The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:00 AM.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

#### Senator Frank B. Aguon, Jr.

The Committee on Guam Military Relocation, Veterans Affairs, and Judiciary is hereby called to order just for the information of the public, bills number 208-32 will be discussed inclusive of bill number 222-32. 208 is relative to providing additional funding source, additional source of funding to the Guam Housing Corporations housing trust fund by authorizing the transfer

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of the same of interest on security deposits arising from the landlord, tenant rental agreements bill number 222 is relative to crimes against minors and sex offender's registry for the information of the community notifications, initial notifications were sent out to the public on December 4<sup>th</sup> and also was followed up with an additional on December 11<sup>th</sup>. The printed media requirement was printed on December 5<sup>th</sup> and then likewise on December 11<sup>th</sup> so that meets the open government requirements. We're gonna go ahead and proceed with entertaining the first measure on the agenda. I know there's a request by the good Speaker, Speaker Ben Pangelinan to proceed with his legislation first, so we are gonna yield to that aside from that I just recognize and thank Speaker Pangelinan and also Senator Mike Limtiaco, thank you very much Senators for joining us this morning for this public hearing in conjunction with, before I turn the floor over to Speaker Pangelinan to just highlight the legislation that he has sponsored I would like to state for the record that the committee has received written testimony from the Bureau of Statistics and Plans on this particular measure and then also from Rapadas Psychological Services, Mr. Juan Rapadas, Speaker Pangelinan on your legislation.

#### Speaker Ben Pangelinan

Thank you and Si Yu'os Ma'ase' for this accommodation Mr. Chairman, Mr. Chairman on the onset bill 222 is a product of the work of the Attorney General's office more specifically the, Ms. Carol Sanchez on the issue of trying to bring Guam into full compliance with SORNA which is Sexual offender sentencing, monitoring, apprehending, registering and tracking program also known as SMART. Trying to bring those elements of the sexual offenders' registry program into full compliance for Guam. Guam is in a review by the Federal Government and the work that's been done so far by the Attorney Generals' Office we are in substantial compliance. However, there are some amendments to statutes that were done which now require us to make changes to those statutes, to ensure that we come into full compliance of that, there are 14 elements and I think Guam is, I think only 3 or 4 elements, are we making any changes to the statutes and some of it just involves moving the statute and the classification of the statute from a tiered program level 1, level2, level3 offender program classification and moving that so that they are in the proper classification to bring us into substantial compliance. So, I do want to give the Attorney General's Office and Carol the opportunity of course but most importantly just give them the credit for working on this our office has continued to work with them to ensure that on the legislature side we are able to present the legislation for consideration by the body that would bring us into full compliance. But the work and the analysis has been done by the Attorney General's Office and there Federal partners so we thank them for their efforts and, and certainly look forward to the, the discussion on this bill thank you and Si Yu'os Ma'ase'.

#### Senator Frank B. Aguon Jr.

Thank you very much Speaker Pangelinan and obviously Ms. Sanchez is already at the table I only have her signed up for this particular measure so if there is anyone else in the audience who would like to provide testimony please proceed to the table to your right, please identify yourself for the record and proceed thank you.

#### Ms. Carol Sanchez

Buenas Senators thank you. My name is Carol Sanchez I'm the Deputy Attorney General for the Family Juvenile Division of the office of the Attorney General of Guam.

Basically as Senator Pangelinan mentioned, the Sex Offender Registry, actually Guam Sex Offender Registry, we fall under the Federal mandates and our island receives federal funding a big, a good chunk of monies that are provided through the burn grant and some other grants that actually fund not only the Guam Sex Offender Registry but also which is also the Judiciary of Guam, but also the Guam Police Department and some funding does come to our office for, for an Attorney position.





