I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land convened a public hearing on April 12, 2013 at 8:30am in *I Liheslatura's* public hearing room.

II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Good morning ladies and gentlemen, we are here today to conduct a public hearing by the Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land. The publication was conducted in accordance to the open government law. On today's agenda, we have six (6) bills before us and we will start in the order the agenda was published. The first bill on the agenda is Bill 16-32, "An act to rezone lots collectively known as Parcel 3 in the Municipality of Tiyan, Barrigada from Agricultural Zone (A) to Light Industrial Zone (M-1), and to change the reference of Limited Industrial to Light Industrial".

The author of the bill, Senator Rory Respicio, is here with us this morning and we would like to extend the courtesy of giving the general public the synopsis of the bill and then we will proceed with the receipt of the public testimony. Thank you very much. Si Yu'os Ma'åse' everyone for listening in today, as well as those who are here and physically present

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Senator Rory Respicio: Thank you very much and good morning Mr. Chairman and thank you very much again for hearing this bill. This bill would rezone certain portions of land that was returned to the people of Guam in the Tiyan area and to change it from limited industrial to light industrial, which would expand the zoning reform for Tiyan beyond the areas addressed by Senator Chris Dueñas' recently enacted P.L. 31-198. His earlier legislation provided a pathway for addressing previously unknown land in Tiyan by extending the zoning already in place for adjacent lots. P.L. 31-198 provided the process to clear the way for responsible development of properties that were being returned to the people of Guam. Because of their location, several returned parcels were not rezoned because they were not adjacent to previously zoned areas. Bill No. 16-32 (COR) will provide these lots with a zoning designation that will allow for responsible development.

We are in receipt of testimony from the Department of Land Management stating that this action would have no potential impact on their mandates as well as a letter of support from the Barrigada Mayors office. Thank you Mr. Chairman.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much Senator Rory Respicio. We have signed up to testify this morning, Mr. Kenneth Chargualaf and Mr. Ed Ching. Please come forward.

We also, as Senator Rory Respicio has mentioned, received testimony that was submitted by the Guam Waterworks Authority and copies of these testimonies are available for the public that may wish to receive them. We will go ahead and begin with Mr. Chargualaf. Mr. Chargualaf you may begin, please state your name for the record and then begin your testimony.

(b) Testimony

(1) Mr. Kenneth Chargualaf

Mr. Chargualaf: [Read written testimony – verbatim]

PANEL COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much Mr. Chargualaf for your testimony. Mr. Ching.

(2) Mr. Ed Ching, Attorney for Core Tech

Mr. Ed Ching: Thank you very much Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee. I am Ed Ching and I am in private practice as an attorney but I also represent Core Tech International so I want to make sure that is fully disclosed. I am sorry, I do not have a written testimony to submit this morning, I did not have time to finish typing my notes. In any event, I just want to give you some of my observations. I have been a resident of Guam for over forty-two (42) years and when I came here, Tiyan was not in use but from my understanding it was used for bowling alleys, schools, repair shops; it was an active really progressive area. Then it lay dormant for many years, for over 42 years. Now it is being used again, for what? Bowling alleys, no. Schools, yes. Construction staging areas, auto repair shops, metal works, no. What is happening is that prior to the land being returned it was very active and being used for schools and light industrial use although it was not zoned, at that time.

Now, after the land has been returned the land is now being used as light industrial use, exactly what it falls under so what we have is the before and after effect, being exactly the same. But what we have here is an active progressive community. To do less than zoning M-1 would be downgrading the zoning and it would create chaos. It would hurt our economy, you would basically lose jobs and you would have to shut down buildings and you would have to remove structures and you would have to stop the economic growth of that area which effects the entire island. What I am saying is that this is a good thing and the right thing to do. It is an intelligent and smart choice for the senators to rezone it to an M-1. Thank you.

PANEL COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan. Thank you Mr. Ching. Senator Rory Respicio, do you have any questions or comments for the panel?

Senator Rory Respicio: Just one thing Speaker. I would like to thank the panel for their testimony and I have to hand it to Mr. Chargualaf for always adding in the plug, even

when it it's not what is in the bill, to keep those issues active. What we do with overcrowding, what we do with our system - I just want to say that the bill is necessary because when the legislature, through Senator Dueñas, set out a process to have all of these lands that were returned that were not zoned, some how through that legislation, when you take the majority contiguous area.... I know that it was something that this Chairman and I didn't support immediately because there are these instances where you just don't know. So, the contiguous property, the majority of it is un-zoned and as a result, instead of this property remaining a light industrial, like all of the activities in the area it was rezoned to agriculture. Right now you have a situation in that area where these parcels of properties are agricultural but those areas should be designated for this kind of zoning which land management agrees, the Barrigada mayor and testimony from Bureau of Statistics and Plans that supports it. Thank you Mr. Chairman for your support.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much Senator Rory Respicio. Mr. Chargualaf, just to be very clear, you are not representing GDOE.

