




BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Appropriation. Notwithstanding any provision of any law, the remaining funds not obligated from Public Law 32-065, the sum of Fifty Three Thousand Six Dollars (\$53,006) is hereby appropriated to the Guam Police Department to purchase mobile radios for seven (7) police vehicles procured in April 2014 and July 2014.

Section 2. Reporting Requirement. The Chief of Police shall submit a report to *I Maga'lahaen Guahan* and *I Liheslaturan Guahan* on a quarterly basis as to the obligations and expenditures of the funds following the enactment of this Act, detailing all transactions pertaining to funds appropriated herein.

I'd like to thank Vice Speaker Cruz and his committee for hearing bills number 430-32 and 431-32. These bills will help us to better address the needs of both our schools and our police department.

Bill 430-32

In Public Law 32-065, I identified \$400,000 for GPD to purchase new police vehicles. They were able to procure seven vehicles – two were received in October 2014, and five more are expected to be received this month. Chief of Police Fred Bordallo reported in a letter to me that the police department was not able to procure mobile radios for these vehicles. There are copies of his letter available at the sign-in table. He requested the use of the remaining funds appropriated in Public Law 32-065 (\$53,006) for mobile radios. Thus, Bill 430-32 re-directs this money toward the purchase of these much-needed radios.

Bill No. 431-32

Public Law 32-095 was enacted over a year ago on November 27, 2013. This law was intended to help GDOE save money on power by allowing them to purchase solar energy. However, procurement of these essential solar panels has not been completed, and at the rate the process is going, we are losing the money we would have been saving had the panels already been procured and installed. Also, GDOE and GSA have been struggling to communicate and reach agreement on a contract to install security systems in all of our schools. In order to prevent this from happening again, this bill gives GDOE the authority to handle the procurement process for purchasing solar energy.

Buenas yan Saluda Speaker Won Pat:

This is in response to your November 12, 2014 letter requesting an update on the progress of the Guam Police Department's purchase of police vehicles referenced to Public Law 32-065 which appropriated Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) to GPD for this purchase. Please find attached our project progress report for the period of October 01, 2013 through October 31, 2014. To summarize, a total of seven (7) new police vehicles was procured in April 2014 and July 2014; a sum of \$348,929.00. Two (2) police vehicles were received in October 2014 and the remaining five (5) is estimated to arrive sometime in December 2014 according to the awarded vendor (Triple J).

Based on the information provided to me by GPD's ASO, Ovita Nauta, the established account has a remaining balance of \$53,006.00. GPD was not able to procure the mobile radios for the vehicles because we weren't sure at the time of the bidding process as to what type of vehicle would be available. In addition, the appropriation account was established with an expiration date of August 31, 2014 therefore GPD could not encumber the remaining funds for the mobile radios. Also, the procurement bidding deadline for purchases over \$15,000.00 had already closed in July 2014. Other factors delayed the expenditure of the total funds where GPD and GSA responded to questions and concerns from prospective bidders and, as a result, led to the amendment of the vehicle specifications.

The Guam Police Department would like to thank you for authoring this law which provided much needed funding assistance to purchase new vehicles for our officers. We would appreciate if these remaining funds can be made available to GPD in this Fiscal Year 2015 to allow us to purchase the mobile radios for these vehicles.

This public law appropriated funds for the purchase of new completely marked police vehicles to include graphics, emergency lighting, siren, police/radio communication system and a prisoner transport system.

PROJECT STATUS:

Public Law 32-065 signed into law August 30, 2013 appropriated \$400,000.00 to the Guam Police Department for the purchase of new police vehicles.

For the period of October 2013 through September 30, 2014, the following activities took place:

- 1) The Guam Police Department submitted a Request for Establishment/Modification of account to BBMR and to DOA. Account number 5100C131200GA026 was established in 11/12/2013 by DOA and funds were loaded in 11/27/2013 by BBMR into the AS400 with an expiration date of August 30, 2014.
- 2) Between December 2013 and January 2014, the Guam Police Department requested the Department of Public Works, Transportation Department, to review the proposed Police Patrol Vehicle Specifications and to provide guidance and comments, if any.
- 3) February 20, 2014: GPD submitted Requisition No. Q141200051 for eight (8) 2014 or latest model police patrol 4x4 sports utility vehicle in the amount of \$350,000 to the General Services Agency (GSA) to procure vehicles as per P.L. 32-065 along with the department's vehicle specifications, for bidding purposes.
- 4) Also in February 2014, a requisition for Bid Invitation was submitted to the General Services Agency (GSA) for advertisement in the local media (Marianas Variety) for interested parties to submit their bid package. The Bid Opening was scheduled between late March and early April 2014 to determine the successful bidder and to award a purchase order.
- 5) April 2014: GSA-041-14 (Police Patrol 4x4 SUV 7 passenger) was issued by GSA. However, due to questions and concerns by prospective bidders, the vehicle specifications were amended (attached copy of Responses to Vendor's Requests to Amend Vehicle Specifications).
- 6) Upon satisfaction of GPD's responses to prospective bidders, GSA approved the bid specifications and thereby awarded Triple J Enterprises on April 30, 2014.
- 7) May 05, 2014: GSA issued Purchase Order No. P146A03649 in the amount of \$99,694.00. Due to an oversight by GSA, the purchase order was issued for two (2) vehicles. GPD was advised by GSA to submit another requisition citing the same Bid Award for the procurement of the remaining vehicles.
- 8) May 07, 2014: GPD submitted Requisition No. Q141200076 for five (5) 2014 or latest model police patrol 4x4 sports utility vehicle in the amount of \$249,235.00 citing bid award no. GSA-041-14.
- 9) July 17, 2014: GSA informs GPD of questions and concerns from two (2) vendors/bidders (Atkins Kroll and Triple J Motors) with regard to "participation in the National Law

