II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Acting Chairman Benjamin Cruz: The Committee on General Governmental Operations, Cultural Affairs, Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land will now come to order. We have four bills on the agenda today. The first bill was introduced by Senator Tina Muña Barnes, Bill 428, An Act to add Subsection (F) to §8121 of Article 1, Chapter 8, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to establishing parity in the Retirement Annuity of the Attorney General of Guam. I want to thank my eolleagues for joining me, Senator Tom Ada, Senator Aguon and Senator San Nicolas. On the first bill, I have two people that are signed up. We have the Public Auditor, Ms. Brooks and Mr. Joe T. San Agustin from the Board. I'll note for the record that the office received a letter in support of this legislation from the Attorney General-Elect. Ms. Brooks, please?

Ms. Doris Flores Brooks: Good afternoon, Senators, my written testimony before you is very brief, but I'll just read it into the record. [Read attached written testimony verbatim].

Acting Chairman Benjamin Cruz: Speaker San Agustin?

Former Speaker Joe T. San Agustin: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I'm representing the Board here, this afternoon. Our testimony is actually based on, one, is we charge some kind of semblance of order in what we have done over the years in suspending annuity payments or get them out to various people. Over the years, the legislature has made a lot of concessions for a lot of people that can continue to receive their annuity payment and as such, we have a long list of it right now. Actually, Mr. Speaker, we have never envisioned a lot of our elected officials would end being elected. We never thought of the AG or the auditor or for that matter or a lot of positions that would have suspended annuity, and so over the years, a listing of positions, even bus drivers now and school teachers...actually started off with mainly school teachers, then social workers, and next you know different kinds, even police officers now are involved. Bus drivers are the latest ones. But with respect to these two positions, the subject of this afternoon, we have the elected officials. As I said, we have the AG and hopefully one of these days we're going to have an incumbent in the OPA that happens to be retired, and what do you do? To be consistent throughout the system we have gone through, we have no problem adding these two people in there, because after all everybody else seems to be...be before you know it, we're going to end up with just a few people not having their retirement annuity suspended. In fact, there might be some consideration later on because there are some people in the management of say GPA, Waterworks or even the University president, those people, because they are appointed by the board, their retirement annuity has been suspended. If the governor appoints you, you don't have to get your annuity

suspended. But even the governor's office, except these areas GPA, Waterworks, University of Guam and GCC, so that's going to be the last remnants, and that's something else, you either give it to them or you don't. One of these days, those people...

Acting Chairman Benjamin Cruz: We'll cross that bridge...

Former Speaker Joe T. San Agustin: I know, that's what I'm saying. That's exactly what we're doing. We're crossing the bridge for the AG and we're anticipating...

Acting Chairman Benjamin Cruz: We're not anticipating anything. It's a very short walking bridge.

Former Speaker Joe T. San Agustin: Exactly. I'm just giving you a history of what we've gone through and where we are going now.

Acting Chairman Benjamin Cruz: Alright, we appreciate the...that will make for a wonderful committee report. Thank you very much. Do any of the Senators have questions? No, ok. Thank you very much, Senators.

This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 428-32 (COR). There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. AN ACT TO ADD SUBSECTION (F) TO § 8121 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 8, TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING PARITY IN THE RETIREMENT ANNUITY OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Subsection (f) is added to § 8121 of Article 1. Chapter 8.

Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

"§ 8121. Same. Suspension of Annuity Payment.

(a) A retired member who subsequently becomes an employee eligible for membership under § 8106 of this Title prior to January 1, 1999, shall, upon becoming so employed, have that member's right to receive payment of that member's annuity suspended for the duration of that member's employment, but all other rights pertaining to that member's annuity provided by this Article, including automatic increases therein, shall be retained by that member. The provisions of this Section shall not be applicable to any retired Judge or Justice designated and assigned by the Chief Justice to perform judicial duties in the courts of Guam as provided for in § 6115 of Title 7 GCA, or any person employed by the Department of Education in Guam schools, as a substitute teacher or as a Certified

Augmentation Teaching Service (CATS) employee as that term is defined by Title 17 GCA § 3127(b). Such employment shall be subject to the provisions of Subsection (d) of this Section.

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The provisions of this Section shall not be applicable to any certified, registered or licensed health care professional, or ancillary service personnel, employed by the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, the Department of Public Health and Social Services; academic faculty positions at the University of Guam and the Guam Community College; a limited term police officer employed by the Guam Police Department, to include Police Officers I, II, III and Sergeant I & II, performing duties such as patrol officers, narcotic officers, criminal investigators and school resource officers; or limited term school bus drivers or automotive mechanics employed by the Department of Public Works; provided, that such person(s) occupies such positions for which no other qualified/certified applicants was available, and that such employment shall be on a fiscal year basis; subject to the provisions of Subsection (d) of this Section.

