

Bill No. 84-32(COR) was introduced on **April 8, 2013** by Senator Vicente (ben) Pangelinan and Senator Tina Rose Muña Barnes and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the **Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Hagåtña Restoration & Redevelopment Authority** on **April 8, 2013**.

The **Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Hagåtña Restoration & Redevelopment Authority** convened a public hearing on **Bill No. 84-32(COR)** on **Tuesday, May 14, 2013** at **9:00 AM** at the Legislature's Public Hearing Room in Hagåtña.

II. INTRODUCTION, SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Senator Muna Barnes: This Public Hearing by the Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Hagåtña Restoration and Redevelopment Authority is now called to order... it is now **9:05 a.m.** On the agenda this morning ladies and gentlemen are the following:

I want to thank my colleagues joining me here this morning. To my right is Senator Ben Pangelinan, to his right is Senator Frank Aguon, to my left is Majority Leader Senator Respicio,



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Senator Tommy Morrison, Senator Chris Duenas and Senator Tony Ada. Thank you all for joining me.

I do want to note for the record that based on statute, notices were sent out via e-mail to all Senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Monday, May 6, 2013 (5-Day Notice), and again on Thursday, May 9, 2013 (48-Hour Notice). Senator Muna Barnes: Okay we'll get started, the first item on the agenda is Bill No. 84-32 and here to present testimony in support of the bill is the President from the Guam Community College is Ms. Mary Okada. At this time I'll yield to Senator Ben Pangelinan to briefly speak on the bill and if anyone else wishes to speak on this bill to please sing-in at the table to my left. With that being said, Speaker Pangelinan.

Senator Pangelinan: Thank you very much and Si Yu'os Ma'ase Madam Chair. Buenas hamyu todos ni man gaille pago na oga'an (greetings to all of you who are here this morning). Very briefly Madam Chair, Bill 84-32 would provide additional resources to the GCC Apprenticeship Program to meet some shortfalls in funding based upon the estimates that were developed by the administration and adopted by this legislature with regards to the Manpower Development Fund which assists GCC in meeting some its operational requirements. When we looked at the adopted revenues versus the actual collections of the revenues, we knew that there was a significant shortfall and that the Guam Community College was not receiving... even with those reduced collections, was not receiving a proportionate amount of it. I think that as of February, it had not received any funds from the Manpower Development Fund to help meet its obligations. And so what we have done is looked at the revenue sources that are available to support the work of the Guam Community College and we saw in the analysis that was done and the audits with regards to the Tourist Attraction Fund that there was additional revenues there that was unappropriated and non-obligated due to the additional collections that were realized. And so what this bill will do is provide up to \$2 million dollars in additional resources to the Guam Community College to support its programs for the apprenticeship program as well as some of the operational requirements of the college. The college is operating on very limited operational funds at this time which of inhibits its ability to meet its mandates and much less expand any program that it has to provide the training needed for our industry and economy most especially of course with the success that the Guam Community College has in its partnerships with the tourism industry and so forth. And so we thought that the Tourist Attraction Fund would be an appropriate revenue stream to assist the college in its mission and



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efforts since a lot of the training that it does and the programs that it implements helps support the tourism industry. And so Madam Chair, that basically is the intent of the bill and what the bill will do should it be supported and passed by this body. Si Yu'os Ma'ase Madam Chair.

Senator Muna Barnes: Buen probetchu Speaker Pangelinan and at time I'd like to welcome President Okada to say a few words... but if you can just for the record state your name, your title, and if you support or don't support the bill.

Mary Okada: Hafa Adai and good morning. My name is Mary Okada and I am the President of the Guam Community College. I'd like to thank Senator Pangelinan, for introducing the bill, Senators Respicio, Aguon, Speaker Won Pat, Senators Morrison, Duenas Ada and Limtiaco for giving me the opportunity to provide written and oral testimony on this bill. Ms. Okada reads her testimony which is attached for the Committee's review.

Senator Muna Barnes: Thank you very much President Okada. Mr. Speaker do you have any questions for Ms. Okada?

Senator Pangelinan: Yes, I do, thank you Mada'am Speaker. Mada'am President, could you please describe where these funds would be going within the Guam Community College.

Mary Okada: We at GCC receive our funding source from the General Fund which goes directly to operations. Whatever it takes to run GCC, is paid out of the General Fund. We receive some money from the TAF and that goes to the Culinary programs. We have 41 staff at the high schools and that supports 5 high schools. We don't have the additional resources to support secondary. We just need the resources to support secondary. The number of students have been increasing the past 6 years, which is about 40%. We have an aggressive capital project, thus the increase number of students. We really need more space and we'd like to continue to expand and offer more courses.

