II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Note: Chairman Cruz had to step away from the public hearing temporarily to attending another meeting. Senator Frank Aguon, Jr. was asked to convene the meeting in his absence.

Senator Frank Aguon Jr. We will proceed with Bill No. 345-32 (COR), An Act to amend Section 3, Section 4, and to repeal Section 6 all of Public Law 21-130 to authorize Department of Land Management to exchange private property taken for the construction of the Agat-Umatac Highway with government land.

We have several individuals who have signed up to provide testimony. If there is anyone else in the audience who would like to provide testimony, please proceed to the table.

We have Mr. Mike Borja from the Department of Land Management, Ms. Janet Quinata from Umatac and Mr. Manuel Aguiningoc from Santa Rita. Mr. Borja, please proceed with your testimony.

Mr. Michael Borja. Thank you Senator, I am Michael Borja the Director of Land Management. Concerning Bill 345 for the exchange of parcels of property for the Agat-Umatac highway. I submitted two written testimonies; one dated June 10 and one dated August 1. The June 10 testimony basically gave some specifics describing the lots and deleting one of the lots for drainage purposes. In the August 1 testimony I submitted, I am also asking that in this bill because it does specifically speak about value for value it did not give the specifics of the definition of how to obtain the value for value, so we ask that they add the following:

"The Department of Land Management shall have the properties to be exchanged under this Act appraised by two independent appraisers licensed to do business on Guam. The two appraisals shall be completed within 180 days of this Act. The averages of the two appraisals shall be used as the values for the basis for such exchange. We would take three lots from lot 5B tract 3241 to be appraised with the average of the two appraisals used to determine the price per square meter for the land exchange. The Department shall have such properties surveyed, mapped and registered. We are also requesting the sum of \$20,000 to be appropriated to Department of Land Management to conduct the appraisals."

We support this land exchange, but the definitions of how we have to obtain it I think are quite important because in dealing with a specific case currently, that definition is what is saving the day on getting the job done because it has to be specific to that point on how we obtain this value for value determination.

Senator Frank Aguon, Jr. Thank you very much, Mr. Borja. Those are very legitimate concerns on behalf of the people of Guam. Please identify yourself for the record and proceed with your testimony.

Mr. Manuel Aguiningoc. [Read from written testimony verbatim. See attached]

Senator Frank Aguon, Jr. Thank you Mr. Aquiningoc for your testimony this morning. Gentlemen, thank you for your comments. Let me also thank you for recognizing Speaker Ben Pangelinan as the primary sponsor of this measure and the efforts that he and his office staff had undertaken in terms of putting this legislation together.

And secondly I just want to also, on behalf of the committee, extend our appreciation to the families because after twenty-two years and this has yet to be finalize and closed, I think by virtue of the passage of Bill 345, this will hopefully end any discussion and allow for the official exchange of property for property that your family had no longer available by virtue of the expansion of the Umatac Agat southern highway many years back. I just want to thank you and your families and we certainly - at least from my perspective - look forward to the eventual passage of this and working with Land Management so that it can be effectuated soon. Thank you Mr. Aquiningnoc. Senators any questions or comments? Senator Barnes?

Senator Tina Muna-Barnes. Thank you Mr. Chair. I was looking at the recommendation from the Department of Land Management and noting that the following government parcels each containing instead of 926, it be amended to 940 square meters is what I am looking at right Mr. Borja? But based on the description of the properties, the majority of that is larger than what is asked for in the amendment and maybe I didn't hear it correctly, but was there any specific reason for the amendment?

Mr. Michael Borja. I think we may have surveyed out the lands and in surveying them they tried to allot them all out to that correct amount of 940 square meters equally for all block 5B tract 3241 and there is a list of lots down there.

Senator Tina Muna-Barnes. Yeah, because just based on the areas and the actual square meters, there is a couple of descendants who received seven times more as noted or if that was taken away. So, you are only asking the government exchange the acreage or the area of only up to 940 square meters. Am I correct?

Mr. Mike Borja. No. The parcels that are listed here - their size 940 square meters. But in this value for value what we are going to determine is that in the case of one family if the value came out to let's say, \$100,000 and the values of each of these tracks are worth \$30,000 we will try give them what is fair for that amount and we will take it from these lots that are listed on this bill.

Senator Tina Muna-Barnes. Thank you for the clarification Mr. Borja. Thank you Mr. Chair.

Senator Frank Aguon, Jr. Thank you, Senator Barnes. Senator Tom Ada?

Senator Tom Ada. I certainly support this bill and I just hope that insult was not added to the injury by requiring you to continue paying the taxes on these properties. I hope that wasn't the case or was it?

Mr. Manuel Aguiningoc. No.