(b) A retired member who subsequently becomes an employee eligible for membership under § 8106 of this Title on or after January I, 1999 shall, upon becoming so employed, have that member's right to receive payment of that member's annuity suspended for the duration of that member's employment, and shall be ineligible for readmission to the Defined Benefit Plan, but all other rights pertaining to that member's annuity provided by this Article, including automatic increases therein, shall be retained by that member; except, that the retired member shall forfeit any enhanced benefits for which that member was eligible pursuant to the early retirement provisions of § 8121.1.

This Subsection shall not be construed to render a member ineligible for participation in the Defined Contribution Retirement System or the Deferred Compensation Program under Articles 2 and 3 of this Chapter, upon a retired member's subsequent employment with the government of Guam.

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- (c) No employee voluntarily purchasing early retirement credit shall be rehired by the government of Guam in any position, whether contractual or otherwise, for at least three (3) years from the effective date of retirement, except for those exemptions listed under Item (a). The Retirement Fund shall make all individuals who voluntarily apply for early retirement credit aware that their purchase of such credit shall be construed as a voluntary waiver of their right to re-employment or reinstatement for a period of at least three (3) years.
- (d) Any persons hired pursuant to the provisions of Item (a) of this Section who are subsequently rehired for consecutive school years shall be exempt from the requirements expected only of new employees, including, but not limited to, physical examinations with the exception of proof of certification, as a condition of such rehire.
- (e) Any employee hired pursuant to § 8121(a), Chapter 8, Title 5 GCA shall only be eligible to enroll in the Government of Guam Health Insurance Program as an active employee.
- (f) Any person who is elected to the Office of the Attorney General of Guam or the Office of Public Accountability, who is retired from Government of Guam and receiving benefits shall not relinquish, forfeit, or have such annuity suspended during the period of such elected office."
- Section 2. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.

GOVERNMENT OF GUAM RETIREMENT FUND BOARD OF TRUSTEES STATEMENT ON BILL 428-32

December 9, 2014

I. INTRODUCTION

If enacted, Bill 428-32 will amend the Section 8121(a), Article 1, Chapter 8, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated to create <u>new</u> categories of retirees who will continue to receive their annuities from the Defined Benefit Plan even after they have returned to employment with the government of Guam. The proposed new categories of employees are persons elected to the office of the Attorney General of Guam or the Office of Public Accountability. Bill 482-32 would authorize retirees in these new categories to "double dip" (<u>i.e.</u>, receive both a retirement annuity and a salary plus benefits).

II. LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Double dipping refers to the circumstance in which a Defined Benefit Plan retiree continues to receive annuity benefits while also receiving a salary (and benefits) upon reemployment by the government of Guam. Since the passage of Public Law No. 17-25 on October 7, 1983, it has been the policy of the government of Guam not to allow retired government of Guam employees to return to service without suspending their annuity benefits for the duration of their employment. The general policy against double dipping has continued even after the closure of the Defined Benefit Plan in 1995 and the creation of the Defined Contribution Retirement System.

Over the years, the Legislature has created limited exceptions to the general prohibition against double dipping. For example, based on express legislative intent that there is "exceptional demand" or "critical need" for "positions for which no other qualified/certified applicant was available", double dipping was permitted on a fiscal (or school/academic) year basis for: certified, registered, or licensed health care professional, or ancillary service personnel, employed at the Guam Memorial Hospital, Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Department of Public Health and Social Services, academic positions for University of Guam and Community College, limited term police officers employed by Guam Police Department to include Police Officers I, II, III and Sergeant I & II, performing duties such as patrol officers, uarcotic officers, criminal investigators and school resource officers". Additional exemptions later were made for employees of the Office of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and unclassified employees appointed by the Governor, heads of autonomous agencies appointed by a governing board. Bill 428-32, as drafted, does not

reflect recently added categories for school bus drivers and automotive mechanics³, and other categories which should have been, but were not, formally codified in Section 8121, such as certain temporary employment of retirees to fill vacant positions caused by employees being activated in military service.

