### COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

#### I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 34-32 (COR) was introduced on February 4, 2013 by Senators V. Anthony Ada and Rory J. Respicio, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Aviation, Ground Transportation, Regulatory Concerns and Future Generations on February 4, 2013.

The Committee on Aviation, Ground Transportation, Regulatory Concerns and Future Generations convened a public hearing on February 12, 2013 at 10:10 a.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was Bill No. 34-32 (COR). The hearing was adjourned at 10:55 a.m.

### II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

**Chairman Michael San Nicolas:** We will now begin to hear testimony on Bill 34-32, also authored by Senator Tony Ada. I will yield to Senator Ada.

**Senator Tony Ada:** Thank you, Mister Chair. Mister Chair, what this bill does is authorizes the DRT to delegate the vehicle registration process to automotive dealers. This bill represents about six months of work

between the Guam Automotive Dealers Association and Revenue and Taxation. This bill is a win-win situation for everyone involved. The government, at Rev and Tax, would be able to process vehicle registrations faster and even utilize their personnel elsewhere if need be. The vehicle dealers would be able to register the vehicles on point of sale at the vehicle sales lot. The people become the biggest winner of all with having to not be able to stand in a long line to register a vehicle or being able to visit their dealer just once or twice and be able to get their registration and license plate. DRT has the means to adjudicate the rules and regulations and they have complete control over this program. It would have the authority to grant or repeal the dealer's authorization to participate in this program. Thank you, Mister Chair.

**Chairman San Nicolas:** Thank you, Senator Ada. Signed up for testimony is John Camacho, Director of Revenue and Taxation.

John Camacho: Thank you again for this opportunity to testify on Bill 34-32. The proposed bill allows the Department to work with the dealers to allow them to issue registrations, certificates and license plates. The Department sees this will benefit both the public and the government. Service will be provided faster at the dealers and the backlog the Vehicle Registration Branch experiences will be reduced. The Department thanks the Senators for providing a framework for our Department to build-on. The Department looks forward to the passing of this bill and will develop the rules and regulations to move quickly towards its implementation. And if there are any questions, I will be happy to answer them.

**Chairman San Nicolas:** Thank you, sir. Are there any Senators who wish to pose questions to Mister Camacho regarding this bill? Are there any members of the community who wish to comment regarding this bill? If you could, please approach the table.

**Jay Jones:** We previously presented testimony in complete support of Senator Ada's bill six months ago or something to that effect. We are just here in case there are any further questions or anything we can do to help move this process along.

Chairman San Nicolas: Thank you, sir. Do any Senators have any questions for Mister Jones?

Senator Frank Aguon, Jr.: Thank you very much, Mister Chairman. There was a comment made by Mister Shelly a little but earlier about the government trying to get its collection of taxes. In terms of how the process may work because I know that it is still subject to rules and regulations being formulated, obviously we are looking at least a minimum net zero loss in terms of revenues that Rev and Tax is presently collecting. I'd say, if the registration fee is right now \$45 for a particular vehicle then the dealership may come in and say, 'Okay, we'll process this based on the allowance by law and promulgation of the rules and regulations but we're going to take a cut of \$10 for administrative fees.' That is a question I would have to ask as it applies to the resources at Rev and Tax and the government of Guam presently collects. So, is it a net zero anticipated loss so whatever additional costs would be tagged on by the dealers so that they can cover the costs of administering such a program?

**Mr. Camacho:** I understand the bill calls on the dealers to practically cover all or part of the costs. I'm hoping they cover all the costs.

**Sen.** Aguon: I anticipate that the dealers, as a private entity, will cover all the costs.

**Mr. Camacho:** As far as the registration, I don't think so. The only additional that the Department will be taking is monitoring those license plates and registrations that are handed over to the dealers and making sure that, and they're going to be bonded by the way, so these are the things that we worked with the good Senator here and partly with the dealers.