Senator Tom Ada. No. Okay. To Land Management, inevitably this is going to open up a pandora's box. This is the right thing to do in compensating the private property owners rightfully. As I understand it, most of Route 4 from Umatac to Malesso to Inalajan the government does not own clear titles over those properties I am just curious if government of Guam still has sufficient properties to be able to make similar land exchanges. I am sure other bills similar to this are going to be coming through. Are you aware of that?

Mr. Michael Borja. I am aware of a bill that is pending right now. I can't recall what the bill number is, but it's to do the exact same thing; to compensate people whose land may have been taken since 1994.

Senator Tom Ada. Part of the ramifications of the government not having clear title of those tracks of land that the highway is located, is that we cannot use federal money that is made available for the maintenance, the reconstruction of our highways for as long as the government does not have clear title of it. I just anticipate that there is going to be more of these demands being made and rightfully so. I just hope the government has enough properties to be able to satisfy the requirements. Thank you.

Senator Frank Aguon, Jr. Thank you very much Senator Ada. I just want to add to the comments, Mr. Borja for recognizing that the value for value that the appraisal needs to be conducted and requesting for that additional funding mechanism. I understand your Land Survey Revolving Fund does have some additional resources beyond the projected revenue based for this fiscal year. Could that be conceivably be utilized as a source?

Mr. Mike Borja. Most likely.

Senator Frank Aguon. Okay. Now, do you have the discretion to utilize that or do you still need the authorization /appropriation?

Mr. Mike Borja. I think I still need to get the authorization.

Senator Frank Aguon, Jr. Okay. Thank you very much gentlemen. Mr. Aquiningoc, again thank you to you and your families. We will see what we can do to expedite this as quickly as possible.

This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 345-32 (COR). This bill establishes a value-for-value land exchange but needs to define how to determine the value. Please add the following section which defines the process for determining property values:

Section 2 (d). The Department of Land Management ("Department") shall have the properties to be exchanged under this Act appraised by two (2) independent appraisers licensed to do business on Guam. The two (2) appraisals shall be completed within one-hundred eighty (180) days of this Act. The averages of the two (2) appraisals shall be used as the values for the basis of such exchange. Three lots from Block 5B, Tract 3241 will be appraised with the average of the two (2) appraisals used to determine the price per square meter for the land exchange. The Department shall have such properties surveyed, mapped and registered. Twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) shall be appropriated to the Department of Land Management to conduct the appraisals.

TESTIMONY ON BILL NO. 345-32

Good morning Mr. Chairman and members of the committee.

My name is Manuel Aquiningoc and I'm appearing before you on behalf of the family of the late Gregorio Q. Gofigan, Victoria G. Sanchez, Sylvia G. Quinata, Louise G. Sanchez and Mr. Herbert Gofigan as listed on Bill 345-32. On behalf of the family, I wish to inform you of our support for the passage of Bill 345-32 introduced by the late Senator Ben Pangelinan. This bill is an act to amend Section 3, Section 4, and to repeal Section 6 all of Public Law 21-130 to authorize Department of Land Management to exchange private property taken for the construction of the Agat-Umatac Highway with government land.

It has been 22 years since the passage of Public Law 20-133 and Public Law 21-133 that identified 17 lots that were taken from our family for the Agat-Umatac Highway expansion project and the authorization for the government of Guam to provide our family with a fair value property exchange in the Umatac Subdivision. Unfortunately, it was found that some of the lots identified in Public Law 21-133 Section 4(b) for exchange in the subdivision were slopes and was deemed undevelopable.

Your serious and considerate decision and passage of this bill will bring closure to our claim for an exchange for our property taken for the construction of the Agat-Umatac Highway. Since the passage of Bill No. 897 signed into Public Law 21-130 by then Acting Governor Frank Blas, dated July 28, 1992, we have been very patient to this date. It is unfortunate that the majority of the land owners listed have passed and never got to see their property as intended in this bill.

The family extends Un Dangkulu Na Si Yu'us Ma'ase to the late Sen. Ben Pangelinan "May he rest in peace" for all his efforts and time spent in trying to bring this case to a close. He is truly a Senator for the People. He had been working with Mr. Gil Quinata for several years, who also had passed three years ago.

Mr. Chairman, the family also would like to convey their appreciation for your interest and desire in taking over this bill for Sen. Pangelinan. Upon hearing of his passing, I immediately wonder if anyone would look at his pending bills. So thank you Mr. Chairman for picking up where he left off as a gesture of his interest for the people.

In closing, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee, we humbly ask for your passage of this bill.

BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 354-32 (COR)

The proposed legislation is aimed at *amending* Section 3, Section 4, and *repealing* Section 6, of Public Law 21-130, to authorize the Department of Land Management to exchange private property taken for the construction of the Agat-Umatac Highway with the Government of Guam.

