The Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land convened a public hearing on <u>December 20, 2013</u> at <u>8:30am</u> in *I Liheslatura's* public hearing room.

II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to this public hearing on the Committee on Land for the specific provisions as identified on the agenda as published required by the open government law. This morning we have Bill No. 221 on the agenda, an act introduced by Senator Rodriguez relative to rezoning a lot in Mangilao, 1106-2NEW located in the Municipality of Mangilao from Single Family Residential (R-1) to Commercial (C) for the purposes of establishing a medical clinic and health related commercial activity.

I have signed up to testify the Mayor of Mangilao, Dr. Vince Akimoto and Dr. Nguyen. In addition, Senator Rodriguez who had a prior engagement that was scheduled prior to the public hearing date and who is the author of Bill 221 is not able to join us this morning. However, he has asked us to proceed with this morning's public hearing. He has submitted a sponsor's statement and I would like to ask the Vice Chair of Senator Rodriguez' Committee, Senator Tony Ada to read the sponsor statement.

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Senator Tony Ada. Thank you Mr. Chairman. Again, Senator Rodriguez apologizes to the Committee and those giving public testimony for his absence this morning. He is giving the welcoming remarks at the Non-Communicable Disease Consortium. Senator Rodriguez' sponsor statement is as follows. [read sponsor statement verbatim]

(b) Testimony

Mr. Nito Blas. I am Nito Blas, the mayor of Mangilao and I am here to testify in favor of the bill that the medical center wants to build in my district.

[Mr. Angel Sablan, Executive Director for the Guam Mayor's Council of Guam read Mr. Blas' written testimony verbatim]

Mr. Angel Sablan. For the record, the Mangilao Municipal Planning Council met on December 11, 2013 and part of the agenda was the request by the American Medical Center to rezone their lot. The Council members unanimously approved and support the request for rezone from "R" to "C".

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you Mr. Mayor. Dr. Nguyen?

Dr. Hoa Nguyen. Thank you for giving us this opportunity to present this project to all of you. The American Medical Center is probably the fastest growing clinic here in Guam. We have about 46,000 patients. Our current home on Route 1 is basically completely filled and because there are many physicians who are close to retirement we anticipate a shortages of primary care physicians on Guam. Our goal is to grow. We have been looking at this project for about two

years and find a place to open a second clinic. Our second goal is to recruit physicians that are from Guam. For the last two years we have successfully recruited three physicians that were born and raised on Guam to come back and join us at American Medical Center. We have four more that we anticipate to come in the next year-and-a half to two years.

We found this lot in Mangilao, which is centrally located to serve the villages of Mangilao and the southern part of the island. We have a time line that we have committed in order for a particular physician to come back to Guam. This person graduated from their residency training and in about a year-in-a half to two years will be ready to come back. In order for us to convince him to come back, we really have to build a second place for him to practice.

We have worked hard with our architect to finish this within the time frame so we can get those people to come back to the island. It is a much needed area. It's a private health care clinic including family practice, pediatric and internal medicine. We also plan to put up the very first rehab center in Guam, which we don't have at this point. We have a lot of people that have suffered from strokes and we don't have a rehab center. The only place we have is at GMH and they are overwhelmed.

So, we respectfully request the Guam Legislature to pass Bill No. 221 to set up quality care on Guam and to also get those physicians to come back to Guam.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much Dr. Nguyen. Dr. Akimoto?

Dr. Vince Akimoto. I believe Dr. Nguyen covered it quite well.

Chairman Pangelinan. Ok.

Mr. John Setiadi Tan. Thank you for allowing us to speak on this issue. My name is John Setiadi Tan and I am the architect for the American Medical Center. Just want to share with you that from the pinnacle standpoint in terms of planning, architecture and engineering, we have reviewed the lot and I believe it is not only compatible, but very appropriate for the development. I would like to share that insight with you and inform you that from the pinnacle perspective it is a good lot.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you. Any questions from the Senators?

Senator Aline Yamashita. Thank you very much Speaker Ben. Thank you all for being here. We certainly need more health care on our island and we all know that the notion of health care is a critical issue on our island. So, the idea that we would be able to --- starting from prevention all the way to intervention for our families on Guam is very appealing to me. All of this helps us. I would ask that as you – for those professionals who are here and those we are recruiting that we please make sure that the competency set includes knowing how to work with those of us with disabilities. It's really hard finding a practitioner who would welcome somebody with autism and then when they do and they don't know, it just exacerbates the whole situation. Then we end up leaving with another problem.

