Bill No. 337-32 (COR)- "AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 76114, 76116, AND 76124 OF CHAPTER 76, TITLE 10 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK MANAGEMENT FUND, CLOSURE, AND ASSOCIATED PENALTIES," by Senator T.C. Ada and Senator R.J. Respicio introduced on May 9, 2014; and was subsequently referred to the Committee on Rules; Federal, Foreign & Micronesian Affairs; and Human & Natural Resources; and Election Reform on May 12, 2014.

Senator Rory J. Respicio, Chairpersou of the Committee on Rules; Federal, Foreign & Micronesian Affairs; and Hnman & Natural Resources; and Election Reform convened a public hearing on **Bill No. 337-32 (COR)** on Tuesday, May 20, 2014, 2014 at 10:00 A.M. in the Legislature's Public Hearing Room to receive public testimony on the measure.

11. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Eric Palacios, Administrator, Guam Environmental Protection Agency, in support of the bill, provided written and oral testimony. Floreann Perez, Mobil, provided written testimony for Mr. Charles E. Ewart, President of Mobil Oil Guam Inc.

Vangie Lujan, Guam Waterworks Authority, provided written testimony on the bill.

Robert Perron, Guam Environmental Protection Agency, provided oral testimony, in support of the bill.

Senator Rory J. Respicio called the public hearing to order at 10:00 A.M. and deferred to Senator Thomas C. Ada as the sponsor of **Bill No. 337-32 (COR)**, to provide opening remarks for the Bill.

Senator Tom Ada:

Bill 337-32 (COR) actually attempts to accomplish three things: 1) It will update the level of penalties for violations as it relates to the underground storage tanks and it will update the penalty level from the current \$11,000 a day per tank per violation up to \$16,000 which is actually about the level that the federal government penalty today. 2) It is my understanding that there is about \$500,000 in the UST fund that's currently on the books but cannot be accessed while it needs to be appropriated. So what the bill would do today is, when passed, it will appropriate that money and any other funds that may subsequently come into the fund and shall be administered by the administrator and the fund will be a revolving non-lapsing fund. As it gets withdrawn and new monies come in, that fund becomes available for the administrator to disperse. In turn of course, the administrator is going to be required to provide all the necessary quarterly accounting reports to the Legislature and I Maga'lahen Guahan and the Office of Public Accountability and the Administrator shall insure the UST fund is compliance with the Open Government existing statutes, rules and regulations, codes, executive orders and any other authority that is applicable to GPA. Currently, any violation of the this Chapter of 10 GCA Chapter 76 is that the first violation will have to be taken by Court and could be subject to a misdemeanor and so that's being changed. The first three violations will actually be considered as civil violations which can then be taken directly to the Superior Court and basically EPA will be represented by inspectors to make the case to the judge and then adjudicate the matter. If after that, the violator is still not responding, then it shall be treated as a misdemeanor case will require that the Attorney General's Office will have to press charges and then take it to the Court to be dealt with. That change of course is very much similar to what was done with the traffic citations and the fire code citations where it is now a civil violation and when push comes to shove, can be then charged as a misdemeanor charge.

Eric Palacios: Provided oral and written testimony in support of the bill. (Please see attached written testimony.)

Senator Respicio thanked Mr. Palacios for this testimony.

Senator Respicio:

Your first suggestion, to change the 30 days to 120 calendar days. I'm probably certain that you are seeing Mobil's testimony for the first time as well as my colleagues on Page 2, they bring up the very point that you do that they are recommending 180 days, no later than 120 days following submission to EPA notice and toward the last paragraph, it talks about the removal of tanks safely in accordance with regulatory requirements and that they are asking for 180 days from the date the associated permits issued and when GEPA grants approval or gives notice of closure. That affects that section right which you just pointed out?

Mr. Palacios:

Yes.

Senator Respicio:

How did you get to 120 days?

Mr. Palacios:

First of all, it was consistent with I believe Subsection A where 120 days is identified therein. We want to keep it as uniform as possible and as recent as this morning I did meet with members of my team and we came to the agreement that I20 days was a good, solid number to substitute the 30 days that is currently in the Bill. I20 days is 4 months and as I mentioned in my closing, obviously, not every situation where this Bill will be applicable will require the 120 days. Of course, emergency circumstances or situations that require immediate attention, this is where the administrator's flexibility will approve beneficial. I don't have to allow for I20 days if really it needs to be cleaned up in 10 days for example 20 days.

