I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land convened a public hearing on November 25, 2014 at 5:30 pm in *I Liheslatura* 's public hearing room.

II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Acting Chairman Benjamin Cruz: Good afternoon, this joint committee public hearing conducted by the Committee on General Governmental Operations and Cultural Affairs and Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation, and Land will now come to order. Notice of this public hearing was disseminated to all local media outlets via electronic format on November 18. The second notice provided on November 23rd. Notice of the hearing was also made known on Guam Legislature's website. We have three bills on for this afternoon. The

first bill we will hear this afternoon is Bill 293 by Senator Tommy Morrison. Congratulations if he is watching. He is a new father as of a couple of hours ago. And I understand the Director needs to get away because otherwise he may not... So anyway, let me read Senator Morrison's sponsor statement.

Sponsor Statement

Acting Chairman BJ Cruz:

[Reads Senator Tommy Morrison's Sponsor Statement on Bill 293-32 verbatim. See Attached]

With that, I have only one person signed up and that's the director of Public Works. Mr. Dominguez.

Director Carl Dominguez: Hafa adai and good evening Mr. Vice Speaker, Senator Ada and Senator San Nicolas. My name is Carl Dominguez, I am the director of Public Works. I am here to testify in support of this bill. If I may, we can just go through the different sections of the proposed revisions of the bill and I will comment on those. It's section 61542 of the Chapter 61 of 21 GCA. And this section of the law covering political signs are political signs on government property only. And primarily they're in the government's rights of way which is under the jurisdiction of the Department of Public Works. Sometimes you'll see political signs on government property that's not on the rights of way but the only other restriction I can think of is you can't put them in parks. But other than that you can put them on government property. So anyway, the bulk of them are obviously along the rights of way.

And with regard to the first revision that is proposed which is 6-E, Period for Posting of Political Signs. Senator Morrison is proposing that the ninety days before any special or primary election be reduced to sixty days. From DPW standpoint, it doesn't have a material effect on us whether it is ninety days or sixty days. It's the same amount of effort and paperwork to issue a highway encroachment permit to the applicants, the political candidates so that doesn't have a material effect on us. I have testified here before on a number of occasions these past four years, and I have said on several occasions that when a monetary fine can be imposed on a violator of the law, it has a very...it's a good deterrent to violating the law. It gives more incentive to the violator to fix the violation, to cure the violation.

And so, I'm in support of the \$25 per day per sign that is in violation. That's a fairly hefty, it's a fairly hefty fine. Especially, I look upon it as \$25 per day per sign. I don't see it as, when you get a highway encroachment permit, you get a single permit for basically an unlimited number of signs in the government's rights of way. But I read this as per day per sign and if you leave ten signs...if you leave ten signs past the fifteen day period after the General Election and, here, I do like the fact that Senator Morrison had proposed that, those that lose in a Primary Election remove their signs fifteen days after a Primary

Election, not let those signs stay on, you know past fifteen days, past primary election. I'm in favor of that as well.

So, if as an example, if you leave ten signs up after this 48-hour written notification to the violator, as an example if you leave ten signs up, that's \$250 per day. That's over and above the \$200 application fee or deposit at DPW. The violator loses that as well. So, I think \$250 a day for ten signs is quite a deterrent. If it's a single sign, it's \$25 per day for that single sign. But as the clock ticks, the violator is in, the violator is responsible for paying for the sign and we'll go after the fine. So, that is basically it.

I do want to ask the committee to consider that the time and effort it would take for DPW to remove signs that are not removed after the 48-hour notification, that takes time and energy, that takes labor, that takes equipment burn. I would like to ask the Committee, consider that the fines be deposited into an account called the Pubic Rights of Way of the Territorial Highway Fund. This account can be seen in Public Law 32-028 which was signed into law by Governor Calvo on May 10th, 2013. It was introduced by Speaker Won Pat, Senator Tom Ada, and Senator Rory Respicio. And it, this public law is in relation to other kinds of encroachments in the government's right of way – nonpolitical signs, other types of encroachments that a violator doesn't remove upon written notice by DPW. And that's the only other thing I would ask that you consider. And that is my testimony. If you have any questions of me, I would be happy to answer them.

