## COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

### I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 429-32 (COR) was introduced on November 25, 2014 by Senator Michael F.Q. San Nicolas. The bill was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Aviation, Ground Transportation, Regulatory Concerns, and Future Generations on November 25, 2014.

The Committee on Aviation, Ground Transportation, Regulatory Concerns and Future Generations convened a public hearing on December 4, 2014 at 2:05 p.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the hearing agenda was Bill 429-32 (COR). The hearing was adjourned at 2:20 p.m.

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via electronic mail to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on November 25, 2014, and again on December 2, 2014. Notice was also posted on *I Liheslatura*'s website beginning on November 25, 2014.

### II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Michael San Nicolas convened a hearing on Bill 429-32. As the main author, he offered an opening statement explaining the bill. He stated that the bill addresses the manpower shortages being experienced by the Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) Board which is affecting their ability to enforce the laws. Chairman San Nicolas stated that the bill is patterned after the existing local Community Assisted Policing Effort (CAPE) program and would allow deputies would be brought into the Department of Revenue and Taxation to help with enforcement of ABC laws. He stated that having deputies helping enforce the laws would help build a self-regulating and self-monitoring system among the businesses and establishments.

John Camacho stated that the Department of Revenue and Taxation has not yet formed an opinion on the bill. He stated that the ABC division only has three employees which presented some difficulties in regulating the different businesses and activities which must comply with ABC laws. Mr. Camacho expressed concern about funding for training and any liability that may be associated with the provisions of the bill.

Chairman San Nicolas asked for clarification about the responsibilities of the three individuals employed with the Department's regulatory division.

Mr. Camacho answered that the employees are responsible for enforcing the laws and regulations for ABC laws, tobacco laws, gaming laws, as well as processing and issuing all licenses and license applications.

Chairman San Nicolas asked Mr. Camacho his thoughts on the effectiveness of the current level of enforcement.

Mr. Camacho expressed the need for more resources.

Chairman San Nicolas stated that his belief that the bill would help alleviate some of the work that is being shouldered by the minimal amount of employees in that division.

Senator Tom Ada asked what if there are plans to help make up for the manpower shortage.

Mr. Camacho stated that there are several things being done to address the manpower shortage including employees taking on dual roles and adjusting operational hours. He stated that the Department is currently exploring ways to help support the administrative function of the division.

Chairman San Nicolas thanked Mr. Camacho for his participation and adjourned the hearing.

### **III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**



ARTICLE 5A TO CHAPTER 3, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE  
ANNOTATED.**



**1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

**2 Section 1. Short Title.** This Act *shall* be cited as the "Responsible  
3 Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Act".

**4 Section 2. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guāhan* finds  
5 that Alcoholic Beverage Control is currently enforced primarily by members of the  
6 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. The Community Assisted Policing Effort  
7 (CAPE) volunteers are authorized to issue citations for littering and enforcement of  
8 Guam's accessible parking law. Given the current challenges in enforcing Guam's  
9 Alcoholic Beverage Control laws, a program establishing Deputies for the  
10 enforcement of these laws could greatly improve compliance.

**11** It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guāhan* to authorize the  
12 Administrator to establish an Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program to  
13 assist the Board in the enforcement of Guam's Alcoholic Beverage Control laws,  
14 by adding a new Article 5A to Chapter 3, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated.

**15 Section 3. Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program.** A new Article  
16 5A is hereby *added* to Chapter 3, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

**"ARTICLE 5A**

- 3               § 35A00. Creation.
- 4               § 35A01. Functions and Duties.
- 5               § 35A02. Recruitment.
- 6               § 35A03. Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records.
- 7               § 35A04. Volunteer: Authority.
- 8               § 35A05. Same: Eligibility.
- 9               § 35A06. Same: Oath.
- 10              § 35A07. Same: Allowance.
- 11              § 35A08. Rules and Regulations.

13              **§ 35A00. Creation.**

14              There is hereby created within the Division an Alcoholic Beverage  
15              Control Deputies Program, which shall be headed by the Administrator. The  
16              Administrator, subject to the advice and control of the Alcoholic Beverage  
17              Control Board, shall be responsible for carrying out the purpose of this  
18              Article, and shall have such additional duties and responsibilities as are  
19              authorized herein, or as may be prescribed by the Board.

20              **§ 35A01. Functions and Duties.**

21              The general functions and duties of the Alcoholic Beverage Control  
22              Deputies Program shall be to serve as volunteer inspectors, as defined in  
23              §3111 of this Chapter, under the general supervision of the Administrator.