Senator Tom Ada:

But I think the issue we are talking about here is the removal of abandoned in place tanks on Page 5 it says there that starting on Line 10 any UST which have previously approved or discovered to be abandoned in place in construction related activities. I have particular concern over it and I think we certainly are going to need to have a mark-up. I think the testimony brought up by Mobil has a number of valid points and we are going to need to balance that out with EPA's objectives but the concern that I have is that I know that when they were doing Route 8/Route 16 tri-intersection, I think they had discovered an abandoned tank and to halt construction for 180 days is something we are going to really need to look at and think closer to see how we can balance that out. I definitely think that a mark-up session is going to be warranted after this before the bill gets reported out. We just need to go back and revisit that.

Mr. Palacios:

Lagree with you that any project should be delayed certainly by that length of time. In instances where we do come across this situation, I think its important that we allow for other aspect of projects being constructed to be addressed.

Senator Tom Ada:

lagree.

Senator Respicio:

I am hopeful that the mark-up hearing will not delay us from anything out of the ordinary Legislative process. Could you please take a look at Mobil Oil Guam's testimony and any concern they raise in the testimony, please provide written feedback to the Committee?

Mr. Palacios:

Absolutely.

Senator Respicio:

They say that they are in general support of the prompt removal of underground storage tanks and their first concern is if these fines will be imposed retroactively. I image this is going forward.

Mr. Palacios:

Progressively.

Senator Respicio:

We talked about the 180 days and your recommendation of 120 days. I just want to make sure that this testimony and all the other testimonies are heard and taken into consideration if we are to move forward.

Mr. Palacios:

I would like to point out that it is one of the things we discussed that we had met this morning the definition of reasonable and what that means to one person can mean 10 different things. If the industry feels and are the experts when it comes to timelines for taking corrective action or making necessary upgrades. If the industry feels it needs 180 days. I do not oppose that.

Senator Respicio:

I am sure that will be helpful to the sponsor and to this Committee. Mr. Perron had noted that he had discussed bill with the Eric and the staff and that he agrees with the Administrator's comments.

Senator Tom Ada:

Can Lask the Chairman to speak that into the record because there is a provision here which takes the Chairman out of the loop.

Robert Perron:

I am in support. I have discussed the Bill with Eric and staff members and in generally in support and concur with Eric's comments and don't have any problems with not being a signatory on to the dispersal of the funds. We will be able to monitor it at the Board level and with the Public Auditor also being kept in the loop and the Legislature. I am comfortable with that set-up.

Senator Tom Ada:

Just to make it clear, in Section 2, 76114, currently the law requires that the Chairman of the Board counter signs any requisitions or requests for payments that the agency may process. And it currently requires a counter signature from the chairman of the hoard. That will be deleted such that it will not require now the counter signature of the Chairman. I thought it was important that you read that change.

Mr. Perron:

Yes, I am in support of that. It is enough oversight and eyes looking that will be protected and in good shape.

Senator Respicio:

Just as a final thought with the testimony we received, this company in closing paragraph says that...for the community as a whole...justify this requirement". You would also be able to respond to that concern right.

Senator Respicio thanked the senators present at the hearing.

No further testimony being offered, Senator Respicio then declared that Bill No. 337-32 (COR) was duly heard.

Specifically, potential leaks 4 from underground storage tanks (UST) and pipelines, which may result from 5 faulty installation, earthquakes, or inadequate operating and maintenance 6 procedures, may seep into the soil and contaminate groundwater sources. 7 The cost of remediation to rectify damages resulting from a leak can be very 8 9 costly. I Liheslatura finds that there are over three hundred (300) regulated 10 Underground Storage Tanks (USTs), with a total capacity of ninety (90) [] million gallons, currently in use to store gasoline, diesel, and residual oil, 12

Of the remainder. 21 are subject to ongoing clean up, remediation and/or monitoring to ensure that conditions continue to improve.

I Liheslatura further finds that the number of incidences has been decreasing annually, due to more stringent construction and operating requirements, the threat to the environment posed by these tanks remains. I

I Liheslatura finds that the Guam UST program was established and codified under Chapter 76 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated. The existing USTs on Guam have largely been upgraded to meet current standards, and 100% of the facilities with active tanks meet regulatory standards for corrosion protection and leak detection systems.

