Committee Report Digest

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education, Public Library and Women's Affairs convened a public hearing on, Monday, November 24, 2014 at 6:20 p.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration was Bill No. 421-32 (COR) - An act to approve amendments to Chapter 8, Title 5A, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations. Introduced by Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D.

Public Notice Requirements

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators on November 17, 2014 (5 days notice), and November 24, 2014 (48 hours notice) via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

II. <u>SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISSCUSSION</u>

Bill No. 421-32 (COR) "An act to approve amendments to Chapter 8, Title 5A, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations."

- Speaker Won Pat Ed.D. announces that three individuals have signed up to testify on this bill but that only one of the individuals, Lea Santos was still present to testify.
- Ms. Lea Santos is in full support of Bill 421-32. Her written testimony is appended to the committee report.
- Ms. Mary Nolte announced that she would like clarification on whether existing teachers must have a minimum satisfactory rating by their administrators. She expressed that she has not been evaluated or observed by an administrator of her school formally or informally. She explained that she is concerned that this issue would prevent her from obtaining recertification.
- Ms. Lea Santos asked Ms. Mary Nolte if she is receiving an annual evaluation.
- Ms. Mary Nolte shared that with the new standards that are in place; there should have been a number of observations that should have occurred already but have yet to take place.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. asked Ms. Nolte if she had received an evaluation at the end of the year.
- Ms. Mary Nolte responded that there is supposed to be one at the end of the year.
- Ms. Mary Nolte expressed that she was provided with an evaluation last year, but two years prior to that she was not provided with one and received an automatic satisfactory. She explained that she wanted to clarify that with the new standards in place, if they do not receive any observations and evaluations each year will that mean that they are not able to recertify.
- Ms. Mary Nolte asked if the Department of Education policy is to provide an annual evaluation.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. states that it is and that at the end of the year the school principal has to evaluate you and that you have to be given a grade of satisfactory or unsatisfactory.

- Ms. Mary Nolte asked how the administrators make their decisions without any observations?
- Ms. Lea Santos responded that what Ms. Mary Nolte is speaking of is an issue to be taken up with the Department of Education and that it is not a certification issue. She explained that it is the assumption that the school principals are supposed to do that and if they do not then it is something that needs to be worked out with them.
- Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. mentions that the amendments in this bill are to define such terms as satisfactory and unsatisfactory as well the requirements for educators and to define the council for educator preparations. Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. states that "So what this is, is bringing the rules and regulations up to standards, this is updating it."

Speaker Won Pat, Ed.D. concluded the public hearing.

Amendments to Existing Rules and Regulations

5A GAR Education
Chapter 8 Guam Commission For Educator Certification

1. § 8102. **Definitions.**

- (o) Evaluation indicates the most recent professional evaluation supplied by a supervisor. A satisfactory evaluation will be indicated by the evaluating entity. As of 2014, Guam Department of Education indicates "Satisfactory" with the ratings "Emerging", "Effective" or "Highly Effective" and "Unsatisfactory" with the rating "Ineffective".
- (t) NCATE is the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. It is one of the U. S. accrediting bodies for teacher education colleges and institutions. NCATE merged with TEAC (Teacher Education Accreditation Council) to form CAEP (Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation) on July 1, 2013 and NCATE will cease to exist by 2020.
- (ab) Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators (CORE) means the series of tests for reading, writing and, mathematics that uses technology to more accurately measure the abilities, content knowledge and critical thinking skills of the teacher candidates from the Educational Testing Service (ETS). This definition will be used in all areas throughout the Rules and Regulations that make reference to Praxis I.
- (ac) Applicants who have successfully passed portions of Praxis-I and the required portions of Praxis Core to complete the series of tests may be eligible for certification.
- (ad) CAEP is the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation. It is the new single accrediting body for educator preparation that evolved with the consolidation of NCATE (National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education) and TEAC (Teacher Education Accreditation Council) on July 1, 2013. This definition will be used in all areas throughout the Rules and Regulations which make reference to NCATE.
- 2. § 8104. Issuance of Certificates, General.
- (i) Holders of Degrees from NCATE-Accredited Institutions. Holders of degrees in teacher preparation awarded by an institution accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) shall be eligible for an Initial Educator Certificate with the addition of the requirements that are stated in §8105 (b). (1) (A), (B), (C) and (D).

- 3. § 8105. Certificates for Teachers, General.
- (a) Temporary Teaching Certificate.

Minimum Qualifications. A Temporary Teaching Certificate may be issued to an applicant who presents evidence that he or she has completed a Bachelor's degree and a passing score on Praxis-I and / or Praxis CORE.