Acting Chairman BJ Cruz: Thank you very much, Bill 293 is considered heard.

This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 293-32 (COR). There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. AN ACT TO AMEND §61542 OF CHAPTER 61 OF 21GCA RELATIVE TO POLITICAL SIGNS.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 3 **Section 1.** Section 61542 of Chapter 61 of 21GCA is *amended* to read:
- 5 §61542. Regulation of Political Signs.
- 7 Candidates for public office or other persons having an interest in an election may
- 8 place political signs which advocate voting for or against candidates, or other matters
- 9 to be considered by the electorate, on government property in accordance with the
- 10 following provisions:
- 12 (a) Definitions.

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- (1) Candidate means a person seeking public office.
- 16 (2) Government property means any tangible or real property held by the government of Guam.

(3) Organization means any political organization or political action group advocating an issue in a special or general election.

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(4) Political sign means all billboards, posters, banners or displays which advocate a candidate for political office or any matter to be presented to the electorate for vote.

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8 (5) Utility pole means any pole erected for street lighting, power lines, and cable television lines.

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- 11 (b) Notice. Notice shall be posted on the campaign sign that the advertisement has 12 been approved or authorized by the candidate or, if the advertisement has not been 13 authorized by the candidate the name and mailing address of the individual(s) or 14 organization that paid for the advertisement.
- (c) Permit: Fee; Deposit. Any candidate or organization may apply for a permit to 15 post campaign signs with the Department of Public Works. The Director of Public 16 Works is authorized to charge a non-refundable permit fee of One Hundred Dollars 17 (\$100.00) and a deposit of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), or as increased from time 18 19 to time by rules and regulations promulgated by the Director of Public Works in 20 accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law. Such rules and regulations shall 21 provide for procedures governing approval or rejection of permits, manner and location of posting, maintenance of sign and surrounding area, procedures for 22 notification, removal of signs, forfeiture of deposit of any sign found in violation of 23 this Section, and any other rules or regulations necessary to ensure the safety of the 24 public. 25

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(d) Restrictions on Posting of Political Signs.

- 1 (1) No political sign may be erected or posted upon the shoulder of any roadway unless it is eight (8) feet from the paved portion of the roadway and in such a manner that would not impede traffic or a driver's visibility, or erected upon any traffic median strip, sidewalk, road, or driveway.
- 6 (2) No political sign may be erected upon, on or within any government building, or nailed to any tree or attached to any fence on government property.
- 9 (3) No political sign may be erected or posted within one hundred (100) feet 10 of any entrance to a public school, or upon any public school property, including 11 school fences and gates, except after 6:00 p.m. on the day before the election 12 date.
- 14 (4) No political sign may be posted upon any utility pole.

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- 16 (5) No political signs may be posted upon any public park within the 17 jurisdiction of the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Department of 18 Public Works, or the village Mayors.
- 20 (6) No political sign may be erected or posted within one hundred (100) feet of any intersection.
- 23 (e) Period for Posting of Political Signs. Political signs shall not be erected any earlier than ninety (90) sixty (60) days before any special or primary election.
- 26 (f) Size Restriction. No political sign may exceed thirty-two (32) square feet in 27 gross sign surface area. Any sign which exceeds thirty-two

- 1 (32) square feet shall be removed immediately by the Department of Public Works,
- 2 and all sign materials and any deposit made shall be automatically forfeited to the
- 3 government of Guam.

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- 5 (g) Maintenance of Political Signs. It shall be the responsibility of every candidate
- 6 or organization to maintain their sign in a manner which does not impede the safety of
- 7 the public, and which complies with applicable rules and regulations as adopted by the
- 8 Department of Public Works. Failure of a candidate or any organization to maintain
- 9 campaign signs shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit and all sign materials.

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- 11 (h) Removal of Signs. Any sign in violation of any of the provisions of Subsections
- (b), (d), (e), (f) or (g) shall be removed within forty-eight (48) hours by the candidate
- or organization after notification by the Department of Public Works or a Mayor of the
- village in which the sign is located. A sign not removed within forty-eight (48) hours
- of notification may be removed immediately by the Department of Public Works or the
- village Mayor. A fine of twenty five dollars (\$25) per day per sign for each day the
- 17 sign, in violation of this paragraph, is not removed after forty-eight (48) hours.