I Liheslatura intends to increase the maximum civil penalty per tank per day, for each violation of a requirement or standard from eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) to sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000) in order to adequately fund mitigation activities and subsequent related actions in accordance with Chapter 76 of Title 10 Guam Code Annotated and Chapter

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Section 2. §76114 of Chapter 76, Title 10 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§76114. Underground Storage Tank Management Fund.

There is hereby established a fund to be known as the "Underground Storage Tank Management Fund", hereafter referred to as the UST-LUST Fund, a non-lapsing, revolving Fund which shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam.

(a) Notwithstanding the Central Accounting Act, aA] fees, reimbursements, assessments, fines, forfeitures, and other funds collected or received pursuant to this Chapter, shall be deposited in the UST-LUST Fund and shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year, but shall rollover into the next fiscal year or until expended. Independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith. This Fund shall be kept in a bank licensed to do business on Guam, and funds shall be paid out only upon a request for payment or requisition submitted by the Director or Administrator and countersigned by the Chairman of the Board. All monies in this Fund shall require legislative appropriation. in the fund are hereby appropriated to the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) to be expended in accordance with this part and are not subject to I Maga 'låhi 's transfer authority. The Administrator shall comply with all existing reporting requirements by issuing a quarterly accounting of the Fund to I Maga lahen Guahan. I Liheslaturan Guahan and the

- (d) Any person who denies, obstructs, or hampers the entrance, inspection, or conduct or release response activity by a representative of the Agency at any building, place, site, facility, vehicle, or structure that the representative is authorized to enter, or any inspector who fails to provide information requested by the agency representative as pursuant to § 76110 shall be guilty of a civil violation and shall be subject to a penalty of fined up to Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000) Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000) for every day the person he denies, obstruct or hinders the acquisition of, or fails to provide, the information requested, as determined in a civil action in the Superior Court of Guam.
- (e) Each separate civil violation shall be subject to the following penalties: for the first, second and third offense, the violator shall be subject to a penalty of up to sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000) per tank per day for each separate violation. Second, third, and fourth offenses are defined as offenses within twelve months from the first, second and third offenses respectively. For any fourth violation of this Part, the

violator shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be subject to imprisonment for up to twelve (12) months and fined up to Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000) Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000) per day for each violation, or both.

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Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.



Håfa Ådai and good moming everyone! My name is Eric M. Palacios and I am the Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (Guam EPA). Mr. Chairman and members of I Mina'trentai Dos Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, thank you for this opportunity to testify on Bill 337-32 (COR), An Act To Amend §§ 76114, 76116, And 76124 of Chapter 76, Title 10 Guam Code Annotated, Relative to the Underground Storage Tank Management Fund, Closure, and Associated Penalties.

Guam EPA supports Bill 337-32 (COR) in its entirety because leaking underground storage tanks (USTs) pose a grave threat to Guam's fragile environment, especially its groundwater and marine ecosystem. Petroleum fueling stations, inclusive of federal, local and commercial establishments, operate USTs to store regulated substances, such as gasoline, diesel, oil or potential hazardous wastes generated from decontamination activities. These substances often contain toxic and hazardous chemicals, such as benzene, toluene, and heavy metals, which are known to cause cancer and, therefore, is harmful to the human health and environment.

If not monitored and constructed properly, USTs can threaten communities when their system fails, by leaking toxins into our drinking water supplies and vapors into homes and buildings. The contamination from leaking USTs has been known to persist in the environment for decades, thereby also reducing residential and commercial property values. Contaminated plumes can spread thousands of feet, affecting vast stretches of communities.

Guam's UST program was established 1988. Since then, amendments were made in 2009 to be consistent with the US Energy Policy Act of 2005. Subsequently, regulations were promulgated in 2013. Since the establishment of the program, Guam EPA has registered 692 underground storage tanks. To date, 63% UST have been permanently closed due to substandard construction. The remaining UST have largely been upgraded to current standards.

Moreover, the Agency has addressed 139 releases from USTs. To date, 81% have been completely cleaned up and permanently closed. 19% are undergoing corrective action towards permanent closure.

We strongly support the underlying principle of the Underground Storage of Regulated Substances Act of 2009 and its amendments, which is to give Guam greater flexibility to implement Guam's Underground Storage Tank Regulation Program. As part of this flexibility, I would like to recommend the revision of the Section 76116(d), under closure, to read as follows:

§76116(d) Any UST, which had been previously approved or discovered to be abandoned in-place during construction-related activities, shall be removed as soon as reasonably possible, but not to exceed one hundred twenty (120) calendar days instead of the thirty (30) calendar days or as may be deemed reasonable by GEPA Administrator

Thank you for allowing Mobil Oil Guam Inc. ("Mobil") to submit this testimony with respect to the above-referenced bill.

