Bill No. 73-32 (COR)

I. OVERVIEW: The Committee on Health & Human Services, Health Insurance Reform, Economic Development and Senior Citizens conducted a public hearing on April 3, 2013. The hearing convened at 10:00AM in I Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of BILL 73-32(LS)- An act to rename the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (DMHSA), to the "Guam Behavioral Health Center" (GBHC), by amending Chapter 86 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, and to allow for changes to other relevant laws as necessary solely for consistency with the agency's name change. Introduced by Sen. Dennis G. Rodriguez, Jr.

II. Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via hand-delivery/fax and/or email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on March 27, 2013 (5-day notice), and again on March 29, 2013 (48-hour notice).

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION.

Rey Vega: [Please see written testimony]

Chairman Rodriguez: I agree with you, Rey, that the name change is important and significant. I know that people are thinking that there are other challenges that we need to address as well and this might be something small, however, I believe that this is still a part of that solution. From personal experience for someone who seeks assistance from mental health, the first reaction is "there's nothing wrong with me. I'm not crazy." I understand and I share the same sentiments with the cosponsors. Now, we need the name to be something that comes from the stakeholders.

Marcelene Santos: [Please see written testimony]

Lourdes Bitug: I am a manger for the Catholic Social Services, Community Rehabilitation Program. I am here in support for the name change. In the early 2000, there was a move to have consumers to go to mental health. There was a petition about it, however, I do not think that it was ever materialized. However, during the permanent injunction, and the transition with DISID, they were against the transition because of the stigma. They said that "our children and your children are not the same because our children are not mentally ill." So, that was the fear that they had. We have been educating our parents in the program and I think they have calmed down a little. So, I am in support of the name change.

There being no other testimony, or comments by Senators, Chairman Rodriguez declared the bill as having been heard, and concluded the public hearing on Bill No. 73-32 (COR).

People can form an opinion out of what they see and *mental health and substance abuse* can mean something to be ashamed of and at times leads to discrimination and prejudice.

We want to give them an opportunity to have quality of life. Not discrimination and prejudice. They are our family. We care for them.

I therefore asked for your kind consideration.

Thank you for the opportunity support a name change with minor revision to the proposed title. This testimony is in strong support for <u>Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center</u>.

The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse had historically and generally been viewed by the public with the stigma and fear more commonly conveyed by the media and more characteristically in horror and suspense films. Such views do not promote early intervention or emotional health and well being. Consequently, those who could have been helped sooner avoided and denied any need for services, in spite of evidence they could benefit from the array of services provided by the department.

In addition to strong staff support, nationally there has been a shift from mental or state hospitals and more recently the more acceptable description of the services provided is that of "behavioral health" as many emotional concerns are expressed behaviorally. The addition, of the phrase "wellness center" can best be viewed as recovery from sexual assault, substance dependence, trauma, and so forth. For those consumers with chronic and severe mental illness which I need to emphasize is small segment of the population we serve, a shift from dependence to more involvement in the community and increased independence and functioning in all realms of life.

What's in a name? Many indigenous cultures choose the naming of a child very carefully as it affects how the child views him/herself but also how others may view them. The same is true in this regard. The suggested name change is not only focused on how the services we provide is experienced by those who need the services but also to those in the community. It conveys the potential for our island community to be more inclusive, understanding and supportive of anyone who suffers from emotional and behavioral concerns. It minimizes the stigma but also shifts to their thoughts to that of a caring community.



Dear Senator Rodriguez,

I write this letter in support of the above referenced bill to rename the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (DMHSA) to the "Guam Behavioral Health Center." I do so with a few caveats.

I am assuming that the fiscal impact of the name change will be minimal since this is no time to expend money on a matter that might be more about form than substance, at least ostensibly.

However, I am hoping that there will in fact be some substance to the name change. Last summer, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) celebrated its 20th Anniversary. In the Summer 2012 edition of their newsletter, SAMHSA reported on a similar name change of one of its offices. SAMSHA noted that

The transition of SAMHSA's Office of Applied Studies to the Center for Behavioral Health Statistics and Quality (CBHSQ) last year represents much more than a change of name. It also underscores SAMHSA's commitment to analyzing as well as collecting behavioral health data and the role of surveillance and other data sources in SAMHSA's public health mission.

"SAMHSA's vision is to promote collaboration on data collection activity across all SAMHSA Centers and programs," said CBHSQ Acting Director H. Westley Clark, M.D., J.D., M.P.H. "That way information can be used not only to talk about the nature of the problem but also to help pursue solutions."

This excerpt highlights the need for data collection, just as Bill 58-32 introduced by Senator Tony Ada intends to facilitate the distribution of surveys at certain high schools in order to evaluate the effectiveness of the school resource officer program, otherwise known as *Prugraman Inagofli'e'*. Such data collection and the evaluation of the information promotes accountability which in turn supports effective programs and practices and provides a basis to terminate ones that are not.

Bill 73-32 asserts that "the current title of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (DMHSA) is not consistent with the current title of the majority of United States and Federal mental health agencies..." Again, while this is true, DMHSA or the soon to be Guam Behavioral Health Center needs to look beyond just the name of its sister agencies, it must also endeavor to match the innovative programing that behavioral health centers represent.

Monterey County in California will open its integrated behavioral health care center this month which will "revolutionize health care for one of the most difficult to reach groups, the mentally ill. Its new program will create one-stop health care shopping for people whose main interaction with doctors is through the county's behavioral health centers." The premise for such a concept was explained by Amie Miller, Monterey County Department of Behavioral Health's project manager for the plan.

"Last year we looked at our severely mentally ill population and 39 percent didn't see a physician at all," she said.

On top that, studies show that the lifespan of a mentally ill person in the United States is 25 years shorter than that of the general population.

The deaths aren't be caused directly by the mental illness either, said Trina Dutta, public health advisor with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

"These aren't suicides," Dutta said. Rather the mentally ill may suffer from related physical ailments like obesity or diabetes. Most often, she said, it is simply more difficult for them to get the health care they need.³

Credit in Bill 73-32 for requesting the name change was given partly to Dr. James J. Kiffer who was then the "outgoing Federal Management Team member." The first *Plan of Action* of the FMT in 2010 proposed such a one-stop center which was roundly criticized. Maybe Dr. Kiffer would be content with just the name change at this point – but my guess is probably not.

As the guardian of approximately 40 mental health consumers, it is my responsibility to advocate for more than just a name change. The stigma of being mentally ill does not come from the location at which you are supposed to receive assistance; the stigma comes from not receiving adequate or appropriate treatment which then results in the exacerbation of ones' symptoms and

thus the perpetuation of the stereotypes about mentally ill persons as being dysfunctional characters in the community.

The definition of recovery according to SAMSHA in 2011 is

A process of change through which individuals improve their health and wellness, live a self-directed life, and strive to reach their full potential.⁴

Therefore, we not only need to change the name of the agency, we need to change our focus on consumers as being mentally ill. The consumers, my wards, are whole persons whose mental and physical needs are intertwined. Therefore their behavior and treatment plans should address the whole person. If options to treat the whole person cannot be in a one-stop center, then case management, transportation and support programs must be improved and increased in order to coordinate the receipt of such services.

I support Bill 73-32 ONLY if it will be more than a "trendy euphemism." I support Bill 73-32 if it promotes data collection and accountability. I support Bill 73-32 if it will inspire "revolutionize" services for the consumers.
