II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

<u>Vice Chairman Cruz</u>: We have five bills on the agenda today and unfortunately the Chairman is not present this morning and so I, as Vice Chairman has been asked to conduct this hearing.

The next item on the agenda is Bill 257-32, An Act to Amend §4107, Chapter 4, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, to Amend Sections 5 and 6 of Public Law 30-37, to Amend Section 7 of Public Law 31-76 and to Amend Section 1107(g), Chapter 1, Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Enhancing I Maga'lahen Guahan's Comprehensive Program and Financial Plan through identifying the Guam Department of Education, the University of Guam, and the Guam Community College Appropriations and to increase the transparency, accountability, and planning the Budget Reporting of Tax Credits.

The sponsor for this legislation is Senator Ben Pangelinan and on his behalf I will read his bill sponsor statement for Bill 257:

Every fiscal year, the Governor is required to submit his Executive Budget Request to the Guam Legislature usually by the end of January for the next fiscal year. In this request, the governor includes details of his proposed appropriation levels for each department and agency of the government of Guam. What we have seen this past fiscal year was the Governor not specifically providing his level of funding for the education agencies—namely the Guam Department of Education, the University of Guam, and the Guam Community College—leaving the Legislature having to guess or read his mind to determine his priorities for education. Bill No. 257-32 seeks to remedy this by mandating that the Governor delineate the specific appropriation amounts to the GDOE, UOG, and GCC toward enhancing his overall Executive Budget Request and in doing so, providing the Legislature with his priorities for funding the education agencies of this government.

Additionally, Bill No. 257-32 also seeks to enhance the Governor's Executive Budget Request by increasing transparency and accountability in the Executive Branch's reporting of tax credits. Tax credits diminishes the Guam Legislature's ability to most accurately estimate revenues every fiscal year which also hampers the ability to prioritize funding for the education agencies and other departments and agencies of the government of Guam.

Written testimony was provided on Bill 257 by the Governor's Office and I will note for the record that in anticipation of this hearing, the Committee sent letters of invitation to the Governor and Lt. Governor, the AG, BBMR, Rev & Tax, DOA, OPA, the Mayor's Council of Guam, GDOE, Chamber. GEDA, UOG and GCC. The Chair will recognize that there are no individuals in the public hearing room at this time for the hearing. I will note for the record that written testimony was provided on behalf of the Governor's Office and will be part of the record.

There being no one to testify and the hearing having been called, the Committee will find that Bill 257 has been properly noticed and heard by the Committee.

This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 257. There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. AN ACT TO AMEND § 4107, CHAPTER 4, TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO AMEND SECTIONS 5 AND 6 OF PUBLIC LAW 30-37, TO AMEND SECTION 7 OF PUBLIC LAW 31-76 AND TO AMEND SECTION 1107(g), CHAPTER 1, TITLE 11 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ENHANCING I MAGA'LÅHEN GUÅHAN'S COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM AND FINANCIAL PLAN THROUGH IDENTIFYING THE GUAM DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM, AND THE GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE APPROPRIATIONS AND TO INCREASE TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY, AND PLANNING THE BUDGET REPORTING IN CREDITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

I Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan

- 2 finds that it is imperative that I Maga'låhen Guåhan's comprehensive
- 3 program and financial plan, also known as the Executive Budget Request or
- 4 "budget document," include details of I Maga'låhen Guåhan's proposed
- 5 appropriation levels of the education agencies of the government of Guam.
- 6 Such knowledge of I Maga'låhen Guåhan's level of funding to the
- 7 education agencies of the government of Guam is paramount to the ability
- 8 for the public and I Liheslaturan Guåhan to ascertain I Maga'låhen
- 9 Guåhan's intent to prioritize the education agencies of the government of
- 10 Guam.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the FY 2014 Executive Budget Request did not delineate the specific appropriation amounts to the Guam Department of Education (GDOE), the University of Guam (UOG), and the Guam Community College (GCC) and that such omission of the detailed amounts that I Maga'lahen Guahan intended on providing these education agencies hampers I Liheslatura's ability to properly plan and prepare the General Appropriations Act of each fiscal year. Collectively, the appropriations to these education agencies represent a significant percentage of the entire government of Guam funds available to appropriate and it is not prudent to leave I Liheslaturan Guåhan to read I Maga'låhen Guåhan's mind to determine his priorities.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the authorization and awarding of tax credits diminishes I Liheslatura's ability to most accurately estimate revenues every fiscal year which hampers the ability to prioritize funding for the education agencies and other departments and agencies of the government of Guam.