Mobil is generally supportive of measures requiring the prompt removal of underground storage tanks ("USTs") and underground fuel lines when the tanks and lines are no longer needed. It is Mobil's practice to comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations regarding USTs and their removal and all requirements of testing, monitoring and remediation that may impact any given UST site. Mobil takes these obligations seriously.

As stated in the recitals to the bill, the Guam UST law has been successful. One hundred percent of facilities with active tanks meet regulatory standards for corrosion protection and leak detection system, the vast majority of releases have been successfully remediated and the rest are in the process of being remediated. All of this is good news for Guam and its aquifer. Mobil is pleased to have been a part of this.

Notwithstanding that, we do have some concerns with respect to the referenced bill. First, while it is not completely clear, it appears that the intent of the bill may be to require that USTs which had previously been properly abandoned in place at the instruction or with the approval of GEPA must now be removed. We suggest that this is neither prudent nor necessary.

If a UST has been properly abandoned, it poses no threat whatsoever to human health and/or the environment. Such USTs, if they were decommissioned and abandoned in place in accordance with applicable regulations, were "degassed" and filled with inert substances such as sand or concrete which would make them difficult to remove. Requiring their removal creates unnecessary safety risks, may negatively impact worker safety, could require disturbance of public infrastructure and could negatively impact structural integrity of nearby buildings, all to no good purpose. Many regulators throughout the world, including the United States Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to its UST regulations, allow USTs to be abandoned in place if proper procedures are followed. These regulations recognize that properly conducted abandonment in place poses no current or potential threat to human health and/or the environment.

Even if removing such properly abandoned USTs were to be required, it would be patently unreasonable (and likely unconstitutional) to fine a UST owner retroactively. For example, retroactively imposing a fine back to the date of a prior request that a UST be removed when the UST had been properly abandoned in place at GEPA's prior instruction is unacceptable. It would be fundamentally unfair to allow any form of retroactive penalty.

In addition, the provisions to §§76116(c) and (d) appear to be inconsistent. Subsection (c) states that if there are extenuating circumstances, certain USTs which have been abandoned may remain in place. Subsection (d) however, contains no such exception and requires removal of USTs that have been previously been abandoned apparently without exception.

We are also concerned about the unrealistic timeframes set forth in \$76116(b) and (d). Subsection (b) requires all USTs containing regulated substances must be physically removed from below ground surface no later than one hundred twenty (120) days following submission to GEPA a Notice of Intent for permanent closure. Subsection (d) requires that any UST which has been previously approved by GEPA to be abandoned in place or discovered to have been abandoned in place shall be removed within 30 days. Removal of a UST requires obtaining permits from the Dept. of Public Works (which itself can take more than 30 days), hiring of contractors to excavate and remove the tanks and working with GEPA to secure approvals. Removal of tanks safely in accordance with regulatory requirements takes a longer time than allowed by these proposed provisions. From our experience in such matters, and upon consultation of our global experts, a more realistic timeframe would be a time range of up to one hundred eighty (180) days from the date when the associated permits are issued and when GEPA grants approval or gives notification for closure. There also should be leeway given where permitting agencies refuse to issue or delay in issuing required permits and the reason is beyond the control of the UST owner.

Consideration also should be given to when these time frames begin to run when ownership of the UST has not been determined. In some cases, particularly when a UST is discovered which was in place before UST regulations were enacted, ownership may be uncertain. Fairness requires that ownership of such a UST be determined before time frames for removal commence to run and potential fines begin to accrue.

Finally, we believe it is better for the community as a whole to leave properly abandoned USTs in place, especially since the necessary precautions and due processes have aiready been followed. In situ, they pose no threat to human health or the environment. Their removal and the associated risks, inconvenience to the community and cost do not justify this requirement.



Thank you for providing to us the Committee's amended bill relative to the UST management fund, closure and associated penalties. We appreciate the effort the Committee took to respond to our earlier comments.