24              **§ 35A02. Recruitment.**

25              The Administrator shall recruit on an entirely volunteer basis, local  
26              residents who desire to make available their services to assist the Division in  
27              carrying out its functions. The Board shall further promulgate rules and

1 regulations regarding the age, health and other requirements for recruitment  
2 purposes, subject to the Fair Labor Standards Act. The Board shall have  
3 final approval of candidates to serve as Deputies pursuant to this Article.

4 **§ 35A03. Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records.**

5 The Administrator shall devise a training program, approved by the  
6 Board, which will provide the members of the Alcoholic Beverage Control  
7 Deputies Program training in operational techniques and procedures for the  
8 proper enforcement of the Alcoholic Beverage Control laws. The Alcoholic  
9 Beverage Control Deputies Program shall maintain a roster of volunteers  
10 who have received the training prescribed herein. In order to maintain  
11 membership in the Program, each member must keep up with his scheduled  
12 training, and no volunteer may remain in the Program if he or she is unable  
13 to keep up with or otherwise absorb the training. Additionally, basic supplies  
14 and equipment shall be provided to assure proper functioning of the  
15 Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program, including a continuing  
16 program for replacement. Each member shall be subject to a mandatory  
17 annual assessment of his or her relevant capacities for the proper  
18 enforcement of the provisions of this Chapter, failure of which shall lead to  
19 suspension from the Deputies Program until he or she is able to pass the  
20 assessment.

21 **§ 35A04. Volunteer: Authority.**

22 Whenever the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program, and the  
23 members thereof are rendering assistance to the Division, such volunteers  
24 shall have the same powers, duties, rights, privileges and immunities, as if  
25 they were paid, full-time inspectors.

26 **§ 35A05. Same: Eligibility.**

1           No person shall be a volunteer member of the Alcoholic Beverage  
2           Control Deputies Program established under this Article who:

3                 (a) advocates a change by force or violence in the constitutional  
4                 form of the Government of the United States or in this Territory or the  
5                 overthrow of any government in the United States by force, or who  
6                 has been convicted of or is under indictment or information charging  
7                 any subversive act against the United States,

8                 (b) has been convicted of a felony, of a crime involving moral  
9                 turpitude, to include a violation under Chapter 52 of Title 9, Guam  
10                 Code Annotated, or of driving under the influence pursuant to Chapter  
11                 18 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated or equivalent offense, or

12                 (c) is an employee or owner of an establishment for which an  
13                 alcoholic beverage license has been issued under this Chapter.

14           **§ 35A06. Same: Oath.**

15           Every volunteer shall, entering upon his duties, take an oath, in  
16           writing, before a person authorized to administer oaths in this Territory,  
17           which oath shall be substantially as follows:

18                 'I \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I  
19                 will support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the  
20                 laws of the territory of Guam, against all enemies, foreign or  
21                 domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I  
22                 take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose  
23                 of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties  
24                 upon which I am about to enter and I do further swear (or affirm) that  
25                 I do not advocate, nor am I a member of any political party or  
26                 organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the  
27                 United States or of this Territory by force or violence; and that during

such time as I am a member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program I will not advocate nor become a member of any political party or organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States or of this Territory by force or violence.'

**§ 35A07. Same: Allowance.**

Each member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program who successfully completes probationary requirements as established by the Board, and who contributes at least forty-two (42) hours per month, shall receive an allowance of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) per month, to defray the cost of maintenance of their equipment and uniforms. The Department of Revenue and Taxation shall identify funds within their department appropriations to satisfy the intent of this Section.

**§ 35A08. Same: False Report.**

A member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program who makes a false verbal or written report shall be subject to disciplinary action, including which may include removal from the Program. Any alleged violations of the provisions of Chapter 52 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated shall be reported by the Administrator to the Office of the Attorney General. Any member who has been indicted of a felony, of a crime involving moral turpitude, of driving under the influence pursuant to Chapter 18 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated or equivalent offense, or a violation of Chapter 52 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, shall be suspended from the program until the case is dismissed or a decision is entered. If the member is found guilty, he shall be removed from the program and become permanently ineligible to become a member.

**§ 35A09. Rules and Regulations.**

1           The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board shall promulgate rules and  
2 regulations for the implementation of the Alcoholic Beverage Control  
3 Deputies Program pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law within  
4 one hundred eighty (180) days from the enactment of this Act.”