Therefore, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* intends on enhancing the requirements of *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* in producing and transmitting his Executive Budget Request to *I Liheslatura* by mandating the delineation of the appropriation amounts to the GDOE, the UOG, and the GCC and the identification of tax credits, from Fiscal Years 2015 and so forth.

Section 2. Section 4107, Chapter 4, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:

"§ 4107. Governor's Recommendation.

(a) The Governor shall formulate the program and financial plan to be recommended to the Legislature after considering the territorial agency proposed program and financial plans, and other programs and alternatives

- that he deems appropriate. The plan shall include his recommended goals
- 2 and policies, recommended plans to implement the goals and policies,
- 3 recommended budget for the succeeding fiscal year and recommended
- 4 revenue measures to support the budget.

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- 5 (b) The Governor shall present the proposed comprehensive program and financial plan in a message to the Legislature not later than 6 7 January 31 prior to each fiscal year. If the Governor is in the first year of his 8 first term or an additional non-consecutive term, then the message shall be presented not later than April 8 of that same year. The message shall be 9 10 accompanied by a budget document which shall contain the Governor's 11 recommended goals, plans and appropriations. The budget document shall 12 be furnished each member of the Legislature and each department or agency of the Government. The budget document shall contain the following 13 14 information:
 - (1) The coordinated program goals and objectives that the Governor recommends to guide the decisions on the proposed program plans and budget appropriations;
 - (2) The program and budget recommendations of the Governor for the succeeding fiscal year which shall delineate the program and budget recommendations of the Governor for the Guam Department of Education, the University of Guam, and the Guam Community College, among the other line and semi-autonomous agencies of the government of Guam;
 - (3) A summary of the Territory's receipts in the last fiscal year, a revised estimate for the current fiscal year, and an estimate for the succeeding year;

Such annual report *shall* detail the following:

(1) For tax credits, a list of tax credit recipients' company name and business license number by the dollar amount of tax credits requested, by the dollar amount of tax credits claimed and authorized by the Department of Revenue and Taxation, by date of the letter requesting the tax credit, by the date such letter was received by the Guam Economic Development Authority, by the date such letter was received by the Department of Revenue and Taxation, by the month the tax credit was claimed, and by the public law and/or section in the

Guam Code Annotated from which the Department of Revenue and Taxation authorized such tax credit(s). The Department of Revenue and Taxation shall identify all tax credits transferred or assigned that were authorized pursuant to Public Law 30-37 as amended, in such annual report, by business license number, company name, and the business license and company name from which tax credits were transferred or assigned; and

For rebates, abatements, and offsets, a list of tax credit (2) recipients' company name and business license number by the dollar amount of tax rebates, abatements, and offsets authorized by the Department of Revenue and Taxation, and by the public law and/or section in the Guam Code Annotated from which the Department of Revenue and Taxation authorized such tax rebates, abatements, and offsets."

Section 7. Public Law 30-37 Tax Credit Reporting Requirements.

The Administrator of the GEDA shall submit a written report pursuant to the detailed reporting requirements in Section 5 of Public Law 30-37 for the following periods:

19 (a) June 30, 2009 through September 30, 2010;

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- October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011; (b) 20
- October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012; 21 (c)
- 22 (d) October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013;
- 23 (e) October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2013; and
- 24 (f) October 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013.

The written report required by this Section shall be submitted to the 25 Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than thirty (30) days after the 26 enactment of this Act.

1 Section 8. Annual Tax Credit Report. The Director of the 2 Department of Revenue and Taxation shall submit an annual tax credit report pursuant to the detailed reporting requirements in Section 1107(g)(1) 3 and (2) of Chapter 1, Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated, for the 4 following periods: 5 6 (a) July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010; 7 (b) July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011; 8 July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012; (c) 9 (d) July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013; and 10 July 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013. (e) 11 The annual tax credit report required by this Section shall be submitted to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than thirty (30) 12 13 days after the enactment of this Act. Section 9. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon 14 15 enactment. 16 Section 10. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect 17 18 other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect

without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of

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this Act is severable.