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Basically every year what happens is them the SMART office, which is out of the Office Justice Programs, they monitor all the jurisdictions to see whether or not they are compliant with respect to the Federal mandates and if they are not in compliance within a certain period of time, it eventually will affect their federal funding. We submitted the initial amendment to the first, we were deemed non compliant so submitted the maybe amendments to the Bill and got us in to substantial compliance at the time we didn't address the issue of juvenile registration because it was the, at the time it was controversial because a lot of states and jurisdictions including Guam had told the Fed's, Federal Counterparts that you know it would be breaching confidentiality. We all had some issues with that and so we kept it out at the time until they made a decision as to what would occur that happened they enacted some supplemental guidelines in 2011.

January 2011 which at the same time we had submitted our public law and it was deemed in substantial compliance but at the same time they had provided us documentation with respect to some changes that were necessary I'm not sure if the good Senators all have a copy? Ok, which is the substantial prelimination review; revise for the territory of Guam dated January 2011. Basically the amendment made to the current law are all amendments that were required for us under the, the actual revise report that was submitted to Guam and the Speaker, as Senator Pangelinan mentioned, some of it is just mere changes to the crimes because we have tiered it, it placed it in the wrong tiering system and there were some deletions to the aggravated murder because that alone in itself doesn't constitute a sex offense and so they felt it wasn't really necessary we actually asked a question whether or not we needed it there and they told us to go ahead and strike it out because in and of itself it shouldn't be a register able offense unless it's in commission of some type of CFC crime and at that point it would become register able. So those are the changes that were made.

I know that when the bill had, when we had worked on the bill I did have an over site on my part and I know I brought it up to Ms. Lisa and I thank Erica Perez from the Guam Sex Offender Registry who noted is, is in the definition section which is subsection 89.01 under definitions D2 under A it shows sections 16.30 because that's the aggravated murder charge we went ahead and request that that be deleted and instead of adding a subsection X to this it might be simple to just go ahead and bring 22.35 up to A. That way we don't have to keep messing around with the letters.

So on that, that's the only correction that I'm requesting on the record and in this particular bill what's important, what this does address, the importance of this actual bill is that it actually now addresses the juvenile registration and what it does is it under our current law. There are, it's very limited as far as juveniles being eligible or being qualified under the Guam Sex Offender Registry there's only like two circumstances really one is if there charged as an adult for, for a sex crime which means they must be 16 years or older and it has to be a first or second degree felony and if there charged with that offense then they would be, they would fall under the, the regular mandates of the Guam Sex Offender Registry and comply with the regular requirements, like as though they were treated as an adult.

The second classification that this talks about is the registration of juvenile offenders who are charged in the juvenile family court the only offenders under are current statute are offenders who commit severe aggravated sexual crimes basically forced rape or sexual offenses where the person is incapacitated or drugged. So, there's really just a limited amount of juvenile that will be required to register under this. So what this does is it provides greater protection the juveniles that will be registering will be on a non public data base that will be run by the Judiciary of Guam.





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Guam Sex Offender Registry and I worked on this legislation not only with BSP, Ms. Lola Leon Guerrero, as you mentioned has submitted written testimony, she's we aware of these charges and I know she supports the bill. We worked together with the Judiciary of Guam who's right behind me. I have the Chief Probation and Second Deputy Probation Office, Chief Probation as well as Ruben Payumo who actually manages the Guam Sex Offender Registry. And we have actively worked locally on this together you know the bill was drafted, it was given to them for their input and prior to even making these amendments. We all sat down and discussed the actual review process I know the, Ann Keith of the legal council was present and so we are all kind of on page of what's going on. I just spoke with Udonis Mendiola this morning, the Director of Department of Youth Affairs, and he also informed me that he did submit on behalf or there was a submission on behalf of the department supporting the bill as well.

So, basically that's what it does, it provides, it enhances the protection because if we don't include this clause really the juveniles will be subjected to this whole registry and they would be on the public registry and so what we are trying to do is we are trying to ensure we continue to provide them that, that full protection that we can as far as public is concerned. And so with this legislation it would create that non-public, non-public registry and the courts are ready to work on that, I think we are actually on pulling all the files to ensure that we classify the right ones and also this legislation we also worked with are counter parts in the Feds, we have a SMART senior policy advisor Ms. Lori McPherson I had done all the corrections just last month and at that point she had mentioned everything is fine as far as the legislation is concerned.