Mr. Ken Chargualaf: No. No, I am just speaking on my behalf as a former occupant of that facility and although I have retired from the GDOE, I continue to be very involved with many of the activities of the GDOE including the reassignment of the attendance areas. I just recently provided, over the weekend, the plan that I had when I was still with the department as to what are some of the options for the use of the Tiyan facility and how do we assign the attendance throughout the Guam Public High School. I continue to be a member of the leadership design team aside from going to business community partners and asking for scholarships and grants to pump money into our Guam school districts.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: But your position is not that of GDOE.

Mr. Ken Chargualaf: No, I don't even work for Core Tech. This is the first time we have met, Mr. Ching. I am not a paid representative either.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: I just want to establish that so we don't get mixed up with the statements being expressed as to the recommended use of the facility, the recommendation to purchase the facility, the recommendation to resolve the over crowding issue, and it may be that GDOE's position is different. GDOE's plan may be different on how to approach those issues than what you are recommending.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: The idea of the zoning to agriculture for all these returned lands that were un-zoned were so that the land owners can go to the GLUC and begin to rezone their properties through that process, this circumvents that process. That was the whole intent of the author of the bill who said, 'let's just zone everything agricultural' and I opposed that as I thought we should take a more holistic in our approach. Land use planning - like we did with the Puntan Dos Amantes - where we took all the un-zoned property and through a process that took over a year (almost 2 to 3 years), looked at the property at what was the best land use with the current contiguous zones. We went provided opportunities for the landowners to basically petition for a rezoning based

upon what the total land use plan was for that area. We didn't take that approach and we said zone it agriculture and let the landowners worry about it.

The use of the facility as light industrial may be more appropriate but there are still concerns about using the facilities as residential. We have had recent EPA reports that the properties are still contaminated, it presents risk to children, to residents, and maybe we shouldn't have those types of uses in there and should confine it. Senator Respicio is correct, the legislature has rezoned properties contiguous to this; to M-1,but we have a whole recreational facility there, right down wind from the facilities. Is that compatible with an M-1 zone use and so forth.

There are still many things that the property owners will still have to deal with; the licensing process to conduct activities there and we hope that the proper authorities would present their concerns with regards to compatible uses with existing facilities as well as the expanded uses for those under M-1. We just hope that everyone pitches in whenever new businesses start in the area so that they are consistent with those uses and take into account the surrounding properties and the effect on the community. Thank you for your input.

Mr. Ed Ching: Thank you. May I say one thing. You brought up something that is very important about residential use. I know with the Airport, because I used to be counsel to the Airport, had spent tremendous amounts of money to the surrounding areas outside of the Airport to soundproof it because of the planes landing and all of the noise problems so it would not be useful for that land to allow single family residential homes in that area. That's a very important part to think about.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much. Senator Ada, do you have any questions?

Senator Tom Ada: Mr. Chargualaf, I just want to get an understanding. I commend you for taking the opportunity to advocate for additional campuses but I am just trying to make the connection. You are supporting this bill because you feel that we need to keep that campus and all that but there is nothing in this bill that says if it is rezoned that it will remain as a campus.

Mr. Ken Chargualaf: Of course, but it is something for the Committee to ponder because I know that is one of the compelling issues throughout my years in the Department of Education. Up to now I know there is active conversation on how we can best utilize that campus and as administrators, we talk to each other and look at possibilities out there and thought this was a perfect campus to fit the needs of our current situation with the Department of Education. We have to resolve it.

Senator Tom Ada: So, you're just planting the seed about the need to make it permanent regardless of whatever the zoning is.

Mr. Ken Chargualaf: For GDOE use, I understand that the Department of Administration is vacating the facility due to health and safety reasons and I think this is a

grand opportunity for the GDOE to be housed under one roof. They are split, they are everywhere and that was my frustration as a school administrator. If I wanted to see somebody, go to an office, I have to drive all the way to Oceanview; one at Chief Brodie, and GDOE is just spread out throughout the island.

Senator Tom Ada: I understand. I just wanted to make sure I didn't miss the connection between the two. Thank you.

Senator Rory Respicio: Can I ask that you go plant your seed somewhere else and not in this bill. Because this bill does not do the things you are suggesting. I don't want to poison the intent of this bill and the significance that we are doing in the zoning and not the purchase of a school. You're a good farmer I meant to add.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: I just want to state for the record, are you aware that the purchase price is about \$45M at 8% interest? Do you think that is a good deal? For a fifty-five (55) year old renovated facility?