III. RESTATING SECTION 8121

Section 8121 as codified and Bill 428-32 as introduced do not accurately reflect the full list of positions exempt from Section 8121's suspension of annuity requirements. Section 8121 as codified also is confusing to understand and difficult to implement, because it includes provisions that are non-existent or have expired due to passage of time and are no longer relevant or applicable, as well as internally inconsistent. To provide for accuracy and clarity, the Retirement Fund offers a restatement of Section 8121 in the form of the attached Restated Section 8121, which reflects the current codified statute, revised to delete non-existent, expired or irrelevant provisions, amended to clarify ambiguities and conform to operational implementation, and updated to reflect (a) the recently enacted Public Law No. 32-128, (b) the non-codified categories contained in annual appropriations acts, and (c) the proposed Bill 428-32.

Restated Section 8121

§ 8121. Same. Suspension of Annuity Payment.

- (a) A retired member who subsequently becomes an employee not ineligible for membership under § 8106 or § 8206.1 of this Chapter 8 shall, upon becoming so employed, have that member's right to receive payment of that member's annuity suspended for the duration of that member's employment, but all other rights pertaining to that member's annuity provided by this Article, including automatic increases therein, *shall* be retained by that member.
- (b) Pursuant to Section 8105(f) of this Article, retired members becoming re-employed by the government of Guam on and after October 1, 2005 *shall* be ineligible for reinstatement in the Defined Benefit Plan established under this Article.
- (c) The suspension of annuities under this Section *shall not* be applicable to the following retired members who become employees not ineligible for membership under § 8106 or § 8206.1 of this Title:
- (1) a retiree employed by the Department of Education in Guam schools, as a substitute teacher or as a Certified Augmentation Teaching Service (CATS) employee as that term is defined by Title 17 GCA § 3127(b) provided, that the retiree is employed in a position for which *no* other qualified/certified applicants were available, and that such employment is on a school year basis;
- (2) a retiree that is a certified, registered or licensed health care professional, or ancillary service personnel, employed by the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, provided, that the retiree is employed in a position for which *no* other qualified/certified applicants were available, and that such employment is on a fiscal year basis;
- (3) a retired Guam Police Officer temporarily employed by the Guam Police Department if a critical need arises because of military activation of police officers or absence due to a long term disability status which has been certified by a medical doctor limited to the ranks of Sergeant I and below, only at Step I (such Officers shall not receive sick and annual leave, shall be terminated when the incumbent returns from military service, shall meet requirements for the position in question except for written examinations, and the Chief of Police shall certify that every retiree hired is fit for duty);
- (4) a retired Guam Corrections Officer temporarily employed by the Department of Corrections if a critical need arises to fill positions left vacant because of military activation of correction officers or absence due to a long term disability status which has been certified by a medical doctor, limited to the ranks of Corrections Officers Supervisor I and below, at Step I only (such Officers shall not receive sick and annual leave, shall be terminated when the incumbent returns from military service, shall meet requirements for the position in question except for written examinations, and the Director of Corrections shall certify that every retiree hired is fit for duty);

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- (5) a retired Guam Fire Department (GFD) firefighter temporarily employed by the GFD if a critical need arises because of military activation of military of GFD firefighters or absence due to a long term disability status which has been certified by a medical doctor, limited to the ranks of Fire Specialist and below, only at Step I (such Officers shall not receive sick and annual leave, shall be terminated when the incumbent returns from military service, shall meet requirements for the position in question except for written examinations, and the Fire Chief shall certify that every retiree hired is fit for duty);
- (6) a retired Customs and Quarantine Officer temporarily employed by the Customs and Quarantine Agency when a critical need arises as a result of military activation of Customs Officers, absence due to a long term disability status which has been certified by a medical doctor, or when vacancies cannot be filled within six (6) months because of the lack of qualified applicants, limited to the ranks of Customs Officer III and below, at Step I only (such Officers shall not receive sick and annual leave, shall be terminated when the incumbent returns from military service or when a fully-qualified applicant is available, shall meet requirements for the position in question except for written examinations (the requirements of Title 17, Article 3, Chapter 32, are waived for employment except for § 32304(b)(4)), and the Director of Customs shall certify that every retiree hired is fit for duty);
- (7) a retired Judge or Justice designated and assigned by the Chief Justice to perform judicial duties in the courts of Guam as Judge *pro tempore* or Justice *pro tempore*, as provided for in § 6115 of Title 7 GCA:
- (8) retired academic faculty at the University of Guam and the Guam Community College, provided, that the retiree is employed in a position for which *no* other qualified/certified applicants were available, and that such employment is on an academic year basis;
- (9) a retiree hired as limited term police officer employed by the Guam Police Department (including Police Officers I, II, III and Sergeant I & II performing duties such as patrol officers, narcotic officers, criminal investigators and school resource officers, provided, that the retiree is employed in a position for which no other qualified/certified applicants were available, and that such employment is on a fiscal year basis;
- (10) a retiree of the Department of Revenue & Taxation temporarily employed by the Department of Revenue & Taxation when a critical need arises or the absence of a Department of Revenue and Taxation employee due to long term disability status which has been certified by a medical doctor, in the areas of tax collection, taxpayer assistance, tax investigation, auditing, and tax processing, compensated at at Step I of the position classification for which the employee was hired to fill (such employees shall not receive sick and annual leave);
- (11) a retiree hired as an employee of the Office of the Governor and Office of the Lieutenant Governor;
- (12) a retiree hired as an unclassified employee appointed by the Governor of Guam:
- (13) a retiree hired as a head of an autonomous agency appointed by a governing board;