Dear Senator Pangelinan,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on Bill 257. We are grateful for your efforts to draw attention to the financial conditions of the University of Guam and we are supportive of any process which brings clarity in the allocation of resources to the University.

The budgetary process at the University is managed through a shared-governance framework which ends at the Board of Regents. In order to maintain our institutional autonomy in accordance with the expectations and guidelines of WASC, the Board of Regents must continue to be the final authority in making a budget submission to the Guam Legislature which actually in turn makes the appropriation. The University Charter at 17 GCA §16104.1 clearly states that "The Board shall submit an annual budget to the Legislature in the manner prescribed by law." Further, §16118 prescribes the manner in which the budget is to be certified and submitted to the Legislature. Any alteration to the Charter would require a University Board of Regents resolution signed by seven (7) members of the Board requesting legislative approval, which would require a public hearing.

We are concerned that requiring that the Governor submit a specific budget request for the University would not only impinge upon the institutional autonomy which the University enjoys, but simultaneously enhances the role of the Executive Branch in internal University of Guam budgetary processes. Therefore respectfully, we cannot support this provision of Bill 257 at this time.

The University requests that our existing budget and resource allocation processes remain intact. As in years past, the University Board and administration look forward to submitting our institutional goals and objectives, annual program plans, budgets and appropriations requests directly to the legislature for policy and funding hearing. Prior to and coincident with our legislative submittal, we will continue to discuss our program plans and resource requirements with the Governor's Office, as has been our practice. Thank you for your understanding.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on Bill No. 257-32 (COR). This proposed legislation is seeking to amend certain legislative mandates governing the composition of the Governor's Annual Executive Budget and the reporting requirements for tax credits. Excerpts of these proposed amendments are as follows:

- 1. Item (b)(2), Section 4107, Chapter 4, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated is amended to require the Governor to specifically allocate funds for the Guam Department of Education, the University of Guam, Guam Community College, the Guam Commission for Educator Certification and other line and semi-autonomous agencies of the Government of Guam.
- Section 4 of P.L. 31-76 is amended to repeal Section 4 of P.L. 30-37 which
 appropriates \$8,438,000 to the Governor's Office for the purchase of collateral
 equipment for the JFK facilities and for the lease of JFK facilities in accordance with
 IFB No. GSA-025-09.
- 3. Section 6 of P.L. 30-37 is amended to require the Governor to specify, in the proposed Executive Budget, the dollar amount of tax credits applicable for the Tiyan Facilities and that the amounts submitted for such purpose shall not be exceeded.
- 4. Section 1107(g), Chapter 1, Title II of the Guam Code Annotated is amended, delineating details required of the reporting requirements of the annual report.

The proposed amendment reflected in item 1 above, to have budget allocations for the above-referenced educational institutions specified in the annual submission of the Executive Budget is not budgetarily prudent. These institutions are legislatively mandated to submit their annual operating budgets directly to the Legislature for approval without prior review and analysis by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research (BBMR). Consequently these entities are exempted from budgetary controls by BBMR to ensure that expenditures are consistent with cash flow and revenue collections and that planned expenditures are adjusted accordingly. The detail review of departmental proposed expenditures for an ensuing fiscal year is the basis of determining the budget allocation for that entity in the Executive Budget. The mandate to submit budget requests directly to the Legislature circumvents this major component in the development of the Executive Budget request for a fiscal year. Some of these institutions are

exempted from the allotment process of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research (BBMR). It should be noted that in addition to these entities, the Legislature, the Mayors, the Judiciary, OPA, PDSC are also exempted by law to submit its budget request to the Governor, via BBMR, for review and adjustment of planned expenditures should anticipated revenues dictate such adjustments. It is for these primary reasons that budget allocations for these institutions cannot be prudently specified in the annual Executive Budget submission to the Legislature. The second proposed amendment as noted in Item 2 above is seeking to repeal the appropriations made to the Governor of Guam for the purchase of collateral equipment for JFK school facilities and the lease payment of the Tiyan temporary school facilities. This amendment will not be implementable since the appropriation has been expended. The Bureau of Budget and Management Research is unable to support Bill No. 257-32 (COR)

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