Mr. Ken Chargualaf: Yes, Mr. Chairman but being there for many, many years and when you see the children in the hallway bumping into each other and there is not enough desks and tables and chairs and no classrooms to accommodate the many programs that we want to advance and promote at our campus and not be able to provide many of these programs that are true back there in the mainland. I think, it is my duty as a member of this community to look for resolutions and that is why I yield to your wisdom.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much. You know the consideration for \$45M at 8% a year, which could take us to \$75M by the time we pay it off; actually more than that, actually about \$100M. We are going to have a lot of wisdom to sift through that cost for facilities. We are building Okkodo and the cost for the additional expansion will cost us less than \$45M. So, do you want brand new facilities for \$45M or renovated facilities for \$45M? I think that is the debate we will have in regards to purchasing the property. But again, this is only to allow light-industrial use for that facility to benefit the current owners of the facility and not for future owners.

Senator Aline Yamashita: Thank you very much Speaker Ben. Mr. Chargualaf, it has been a while, you bring back many fond memories of your gift of presentation and your gift of connecting everything. I do appreciate you raising this, taking the opportunity, coming here and looking into the future and we do know that this bill isn't addressing that, it is addressing rezoning and you are looking beyond that. Since you did raise it, I do want Speaker Ben and this Committee to know that we have had conversations with the Department of Education and we are looking into receiving in June, what their plans are. They do need to move forward with their CIP (Capital Improvement Project) master plans, with their alignment issues, with what we do know. As much as you are saying that the Wildcats (Untalan Middle School) want to stay there, our information is that they are looking forward to moving back to Barrigada as all the ARRA (America Recovery and Reinvestment Act) is being addressed. We know we will be hearing from the Superintendent as to the overall plan is.

You are also correct that the band aid approach of how we have been aligning our issues; our attendance issues, our facility issues, cannot happen any more and that is a waste of money. Since you did raise it, I did want to say that is coming and it should be around the corner. And we look forward, Speaker Ben, to receiving that from GDOE. Thank you very much.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much. Thank you very much gentlemen, you are dismissed. We also have Mr. Ernie Wusstig who wishes to testify on Bill number 16. Please join us at the table, identify yourself and present your testimony.

Again, the bill is to rezone the collective Tiyan area that is currently owned by Core Tech from Agriculture to M-1.

(3) Mr. Ernest Wusstig

Mr. Ernie Wusstig: Good morning Mr. Chairman and Senators my name is Ernie Wusstig, for the record. I am sitting here listening and this would affect my family. Our property is right next to Core Tech and I am in support of the bill because I believe, we don't have to go in and apply for a rezoning if this law is passed because it would automatically be light industrial, the neighbors also. If Core Tech can get it, why can't we? We're right next-door. It's unfair for one to get it and we have to go through the due process. I would like, Senators, for you to amend this bill and have all those areas light industrial.

Now, the testimony for the school, I am listening. I don't think it is practical to have a school in that area as it is a noise zone, there are a lot of noises. The kids can't learn when you are distracted from the airplanes landing and going. If you have it like a bunker so you don't hear the noises that'll cost a lot of money to turn the school into a bunker. I don't think it is wise for that area to have a school there. But for light industrial like warehouses or whatever and the neighbors should be light industrial too. I am in support of this bill but you have to include the neighbors.

PANEL COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much Mr. Wusstig. Si Yu'os Ma'åse' Mr. Wusstig.

There being no more testimony on Bill 16-32, this concludes the testimony on Bill No. 16-32. There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. 
III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** It is the desire of *I* 3 Liheslaturan Guåhan to maintain consistent development and use of land to promote the highest and best use of Guam's lands, one of our most 4 important assets. I Liheslatura finds that the passage of P.L. 31-198 5 6 caused all federal excess land that were returned to original landowners to be designated as Agricultural Zone (A). However, many of these 7 lands as returned were already in use for purposes other than 8 Agricultural Zone (A), such as schools, construction staging areas, 9 warehouses, and offices, which more appropriately fits the designation 10 of Light Industrial Zone (also known as Limited Industrial Zone). It is 11 the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to allow the use of the lots described 12 herein to continue without interruption. 13

Thank you for scheduling Bill No. 16-32 (COR) for a public hearing. I introduced Bill No. 16-32 (COR) "An Act to rezone Lot 2181-4NEW-R1NEW-R2, Lot 2181-4NEW-R1NEW-2, Lot 2181-4NEW-1-1, Lot 2181-4NEW-1-2, Lot 2181-4NEW-1-3, Lot 2181-4NEW-1-4, Lot 2181-4NEW-1-R4 and Lot Naval Air Station Agana -21-R1 (Airport Parcel 4) in the Municipality of Tiyan, Barrigada from Agricultural Zone (A) to Light Industrial Zone (M-1); and to change the reference of Limited Industrial to Light Industrial," which will expand the zoning reform for Tiyan beyond the areas addressed by Senator Christopher Dueñas' recently enacted Public Law 31-198. The earlier legislation provided a pathway for addressing previously un-zoned land in Tiyan by extending the zoning already in place for adjacent lots.