We have carefully reviewed the amended bill and wish to make some additional recommendations. Our first comment is with respect to subsection (d) to Section 76116 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated. That proposed section states as follows:

(d) Any previously approved UST, which is discovered to be abandoned inplace during construction-related activities, shall be removed and any soil and/or groundwater contamination found to be caused by a release from the UST shall be mitigated as soon as reasonably possible, but not to exceed one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days or as may deemed reasonable by the GEPA Administrator.

Mobil recommends that this proposed paragraph be deleted from the amended bill. Historically, GEPA has been diligent and careful to ensure that whenever tanks were properly abandoned or removed, under GEPA's guidance and approval, proper procedures were followed and testing and remediation, if necessary, undertaken to meet regulatory requirements. If additional contamination was found, it could be related to some entirely different cause than a discharge from the UST.

Additionally, when a UST is abandoned in site, it is filled with inert material such as sand or concrete. Removing a tank that has been filled with sand and or concrete is a much more difficult proposition compared to the removal of an empty tank and creates a far greater risk of damage to property or injury to person.

Our second comment is with respect to new subsection (e) of Section 76116 of Title 10. This proposed subsection reads as follows:

(e) Any UST discovered to have been abandoned in-place without written approval from GEPA, shall be removed and any soil and/or groundwater contamination found to be caused by a release from the UST shall be mitigated as soon as reasonably possible, but not to exceed one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days or as may be deemed reasonable by the GEPA Administrator.

In the past, Mobil has had experiences where an abandoned UST has been discovered but ownership of the UST is undetermined. Mobil fully supports the proposition that USTs which have been abandoned in-place without proper procedures having been undertaken and where there is evidence of soil and/or groundwater contamination must be removed and any contamination remediated. However, where the ownership of the UST is unknown, uncertain or disputed, there appears to be no procedure available to determine ownership.

In order to avoid this problem, Mobil recommends that the owner of the property where the UST is discovered be responsible in the first instance for removal and mitigation. However, nothing should preclude the owner from investigating and determining who else may have owned the UST in the past. The owner should be able to proceed against any such prior owner of the UST if such prior owner can subsequently be identified, either to force the prior owner of the UST to remove it or to recover damages sustained by the land owner as a result of him being required to remove the UST and conduct the remediation.

In addition, while 180 days is generally sufficient time to obtain permits, excavate and remove a UST, investigation, remediation and monitoring always takes more than 180 days. Thus, we recommend the 180-day limit apply to UST removal only. The length of time to investigate, remediate and monitor can best be determined by GEPA on a case-by-case basis. As a consequence, we would suggest that subsection (e) be revised to read as follows:

(e) Any UST discovered to have been abandoned-in-place without written approval from GEPA shall be removed as soon as reasonably possible but not to exceed one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days or for longer time as may be deemed reasonable by the GEPA Administrator, and any soil and/or groundwater contamination found to be caused by a release from the UST shall be mitigated as soon as reasonably possible. If ownership of the UST is unknown, uncertain and disputed, the owner of the land where the UST has been found shall be responsible

for removal of the UST and any required mitigation. Nothing herein, however, shall prohibit the owner of such land from pursuing any remedies available in equity or at law against the party which previously owned and abandoned in-place the UST in question if such party is subsequently identified.

We believe these changes will further improve the bill and request your kind consideration of them. Should you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me. Once again, I thank you for allowing us to comment on this important legislation.

We thank you and your senior policy analyst, Mr. Brennen, for sending us the most recent version of Bill No. 337-32. We greatly appreciate the cooperative attitude you have displayed in fine tuning this Bill. We feel that when the public and private sector work together in this fashion, the result is a more robust outcome which benefits the broader community as a whole.

In that spirit, we would suggest just a few corrections to the bill most of which are to simply improve the language a bit. The sole substantive comment is with respect to new Section 76116(e) where we suggest that where the ownership of a UST is unknown, uncertain and disputed the "current owner" be responsible for removal. This will clarify that it is indeed the current owner who will be responsible for removing the UST in the first place and that current owner will then be able to proceed against prior responsible parties including prior owners or operators of improperly abandoned UST's on the current owner's property.

We attach a marked up version of the Bill showing the change and other minor, suggested changes intended to clarify the language of the Bill.

Thank you again for your consideration and engagement in this process. We look forward to working with you in the future on other legislation that will benefit the community as a whole.