So, just knowing that if you need to see them in a parking lot – that's what we end up doing, but that's OK. At least I get some kind of service. So, the competency set from birth all the way to sunset, how do you help diagnose, how do you treat. I would hope that we do that. Those are the training competencies, but even physical assets; accessibility. I really do hope we have ramps. I really do hope we have rails everywhere, particularly as I get older, I really do appreciate those kinds of assets. Our people are very proud people and they really want to do as much as they can for themselves. In order for that to happen we do need to address the ADA issues.

Chairman Pangelinan. Excuse me, Senator Yamashita. We need the Health Committee Vice Chair to ask the Chair to hold hearings on recruiting of physicians and their competencies. This is the rezoning bill.

Senator Aline Yamashita. As we are talking about rezoning in order to get my support for this rezoning effort I would like to know that you are going to recruit and ensure that those competencies are in place.

Dr. Vince Akimoto. Two things: Mr. Setiadi is a humble guy, but he is actually the architect for the new hospital, as well – the GRMC. So the designs that we are incorporating into this new clinic will take the best practices that are being used for that hospital as well as health care facilities around the world. Our parking lot – we hope – will be the most beautiful parking lot, a least in Mangilao. The lot is beautiful. The Mangilao land that we are using has never been used for anything else other than cow pastures. So, it's raw land and I guess that's why we are here for the rezoning.

But the purpose of the build out is to provide Guam with, as well as the state of the art new private hospital, a state of the art new private clinic and there are others coming. The good news is all your hard work and encouragement is coming to bear and there are local doctors coming home. If they were to come to our clinic right now on marine drive, which has a very ugly parking lot along a busy road, we could not take them. There is no space to bring a new doctor in. We have turned away three already – three doctors that are on island who wanted to work with us. We simply have no space; we have 46,000 patients, we have ten doctors. We are too full in our marine drive location and things will change where we probably won't be able to keep those guys there. So, if we don't do this soon – there has already been one doctor who has left because of our inability and there might be a second to leave, as well.

Guam will lose doctors simply because we are not ready. The new hospital is coming but it's meant for at the end of the road. You don't want to go to the new hospital, you want to come to our clinic and stay healthy. I think Mr. Setiadi can speak on the safety and the handicapped accessibility because this will be a rehab clinic. We are building a primary care clinic and a rehab clinic.

Mr. John Setiadi Tan. Just want to confirm that yes, the facility will be designed to meet the accessibility requirements and all other building codes and zoning requirements.

Chairman Pangelinan. Thank you very much.

Senator Chris Duenas. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Dr. Akimoto, I would have thought by reading your letter to the editor the other day that your new location would be in Tamuning.

Dr. Vince Akimoto. It's too crowded there. I don't think you should zone anymore new facilities.

Senator Chris Duenas. I was thinking of the hospital – GMH privatization. I just wanted to say that originally, before reading - I am sure the Chairman was going to mention this – the testimony of Land Management, I was wondering why you didn't go with conditional use. Now, I see they have fully endorsed commercial. So, I just wanted to make that comment.

Dr. Vince Akimoto. Actually we just learned about conditional use this morning or last night. We just need to get our permits. According to Mr. Setiadi, the longer it takes --- not only are there favorable loan rates we are going to miss out on, USDA is actually asking us, or is trying to help us so we've got applications with the USDA to bring training grants and telemedicine grants to this clinic. The longer we take to get the construction grants, the greater chance we are going to miss out on funding opportunities. So, there are training grants for local practitioner as well as those in Micronesia. We have the most sophisticated telemedicine networks in our clinic and our hope is to be participating in the American Heart Association training for advanced life support. There are many things this clinic will allow us to do, particularly since it is in heart in the village of education, Mangilao.

Senator Chris Duenas. That's smart. I will just close with that. Normally on the application process itself, commercial is the catch all and some people use that to hide other activities that they want to do down the road. But obviously you are going to be clinic, so it's no big deal. I was just thinking that could have been faster.