P.L. 31-198 provided this process to clear the way for responsible development of properties that were being returned to the people of Guam. Because of their location, several returned parcels were not rezoned because they were not adjacent to previously zoned areas. Bill No. 16-32 (COR) will provide these lots with a zoning designation that will allow for responsible development.

Bill No. 16-32 (COR) proposes establishing an M-1 light industrial zone for the property, which is consistent with how the parcels were being used before the new statute. The light industrial zone designation allows for the construction of schools, staging areas, warehouses and offices; all of which will contribute to additional business growth and expand our island's economic base.

The Department of Land Management has stated that the passage of Bill No. 16-32 (COR) will not have any potential impact on their mandates.

Thank you, again, for this opportunity. I respectfully request that this statement be included with your committee's report on Bill No. 16-32 (COR).

Chargualaf a former Guam Department of Education district office administrator, school administrator, and classroom teacher for over 33 years. I'm also a parent in the Guam public school system. 

Any extension of the water and sewer systems and/or capacity upgrades required to serve the properties shall be subject to the rules and regulations of GWA. Any required extension to the existing facilities to serve the subject property shall be at the expense of the property owners.

GWA record shows that there is an existing eight-inch (8") waterline located along Mariner Street fronting subject Lot Numbers 2181-4NEW-R1NEW-2, Naval Air Station Agana-21-R1 (Airport Parcel 4), 2181-4NEW-1-4 and 2181-4NEW-1-2. 



The Department has reviewed Bill 16-32 (COR) —AN ACT TO REZONE LOT 2181-4NEW-R1NEW-R2, LOT 2181-4NEW-R1NEW-2, LOT 2181-4NEW-1-1, LOT 2181-4NEW-1-2, LOT 2181-4NEW-1-3, LOT 2181-4NEW-1-4, LOT 2181-4NEW-1-R4 AND LOT NAVAL AIR STATION AGANA-21-R1 (AIRPORT PARCEL 4) IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TIYAN BARRIGADA FROM AGRICULTURAL ZONE (A) TO LIGHT INDUSTRIAL ZONE (M-1); AND TO CORRECTION OR REFERENCE TO LIMITED INDUSTRIAL TO LIGHT INDUSTRIAL. This bill was originally submitted to the 31st Guam Legislature under Bill No. 533-31. We reiterate our findings and review and provide the following:

- 1. Tiyan is not a "municipality" pursuant to Chapter 4, Title 5 (GCA) please correct to "Municipality of Barrigada." Moreover, the above reference lots are located within the proper name place of "Unguguan"
- 2. Guam Public Law 23-51 provides for a redevelopment and planning of NAS Agana as a result of BRAC'95. As a result, a document was approved by the Guam Legislature and transmitted to the Undersecretary of Department of Defense for transfer to the government of Guam. The parcels listed above are in an area designated for "Economic Development."
- 3. Next to "M-2" (Heavy Industrial) zones, Guam's "M-1" (Light Industrial) Zone is the least restrictive of all zoning designations and can encompass both offensive as well non-offensive activities, albeit, there remains the responsibility for justifying and ensuring that public safety and welfare prevails. In other words, industrial uses or activities as permitted may apply uses being objectionable, obnoxious or offensive by reason of odor, dust,

smoke, noise, gas fumes, cinders, vibration, flashing lights, or water-carried waste that are or are likely to be emitted. In such case, properties listed in this legislative proposal includes certain harden facilities that are being utilized as temporary public school services. Here certain "residential uses" such as "schools" are also permitted in an "M-1" Zone and appropriate coexistence between such uses must be sanctioned through appropriate regulatory relief to eliminate or promote the least negative potential impact that may occur onto such more restrictive residential uses without compromising full use and benefit.

4. Notwithstanding, the fact remains in that aforementioned are part of a land corridor that separate Barrigada Proper from "M-2" (Heavy Industrial) uses, namely within the Tiyan Re-Use Master Plan, of which is inclusive of the Guam International Airport. Therefore, we are of the opinion that rezoning said properties to "M-1" (Light Industrial) zone would be appropriate and reflect deliberate steady community growth from more intensive/less restrictive uses to less intensive/more restrictive uses.

In respect to potential impacts to our mandates as requested by the Bureau of Budget Management and Resources, passage of Legislative Bills 16-32(COR) will not have any affects, thereof.

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