These are all mandatory requirements that they are requesting change or make amendments to, that's the reason it's being submitted is because they are mandatory requirements and I just don't want us to be affected in any ways as far as are compliance is concerned because we do get Federal monies that do provide very critical you know services to the community and I don't want that compromised there are some recommendations which I did speak with Senator Pangelinan's Office about.

I'll be attending an actual policy advisors meeting with our senior policy advisor and some other jurisdictions in the next month or so and at that time I'm gonna further discuss with them because they were discussing with us other areas of juvenile concerns that they had it's not mandatory at this point there isn't a need to work on the legislation for it, but, if I do go back there and there is some other changes then I would be requesting some further amendments but at this time these are all the amendments that are requested for.

For the most part the Senator mentioned a lot of it has just a matter of correcting the tearing system of some of the crimes and also the definition section of aggravated sexual, I believe he included one word that or failed to include a word it just offsetted the definition of sexual, aggravated sexual crimes so that's corrected in this legislation. And, I apologize I'm not too sure what page it's at, but, I can point it out just so that you guys are aware. It is on page 3 of the bill under section 89.01 62B where it says 14 years of age on lines 24 I'm sorry 14 years of age or younger.

It's actually supposed to be 14 years of age at the time of the offense because that's where the classification point of whose gonna be on the non public registry so anyone under 14 will not even be considered a register able offender. It would be 14 years or older and again it's only aggravated sexual abuse and like I mentioned under the Federal statutes its only forced rape or criminal sexual conduct that occurs where there use of drugs or the persons incapacitated and basically those are the amendment being made you know.





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Our office fully supports this legislation, we believe that it's necessary we want to ensure that Guam remains in compliance with the Federal mandates, we think that it's a plus because it does provide that greater protection for juveniles I know it's always been a concern before the courts and for defense attorneys but this is actually an enhanced protection for their client to ensure that they are not just placed on the public registry without these amendments in essence they should be in the public registry but we were holding back because we knew that this was forth coming and we just did not want to address it and put it here and then have to place them on the public registry and affect them, their future and then take them off later so it's best that we have this addressed first and then now we can move forward and place them on this non public registry.

#### Senator Frank B. Aguon Jr.

Thank you very much Carol for your testimony this morning just t recognize are representatives from the court, the probation officers that are here and sexual registry component. I wanna just also extend the appreciation of the committee Carol for working with all of the other stake holders in this entire process because obviously anytime that there's gonna be adjustments to existing code it's always helpful to bring them to the table thank you very much I'm gonna open up the table to the Speaker but before I do so I'm gonna recognize Senator Tony Ada, Senator Chris Duenas, and Senator Tina Muna Barnes whose the Vice Chair of the committee thank you very much Senators for joining us this morning, Speaker Pangelinan any questions.

#### Speaker Ben Pangelinan

No questions other than again just to express our deep appreciation to the office of the Attorney General and Ms. Sanchez and of course all of the other partners that she's been working with over the years I think that you know, this is something that I, we certainly support we certainly, we can get colleagues support on it and it's just to ensure that we handle the registration of minors in an appropriate manor such that we're able to know who they are but also give them the opportunity as minors to be able to rehabilitate and move on with their lives and, and one way of doing that of course is ensuring that we do keep them on a track but we do keep them off the public registry until such time of course as they deviate from norm behavior at a later time when there adults but certainly I want to thank you and all of the partners that you had working on this so SI Yu'os Ma'ase.

#### Ms. Carol Sanchez

Thank you very much Speaker.

#### Senator Frank B. Aguon Jr.

Thank you very much Speaker Pangelinan, Senator Limtiaco.

