II SUMMERY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Speaker Judith Won Pat presents Bill 78-32 – introduced by Senator V.C. Pangelinan – for discussion (to add subsection D to section 3102.3 chapter 3 of title 17 Guam code annotated: relative to the composition of the Guam Education Board to include a representative from the Mayors Council of Guam).

Dr. Jose Cruz, Ed.D., In Support of Bill 78-32, Written Testimony (on file) - recited

Maria Atalig Gutierrez, Guam Board of Education – as a "Private Citizen" – In Support of Bill 78-32, Written Testimony (on file)

Senator V.C. Pangelinan, author of bill 78-32, not in attendance, provided a written statement (on file) of bill 78-32, which was recited by the Speaker.

Speaker Won Pat, after listening to Dr. Jose Cruz deliver his written testimony, verifies Dr. Cruz's suggestion to have the mayor of the school vicinity sit at each scheduled board meeting, which are held at that districts school (e.g., if the board meeting is at Southern High School then the mayor from Santa Rita shall be the mayor representative). Speaker expresses that if this is indeed what Dr. Cruz means in his suggestion, this is ideal; it allows more than one mayor to have the opportunity to be there and part of the discussion, and avoids overburdening a single mayor representative.

Dr. Jose Cruz confirms, yes. With the bill allowing the mayors' council to appoint, he suggests that the mayors' shared participation at these board meetings be a specificity indicated into the bill, or even set by the mayors' council rather than be put into law. Dr. Cruz raises points regarding participation and partnership: to encourage, in instances when a mayor is appointed rather than voted-in, that the participation at meetings still be met. He equally supports partnership and involvement between the mayor, and their municipal council, and the board of education committee members. Dr. Cruz ends with a policy that he had incorporated into Board Meetings regarding work sessions; that work sessions do not last longer than two hours, and that discussions take place and are well-considered before the decision making process.

Speaker Won Pat recaps the opportunity of the mayor from every district correspond to the district which the meeting is held, and hence the mayor, the representative, for that particular area.

Senator Tommy Morrison asks if conceivably the proposal of the mayors' council to be co-shared be built in to the legislation, and that mayor representation be built into policy, to ensure participation and that it is indeed co-shared.

Dr. Cruz explains that it would simply be the community where the meetings be held. While he doesn't want to dictate mayor representation according to school district, he encourages the district mayor(s) to attend, be visible and take part.

Senator Morrison confirms that the bill in discussion is in fact to restore a non-voting member, a member of the Mayors' Council of Guam. It his understanding that in the past it was once co-shared, and that the bill shall thus restore voting status.

Dr. Cruz expresses confidence that the bill will be "voted on positively," after bringing up an account of a time when the governor appointed education board members. Mayor Vicente Benavente, he believes, was chair of the board of Education at one time, and possibly the Benavente Middle School's namesake.

Speaker Won Pat recalls while serving as principal at F.B. Leon Guerrero Middle School, L.G.'s autobiography was on hand, hence the history of Vicente S.A. Benavente may perhaps be, likewise, on hand at B.M.S.

Mr. Albert San Agustin, Guam Board of Education member – In Support of the Bill – recites his creditability: Chairman of the Board on the 1st elected school board, 1980 & school GDOE superintendent. Mr. San Agustin validates that Commissioner/mayor Benavente in fact served as chairman of the board, and contributed to the early developments of the board of education, which was indeed one of the reasons why the school. B.M.S. was named after him. Most importantly, Mr. San Agustin renders support of the intent of the Bill – and welcomes every stakeholder to contribute and be a part of the Board process.

Speaker Won Pat asks Dr. Cruz and Mr. San Agustin, as seasoned board members who have served in different capacities, appointed and elected, their perspectives on the ideal size and composition of the board.

Dr. Cruz suggests advance planning, and comments on the duration of terms served: he states that planning the regularly scheduled meetings in advance ensures that there will be a quorum as well as informs the public appropriately – and expresses that two year terms are not adequate, and campaigning often gets in the way of tasks at hand. In Dr. Cruz's experience, having held the position for 4 years and then an additional two, distinguished by the law at the time, the extended term resulted in overall better quality of boards and sufficient time to implement plans for school development. Responding to the composition of the Board, Dr. Cruz expresses that it currently "seems to be working." Dr. Cruz addresses the federal engineers that are assessing schools in Guam and the Northern Marianas, that their recommendations need to be posted not only for board members but the entire community of Pacific, in order to share facility developments, and "muster support" from the Department of Interior, which, additionally, can contribute to the better quality of Boards.

Mr. San Agustin brings up the issue of inequality between a mayor on the council, as an elected official receiving salary, and others on the board. Dictated by law, the Board of Education, the biggest department of the Government of Guam, meets a minimum of once a month and its members are paid \$250 a meeting despite work sessions being longer than work meetings. Mr. San Agustin brings up the possibility of thus raising the member in stature, incorporated by law.

Speaker Won Pat replies that as a government employees they do not get the stipend, however will look into it further to confirm.

Mr. Cruz differentiates: he gets a salary as a retiree, not an employee; the mayor, elected, receives an *additional* salary, and not because he is an employee of the mayor's council,

Senator Morrison imparts, it's a similar situation with the Contractor's Licensing Board and employees, in which case, stipend was justified by conducting meetings after hours. In the case of unclassified employees, or members serving in different capacities in the government; such stipend could also be justified if meeting was held afterhours.

Dr Cruz replies that the reason the Board does not meet at 8am (a time proposed to meet) was because it intruded into instructional time and was a distraction to students.

Speaker Won Pat, after receiving confirmation, reports that stipends are not given because it is applicable to elected officials, directors, and deputy directors – as unclassified employees – and shall verify this further in writing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

"§3102.3. Composition and Terms of Office for Board Members.

- (d) Non-Voting Member of the Mayors' Council of Guam. One (1) member
 appointed by the Mayors' Council of Guam who shall serve for a term of two (2)
 years or the remaining term of the appointed mayor, whichever is longer."
 - **SECTION 3.** Severability. If any of the provisions of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity *shall* not affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.



I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that a Mayor representative of the Mayors' 5

Council of Guam (MCOG) was at one time an appointed ex-officio member of the 6

Guam Education Policy Board (GEPB) pursuant to Public Law 26-26. Public Law 31-

19 amended portions of Chapter 3 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated, which 8

removed the section of the law that included a non-voting ex-officio member to be part

of the GEPB.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds the Mayor representative to the GEPB have

proven to be a contributing member to the GEPB to promote community involvement

and support of our education school system and the children they serve. 13

Therefore, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* intends to amend the composition of the GEPB to include a Mayor representative of the MCOG.

SECTION 2. Subsection (d) is hereby added to Section 3102.3, Chapter 3 of 17 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

5 "§3102.3. Composition and Terms of Office for Board Members.

- (d) Non-Voting Member of the Mayors' Council of Guam. One (1) member
 appointed by the Mayors' Council of Guam who shall serve for a term of two (2)
 years or the remaining term of the appointed mayor, whichever is longer."
 - **SECTION 3. Severability**. If any of the provisions of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity *shall* not affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