I Liheslatura finds that there are over three hundred (300) regulated Underground Storage Tanks (USTs), with a total capacity of ninety (90) million gallons, currently in use to store gasoline, diesel, and residual oil, and approximately fifty-five (55) miles of buried pipeline, with a static holding capacity of three (3) million gallons, used to transport these products. These facilities are owned by commercial, private, local and federal government entities located at 136 different sites which include gas stations, residential estates, commercial and industrial buildings, hotels, golf courses, resorts, and federal and local government agencies.

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I Liheslatura finds that during the period 2000 to 2013, there were a total of 139 releases from underground tanks in Guam. The majority of incidences have occurred in northern Guam where the island's sole-source aquifer is located. I Liheslatura further finds the vast majority of these releases, 118 or 84%, have been completely cleaned up. Of the remainder, 21 are subject to ongoing clean up, remediation and/or monitoring to ensure that conditions continue to improve.

I Liheslatura further finds that although the number of incidences has been decreasing annually, due to more stringent construction and operating requirements, the threat to the environment posed by these tanks remains.

I Liheslatura finds that the Guam UST program was established and codified under Chapter 76 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated. The existing USTs on Guam have largely been upgraded to meet current standards, and 100% of the facilities with active tanks meet regulatory standards for corrosion protection and leak detection systems.

I Liheslatura intends to increase the maximum civil penalty per tank per day, for each violation of a requirement or standard from eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) to sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000) in order to adequately fund mitigation activities and subsequent related actions in accordance with Chapter 76 of Title 10 Guam Code Annotated and Chapter 50 of Division 10, Title 22 of the Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations.

*

Section 2. §76114 of Chapter 76, of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§76114. Underground Storage Tank Management Fund.

There is hereby established a fund to be known as the "Underground Storage Tank Management Fund", hereafter referred to as the UST-LUST Fund, a non-lapsing, revolving Fund which shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam.

(a) Notwithstanding the Central Accounting Act, aAll fees, reimbursements, assessments, fines, forfeitures, and other funds collected or received pursuant to this Chapter, shall be deposited in the UST-LUST Fund and shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year, but shall rollover into the next fiscal year or until expended.

Independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith. This Fund shall be kept in a bank licensed to do business on Guam, and funds shall be paid out only upon a request for payment or requisition submitted by the Director or Administrator and countersigned by the Chairman of the Board. All monies in this Fund shall require legislative appropriation. in the fund are hereby appropriated to the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) to be expended in accordance with this part and are not subject to I

Nothing herein, however, shall prohibit the owner of such land from pursuing any remedies available in equity or at law against the party which previously owned and abandoned in-place the UST in question if such party is subsequently identified."

Section 4. §76124 of Chapter 76 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows: "§76124. Penalties.

- (a) A person who violates any provisions of this Chapter, or rules or regulations enacted pursuant hereto, or refuses or neglects to comply with an order issued by the Administrator to require compliance with this Chapter, *shall* be guilty of pay the Agency a civil violation and shall be subject to a penalty up to Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000) Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000) for each tank for each day of each violation.
 - (b) Any person with an interest that may be adversely affected by

a violation of this Chapter may intervene as a matter of right in any civil action brought by the Administrator to require compliance with this Chapter.

- (c) A person who knowingly fails to notify the Administrator pursuant to §§ 76105 or 76112, or who makes any false statement or representation in any UST notification, permit application, or other document filed, maintained, or used for compliance with this Chapter, *shall* be guilty of a <u>civil violation</u>. misdemeanor and may be subject to imprisonment for up to twelve (12) months and fined up to Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000) per day for each violation, or both.
- (d) Any person who denies, obstructs, or hampers the entrance, inspection, or conduct or release response activity by a representative of the Agency at any building, place, site, facility, vehicle, or structure that the representative is authorized to enter, or any inspector who fails to provide information requested by the agency representative as pursuant to § 76110 *shall* be guilty of a civil violation and shall be subject to a penalty of fined *up to* Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000) Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000) for every day the person he denies, obstructs or hinders the acquisition of, or fails to provide, the information requested, as determined in a civil action in the Superior Court of Guam.
- (e) Each separate civil violation shall be subject to the following penalties: for the first, second and third offense, the violator shall be subject to a penalty of up to sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000) per tank per day for each separate violation. Second, third, and fourth offenses are defined as offenses within twelve months from the first, second and

third offenses respectively. For any fourth violation of this Part, the violator shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be subject to imprisonment for up to twelve (12) months and fined up to Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11.000) Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16.000) per day for each violation, or both.

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Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.