Enforcement/Michigan State Police Vehicle Tests” and “the need for graphics or signage on the vehicles. See attachment for GPD’s response.

- 10) Upon satisfaction of GPD’s responses to bidders, two (2) amendments to GSA-041-14 were issued by GSA amending the vehicle specifications thereby Purchase Order No. P146A05264 was issued dated 08/06/2014 for five (5) vehicles in the amount of \$247,300.00.
- 11) GPD received two (2) vehicles in October 2014. Purchase order no. P156A00421 was issued to install graphics/signage on the vehicles using GPD FY2015 funds;
- 12) Project is at 50% complete pending the arrival of the remaining five (5) vehicles expected to arrive by December 2014. These vehicles will be marked by the awarded vendor (Triple J) upon delivery of vehicles.

GPD was not able to expend the remaining funds of \$53,006.00 because of the funding expiration date of 08/30/2014. These funds would have been used to purchase the mobile radios. GPD would have to utilize its FY2015 funds to procure these seven (7) mobile radios.

Dear Senator Cruz,

Bill No. 430-32 (COR) is an act to appropriate the sum of Fifty Three Thousand Six Dollars (\$53,006) from funds not obligated pursuant to Public Law 32-065 to purchase mobile radios for police vehicles.

The intent of Bill No. 430-32 (COR) is to appropriate the available balance of \$53,006 which was appropriated in Public Law 32-065. P.L. 32-065 appropriated \$400,000 in escheated funds to the General Fund to the Guam Police Department to procure police vehicles. Section 2 of that law stated that funds not obligated by August 30, 2014 would not be available for GPD's use. The Bureau has confirmed that, as of August 30, 2014, the unobligated balance is, in fact, \$53,006. These funds will be used to procure mobile phones for the police vehicles procured with via the original \$400K appropriation. Lastly, it should be noted that the aforementioned escheated funds were deposited into and made available for appropriation in FY2013.

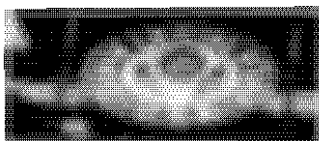

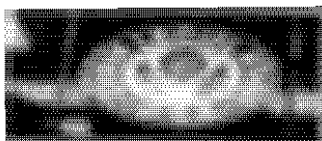

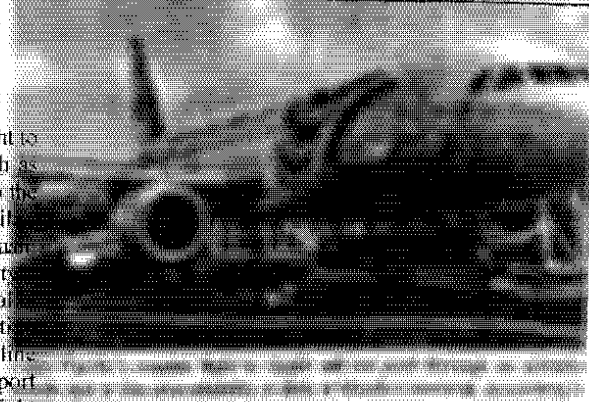

CEBU Pacific's maiden flight to Guam will not push through as scheduled this month due to the unavailability of slots at Manila terminal, according to Guam International Airport Authority Rolenda Faasuaamalie. GIAA's airport market administrator, said the airline recently informed the airport management of the flight launch delay.



Cebu Pacific, a Philippine budget carrier, was originally slated to launch its Guam service this month, with four weekly direct flights for its Manila-Guam route. With the airline service, Guam will soon have three carriers that will operate direct flights to and from Manila. At present, Philippine Airlines and the United Airlines serve that market.