- (b) Initial Educator Certificate
 - (1) Minimum Qualifications.
 - (D) successfully passes Praxis I, and Praxis II Principles of Learning (PLT) and Praxis II content tests.
- 4. (c) Professional Educator Certificate.
- (1) Minimum Qualifications. A Professional Educator Certificate may be issued to an applicant who presents the following evidence:
 - fulfillment of all educational requirements for the Initial Educator Certificate or the Initial Educator Chamorro Language and Culture Teaching Certificate and provides evidence of the following:
 - (B) completion of requirements related to Guam History or Guam Culture; and
 - (C) completion of sixty (60) clock hours of professional activities, to include semester hours, Continuing Education

Units, or Professional Growth Plan requirements as

- acknowledged by administrator on-site; and
- (D) satisfactory performance evaluation and/or completion of Professional Growth Plan as approved by on-site administrator; and
 - (E) completion of a one (1) year mentorship in a Guam school; and
 - (F) completion of two (2) years as an Initial Educator Certificate Holder.
- (2) Length of Certification. The length of certification for a Professional Educator Certificate shall be five (5) years.
- (3) Renewability. A Professional Educator Certificate shall be renewable for any number of years. Within the length of certification provided herein, a person issued a Professional Educator Certificate shall be considered in good standing to retain such certificate by presenting evidence of the following:
 - completion of ninety (90) clock hours of professional activities, to include semester hours, Continuing Education Units, or Professional Growth Plan requirements as acknowledged by administrator on-site; and
 - (B) satisfactory performance evaluation.
- 5. (d) Muster Educator Certificate

- (1) Minimum Qualifications. A Master Educator Certificate may be issued to an applicant who presents evidence of the following:
- (A) he or she meets all educational requirements for the Initial Educator Certificate and the Professional Educator Certificate:
- (B) has a minimum of at least five (5) years of satisfactory teaching experience; and
- (C) has earned a Master's Degree and/or is a National Board Certified Teachers: and

(D) satisfactory performance evaluation.

- 6. (4) Holders of Professional II Certificates Issued by the Department of Education. No Master Educator Certificate issued under this rule shall be renewed for an applicant who *does not* provide evidence of having completed a Master's degree or National Board Certified Teacher.
- 7. (e) Professional Endorsement for Specialty Areas. Educators wishing to certify in multiple content areas, or to add an additional area, are able to apply for an endorsement on their existing valid educator certificate. To qualify for an endorsement, the applicant must provide evidence of the successful completion of fifteen (15) credit hours in the field or a passing score on the Praxis II in the designated content area. There will be an additional charge for the endorsement which will last the term of the existing certificate. Specialty areas for consideration are library science, instructional technology, visually impaired, orientation and mobility, deaf and hearing impaired, speech, media specialist, autism spectrum disorders, emotional and behavioral disorders or other specialty teaching areas as approved by GCEC.

8. § 8111. Endorsements for School Librarians.

(4) Renewability. A Professional School Librarian Endorsement may be renewed any number of times, provided that he or she presents evidence of satisfactory service as a school librarian; completion of ninety (90) hours of professional activities, to include semester hours in courses that will enhance the school librarian's work (such as courses in specific content areas, education courses, and library science courses); and Continuing Education Units, or Professional Growth Plan requirements, as approved by the administrator that have been acquired within the preceding five (5) years.

9. § 8112. Certificates for School Counselors.

- (a) Temporary School Counselor Certificate.
- (4) Holders Issued Certificates Known as "Emergency" by the Department of Education. A holder of a certificate known as an "Emergency" Guidance and Counseling certificate issued under Guam Education Policy Board Policy 1000.33 may be issued a Temporary School Counselor Certificate under §8112 (a)

of this Chapter provided they meet the minimal qualifications of the Temporary School Counselor Certificate.

- (c) Professional School Counselor Certificate.
- (4) Holders of Professional I Guidance and Counseling Certificates Issued by the Department of Education. Notwithstanding Subsection (c) of this Section, a Professional School Counselor Certificate maybe issued to a holder of a valid or recently expired "Professional I" Guidance and Counseling Certificate issued under Guam Education Policy Board Policy 1000,33 who provides evidence of satisfactory teaching and ninety (90) clock hours of professional activities within the Professional I certification period.
- (d) Master School Counselor Certificate.
- (4) Holders of Professional II Guidance and Counseling Certificates Issued by the Department of Education. A Master School Counselor Certificate may be issued to a holder of a "Professional II" Guidance and Counseling Certificate issued under Guam Education Policy Board Policy 1000,33 who provides evidence of satisfactory teaching and ninety (90) clock hours of professional activities within the Professional II certification period. No Master School Counselor Certificate issued under this rule shall be renewed for an applicant who does not provide evidence of having completed a Master's degree.

Hafa Adai and Good Afternoon, Honorable Speaker Won Pat and members of the Committee.

My name is Lea Santos, the Executive Director of the Guam Commission For Educator Certification. I am pleased to appear before you today in support of Bill No. 421-32 "AN ACT TO APPROVE AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 8, TITLE 5A, GUAM ADMINISTRATIVE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The bill contains various amendments, including some technical corrections that are essential to the existing law.

There are also several definitions that evolved from recent developments. With the revision of GDOE's teacher performance evaluation, new terms were introduced that must be incorporated in GCEC's rules and regulations. Due to the implementation of the Common Core through most schools, ETS (Educational Testing Service) has replaced the Praxis I test with the Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators test. In addition, CAEP (Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation) will be replacing NCATE (National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education).

By adding the requirement for passing the Praxis II Content tests for Initial Educator certificate holders, GCEC and UOG will be aligned. Passing this test proves that the teacher is Highly Qualified and guarantees that they have mastery of their subject. Moreover, through this test, Professional or Master Educator certificate holders can also earn an Endorsement in another subject area.

In recognition of the special needs of some of our students, GCEC is adding Professional Endorsements in Autism Spectrum Disorder, and, Emotional and Behavioral Disorders.