Dr. Vince Akimoto. [inaudible]

Senator Chris Duenas. Sometimes it is because of the fact that it is set in stone that that is what you are going to do on that property. Some people get commercial and they say they are going to build a store, then it becomes a bar. I am just saying that normally conditional use is more likely accepted. But, Land Management is in full support, so it makes sense and certainly will support this bill. Thank you Mr. Chair.

Senator Tony Ada. Thank you for expanding health care in other regions of our island. I think making health care accessible is really important to the people of Guam. My only question is do you also plan to have an urgent care clinic?

Dr. Hoa Nguyen. Yes, we are going to have an urgent care clinic just like the American Medical Clinic opened to 9pm. We also plan to open on Sundays, too – access seven days a week. We will bring in specialists on a rotating basis that we don't have on Guam right now. It's kind of hard to bring in specialists because we don't have space – rheumatology, cardiologists, everything we can bring in and have enough room for people to practice.

Senator Tony Ada. Thank you. That's good to hear that you will have urgent care so people won't have to drive to the hospital, especially from the southern end of the island. We have

people at DÔC (Mangilao) and if they need access to a medical facility immediately, there is a facility in Mangilao now. Also the people at DYA. Thank you for your presentation this morning and I hope you will be able to build your clinic and serve the people of Guam. Thank you Mr. Chairman.

Senator Brant McCreadie. Thank you, Mr. Chair. Some of my colleagues hit it right on the nose. This is a no brainer, basically to support. I also thank you guys for improving the quality of life for people that are underserved. This is a much needed gap filler. I am sure in the future we will have more of these. But, not only does it address an issue that is much needed, which is medical care but it also creates jobs and that is a huge infusion to economy. So, when I look at all the aspects of why we should do this it's a 100% support.

I would like to ask one question. You mentioned 46,000 patients that you currently have. Is there any projection – are you going on the 46,000 patient number when you are building this facility or are you planning for more than 46,000 patients?

Dr. Hoa Nguyen. Our clinic has grown a lot. We have a lot of new patients. After you reach a certain number, the quality of care goes down. So, we have had to turn patients away. Unfortunately the only way we can provide access to these patients is to have more room, either in the same place, which cannot happen so we have to open a second one. To answer your question, we do have patients who would like to come to us for care, this is one way we can do it.

Senator Brant McCreadie. Thank you and I fully support this. I know we spend a lot of money taking our medical monies off-island and the more money we can keep here on-island is a plus for the community so I thank you guys. You have my full support.

Senator Michael Limtiaco. Thank you Mr. Chair. Dr. Akimoto, we definitely support this endeavor. Obviously it is for the betterment of the community. But I do have to ask the question on whether or not you had gone through the normal channels through the Guam Land Use Commission.

Dr. Vince Akimoto. We submitted our application to the Land Use Commission – we used the information that was on-line as what was recommended. When we turned the application in it was rejected and they said there was a different application that we had to fill out, which was not the one that was on-line. We continue to comply with what they asked us to do – some of their requests are contingent it seems upon a rezoning of the land because one of the things they asked us to put on the billboard is who is the developer, which we understand is our contractor. However we cannot select a contractor until we have some idea on when we will start, which will require some of the permits that we are trying to seek.

The process seems to be one that does not go very quickly and we are trying our best to find all avenues. We just learned about the conditional use this morning. We just want to build a clinic. We are learning a lot about land, as we speak. But, you guys seem to know a lot about it. All I know is we are going to probably create more jobs in Mangilao – 75% of them are going to be those professionals graduating from UOG and GCC. Dr. Nguyen is the Medical Director of the

Guam Memorial Hospital, where we do most of our training so a lot of our nurses are already looking at coming into private practice with us. I am the Medical Director for GCC. So, we are definitely going to get over this land use issue and create jobs.

Senator Michael Limtiaco. Sure. I think you have the full support from everybody here on what you are doing. There is no doubt about that. It's just that we do have a process and a facility to do this rather than coming through the legislature and they are in a better position to determine regarding infrastructure, etc. So, I just wanted to ask the question because I will ask it at every rezoning bill that comes through here — have you gone through the Land Use Commission because that's the process that it should go through.