#### Senator Mike Limtiaco

Thank you Mr. Chair the only question I have is in the event that there's another, another offence will the, will the offence that was adjudicated in family court, would that also be made available on their sex registry.

#### Ms. Carol Sanchez

You know what actually the, the registry Senator is basically a public notification in the, in the specifics as to juveniles what it's for is just basically notification to the other jurisdictions that this juvenile offenders there so there are ways for Defense Attorneys and Prosecuting Attorneys to get this information, juvenile records through the court process of subpoenas and what not at the time you know, they would subpoena are division.





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The current process they have right now is basically they don't have access to are records often times Defense Attorneys are aware of it because they might of represented them as well when they were juveniles but Prosecuting Attorneys may or may not be aware of it they may know about it because of police reports or CPS reports and what they would have to do is subpoena are division and we don't ever give them the records, the records actually go to the courts and then the courts based on are family court act will determine whether or not to, we give it to the court in camera under, under seal and if the court believes that this particular record is essential to the disposition of the criminal case before it, then the judge will make that determination to release the records, so the registry is not meant to give any information out, it's meant to, only for law enforcement as you, under the actual thing it does say non public registry that will be provided to the National and what that is, is just basically like I said if this juvenile will be moving from state to state at least the, the registries across the jurisdictions will be aware that juveniles entering into the jurisdictions.

#### Senator Mike Limtiaco

Ok, but I'm the event that there's an additional offense and they are no longer a juvenile does the offense that was adjudicated in the family court now become part of that public record.

Ms. Carol Sanchez
No it will not.

Senator Mike Limtiaco

It does not.

#### Ms. Carol Sanchez

Yea it will not become a part of the public record.

#### Senator Mike Limtiaco

And is there, what is the rationality behind that.

#### Ms. Carol Sanchez

Juvenile records are generally sealed documents and there even, even as we you know just on a daily basis any records coming out of my division. It either needs to be through summon, subpoena, or court order none of those records are released to anybody because of the statute being very, very clear that you know it's confidential when we handle juvenile cases. They're not really considered convicted of crimes there adjudicated delinquents and cause we want to service them and treat them, there are those cases where there gonna be treated as adults because of the classification of crime and because of their age.

But as far as, as far as juvenile records are concerned they, they remain sealed and confidential you know, release of those information's is actually a crime so you know, we're prohibited from releasing unless we are court ordered I mean even when we work with the military jag offices we kind of have to go through a whole process with and even go through the court and request the court to release the records to there, there military counter parts just because of the whole process and to ensure protection of the juveniles.





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#### Speaker Ben Pangelinan

And the sealing of those records is not limited to sexual offenders.

#### Ms. Carol Sanchez

Correct, across the board, yes.

#### Senator Mike Limtiaco

Ok, thank you

#### Senator Frank B. Aguon Jr.

Thank you very much Senator Limtiaco, Senators any other questions, following questions if not Ms. Sanchez thank you very much and the committee will be working with your office to just make those slight modifications as you hinted to during your presentation.

#### Ms. Carol Sanchez

And I just want to point out to the Senator that I am working with the Speaker on another piece of legislation that will address and I know that Senator Ada's Office had inquired as well to address the Romeo and Juliet issue we are working on the changes to the actual automatic certification statute that will allow the Prosecutor Attorneys discretion to drop down to family court those particular cases where you know a juvenile commits a crime and there, there, their intention were not the intent of the actual crime such as the Romeo and Juliet cases and also in cases where we have burglary where its first degree felony and you know, the minor was used by family members or parents to be a look out those kind of cases will, will give the Prosecutors discretion to, to drop into family court if we feel like rehabilitation is the better course and I know, I'm working closely with Ms. Lisa on that one right now ok.

#### Senator Frank B. Aguon Jr.

Thank you very much again for your testimony this morning, just for the information of the public the committee will continue to receive testimony on this legislation and subsequent legislation that will be discussed very shortly for the next ten days before we close out on the committee report thank you again Ms. Sanchez.