Should this proposed legislation become law, the 21 lots of Block 5B, Tract 3241 will be distributed to the private owners of properties utilized in the reconstruction of the Agat-Umatac Highway. The private owners include the following: Louise G. Sanchez, Herbert R. Gofigan, Victoria G. Sanchez and Gregorio Q. Gofigan, Sylvia G. Quinata, and Vicente A. Quinata. The intent of the proposed legislation is to properly compensate the above stated private property owners after the original enactment of P.L. 21-130 to reconstruct the Agat-Umatac Highway over twenty-one years ago.

The exchange of the 21 lots of Block 5B, Tract 3241 for the properties owned by the above stated private owners will be conducted on a value for value basis. Due to the exchange being conducted on a value for value basis, there should be no increase or decrease to land inventory owned by the Government of Guam.

The proposed legislation stipulates that the government lands designated for exchange are based on recorded and registered maps with the Department of Land Management. However, there is no component of the proposed legislation that waives the fee to register the subject government properties after it is exchanged with the above stated private property owners. The fee to register a parcel of property amounts to \$25.00 per parcel of land and \$40.00 for the first issuance of Certificate of Title in a Land Registration Case. This amounts to approximately \$65.00 per parcel of land, which 21 lots are designated to be exchanged through this proposed legislation. Based on the above stated costs, the Bureau estimates that \$1,365 will be received by the Department of Land Management in the form of Land Registration and Filing fees.

If the proposed legislation is passed, the subject properties currently owned by the Government of Guam will be exchanged on value-for-value basis with the private property owners whose lands were used in the reconstruction of the Agat-Umatac Highway. There is a potential of revenues received by the Department of Land Management in the form of Land Registration and filing fees.



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

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

Munoz said he's very happy for his cast. crew, "and especially for my funders who also contributed to the project." He noted however that in moments of euphoric triumph "one must always remain anchored in humility and grace. This is an industry where you experience amazing peaks and low altitude valleys. It's important to focus on doing quality work and dangerous to be caught up in the hype."

This is the first time Munoz has utilized the web to release a film. He decided to take this route to get an audience.

"More people watch content on computers and smart phones then they do on traditional televisions. Looking at the analytics, more people have seen 'Griot's Lament' over the past three weeks then my fast three films combined."

The feedback and reviews make the efforts worthwhile with funding being a huge obstacle to the success of the project. Additionally, Munoz recognited an incident when his team was almost shot down by the LAPD because they weren't officially permitted to film.

The officer was actually happy to see a group

of people making an artsy film in his beat. He could have shot us down, but instead he let us off the hook.

Noting the outstanding contributions of people from Guam, Munoz mentioned locals Jeannett Da Duck and Thelma Hechenova.

"Averiff Leano did an amazing job doing the color correction and creating an award winning moon shot. The film looks good because of Averill's great eye. And the film sounds amazing because of Teddy Salas. We were up until 3 in the morning mixing the film. I have never met with a sound mixer who is so creative, innovative, and efficient. Lam very proud of Averill and Teddy's contributions. Success is always best when it is shared."

While webisode 2 will be released on Michael Jackson's birthday, in the meantime, Munoz looks forward to more contributions to Guam's film scene.

"I'm going to get back to Guarn to conduct another FYI FILMS workshop with youth at DYA in 2015. We were just awarded a significant grant. Hove working with youth, particularly on Guam."


Youth can also look forward to the 673/213 Alliance, an initiative meant to offer support and networking for people

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 3 of Public Law 21-130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Legislative findings and intent. The Legislature has been apprised by the Department of Land Management (DLM) and the Department of Public Works (DPW that the continuation of the work on Route 2, the Agat-Umatac Highway, is totally dependent on the acquisition of certain parcels of private property. The Legislature finds that such widening and reconstruction of the Agat-Umatac Highway must continue, and thus it is clear those private properties which have not been condemned for such purposes must be utilized. With this in mind, it is the intent of the Legislature that the owners of such properties either be justly compensated or be afforded the opportunity to exchange the lands required for the reconstruction and widening with government properties on a value-for-value basis.

It has been over twenty-one (21) years since the enactment of this Act to exchange government parcels with private property in order for the DPW to complete the work to widen Route 2. Unfortunately, as of this date there are some private landowners who were never compensated or afforded the opportunity to exchange lands pursuant to law.

Over the years, the DPW has made a determination that the government land identified in this Act is unsuitable for development and therefore the DLM has identified new parcels of government land for exchange.

I Liheslatura Guåhan further finds that the DLM worked diligently with the private landowners and the Mayor of Umatac, to identify parcels of government land acceptable for the exchange.

Therefore, *I Liheslatura Guåhan* intends to right the wrong that was done to these private landowners for over twenty-one (21) years and authorize the DLM to exchange government parcels with the private landowners."

Section 2. Section 4 in Public Law 21-130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. Land exchanges authorized. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Governor of Guam is authorized to exchange government property, on a value-for-value basis, with the following owners for their respective parcels situated along the proposed route for Route 2, the Agat-Umatac Highway:
