, including the walls of the 17th century church, may be seen today. These landmarks and others from more recent history—including the intriguing Outdoor Library and the Magellan Monument Park—are here in the heart of the village along with community centers, the modern day San Dionisio church and Francisco Q. Sanchez School.





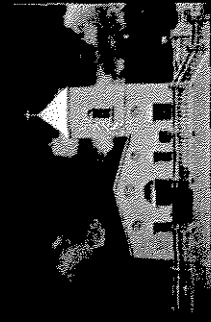
Outdoor Library

The tiny, unique Umatac Outdoor Library was the first public library built in the southern part of Guam. Located 200 yards west of the church, the library is seven feet tall by six feet wide. At one time it was sheltered by a thatched shelter although the books on the library shelves were still exposed to the elements. The "Pride of Umatac" as it is inscribed held not only books, but a listing of Humatac's many scholastic and athletic achievements. The library was built in 1933 by the people of the village under the direction of Francisco Quinata Sanchez, a resident and pioneering educator.

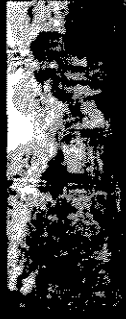

San Dionisio Catholic Church

The Dionisio Catholic Church is a prominent focal element in the village of Humatac. It was built in 1939 by residents under the direction of the Capuchin Order on the site as the colonial era's Casa Real, the Spanish Governor's summer house. Having survived World War II, the church is one of the island's two oldest churches still in use. The architecture of the church depicts the Spanish colonial influence with its massive mason walls and detailed railings. A series of typhoons and the 1993 great earthquake destroyed parts of the church, but in 1999 it was rehabilitated by the Guam Preservation Trust.

San Dionisio Church Ruins

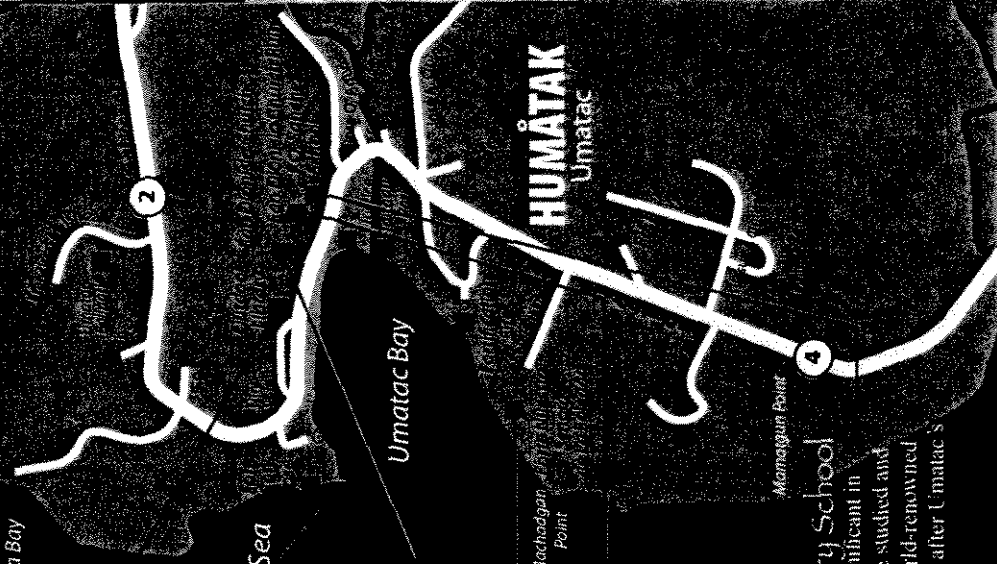
First built in 1681, the San Dionisio church was constructed of wood with a palm thatched roof. In 1684, the church was destroyed as a result of the opposition of the Chamorro people. After much destruction by typhoon and earthquake, it was rebuilt in 1694 of coral masonry. Today the masonry ruins of the old San Dionisio Church can be viewed in front of the Francisco Q. Sanchez Elementary School.



Francisco Q. Sanchez Elementary School

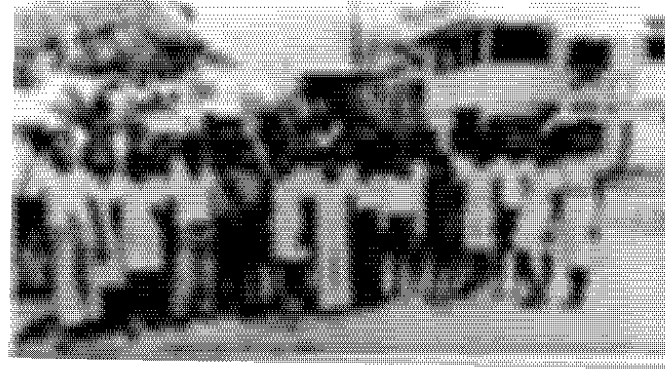
Francisco Q. Sanchez Elementary School is significant in that it holds many memories for those who have studied and taught there and because it was designed by world-renowned architect, Richard Neutra. The school is named after Umatac's great educator Francisco Quinata Sanchez.

Through history, education has been a matter of paramount importance to the people of Umatac. The many schools built in Umatac over the past one hundred years are clear indications of the educational legacy that has been passed from generation to generation. Today, the people of Umatac are once again challenged to overcome adversities in their quest to provide the highest level of education to their children.



Because of its small student population, the school was targeted for closure by Guam Education School Board who proposed sending its students to another village. Humatak residents strongly opposed this move. In 2011, the Humatak Community Foundation was created to develop and establish a charter school for the community of Humatak. In addition to its importance to the survival of Humatak's long and rich culture and a community resource, the Francisco Q. Sanchez Elementary School is an historic place that holds many memories for those who have studied and taught there. Not the least of whom is one the island of Guam's greatest educators and respected leaders. In addition, it is one of Guam's significant historical structures.

In 1998, the school was listed under both the Guam and the National registers of historic places. It is one of the first buildings built in a plan to restore Guam after the devastation of World War II. Completed in 1953, the school was designed by a world-renowned architect Richard J. Neutra (1892-1970), who was known for harmoniously incorporating nature in his work. Neutra also designed Government House, the official residence of the Governor of Guam and a large body of master work in the International Modern style of architecture.

Neutra's design for the elementary school in Humatak takes advantage of the village's backdrop of dramatic mountains and views of the sea. Located on a terraced hill in the heart of the community, the school is an important element of daily life in Humatak. The mayor's office and community center is just across the street and the walls of the historical Spanish era church are located on the front lawn. Many children walk to school. Residents say the





school brings the community together and makes possible the sense of pride in heritage passed from generation to generation.

The original school included two wings housing eight classrooms and administrative office flanking a central covered plaza where students and teachers gathered for lunch and special programs. Through the years, additions to the structure have included an enclosed cafeteria and covered stairway leading to the central entrance. It has been modernized to accommodate air conditioning, but the original feeling of harmony with nature remains.

The school bears the name of native son, Francisco Quinata Sanchez (1899-1954) who began teaching at Umatac school at age 18. Because there was no school in the village, the young Sanchez attended grade school in Agat walking the distance daily. He pursued his education at the Guam Institute and the Richard P. Leary School, and throughout his life remained an earnest hands-on supporter of education. He served as principal of the Magellan School, as it was then called, and led local residents to build the first library in southern Guam. Also on historical registers, the Humatak Outdoor Library was a popular facility that encouraged both children and adults to read and take pride in the village's scholastic and athletic accomplishments. He and his wife, the former Amparo Q. Santiago, had one daughter, Angelina, also a noted educator.

A member of the pre-World War II Guam Congress, Sanchez is also admired and well remembered for his many and varied contributions outside education. He organized the Guam Teachers Association to raise funds for the Magellan monument, which stands, in the center of Humatak, and the annual celebration commemorating Magellan's visit. Discovery Day is observed each March and draws an influx of visitors to the village. Also known for his athleticism and patriotism, Sanchez was a musician as well. Among his compositions are "Umatac by the Sea" and "Magellan's Voyage."

Comments on Legislative Bill No. 159-32

This proposed legislation is seeking to amend the Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) adopted revenues from \$25,500,082 to \$26,507,329, an increase of \$1,007,247. Additionally, it proposes to add a New Section 19 to Chapter X of Public Law 31-233.

The proposed increase in the TAF is supported by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research's (BBMR) FY 2013 Special Revenue Tracking Report dated June 7, 2013 for the period ending April 30, 2013. This report reflects a positive tracking of the TAF, showing the amount of \$1,007,247 over the adopted revenues.

The proposed New Section 19 is proposing a new appropriation of \$50,000 to the Guam Visitors Bureau for the Humåtak Community Foundation (HCF) for the purpose of developing the Humåtak Heritage Museum. Given the proposed change in the adopted level of the TAF, funding will be available to cover this proposed appropriation.

THE HUMÅTAK COMMUNITY FOUNDATION (HCF), INC.
FOR THE PURPOSES OF DEVELOPING THE HUMÅTAK
HERITAGE VILLAGE MUSEUM (HHVM).

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that the Humåtak Community Foundation (HCF), Inc. was established in
4 September 3, 2011 as a registered non-profit 501(3)c public corporation for the
5 people of the village of Humåtak (Umatac), for the purposes of bringing together
6 the people of Umatac and families near and far to safeguard and perpetuate the
7 natural and cultural resources in the village of Humåtak.

8 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that one of the program goals of the
9 Humåtak Community Foundation (HCF), Inc. is to develop the Humåtak Heritage
10 Village Museum (HHVM) as a community-based village museum showcasing the
11 people and history of the village of Humåtak in its natural and cultural

1 environment. The HHVM is a component of the Heritage Mission of the Humåtak
2 Heritage Center, an initiative of the Humåtak Community Foundation and in
3 partnership with the Umatac Mayor's Office. The museum will be located in the
4 F. Q. Sanchez School Facility and will be managed by the Humåtak Community
5 Foundation and community volunteers.

6 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that one of the proposed outcomes of
7 the Humåtak Community Foundation (HCF), Inc. is that the Humåtak Heritage
8 Village Museum will showcase the people and history of the village of Humåtak in
9 its natural and cultural environment at the Francisco Quinata Sanchez Humåtak
10 Heritage Center by March 2014.

11 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that revenue estimates for the Tourist
12 Attraction Fund (TAF) for Fiscal Year 2013 are tracking at Twenty-Six Million
13 Five Hundred Seven Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-Nine Dollars
14 (\$26,507,329), of which Twenty-Three Million Eight Hundred Eighty-Eighty
15 Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$23,888,200) is appropriated.

16 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the TAF revenues for Fiscal Year
17 2013 are projected to exceed appropriations by One Million Seven Hundred Eight
18 Thousand Four Hundred Eighty-Eight Dollars (\$1,708,488), in addition to the
19 Fiscal Year 2012 ending cumulative fund balance of Four Million Sixty-Five
20 Thousand Fifteen Dollars (\$4,065,015), and is available for appropriation.

21 It is therefore the intent of the *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to support the mission
22 and program goals of the Humåtak Community Foundation (HCF), Inc. by
23 providing a funding source for the purposes of developing the Humåtak Heritage
24 Village Museum (HHVM) to be located in the F. Q. Sanchez School Facility.

25 **Section 2.** Subsection II. AG. (Tourist Attraction Fund) of Section 2
26 (Estimated Revenues for Fiscal Year 2013) of Chapter I (General Provisions) of
27 Public Law 31-233 is hereby *amended* to read:

1 "AG. Tourist Attraction Fund \$26,507,329"

2 **Section 3.** A New Section 19 is hereby *added* to Chapter X (Guam
3 Visitors Bureau) of Public Law 31-233 to read:

4 "Section 19. **Appropriation to GVB for Humåtak**
5 **Community Foundation (HCF), Inc.** The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars
6 **(\$50,000)** is hereby appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) to
7 the Guam Visitors Bureau for the Humåtak Community Foundation (HCF),
8 Inc. for the purposes of developing the Humåtak Heritage Village Museum
9 (HHVM) to be located in the F. Q. Sanchez School Facility.
10 Notwithstanding the general provisions of §30107.1 of Chapter 30, Title 11
11 GCA, and this Act, this appropriation *shall* continue to be available until
12 expended. The provisions contained in Section 14 (Service and Reporting
13 Requirements) of Chapter X of Public Law 31-233 *shall not* be applicable.
14 In lieu of this requirement, the Guam Visitors Bureau *shall* determine the
15 manner in which the Grantee is to provide such service and reporting
16 requirements."

17 **Section 3. Effective Date.** The provisions contained herein shall take
18 effect immediately upon the enactment of this Act.