Sen. Aguon: I am not necessarily concerned about how the private business enterprise and the dealers are going to be able to recover costs because that is going to be factored in. My biggest concern is, is this going to be a net zero revenue loss, or net zero revenue situation, on the part of Rev and Tax? Or are we looking at every additional vehicle that is going to be registered through this mechanism – through the dealership? I support the concept. Obviously, it is moving in a direction where the dealership will be able to expedite the processing of registration, administering license plates and what not. My question again comes back to – will this reflect a net zero revenue loss or situation rather than a \$90 vehicle registration now the government of Guam is only going to generate \$60 because the additional \$30 is going to be directed towards the dealers for incurring the costs of processing this outside of your agency? That's my question.

**Mr. Camacho:** My understanding of the bill is that everything remains the same. It's just that they're allowed to issue those registrations.

**Sen. Aguon:** Just for clarification purposes, there will be a net zero revenue base?

**Mr. Camacho:** In terms of the collection of fees, yes.

**Sen. Aguon:** Your fees will still be the same and any additional costs will be incurred by the dealers.

Mr. Jones: The dealers never anticipated any change in our expense to do this.

Sen. Aguon: I just want to make sure that is clear.

Mr. Jones: We don't plan on charging a fee or anything.

**Sen. Aguon:** I did qualify my statement. I support the concept. I want to make sure that in this particular case, if there is going to be a direct impact, that Rev and Tax has to understand and make sure that accommodations are provided.

Mr. Jones: We have not asked for any of those accommodations.

Sen. Aguon: Alright. Thank you very much. Thank you, Mister Chair.

**Chairman San Nicolas:** Thank you, Senator Aguon. Are there any other Senators who wish to pose any questions? Any other members of the community wish to testify? Please state your name.

Art Illagan: When I was director, we had discussions and we were talking with the dealerships about putting this thing together. The problem we had was the cost. Who was going to bear the cost and how would they be able to interface with Rev and Tax? I believe the Association was willing to bear the cost at that time but was it proper. There was no legislation for us to accept that work from the Association. I don't know how the mechanism is going to work with this law. There has to be a budget for it if you want us to do it. There has to be an appropriation for us to go out there and bid. Or, if the law allows, put the burden on the Association. Let them pay for it and let them implement. Make that program communicate with our computer system.

**Chairman San Nicolas:** Thank you, sir. I did have a question regarding that for John Camacho. Do you anticipate that the implementation of this program is going to incur any additional cost to be able to interface with the dealerships?

**Mr.** Camacho: The way I read the bill, the cost will be bore by the dealers to provide those costs to connect the required computers and technologies and to have access on all these vehicles that are going to be registered. That is my understanding.

**Chairman San Nicolas:** Just to clarify with Mister Jones, the dealerships are prepared to incur that cost not only on the dealership end but also on the DRT end so that there is a free flow of information and full integration?

Mr. Jones: Based on our understanding of how it's supposed to work with us inputting the customer information into the Rev and Tax system, yes. That is our intention to absorb those expenses as we know them. If there is some huge hardware or software expenses that we are unaware of to this point then that would have to be discussed. Based on our understanding of how it should work, yes, we do plan to absorb those expenses. We'll gain additional efficiency from this process as well. It's not like we are doing it out of the goodness of our heart. We all benefit and the customers benefit. It is basically a win-win situation as far as we can tell.

Chairman San Nicolas: Thank you, sir. Do other Senators have any questions?

Senator Tom Ada: I just hope that when Rev and Tax develops rules and regulations as to how this thing would work, there is somehow that quality control that is put in there. Then the dealers do not go directly into the Rev and Tax database to enter in their data as opposed to basically storing it and, for their purposes, basically have completed the registration for that vehicle so that he can drive out of the lot. Rev and Tax will have to come back and take a look so that we don't have a situation of corrupted data in the database and it's like, 'oh, this came from the dealers' or 'this came from our folks.' Once it gets into the Rev and Tax database it has gone through the scrutiny of Rev and Tax so that what is in the database, if it is wrong and an error, it is because of something Rev and Tax did and not because... I hope we don't do this finger pointing. I hope that is a consideration that will be made.