- 19 Failure to remove any political sign in violation of this Section shall be grounds for
- 20 forfeiture of any deposit. Every political sign shall be removed no later than fifteen
- 21 (15) calendar days after the conclusion of any general or special election or primary
- 22 <u>election if the candidate is not successful in the primary election</u>. Failure to remove
- 23 any political sign within fifteen (15) days after the conclusion of any general or special
- 24 election shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit <u>plus a fine of twenty five dollars</u>
- 25 (\$25) per day per sign for each day the sign not removed after the said fifteen (15)
- 26 <u>days, supra</u>.

BRIEF STATEMENT FROM SENATOR TOMMY MORRISON RELATIVE TO BILL NO. 293-32 (COR)

November 25, 2014

Good afternoon and *hafa adai* Vice-Speaker Cruz and members of the Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land. Thank you, Mr. Vice-Speaker, for moving Bill No. 293-32 (COR) forward by scheduling this public hearing today.

In summary, this legislation was introduced to help address concerns brought to my attention by members of our community regarding the placement of political signage. Some of these concerns include the lengthy period political signage may be posted on government property, the seemingly limitless amount of signs campaigns are allowed to install throughout the island, and most importantly, the dangers involved when campaigns fail to properly remove political signs and related materials such as rebar, lumber, and tie wire in areas frequented by joggers, bicyclists, and yard maintenance personnel.

I wish to thank my colleague, Senator Aline Yamashita, for co-sponsoring this legislation. I thank her for her leadership in helping to address safety concerns relative to political signage. As the committee may be aware, it was Senator Yamashita's law, P.L. 31-148, which reduced the size of political signage authorized to be posted on government property.

Bill No. 293-32 (COR) is a measure aimed at continuing the legislature's efforts to improve local statutes governing political signage. My office has and continues to be in contact with a number of residents, business owners, and government representatives who all hope to amend existing political signage laws allowing for safer areas along Guam's roadways.

I look forward to receiving comments and recommendations that will help strengthen this legislation. Si Yu'os ma'ase'!

Enactment of the proposed legislation entails a fiscal impact relative to staff requirements to carry out enforcement activities to be performed by the Department of Public Works, Highway Maintenance Division (Guam Highway Fund) or the respective village mayors (General Fund), the cost breakdown for which is not available at this time. A fine of \$25 is imposed per day per sign (located on government rights-of-way) for each day the sign is in violation of the requirements specified in the Bill. The Bill includes that in addition to the period after any general or special election, that also after the conclusion of any primary election, if the candidate is not successful in the primary election, every political sign for such candidate shall be removed no later than 15 calendar days. Failure to remove such sign shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit plus a fine of \$25 per day per sign for each day the sign is not removed after the 15 days, which is to be deposited into the General Fund.

Comments:

Enactment of the proposed legislation entails a fiscal impact relative to staff requirements to carry out the enforcement activities to be performed by the Department of Public Works, Highway Maintenance Division (Guam Highway Fund) or the respective village mayors (General Fund), the cost breakdown for which is not available at this time. A fine of \$25 is imposed per day per sign for each day the sign is in violation of the requirements specified in the Bill. The Bill includes that in addition to the period after any general or special election, that also after the conclusion of any primary election, if the candidate is not successful in the primary election, every political sign shall be removed no later than 15 calendar days. Failure shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit plus a fine of \$25 per day per sign for each day the sign is not removed after the 15 days, which is deposited into the General Fund. As an example, after the conclusion of a primary election, and one week has lapsed from such conclusion date, if 3 candidates are not successful in the primary election, and each have 25 signs which are not removed, then citations will be issued for a total of \$13,750 (i.e. \$25 dollars per sign x 25 signs of 1 candidate x 7 days x 3 candidates = \$13,125). And since the statute currently provides that failure to remove any political sign in violation of this Section shall be grounds for forfeiture of any deposit, then an additional of \$600 would be assessed in this case (i.e. \$200 each x 3 candidates = \$600).