Bueñas yan Hafa Adai Chairman Aguon,

The Bureau of Statistics and Plans (BSP) appreciates this opportunity to offer its written testimony on Bill 222-32 that will amend regulations relative to crime against minors and sex offender registry.

As you may know, Guam implemented the provisions of the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) under Title I of the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006 (Public Law 109-248) with the passage of Guam P.L. 30-223. This was made possible by the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Sex Offender Sentencing, Monitoring, Apprehending, Registering, and Tracking (SMART Office) technical assistance provided to Guam's Sex Offender Registry Committee comprised of the Office of the Attorney General, the Bureau of Statistics and Plans, and the Judiciary of Guam.

SORNA was enacted to protect the public from convicted sex offenders by establishing a comprehensive national system for the registration and notification of those offenders. SORNA provides for a comprehensive set of minimum standards for sex offender registration and notification in the United States, the District of Columbia, the principle U.S. territories, and federally recognized Indian tribes. The Bureau of Justice Assistance will impose a 10 percent penalty for States, District of Columbia, U.S. territories and federally recognized Indian tribes that fail to substantially

implement SORNA by July 27, 2011, and for any year thereafter on their Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant Program. Guam made the timeline to only substantially implement SORNA requirements with the passage of P.L. 30-223.

In collaboration with the Office of the Attorney General and the SMART Office, proposed SORNA amendments were drafted by the Office of the Attorney General and pre reviewed by the SMART Office. The outcome of the draft review finds Guam to be in full compliance versus substantial compliance, and ensures Guam sustains its full funding under the Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant Program. We are pleased to see our collaborative efforts with the Office of the Attorney General and the SMART Office is now in bill form and ready to be heard.

The passage of Bill Number 222-32 will bring Guam into full compliance with SORNA. It will add a section in Guam's law to clarify juvenile sex offender and registration requirements to include registration in a non public data base; reclassify some of the crime in Guam's law as they were not properly tiered under the three tier level; add additional crime pursuant to SORNA recommendation that was not included in Guam's law; and correct the juvenile definition under aggravated sexual assault.

The Bureau of Statistics and Plans strongly supports Bill Number 222-32(COR) provided that no major changes are made to it.

#### Dear Senator Aguon:

I hereby submit this written testimony in full support of Bill 222-32 which amends GCA89.01 and 89.02 in the above sections as noted.

I believe in the basic tenor of the amendments that protects the identity of younger adjudicated juvenile sex offenders in the family court. These amendments appear to help clarify the rules for the Guam juvenile sex offender listing and determine who may or may not be included in the list; in other words, which juvenile sex offender would be exempt from public display of their name and pictures on the World Wide Web. The clarification was sorely needed.

It has always been my position that younger juvenile sexual offenders' names and pictures should not be displayed ever. It is good public policy to always proceed cautiously and deliberately. Even in the case of older juvenile sexual offenders, there should be proper vetting of the case before their names and pictures are published. The population of juvenile sex offenders has always been a complex, heterogeneous population with varying degrees of trauma history, criminal history, dangerousness, and prognosis. They cannot be looked at through only one lens of punishment and adjudication.

Legislatively and judicially, this can be a difficult prospect to have empathy and consideration for these juvenile sex offenders that may actually commit seemingly heinous acts. However, in my time as the department of Youth Affairs Psychologist for more than ten years, I have always believed that discretion and taking a step back on all cases is probably more prudent in the long run and may actually save time, energy, and heartache for all parties involved.

This is good legislation that does try to err on the side of common sense and fairness.

Thank you for allowing me to submit testimony for this extremely important legislation that is essential in moving forward the one part of the juvenile justice agenda for Guam. If there are any questions regarding this testimony please do not hesitate to contact me.

### SORNA Substantial Implementation Review (Revised) Territory of Guam

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office of Sex Offender Sentencing, Monitoring, Apprehending, Registering, and Tracking (SMART) would like to thank the Territory of Guam (Guam) for the extensive work that has gone into its effort to substantially implement Title I of the Adam Walsh Act, the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA). The SMART Office has completed its review of Guam's SORNA substantial implementation packet and has found that Guam has substantially implemented SORNA.

Guam has previously submitted materials for a substantial implementation review and the SMART Office issued reports on those materials in September of 2009. Since that time, Guam has passed additional legislation, and Guam's current submission consists of all of the previously-submitted materials plus Guam Public Law 428-30, which was effective as of midnight of the date of its signing, December 30, 2010. In addition, email and phone correspondence with the Guam Attorney General's Office filled in gaps in information and procedure, which informed our review.

Our review of these materials follows the outline of the SMART Office Substantial Implementation Checklist-Revised, which contains 14 sections addressing the SORNA requirements. Under each section, we indicate whether Guam meets the SORNA requirements of that section or deviates from the requirements in some way. In instances of deviation, we specify where the departure(s) from a particular requirement does not substantially disserve the purposes of that requirement.

While Guam is encouraged to work toward rectifying deviations from requirements in order to achieve full implementation of SORNA, this is not required for substantial implementation purposes. This report is an exhaustive review and is intended to detail every area in which the territory has not met SORNA standards.

We encourage you to review the information below, share it with relevant stakeholders in the state, and get back in touch with us to develop a strategy to address these remaining issues.

#### I. Immediate Transfer of Information

SORNA requires that when an offender initially registers or updates his information in a jurisdiction, that that registration information be immediately sent to other jurisdictions where the offender has to register, as well as to NCIC/NSOR and the jurisdiction's public sex offender registry website.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### II. Offenses the Must Be Included in the Registry

SORNA requires that certain federal, military, and foreign offenses are included in a jurisdiction's registration scheme. In addition, SORNA requires that the jurisdiction capture certain sex offenses, both offenses from its jurisdiction and from other SORNA registration jurisdictions, in its registration scheme. SORNA also requires that certain adjudications of delinquency are included in a jurisdiction's registration scheme.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### III. Tiering of Offenses

SORNA requires that offenses be classified based on the nature of the offense of conviction. The SMART Office has reviewed all statutes identified in the substantial implementation submission package and has identified Guam's placement of these statutes within the SORNA three tier levels. Guam correctly places its statutes within at least the minimum appropriate SORNA tiers, with the following exceptions (see the Appendix, "Guam State Statutes" for information about Guam's classification of its offenders and associated registration requirements):

#### • 9 GSA § 25.15(a)(2) First Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct, Victim 14-16

Placement of this statute in Level Three (Tier I) does not meet SORNA's requirements.

This statute will encompass acts which would require a tier III classification, namely, "sexual acts" with minors as defined by 18 U.S.C. §2246. It should be noted that a factual scenario supporting a conviction under this statute would likely also support a conviction for Incest under 9 GSA § 31.15, which is classified as a Level One (SORNA Tier III) Offense.

#### • 9 GSA § 25.20(a)(2) Second Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct, Victim 14-16

Placement of this statute in Level Three (Tier I) does not meet SORNA's requirements.

This statute will encompass acts which would require a tier II classification, namely, "sexual conduct" with minors as defined by 18 U.S.C. §2246. It should be noted that a factual scenario supporting a conviction under this statute would likely also support a conviction for Incest under 9 GSA § 31.15, which is classified as a Level One (SORNA Tier III) Offense.

The SMART Office has considered these deviations from SORNA's requirement, and has determined that they do not substantially disserve the purposes of this requirement.