Mr. Camacho: Yes, Senator Tom Ada. When we adopt the proposed rules and regulations, we will look into checks and balances to make sure that the inputting of all the data that the dealers

are doing are at least monthly or quarterly looked at moving forward to ensure that there is continuity on their part and making sure that all cars are properly documented.

Chairman San Nicolas: Senator Aguon, you had a follow-up question for that?

**Sen. Aguon:** Thank you very much, Mister Chairman and thank you for your patience gentlemen. Let's say your registration is based on a formula that is applied for cost recovery, is that correct? Or is it arbitrarily...

Mr. Camacho: No. It is based on weight, I believe. The vehicle itself is based on weight.

Sen. Aguon: Okay. So, it isn't based on cost recovery. The reason I bring that up is because if it is based on cost recovery, the cost of personnel to administer, the preparation of the registration and what not, then a \$90 registration that would be conducted and administered out of Rev and Tax should be reduced in terms of the dealer administering the program. If the cost recovery is \$90, you would extract the cost of personnel, extract the cost of documentation, they will provide the license plate, they will provide the registration documentation. That cost factor would be extracted from the cost that would actually be assessed to the dealers so that a customer would still be paying that \$90 fee for registration but, guess what, the cost... and this is from the financial component and the business perspective. So, I would anticipate the formula that would be applied in this case because a \$90 registration fee that is based on weight would be applicable to the same with the dealers but, in the same token that administering the registration form, 1 don't know if that would be factored into the cost reduction so that the dealer will charge the same cost to the customer base but they would absorb that based on the fee that is assessed. I guess I'm digging too far into the weeds in terms of how the formula will be applied. That's going to come up through the rules and regulations. It's a concern I had originally that I stated whether the government is not going to lose revenue as a result of this or because the offset is direct service to the customers and improving efficiency in getting the registration in the hands of the customer once that customer purchases a vehicle. I think that the process is going to work to the benefit of our people. Thank you.

**Chairman San Nicolas:** Thank you, Senator Aguon. Any Senators wish to comment on this bill or pose questions to members of the community? If none, this shall conclude the hearing on Bill 34-32. Thank you, gentlemen.

#### III. RECOMMENDATIONS

Each record shall be kept for a period of at least three (3) years from the date of entry and shall be available for inspection by representatives of the Department during regular business hours.

(e) A temporary registration license plate issued to an owner or purchaser of a vehicle in accordance with this section shall be valid for a period of sixty

- (e) A temporary registration license plate issued to an owner or purchaser of a vehicle in accordance with this section shall be valid for a period of sixty (60) days from the date of issuance *or* until the issuance of a permanent registration plate or until the cancellation or rescission of the contract of purchaser, whichever occurs first. Upon the expiration of a temporary registration plate, the holder thereof shall immediately destroy surrender the same.
- (f) The director of the Department shall have the specific power, after hearing, to suspend the right to issue temporary registration license plates of any dealer or distributor who fails to comply with the requirements of this section or any other applicable rules or regulations.
- (g) The Department shall be responsible for the design of the temporary plates and registration certificates.
- (h) The Department shall promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 9 of 5GCA (Administrative Adjudication Law) for the administration of the provisions of this Section and costs related to postage, handling and supplies. All fees assessed herein this Section shall be paid before the plates and registrations are mailed to the buyer and the lien holder."

#### Comments on Bill No. 34-32

This proposed legislation is seeking to add new §7178 and §7179 to Chapter 7 of 16 GCA, which would license car dealerships to issue vehicle registrations and temporary license plates, who are the point of sales for all new cars and for most used cars. The Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT) is the authorization body for such measure that would develop the necessary administrative protocol to manage such endeavor entailing training, monitoring, auditing, and enforcing. Such legislation would consummate the issuance of such documents to car dealers as an extension of DRT.

This proposed change in the current motor vehicle policy and process will provide operational capacity to DRT at its present location by decentralizing the number of vehicle registrations processed and the number license plates issued. Furthermore, it will provide for the increased ability of the Motor Vehicle Division of DRT to service the growing population of the Guam without substantially increasing its work force. By providing more service capacity, DRT would be to generate more revenues, increasing its revenue contributions to the General Fund and other associated funds.