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- (14) a retiree hired as a limited term school bus driver or automotive mechanic employed by the Department of Public Works, provided, that the retiree is employed in a position for which *no* other qualified/certified applicants were available, and that such employment is on a fiscal year basis; and
- (15) a retiree elected to the Office of the Attorney General of Guam or the Office of Public Accountability.
- (d) This Section shall not be construed to render a member ineligible for participation in the Defined Contribution Retirement System or the Deferred Compensation Program under Articles 2 and 3 of this Chapter, upon a retired member's subsequent employment with the government of Guam.

Additional provisions:

Section X. Subsections (f) and (g) are added to Section 8105, Article 1, Chapter 8, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, to read:

- (f) Retired members becoming re-employed by the government of Guam on and after October 1, 2005 *shall* be ineligible for reinstatement in the Defined Benefit Plan established under this Article.
- (g) A retired member who subsequently becomes an employee not ineligible for membership under § 8106 of this Title shall, upon becoming so employed, be eligible to enroll in the Government of Guam Health Insurance Program as an active employee, and not as a retiree.

Section Y. Subsection (e) is hereby added to Section 8206, Article 2, Chapter 8, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, to read:

(e) a retired member who subsequently becomes an employee not ineligible for membership under § 8206.1 of this Title shall, upon becoming so employed, be eligible to enroll in the Government of Guam Health Insurance Program as an active employee, and not as a retiree.

Section Z. This Act shall take effect as of January 1, 2015.

Dear Senator Cruz,

Bill No. 428-32 (COR) is an act to add Subsection (f) to § 8121 of Article 1, Chapter 8, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to establishing parity in the retirement annuity of the Attorney General of Guam. Subsection (f) is to read as follows:

"Any person who is elected to the Office of the Attorney General of Guam or the Office of Public Accountability, who is retired from Government of Guam and receiving benefits *shall* not relinquish, forfeit, or have such annuity suspended during the period of such elected office."

The intent of Bill No. 428-32 (COR) is to provide for the Attorney General of Guam and the Public Auditor, if retired and elected to the position, to continue receiving their annuity. This bill is being introduced to establish parity. It appears the parity is to establish equitable standing with individuals who are employees of the Office of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor and those unclassified employees appointed by the Governor as amended by Public Law 30-233. This amendment, made in FY11, allowed for individuals who are retired and appointed or who work in the Governor and Lt. Governor's Office to keep their annuity and receive a payroll check.

The fiscal impact of Bill No. 428-32 (COR) will be the annuity payment from the Retirement Fund. This is so as the subject legislation would allow the elected Attorney General and Public Auditor to continue receiving an annuity (if any) along with the established salaries for their respective positions. The Public Auditor and Attorney General's salaries are between \$100,000 to \$110,000 with annuities calculated at 70% - 85% of salaries for the Defined Benefits Plan members which will be between \$70,000 to \$77,000 at 70%.

CEBU Pacific's maiden flight to Guam will not push through a scheduled this month due to unavailability of slots at Mani terminal, according to Gil International Airport Authorit

Rolenda Faasuama GIAA's airport market administrator, said the airling receptly informed the airport management of the flight laurich delay.

Cebu Pacific, a Philippine budget carrier, was originally slated to launch its Guam service this month, with four weekly direct flights for its Manila-Guam route. With the airline service, Guam will soon have three carriers that will operate direct flights to and from Manila. At present, Philippine Airlines and the United Airlines serve that market.

Faasuamalie said Cebu Pacific now anticipates to open the Guam service in March 2015.

"The delay in startup from December 2014 to March 2015 is due to the shortage of slots available at Terminal 2 in Manila where all international flights operate," Faasuamalie said in an interview with Variety.