#### IV. Required Registration Information

SORNA requires that the jurisdiction collect certain pieces of information from and for each offender that it registers, and requires that the jurisdiction keep that registration information, in a digitized form, in its registry.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### V. Where Registration is Required

SORNA requires that the jurisdiction register an offender if the jurisdiction is the one in which he is convicted or incarcerated. In addition, SORNA requires that the jurisdiction register offenders who reside, work, or attend school in the jurisdiction.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### VI. Initial Registration: Generally

SORNA requires that when an offender is incarcerated within the jurisdiction, registration must occur before release from imprisonment for the registration offense. Similarly, when an offender is sentenced within the jurisdiction, but not incarcerated, SORNA requires that registration occur within three business days of sentencing. Finally, when an offender has been convicted, sentenced, or incarcerated in another jurisdiction (including federal or military court), the jurisdiction must register the offender within three business days of the offender establishing residence, employment, or school attendance within the jurisdiction. SORNA also requires that, during the initial registration process, the jurisdiction inform the offender of his registration duties and require the offender to acknowledge in writing that he understands those duties.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### VII. Initial Registration: Retroactive Classes of Offenders

SORNA requires that each registration jurisdiction have a procedure in place to recapture three categories of sex offenders: those who are currently incarcerated or under supervision, either for the predicate sex offense or for some other crime; those who are already registered or subject to a pre-existing sex offender registration requirement under the jurisdiction's law; and those who reenter the jurisdiction's criminal justice system because of a conviction for some other felony crime (whether or not it is a sex offense).

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### VIII. Keeping the Registration Current

SORNA requires that when a sex offender resides in a jurisdiction, that the offender immediately appear in-person to update his or her name, residence, employment, school attendance, and termination of residence. When an offender works in a jurisdiction, but does not

reside or attend school there, SORNA requires that the offender immediately appear in-person to update employment-related information. When an offender attends school in a jurisdiction, but does not reside or work there, SORNA requires that the offender immediately appear in-person to update school-related information.

SORNA also requires that when an offender resides in a jurisdiction, that the sex offender immediately update any changes to his or her email addresses, internet identifiers, telephone communications, vehicle information, and temporary lodging information.

In addition, SORNA requires that when an offender notifies the jurisdiction of his intent to relocate to another country to live, work or attend school, or of his intent to travel to another country, that the jurisdiction do three things: immediately notify any other jurisdiction where the offender is either registered, or is required to register, of that updated information; immediately notify the United States Marshals Service, and immediately update NCIC/NSOR.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### IX. Verification/Appearance Requirements

SORNA requires that offenders register for a duration of time, and make in-person appearances at the registering agency, based on the tier of the offense of conviction.

#### A. Frequency of Registration

SORNA requires that offenders register for a duration of time based on the tier of the offense of conviction. Specifically, SORNA requires that SORNA Tier I offenders register for 15 years, SORNA Tier II offenders register for 25 years, and that SORNA Tier III offenders register for life.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### **B.** Duration of Registration

SORNA requires that offenders make in-person appearances at the registering agency based on the tier of the offense of conviction. Specifically, SORNA requires that SORNA Tier I offenders appear once a year, that SORNA Tier II offenders appear every six months, and that SORNA Tier III offenders appear every three months.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

### X. Registry Website Requirements

SORNA requires that each jurisdiction maintain a public sex offender registry website and publish certain registration information on that website. SORNA also requires that certain information not be displayed on a jurisdiction's public registry website.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

### XI. Community Notification

SORNA requires that each jurisdiction disseminate certain initial and updated registration information to particular agencies within the jurisdiction. In addition, SORNA requires that each jurisdiction also disseminate certain initial and updated registration information to the community.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

### XII. Failure to Register as a Sex Offender: Territory Penalty

SORNA requires that each jurisdiction, other than a federally recognized Indian tribe, provide a criminal penalty that includes a maximum term of imprisonment that is greater than one year for the failure of a sex offender to comply with their registration requirements.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

### XIII. When a Sex Offender Fails to Appear for Registration

SORNA requires that when a jurisdiction is notified that a sex offender intends to reside, be employed, or attend school in its jurisdiction, and that offender fails to appear for registration as required, that the jurisdiction receiving that notice inform the originating jurisdiction (the jurisdiction that provided the initial notification) that the sex offender failed to appear for registration.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

### XIV. When a Jurisdiction has Information that a Sex Offender may have Absconded

SORNA requires that when a jurisdiction has information that a sex offender may have absconded, that the jurisdiction take certain actions in terms of investigating the absconder and notifying various law enforcement agencies.