## AN ADD A NEW §§ 7178 & 7179 TO 16GCA RELATIVE TO VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 2. Section 2. A new Section 7178 is added to Chapter 7 of 16GCA to read as 2
- 3 follows:

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- 5 §7178. Point of Sale (POS) Registration authorized. The director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall, unless there exists legitimate reason not to, 6 by contract, authorize an automobile dealer licensed to do business on Guam to issue 7 registration certificates and license plates for vehicles sold by said dealer. 8
  - (a) The director may require each dealer it authorizes to issue registration certificates and license plates/decalcomania to:
    - (1) Undergo training for staff and management involved in the registration process,
    - (2) Provide a secure facility for data processing equipment and license plates,
    - (3) Post a fidelity bond, to indemnify the dealer against criminal acts that may be committed by an employee, in an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) per employee involved in the registration process,

1	(4) Pay all or a portion of reasonable data communications costs between
2	the dealership office and the Department of Revenue and Taxation;
3	and
4	(5) Require any other conditions necessary for an efficient and secure
5	registration process.
6	(b) All registration and licensing fees shall be retained by the Government of
7	Guam in a manner prescribed by Public Law.
8	(c) Any person who attempts to use data processing equipment, license plates
9	and decalcomania in manner inconsistent with this section commits a misdemeanor for
10	the first offense and a third degree felony for subsequent offenses. These penalties are
11	in addition to other penalties prescribed by Public Law.
12	(d) The Director of Revenue and Taxation may revoke a dealer's authorization
13	prior to the expiration of the contract for cause.
14	(e) The Department shall promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to the
15	provisions of Chapter 9 of 5GCA (Administrative Adjudication Law) for the
16	administration of the provisions of this Section.
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18	Section 2. A new Section 7179 is added to Chapter 7 of 16GCA to read as follows:
19	§ 7179. Temporary Registration Plates.
20	(a) The Department may authorize a dealer or distributor of motor vehicles or
21	motorcycles to issue temporary registration license plates. The
22	Department shall require that all authorized dealer or distributors submit
23	proof of status as a bona fide dealer or distributor.
24	(b) A dealer or distributor may issue a temporary registration license plate for
25	a fee of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10) for each plate to a purchaser of
26	an unregistered motor vehicle or motorcycle.

1	(c) A dealer or distributor who issues a temporary registration license plate
2	shall mark or stamp thereon with indelible ink in letters at least 3/4 of an
3	inch high the following information:
4	1. The word "Guam";
5	2. The dealer or distributor's name;
6	3. The date of issuance;
7	4. The date of expiration; and
8	5. The make and serial number of the motor vehicle or motorcycle.
9	The dealer or distributor shall immediately transmit this information to the
10	Department.
11	(d) Every dealer or distributor who issues a temporary registration license
12	plate shall maintain at such place of business a record of the following
13	information:
14	1. All temporary registration license plates issued by such dealer;
15	2. The date of receipt and issuance;
16	3. The name of the purchaser to whom the temporary registration
17	license plate was issued;
18	4. The make and serial number of the vehicle for which issued; and
19	5. Such other information as the Department may require.
20	Each record shall be kept for a period of at least three (3) years from the
21	date of entry and shall be available for inspection by representatives of the
22	Department during regular business hours.
23	(e) A temporary registration license plate issued to an owner or purchaser of a
24	vehicle in accordance with this section shall be valid for a period of sixty
25	(60) days from the date of issuance or until the issuance of a permanent
26	registration plate or until the cancellation or rescission of the contract of
27	purchaser, whichever occurs first. Upon the expiration of a temporary
28	registration plate the holder thereof shall immediately destroy the same.

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- (f) The director of the Department shall have the specific power, after hearing, to suspend the right to issue temporary registration license plates of any dealer or distributor who fails to comply with the requirements of this section or any other applicable rules or regulations.
- (g) The Department shall promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 9 of 5GCA (Administrative Adjudication Law) for the administration of the provisions of this Section.
