II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: The bill is authored by Vice Speaker BJ Cruz and myself. The bill it is intended to level the playing field when Government of Guam and its agencies and instrumentalities intend to lease its properties out to the private sector. With regards to competing with the private sector, we want to stimulate private sector investments and sometimes what occurs is instead of going to private sector development some investors get steered to government properties. We believe that by requiring those Government entities to pay the 4 % business privilege tax on their lease income and real estate tax on the improvements, this makes sure the private sectors are on the same even level playing field for development.

We will begin with Phil (Tydingco) and then receive testimony from Henry Taitano.

(b) Testimony

1. Mr. Phil Tydingco

Mr. Phil Tydingco: Good morning Chairman and Vice Speaker and Senator Limtiaco. My name is Phil Tydingco representing Leonardo Rapadas from the office of the Attorney General. I only signed up just to share with you preliminarily not so much of the issue, the policy. I know the language proposed on Section 2 says, "Taxes shall be applied to lands leased in 60114 of the Chapter." I think for clarification it would be important to consider amending, at least as it applies to Business Privilege Tax, Title 11 that governs business tax. There is a statute that exempts all Government of Guam entities in Section 26. You may want to put that particular provision under that otherwise we have a conflict. On the books we now have that Government entities exempt from Business Privilege Tax so we may want to address it in the Business Privilege Tax Code. It would be better clarified if we made it a subsection or modified it. I don't know if there is a similar one for Real Estate Tax. So we just need to make sure those issues are addressed or we will have people challenge this. Thank you.

Chairman Vicente C. Pangelinan: Thank you very much and Si Yu'os Ma'åse Mr. Tydingco.

2. Mr. Henry Taitano

Mr. Taitano: Thank you Mr. Chairman [read written testimony-verbatim]

Discussion:

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you and Si Yu'os Ma'åse Mr. Taitano. Just real quick... the Bill does distinguish that the deposited funds go into the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission Land Bank. So, part of it goes into the Land Bank to compensate landowners who are never going to get their properties back. We do make a distinction; half will go to Chamorro Land

Trust and half to the Land Bank. So, it does address the issue of legality when you say that the monies will go into the Ancestral Lands Bank to fund those properties that will never be returned. The second thing is I don't think it's going to affect GEDA's day-to-day operations. It doesn't take your income away. It just means if you were the landlord and you going to lease land, you will build your tax into your lease.

Mr. Henry Taitano: Would you agree taxing the agency?

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan:: That's correct

Mr. Henry Taitano: But that would take our.....

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: If you want to compete. The idea is to stabilize and equalize the competitive field so you don't undercut the private sector investments on Guam by providing below market leases because you don't have to pay the taxes. You would have to manage your operations efficiently and you would have to account for the income on the taxes. We looked at those issues and that is really the intent of the bill - to equalize the playing field. Let's not undercut the private sector. Let's compete with them fairly.

If we are going to compete with them as a Government we should do it fairly and not hamper and be at an advantage because we are a Government entity. But I do thank you for your comments. We will certainly take a look at them and address some of those issues that require addressing and incorporate them into the committee report. The other thing is the Governor fully supported this by actually sending invoices to all the autonomous agencies for payment in lieu of taxes. So he doesn't support it in this case, but he wants to tax the agencies and the autonomous agencies under total income.

Mr. Henry Taitano: I believe that liability has been on the books for a couple of decades now.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Right.

Mr. Henry Taitano: I am not sure that is the Governor's fault.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: He was the only Governor who sent an invoice. In that respect he certainly could have done what everybody else had done and not send an invoice.

Mr. Henry Taitano: But I think he was trying to help the fiscal stabilization of the Government by collecting revenues that are owed.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: So are we, so are we. We don't take advantage as a Government to unfairly compete with the private sector. This is really the intent.

Mr. Phil Tydingco: The definition for consideration...we are just trying... other areas such as commercial leases that would also involve leases to nonprofit, in terms of the definition of public instrumentalities. We are all over the map as to what constitutes public instrumentalities. For

example, mayors may lease certain portions to nonprofits. These are things we want to tighten as far as a definition.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Right. We are certainly open to any language the Attorney General's Office has to suggest.

Mr. Phil Tydingco: I will ask them to look over the last case log. I think what your intending are the autonomous agencies. I think public instrumentalities are rather broad as well as public corporations. Just wanted to point that out.

Vice Speaker BJ Cruz: Mr. Taitano, thank you for your comments today. How much does GEDA get in leases per month and how much would this 4% total?

Mr. Henry Taitano: I have not done all the calculations but I think we are about 1.2 to 1.4 million dollars.

Vice Speaker BJ Cruz: And what would the 4% be?

Mr. Henry Taitano: I believe somewhere around 50 grand.

Vice Speaker BJ Cruz: How much did GEDA charge the Government for the bonds that you floated for us?

Mr. Henry Taitano: I don't have the details of that but I could find out.