Guam meets all of the SORNA requirements in this section.

#### Conclusion

Guam put forth exceptional work and effort in adopting SORNA and enhancing its sex offender registration and notification system.

### **Appendix: Guam Statutes**

The SMART Office has reviewed all of Guam's statutes identified in its substantial implementation submission package and has identified Guam's placement of these statutes within the tiering structure created in Title I of the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006, the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA). Unless indicated in the notes herein, the SMART office has not reviewed any statutes (or subsections) that were not included in the legislation provided by Guam.

In reviewing Guam's statutes, the SMART Office understands that Guam has three categories of registrants for purposes of its duration of registration and frequency of registration requirements.

Guam utilizes an inverted numbering system to that used in SORNA; Guam's "Level One" is its highest classification, followed by Levels Two and Three:

- A level one offender is required to register for life, with quarterly verification appearances;
- A level two offender is required to register for 25 years with semi-annual verification appearances; and
- A level three offender is required to register for 15 years with annual verification appearances.

### **SORNA Tier I Offenses**

SORNA requires that Tier I offenders register for a minimum of 15 years and annually verify registration information. The following offenses listed in Guam's statutes would require, at a minimum, Tier I registration requirements under SORNA.

9 GCA § 22.35	Unlawful Restraint
9 GSA § 25.30	Fourth Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct
9 GSA § 25.35	Assault with Intent to Commit Criminal Sexual Conduct
9 GSA § 28.49	Obscenity: Distribution or Possession

SORNA requires registration under this statute if the offense relates to child pornography.

9 GCA § 28.50 Participation in Obscenity

SORNA requires registration under this statute if the offense relates to child pornography.

### 9 GSA § 70.35 Invasion of Privacy

### **SORNA Tier II Offenses**

SORNA requires that Tier II offenders register for a minimum of 25 years and semiannually verify registration information. The following offenses listed in Guam's statutes would require, at a minimum, Tier II registration requirements under SORNA.

9 GSA § 25.20 Second Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct

Every subsection of this offense except for (a)(1) will be classified as a tier II offense under SORNA.

9 GCA § 28.20	Promoting Prostitution (minor victim)
9 GCA § 28.25	Abetting Prostitution (minor victim)
9 GCA § 28.30	Compelling Prostitution (minor victim)
9 GSA § 28.51	Obscenity: Employment of a Minor

SORNA only requires registration under this statute if the offense relates to child pornography.

9 GCA § 28.52 Use of One's Own Child in Obscene Acts (minor victim)

SORNA only requires registration under this statute if the offense relates to child pornography.

9 GCA § 28.80 Photography of Minors' Sexual Acts (minor victim)

9 GSA § 31.15 Incest

SORNA only requires registration under this statute if the offense relates to sexual intercourse.

### **SORNA Tier III Offenses**

SORNA requires that Tier III offenders register for life and quarterly verify registration information. The following offenses listed in Guam's statutes would require, at a minimum, Tier III registration requirements under SORNA.

9 GSA § 22.30 Felonious Restraint

9 GSA § 22.40 Child Stealing (minor victim)

9 GSA § 25.15 First Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct
9 GSA § 25.20(a)(1) Second Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct
9 GSA § 25.25 Third Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct

### **Further Review**

The SMART Office notes that Guam also registers the following offenses; however, those offenses, without the commission of (or the attempt or conspiracy to commit) a sexual offense, do not require registration under SORNA:

9 GSA § 16.30	Aggravated Murder
9 GSA § 22.50	Custodial Interference (minor victim)
9 GCA § 28.65	Indecent Exposure



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