Faasuaamalie said Cebu Pacific now anticipates to open the Guam service in March 2015.

"The delay in startup from December 2014 to March 2015 is due to the shortage of slots available at Terminal 2 in Manila where all international flights operate," Faasuaamalie said in an interview with Variety.

Lobbying efforts

Faasuaamalie said Cebu Pacific has advised GIAA that they are continuing their lobbying efforts to get the service going, having already applied to the U.S. Department of Transportation for the approval to start passen-

ger service to Guam. The airline's top executives were on Guam in August to meet with airport officials and board members. They toured the airport facility including ticketing booths and operational areas.

The group then sealed the agreement with Guam airport officials about its much-awaited operation in Guam.

Weekly flights

Despite the anticipated delay, Cebu Pacific remains committed to fly Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday. The airline will utilize A320 aircraft with 180-seat capacity for each flight which will depart Manila at 11:35 a.m. and will arrive in Guam at 3:05 p.m. on those days.

With A320 aircraft, Cebu Pacific's four weekly flights will bring in additional 720 air seats to the market.

The current seat capacity from the Manila market provided by Philippine Airlines and United is at 12,000 seats weekly. Phil-

ippine Airlines operates times a week while United nine times weekly.

Cebu Pacific's business operation on Guam is in line with the company's expansion across the board including expanding services to Palau, Japan and Micronesia.

GIAA officials earlier expressed interest in servicing the Cebu Pacific initially expected market two years ago. On Oct. 2012, the airline filed its application with the U.S. Department of Transportation and Communications requesting authorization to serve the U.S. market.

During that time, the Aviation Administration yet to lift the security of the Philippines and Cebu Pacific had initially planned to lease a U.S. aircraft. Earlier this year, the FAA lifted the Category 1 which allows additional flights from the Philippines to the U.S.

Cebu Pacific will use aircraft for this new service.

Minor found pregnant, step-mom has 25-year-old boyfriend charged in court

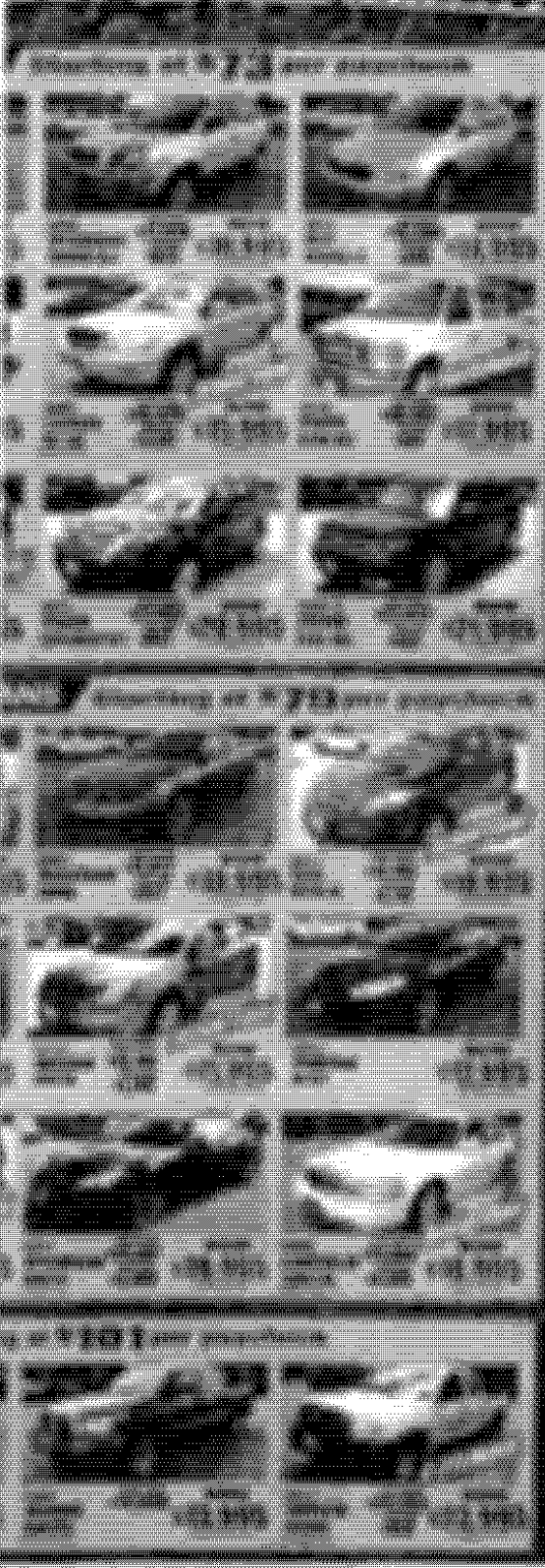