Vice Speaker BJ Cruz: It's not as if we are just sucking the blood out of GEDA with the 4%. I bet that each one of those bonds netted GEDA twice, if not four times that 1.5 million that went toward GEDA's operations. So as a customer of GEDA - and you are a part of the Government I hope - but you charge us thru the nose to service the bond for us, but when we ask for 4% you act as if we are taking your first child.

Mr. Henry Taitano: Can I respond?

Vice Speaker BJ Cruz: Yes.

Mr. Henry Taitano: First we have to distinguish between leases and bonds.

Vice Speaker BJ Cruz: I am just saying that these lands were given to the agencies so that it could generate some money. That is your testimony right? And as result you have been able to sustain yourself and you also have been able to sustain yourself whenever we go to the bond market and you guys have made tens of millions of dollars for those bonds you floated for us. So it's not as if we haven't contributed to GEDA to keep its operation.

I really object to the way that it is said. And in trying to deal with some of the other agencies, especially my pet peeve with the airport. We took land that was given back to us from the Federal Government and we got the land back. I wasn't at the legislature at the time. The

decision was made to give the land back to some families, but some of us have land under the runways that we will never get back. But the airport is keeping all that land and is now leasing those lands and it's undercutting real estate development outside and paying nothing to us and all we are trying to say is 4%.

I would have ask for more but I was the co-sponsor. I am just saying we took our lead from the Governor in the first few month of his administration when he sent out invoices to all the government agencies. Now that you have switched hats from Adelup to GEDA you no longer are saying..........

Mr. Henry Taitano: Maybe I can respond to that. If you look at your bill starting from line ten line 10: "*I Liheslaturan Guahan* further finds that *I Liheslaturan Guahan* created the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission (GALC) and the Chamorro Land Trust (CLT), who are tasked to oversee and care for land parcels of land deemed for the native inhabitants of our island community, however lack the necessary funding to provide compensation and infrastructure."

I think that point.... the legislature created the entity to do something but it doesn't have funding and what you are trying to do now is find sources. When the administration sent the invoices I think he was just trying to collect on an obligation because everyone was screaming that we need to collect as much revenue as possible and if it was an obligation on the books then why wouldn't the Governor want to collect it? I mean that his fiduciary right?

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: He doesn't want to collect income tax funds and what he doesn't has been won in the court.

Mr. Henry Taitano: He is doing his best to pay income... I think he is doing everything he can to pay income taxes.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: He wants to settle a 1.2 million dollar debt with 100,000 dollars.

Mr. Henry Taitano: Trying to forgive a million dollars in debt?

Vice Speaker BJ Cruz: The senator is talking about something else - a different case. What I am trying to point out is trying to get money back to the Ancestral Lands and Chamorro Land Trust. We are trying to provide them with some funds. The land given to the airport - huge tracts of land that they are charging government agencies for and tossing them out because they weren't paying rent We're just trying to make sure that some money comes back to those families who have land under the runway under those tens of hundreds of thousands acres that surround the airport. They are never going to get their land back and we just want to be sure that there will be some money in the Ancestral Lands Commission to be able to compensate some of those families that lost land. This was a small effort to try and address that. For the administration to on one side say pay the 18 million tilt but don't pay the fifty thousand in Gross Receipt Tax, I can't even begin to figure out how to describe that.

Mr. Henry Taitano: I don't think the Governor created the obligation, Sir. It was an obligation on the books. He was just trying to collect.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: There are many other obligations that we hope he is trying to collect.

Mr. Henry Taitano: Yes sir, absolutely.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Maybe we should get a list of those that he is trying to collect because in his budget he submitted he showed no additional forecast for economic initiatives. Senator Limitaco?

[Senator Limitaco indicated no questions]

Thank you very much, Si Yu'os Ma'ase. Gentlemen thank you very much for your testimony.

SECTION 2. §60114.1 and §60114.2 are hereby *added* to Chapter 60, 21 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"§60114.1. Applicable taxes on leasing of land by autonomous agency, public corporation, and other public instrumentalities of the government of Guam for commercial purposes.

Taxes shall be applied to lands leased as stipulated in §60114 of this Chapter.

Bill 29-32 - "AN ACT TO ADD §60114.1 AND "§60114.2 TO CHAPTER 60 OF 21 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO COMPETITIVE EQUALIZATION ACT ON THE LEASING OF GOVERNMENT OF GUAM PROPERTY

Good morning Senator Pangelinan and members of the Committee on Appropriations, Taxation, Public Debt, Banking Insurance, Retirement and Land. My name is Henry J. Taitano, Acting Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), and I hereby submit this written testimony on Bill No.29-32.

Bill 29-32 intends to generate revenues derived from the leasing of lands transferred to the autonomous agencies, public corporations, and other public instrumentalities of the government of Guam to provide necessary resources to the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission for implementation of programs to benefit their respective beneficiaries to include the development of infrastructure improvements on land trust residential and agricultural lands by charging such agencies business privilege tax and real estate tax on properties it currently leases from the government of Guam.

