#### **COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST**

**Bill No. 427-32 (COR)**: An act to *amend* § 85103(b) of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated; relative to the composition of the Council on the Arts and Humanities.

#### I. OVERVIEW

**Bill No. 427-32 (COR)** was introduced by Vice Speaker Benjamin J.F. Cruz on November 24, 2014, and subsequently referred to the Committee on General Government Operations and Cultural Affairs on November 25, 2014.

The Committee on General Government Operations and Cultural Affairs convened a public hearing on Tuesday, December 9, 2014, at 2:00PM in the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room. The hearing for Bill No. 427-32 (COR) began at 2:40PM and ended at 2:45PM.

#### **Public Notice Requirements**

All legal requirements for public notices were met, with requests for publication sent to all media and all Senators on December 1, 2014, and December 5, 2014, via email. Copies of the hearing notices are appended to the report.

#### II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairperson Benjamin J.F. Cruz announced Bill No. 427-32 (COR), and explained that

the bill is a fairly simple amendment to the statute governing the composition of the Council of the Arts and Humanities (Council) Board, whereby the last sentence is removed to allow board members to serve multiple terms.

**Joseph A. Cameron** (*President, Department of Chamorro Affairs*) thanked Chairperson Cruz and read his written testimony, which is appended to this report.

**Chairperson Cruz** thanked Mr. Cameron and called on the next speaker.

**Jessy C. Gogue** (*Mayor, Municipality of Chalan Pago-Ordot*) greeted members of the Committee, introduced himself, and noted that he was speaking on behalf of the Mayors' Council of Guam (MCOG). He proceeded to read written testimony, appended to this report, which he said was authorized by MCOG during its regular board meeting that took place the week preceding the public hearing for Bill No. 427-32 (COR).

Chairperson Cruz thanked Mayor Gogue and said that it had always been desirous to have a mayor as part of the Council Board. He added that the Festival of the Pacific Arts Coordinating Committee includes mayoral appointees. He continued:

"I know that sometimes they like to keep saying, 'You keep adding to our responsibility.' [But] as you put it, you guys have come forward and ask to assume this responsibility and we wholeheartedly support the idea of doing it. So, thank you very much for getting the mayors on board to say that they want to come onto the [Council] Board and make sure that that amendment is included in the bill."

#### Mayor Gogue thanked Chairperson Cruz and continued:

"It just goes [in] line [with] what has been oftentimes perceived as a needed advocacy on the part of the mayors and vice mayors, and that's our culture and humanities. And getting it out [into] the communities and finding those skill sets that may need a little extra funding to boost their skills and to promote our culture and humanities, by establishing our relationships, just seem to be appropriate. There was no reason for the mayors not to want to be on board with this proposal."

#### **Chairperson Cruz** said in response:

"And you're much too modest. I know there are many of you that have talents and [skills with] all kinds of musical instruments and supported the Pa'a Tao Tao Tano dancers in all of the villages. And so I want to thank the mayors, the

support they've been giving, the culture preservation over the last decade and we welcome your willingness to come to this [Council] Board."

**Chairperson Cruz**, on account that there were no questions from the Committee, considered Bill No. 427-32 (COR) as heard.

#### III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee finds that the Mayors' Council of Guam recommended that one of its members be added to the statutory composition of the Council on the Arts and Humanities (Council) Board. The Committee, having recognized the importance of the island's mayors, accepted that recommendation and has modified the composition of the Council's Board accordingly.

The Committee on General Government Operations and Cultural Affairs to which was referred "Bill No. 427-32 (COR) - B.J.F. 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

As the current Legislative Liaison for the Mayors' Council of Guam, I have been authorized by a majority vote of the Mayors' & Vice-Mayors', at our regular monthly meeting held on Wednesday, December 3, 2014, to submit testimony IN SUPPORT of this bill on behalf of the Mayors' Council. Additionally, during our discussions on this bill, the Mayors' Council is requesting for an amendment to Bill 427-32 that will "add" a voting member to the governing board for the Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA), to be appointed by the Mayors' Council of Guam.

First, it is the position of the Mayors' Council, that the basic intent of this bill, to eliminate board appointments for more than four (4) years "without interruption", is reasonable and appropriate. That, the passage of this bill acknowledges the importance of "continuity" within CAHA's governing board in their effort to maintain strong leadership and experience among these volunteers. And, should our request for an amendment to this bill be supported by the Legislature, we believe that this will further add to the continuity of leadership within CAHA's governing board.

It has always been evident throughout our Island's history that most of the arts and humanities programs, for all ages, rests on the support from our community and, often times, the advocacy of our Mayors and Vice-Mayors. With our requested amendment to this bill; to add a voting member appointment from the Mayors' Council of Guam; we believe that this will foster an even stronger relationship between CAHA, their Governing Board, and ALL of our villages. However, it will be up to the Legislature to determine if the board composition remains at eleven (11) appointments by the Governor or, is reduced to ten (10), with the eleventh appointment coming from the Mayors' Council of Guam. And, since an appointment from Mayors' Council does NOT involve any stipend or new financial requirements, there should be no budget concerns linked to this requested amendment.

The Mayors' Council of Guam submits this letter of support and request for an amendment, in hope that it receives favorable support from our Senators; and, if adopted and passed, the support of our Governor. That, often times, our Island leaders seek out the support and assistance of the Mayors' & Vice-Mayors' of Guam; but, in this case, we publicly offer up our assistance to the Council on the Arts and Humanities and its Governing Board.