But, having said that I want to let you know that we fully support – I fully support what you are trying to do here and obviously so does the Land Use Commission and the Department of Land Management via their testimony that supports this type of zoning on routed roads. So, contrary to what the delays may be you are in a very good position to get a favorable outcome from the Guam Land Use Commission, in my opinion had we gone through the process. But I understand there are delays in it. Having said that I fully support what you are doing. Thank you.

Mayor Nito Blas. The reason I am supporting this project is because it is very close to the manamko center. If they get sick it will take about 3 seconds to reach the medical center. Also, support the [night] market — their patients will buy more stuff there. If something happens at DYA, the medical center is close. So everything in the area will benefit — they don't have to go to Guam Memorial Hospital for emergencies. I am supporting this project because it will be convenient for the community of Mangilao.

Chairman Pangelinan. Did you say you submitted an application to the Guam Land Use Commission? We have been attending all those hearings and I don't recall every seeing

Dr. Vince Akimoto. Like I said, in our attempt to follow the rules – there is an application that is available on-line, which we downloaded and we began the process of getting all the page-long list of documents, including getting EPA and whoever else it was. In anticipation that we were going down this route, again understood that the GLUC also had trouble making quorum and so knew this was going to take a while. We started this several months ago to try to get our packet ready for the GLUC. Even as recently as yesterday, they still told us that we didn't have all the documents. They never received it. We have attempted to give it to them, they have not received it.

Chairman Pangelinan. Right. You have attempted to package the information required

Dr. Vince Akimoto. They have just requested for more and more information. Again, it's just the process.

Chairman Pangelinan. I want to assure the public that when the Legislature and this Committee receives a request to rezone on a piece of property that the Committee and the Legislature goes through and requests input from the same people that the Guam Land Use Commission gets input. So, if the Guam Land Use Commission receives your application, which solicits comments

from the application review committee (ARC) - those are the infrastructure people, the planning people, the environmental agencies and so forth. So, they all get a copy of the bill and is required by law - those are supposed to then... the Department of Land Management coordinates those responses, sends them to the Legislature so that the Legislature should be looking at the same information that the Guam Land Use Commission is looking at when they decide to rezone or not rezone a piece of property.

The system is set up so we don't do it in vacuum and we avoid making a decision on a rezoning bill without that kind of information that is necessary to make the best decision we can. The problem we run into is that these departments and agencies don't respond. It's the same as the Land Use Commission - the departments and agencies do not submit comments. That is the thing we are trying to cure. We send another letter to Land Management saying by law you are required to submit this land use report that tells the Legislature what the affect of this land zoning may have on the environment, on traffic, on DPW, on GPA, on water pressure and such. Then we can make that decision. But, we don't always get those responses. Some agencies are much better at responding than others.

In regards to rezoning without any information, the process is set up that requires these departments and agencies to submit the information. Just like the Land Use Commission, sometimes it takes a long time because the departments and agencies don't respond and the [GLUC] members send it back. They actually say, you go back and you get me the response for GPA or if they have a meeting, they may call GPA in and get the response immediately at that time. So they are also making the best decision they can.

I just want to assure the public that this process in that respect mirrors the decision making process [by GLUC] and the informational requirement in order to make these kinds of decisions. That's why we move ahead on these issues because we then push these departments and agencies to give us that information.

Senator Muna Barnes. Si Yu'os Ma'ase, Mr. Speaker. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to speak. I want to say for the record that I am glad you shared those sentiments because as in the process of the Legislative body, as a policy maker we too have that opportunity. Sometimes statutes permits us to where there is sometimes different avenues a constituent can go through to make sure that they get their request done. This is one of those. That is the job of a policy maker if the request is made. That doesn't mean we do anything on the cuff. We do have a process that we follow and I am glad, Mr. Chair that you shared that with the listening audience.

I do want to take the time to thank the panel members for being here inclusive of the mayor. To the engineer, thank you very much. I very rarely see engineers come in to support a project. It just means that there is a collaborative effort to make sure that this project is done right, that you guys are literally dotting your i and crossing your t. But more importantly, as we look at economic opportunity, as we look at bringing the medical community more - not just from the indigent side, but more on bringing the medical services to the village of Mangilao, which I would say is the central part – the heat beat – of the island.

I just want to say thank you, saina ma'ase for the work you do. I know that a lot of you, several of you wear different hats and continuing to bring medical services to the island but more importantly [those] coming home and taking care of our own people. Thank you and I want to say for the record, you do have my support.

Senator Frank Aguon. Thank you very much, Mr. Chair. Gentlemen, it is always a quandary whenever you are the final speaker because a lot of things have already been said. But it is very interesting that in light of the expansion of some of the other clinics on island, in light of the impending medical center that is going to be constructed and completed next year, in light of the challenges that GMH continues to experience - we just had an expansion of the emergency room and the intensive care unit, you continue to believe and understand exactly what our people need in terms of health care services.

I want to thank you very much from that perspective because not only do you service 46,000 patients but I anticipate with the expansion you will not only provide convenience and easier access for many of your patients, but more importantly you are looking at increasing your customer base so you can serve our community even more.

I preface my comments in light of the competitive nature in the health care industry on Guam. You have optimism and belief in the environment and the anticipated activities you will be taking place down the road. I certainly commend you for moving aggressively in investing millions of dollars for a brand new facility and most importantly as mentioned by Dr. Akimoto that you are looking at hiring some of our nurses that come out of the University of Guam, as well as Guam Community College so that holds very well for some of the programs that are there.

Thank you very much for reaching out to my office initially when this idea as being thought of in terms of who you would like to introduce of this legislation. I thought it was great that you were moving in the direction of constructing a medical facility in Mangilao addressing the health care concerns. Those two aspects are very sellable to me, especially living in the south trying to bring more services to our people in the south. But, the biggest selling point and what made it very easy for me to show my support and yes, you have my commitment was when you shared with me that you already have three or four locally grown doctors who are presently providing medical services in the mainland who have made commitments to come back home and to serve their community. To me, that was one of the biggest selling points in terms of stepping forward and saying, this is not only a wonderful idea to bring the clinic to Mangilao closer to our people, not only in central but also the south and also hiring some of our nurses coming out of UOG and GCC, most important bringing back some of our doctors that are locally grown, educated here who had to go off-island for further education and now are professionals in their own right and they want to bring their services back to our community.

So, thank you very much for always advocating for that because Dr. Nguyen I have known you for awhile and I know you have always looked at bringing back home grown doctors, physicians and professionals and this is again another token of what you have committed to this community and your entire facility.

Thank you very much and you have my support not only in this measure but continued success in your effort and thank you for providing a very badly needed service to our island and our community.

Si Yu'os Ma'ase. Thank you Mr. Chair. .

Dr. Vince Akimoto. If I could just comment on the issues brought up by the Senator from Maneggon. One of the biggest reasons we are having trouble with housing all the doctors that want to come back home - the village of Yona has produced extraordinary doctors in the last several years: Dr. Luis Cruz, Dr. Erica Flores Alfred, Dr. Jerry Castro, who is an ENT doctor who hopes to come next year, Dr. Frankie Mendiola, who an emergency room doctor and was at SDA over the past summer who we hope will come home, Dr. Jeffrey Cruz who is another doctor who has ties to Yona and there is a Dr. Leon Guerrero whose family lives on the hill in Yona – we met with her last week, she wants to come home and wants to join us the American Medical Cliinic.

We can count about a half a dozen physicians just from the village of Yona coming home and speaks well of the village in terms of the students from there getting into medical school and graduating. But the biggest thing is they all want to come home. There is one thing why Yona is producing so many doctors they don't want to drive to Tamuning to work in our clinic there, so we have to build them a clinic in Mangilao.

Why do those physicians come home and have a commitment to return? We don't know what the answer is. That is why we are building this clinic.

Chairman Pangelinan. There being no further comments, I would like to thank the panel for their presentation this morning.

This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 221-32. There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. 
Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 2 that the subject Lot No. 1106-2NEW, MUNICIPALITY OF MANGILAO, is 3 presently zoned "R-1" - Single-family residential zone. The subject Lot is fronting 4 Route 10, Mangilao. The property immediately to the northern side of the subject 5 lot, but separated from the lot by a road, is zoned "C" (Commercial), and is being 6 utilized as a commercial retail store (KNS Market). There are other commercial 7 lots in the immediate area, but not necessarily contiguous to the subject Lot. To 8 9 the east of the subject Lot, separated by Route 10, is another active commercial lot (Champion Sporting). 10

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that it is the intent of the owners to utilize the subject lot solely for medically related commercial purposes. In consideration of the expanding economy and medical needs of the population of Mangilao, and residents of southern Guam, the utilization of the property for medical services is

- 1 consistent and appropriate, and the application from its present zone to
- 2 Commercial ("C") would enable the designated property to provide economic
- 3 movement developing in the area for a needed private medical facility related
- 4 health care service purposes.
- The municipality of Mangilao has an expanding population base, and is the 5 site of the Guam Community College and the University of Guam. 6 populations health care demands are constantly increasing. A private medical 7 clinic providing needed medical services to the community would be compatible 8 with increasing the healthcare demands. Further, residents of the southern & 9 south-eastern areas of Guam are essentially residing in medically underserved 10 areas, and this proposed development would place additional medical services 11 within a much more convenient location, reducing the need to travel to Tamuning 12 and other central locations. 13
- Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to support the expanded use of existing properties in Guam that would provide economic benefits to property owners, and most importantly positively contribute to the creation of jobs by way of providing needed medical services t to the community.
- It is, further, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that the rezoning of Lot No. 1106-2NEW, MUNICIPALITY OF MANGILAO, be *solely* restricted for any category of medically related commercial activities.
- Section 2. Re-Zoning of Lot No. 1106-2NEW, located in the municipality of Mangilao, from Single Family Residential Zone ("R-1") to Commercial ("C"). Lot No. 1106-2NEW, MUNICIPALITY OF MANGILAO (formerly Municipality of Barrigada), TERRITORY OF GUAM, containing an area of approximately 172,292 +/- Sq. Ft., is hereby re-zoned from Residential

- 1 ("R-1") to Commercial ("C"). The real property map for Lot No. 1106-2NEW,
- 2 MUNICIPALITY OF MANGILAO (formerly Municipality of Barrigada), is
- 3 hereby incorporated and appended to this Act as EXHIBIT "A".
- 4 Section 3. Commercial Use Restricted for Medically Related
- 5 Enterprises. (a) The subject Lot No. 1106-2NEW, MUNICIPALITY OF
- 6 MANGILAO (formerly Municipality of Barrigada), zoned "C" pursuant to this
- 7 Act, is restricted to medically related commercial activities. For the purposes of
- 8 this Act, medically related commercial activity shall include, but is not limited to,
- 9 doctors office(s), doctors clinic, pharmacy, medical laboratory, radiological,



Bueñas Yan Hafa Adai: The Department has reviewed Bill 221-32 (COR) – AN ACT TO REZONING LOT NO. 1106-2NEW, IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF MANGILAO FROM SINGLE-FAMILY DWELLING ZONE (R1) TO COMMERCIAL (C)

Hereby submitted is the testimony for the above-described proposal. Based on the requirements of Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 61 Zoning Law, Article 3, §61301 we render the following:

The property is located adjacent to Route 10 and is currently zoned "R-1" (Single-Family Residential Dwelling) per Official Zoning Map of the municipality of Mangilao (1968). The Department maintains its support of non-residential use of lands particularly occurring adjacent to routed roads. Our support generally reflects the fact that residential uses in such areas may be considered non-conducive due to excessive traffic activities and other elements that may pose hazardous from typical residential development. Currently Route 10 serves as a major arterial link between the south and northern municipalities. Most recently property within 500 feet of the subject lot garnered both Guam Land Use Commission and executive support of a change of zone to "C" (Commercial) and currently maintains Champions Sporting Goods Store.

We further support this request as appropriate infrastructure is available at least along Route 10 where typical zoning schemes identify commercial strip zones at 200 feet from the routed easement's center line.

The Department would like to remind all concern that our Guam Legislature delegated land use development including zone changes through Public Law 1-88, as amended, to the Guam Land use Commission and the Department of Land Management. Furthermore, a viable zone change process exists, it is efficient, and considers all aspect of land use planning in protecting the community and our island's interest.

Comments:

1/ Should this proposed legislation become law, there is a potential of revenues generated in the form of building permits, real property taxes, and a business licence through the proposed zone change of Lot No. 1106-2NEW, containing an area of 172,292± square feet, from a Single Family Dwelling Zone (R1) to a Commercial Zone (C) for the purpose of establishing a medical and health care clinic. The proposed legislation would establish the said lot to be restricted, but not limited to, doctor's office(s), doctor's clinic, pharmacy, medical laboratory, radiological, physical therapy, and similar medically related applications. This would require building permits to construct such facilities, and thus would increase the value of real property taxes due to the Department of Revenue and Taxation. Assuming that a doctor's clinic was to be built inclusive of a medical laboratory, radiology division, physical therapy division, and pharmacy (similar to the likes of the TakeCare facility in Tamuning) with an estimated gross square feet count at approximately 20,000 square feet, the Bureau estimates that the Department of Public Works will receive \$12,000-\$15,000 of revenues generated in the form of a building permit. Per Department of Rev & Tax appraisal rates, the appraised value of the facility would be \$2,000,000. This would impose a building tax rate (0.388%) of \$7,760 and an additional land tax rate (0.0875%) of \$1,750. Also, a business license would be required for a medical facility in regards to accepting payment from patients, which would cost \$100 for such license. With the given information, the Bureau estimates that the amount of \$9,610 will be received Department of Revenue and Taxation in the form of additional real property taxes and a business license. Also, the Bureau estimates that there is the potential of revenue in the form of a zone change amendment (\$50) and certification of zoning (\$10) amounting to the total of \$60 to be received by the Department of Land Management.

Bill 221-32 is relative to re-zoning Lot. No. 1106-2NEW, located in Mangilao, from single-family residential (R-1) to Commercial (C) for purposes of establishing a medical clinic and health care related commercial activity.

The subject lot is presently zoned R-1 and is fronting Route 10 in Mangilao. The property immediately to the north side of the lot, but separated from the lot by an access road is zoned "C" Commercial and is being utilized as a retail store known as KNS Market. There are other commercial lots in the immediate area, but not necessarily contiguous to the subject lot. Immediately to the east of the subject lot, separated by Route 10, is another active commercial lot, known as Champion Sporting Goods Store.

The owners of the subject lot intend to utilize it solely for medically related commercial purposes. In consideration of the expanding economy and medical needs of the population of Mangilao, and residents of Southern Guam, the utilization of the property for medical services is consistent and appropriate. The application from its present zone to Commercial would enable the designated property to stimulate positive economic movement by way of providing a needed medical facility, and related health care services.

Our residents of southern and southeastern areas of Guam are essentially residing in medically underserved areas. This proposed development would place additional medical services within a much more convenient location, reducing the need to travel to Tamuning and other central locations.

The expanded use of this property in Mangilao would positively contribute to the creation of jobs by way of providing needed medical services to the community.

1/ Should this proposed legislation become law, there is a potential of revenues generated in the form of building permits, real property taxes, and a business licence through the proposed zone change of Lot No. 1106-2NEW, containing an area of 172,292± square feet, from a Single Family Dwelling Zone (R1) to a Commercial Zone (C) for the purpose of establishing a medical and health care clinic. The proposed legislation would establish the said lot to be restricted, but not limited to, doctor's office(s), doctor's clinic, pharmacy, medical laboratory, radiological, physical therapy, and similar medically related applications. This would require building permits to construct such facilities, and thus would increase the value of real property taxes due to the Department of Revenue and Taxation. Assuming that a doctor's clinic was to be built inclusive of a medical laboratory, radiology division, physical therapy division, and pharmacy (similar to the likes of the TakeCare facility in Tamuning) with an estimated gross square feet count at approximately 20,000 square feet, the Burcau estimates that the Department of Public Works will receive \$12,000-\$15,000 of revenues generated in the form of a building permit. Per Department of Rev & Tax appraisal rates, the appraised value of the facility would be \$2,000,000. This would impose a building tax rate (0.388%) of \$7,760 and an additional land tax rate (0.0875%) of \$1,750. Also, a business license would be required for a medical facility in regards to accepting payment from patients, which would cost \$100 for such license. With the given information, the Bureau estimates that the amount of \$9,610 will be received Department of Revenue and Taxation in the form of additional real property taxes and a business license. Also, the Bureau estimates that there is the potential of revenue in the form of a zone change amendment (\$50) and certification of zoning (\$10) amounting to the total of \$60 to be received by the Department of Land Management.