The preamble language does not recognize that the reason autonomous agencies, public corporations, etc., were allowed to derive revenues from leasing is because they are performing public functions, without subsidy from the General Fund. When GEDA leased its Industrial Park properties from the government of Guam in 1966, the intent was to find a means to fund GEDA operations as a self-sustaining entity as well as have a means to support economic development activities in Guam in the early 1970s via subsidized leases on these lands.

Generally, the bill requires that government autonomous agencies such as GEDA pay GRT on the income it makes from leases and also pay property tax on improvements that are leased out. First, this will have a negative impact on GEDA's operations, its ability to adequately support its programs, and meet its mandates. GEDA's lease revenues are a critical source of operational funding that provides sustainability for the Authority which operates without annual appropriations from the general fund. Second, the legality and impact of taxing government entities should be carefully assessed before it is even considered as a viable funding mechanism.

The bill indicates that taxes collected will be deposited in GALC and CLTC funds for infrastructure development purposes. There needs to be a legal review of this concept, which may be inconsistent with the legislative policy regarding GALC, that money be remitted to those that will never get their lands back.

GEDA does not support this bill as written as it would adversely impact on GEDA's ability to maintain its current day to day operations and carry out its mission and programs that promote economic opportunities and



quality of life. Also, further analysis is needed to determine whether Bill 029-32 is applicable to all commercial land leases under management of autonomous agencies, public corporations, and other instrumentalities of the government of Guam. More importantly, a complete analysis should be done on the legality and the impacts to imposing land taxes on government entities, and any possible impacts to federal grant funding programs administered by these entities.

In closing, GEDA does not support this bill due to the fact that it lacks adequate analysis of the long-term legal and economic impact to all entities potentially affected and the community a whole. I thank you and the members of your Committee for this opportunity to provide written testimony today.

The Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port is providing written testimony to Bill No. 29-32 (COR), An Act to add §60114.1 and §60114.2 to Chapter 60 of 21 Guam Code Annotated relative to Competitive Equalization Act on the leasing of Government of Guam property.

The Port is in opposition to Bill No. 29-32. As a self-sustaining, autonomous instrumentality of the Government of Guam the Port is required to generate its own review and does not receive funding from the General Fund to support its operations. The Port derives its revenues from both operational and non-operational activities that include the lease of Port properties and other user agreements. The revenue generated by the Port is in turn used to support the ever growing costs associated with operating and maintaining the Islands sole commercial seaport.

The Commercial Port is the economic engine of the Island and the region. Presently, Port lands are leased to commercial entities that directly and indirectly support and benefit local and regional economies. As such, it is significant to note that the tenants that lease properties from the Port are actively registered with the Department of Revenue and Taxation and already pay business privilege taxes and other assessments levied against and incidental to their respective operations as well as have the possessory interest granted under any given lease that is subjected to real estate taxes that can be levied upon its property and improvements of any kind.

All the lands under the jurisdiction and administrative control of the Port are a result of a series of quitclaim conveyances provided over time that are specific to uses as approved in or identified in the approved Port Master Plan. The bill currently does not identify the impacted lands, leases nor does it reference an effective date.

While the intent of the bill is to take funds derived from this legislation to support the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission's respective Land Bank and Chamorro Home Development Fund accounts, this very intent adversely impacts the much

needed revenues generated by the Port, that currently has to borrow millions of dollars in order to pay for much needed equipment and maintenance needs to maintain operations. This very process has required the Port to request rate increases on every cargo container coming into the Port that inevitably is passed on to all our island consumers who have to pay even more for the most basic of needs.

With all these issues of concern, the Port is unable to support this legislation.

Dear Senator Pangelinan:

The Chamorro Land Trust Commission is tasked with issuing leases of government land for residential and agricultural uses and to take "steps necessary to develop these lands for their highest and best use." Over the course of time, land has been leased for residential and agricultural use but the necessary infrastructure has been either non-existent or sub-standard for worthy subsistence of the lease holders. For some, for example, the cost of laying water lines to their property in accordance with established requirements has been extremely cost prohibitive, and, therefore, undoable. As a result, numerous leased properties remain dormant and the Commission has been reluctant to issue land in areas that have no infrastructure. This has left the list of applicants frustratingly long and unfulfilled after many years.

Bill #29 identifies a source of revenue for the Commission to develop infrastructure so more residential and agricultural lessees can properly utilize their land. With the ability to fund infrastructure and to properly develop the land, more people of Guam may enjoy benefits of these lands. For too long, the Chamorro Land Trust Commission has been an organization with the inspirational tasking to help our people realize their dreams and potential with land for homes or land to farm. However, for too long, the Commission has been unable to achieve its mission because of the lack of direct and indirect funding to ensure the land it disperses are fully usable. Funding identified in this bill and potential funding from collected lease payments is a large step toward fulfilling the dreams of our past leaders when they created this Commission and its task to help our people.

My fellow Chamorro Land Trust Commissioners, David Matanane and Amanda Santos, and I, along with the executive director Monte Mafnas, fully support the passage of Bill #29 and thank you and your sponsors for introducing this legislation. We hope for the swift passage of this legislation so we may move forward at allowing the dreams of many of our residents to be fulfilled.