Senator Pangelinan: Thank you very much. I'm sure that should my colleagues support this legislation, you would put that money to wise use as you have over the last several years. Because you can do more with less, but you can hurt the people that you serve, most importantly by not providing the resources. This college is geared towards the working environment and this is certainly a good for our economy and our tourism business community.

Senator Muna Barnes: Senator Respicio, would you like to say a few words?



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Senator Respicio: Yes, Mada'am Speaker, thank you! Every time I hear of GCC, I get a good feeling and every time I hear of Dr. Mary Okada that's behind something that GCC's doing, I get an even greater feeling. I can see the connection of the Tourist Attraction Fund to help augment the manpower development fund. I'm hoping that DOL supports this legislation. This would certainly augment what they are doing as well with the AHRD program.

Senator Muna Barnes: I'd like to ask if GCC has worked closely with DOL as it relates to the manpower development fund?

Mary Okada: No, ma'am.

Senator Respicio: Well, GCC is a member of the Guam Workforce Investment Board and those funds are specific and restricted to like incumbent workers or dislocated individuals so I maybe your clientel may not be able to meet those requirements due to income level. The use of TAF to augment manpower development funds would be helpful to GCC because of its flexibility.

Mary Okada: How the manpower development fund works, is that you have to be employed. Generally how it works is that 30% goes to DOL for administrative component of the apprenticeship program and 70% comes to us to support the education and training aspect. You have to be employed by an employer in the apprenticeship program.

Senator Aguon: Thank you Mada'am Chair. The only issue I have here is that GCC has yet to receive a significant portion of proceeds from the manpower development fund and I don't see an off-set in terms of should the TAF be provided to you through this legislation. This would augment, presuming that you get all the resources, as identified by Public Law, that you get the 70% from the manpower development fund. I certainly support GCC and want to extend Kudos from 98 to 443 enrolees in the apprenticeship program. Keep up the good work and thank you Mada'am Chair.

Speaker Won Pat: Thank you Mada'am Chair. Dr. Okada, I know you stated that you've been appropriated 1.4 million but have only been 324. Because of some of the reserves being held back do you know what the portion would be from the MDF fund as of today?

Mary Okada: If we were to calculate revenues to be given by the end of this year, we would receive about 650,000.

Speaker Won Pat: Speaker: In the bill it states that this appropriation would be to fund other programs in GCC after exhausting MDF funds, what other programs do you plan to use these monies for?



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Mary Okada: The money that's available from MDF could be used for operations.

Speaker: You would think that monies from MDF should be used strictly for the apprenticeship program and anything else should come from the General Fund. We don't want to defeat the whole purpose of what the funds are being set aside for. I think it's very important that this be a tight request.

Mary Okada: Let me briefly explain the mechanics of the MDF fund. The apprenticeship program may not directly support the tourism industry, but take for example an H2 worker. They pay the \$1,000 fee, we train them and then they in turn help support the tourism industry in one way or another.

Senator Mike Lintiaco: Thank you for your segway into that last description. What kind of apprenticeship program exist for the tourism program? Does GCC have plans to expand the apprenticeship program?

Mary Okada: The expansion of the apprenticeship program is really contingent upon the employers supporting apprenticeship. If GHRA supports the program by hiring people that participate in apprenticesable occupations, they can avail themselves to the apprenticeship program. Just one example: Based on industry requirement to have registered land surveyors, we have as of March 31st of this year, 30 people just from the department of Land Management. She explains other private industries that are involved in the apprenticeship program and then states that there are many different opportunities for GCC to provide these programs as long as the employers are interested in supporting the apprentices.

Senator Mike Lintiaco: So my last question is has GCC looked at the pending affect of the sunset clause regarding the tax credits that offer the apprenticeship program and what are the affects in the future?

Mary Okada: That program is administered by DOL.

Senator Mike Lintiaco: I would just encourage you to take a look at the current law as it may apply to GCC programs because there may be a coming sunset and it may affect GCC apprentice programs.

Mary Okada: Thank you!



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Senator Tony Ada: Thank you Mada'am Chair. My questions are in regards to the Guam Visitors Bureau and since the General Manager from the Guam Visitors Bureau is here I would like for him to provide his testimony.

Senator Muna Barnes: Yes, of course. Thank you Senator Ada for pointing that out. Please come up Mr. Pangelinan. For the record, please state your name and when you're from and if you're in support or not in support of the bill.

Karl Pangelinan: Thank you Mada'am Chair. My name is Karl Pangelinan and thank you for allowing me to provide testimony. I have provided written testimony. He reads his testimony, which is attached for the Committee's review. They are not in support of this bill. They support GCC and its mission, however are humbly asking the Legislature to consider more appropriate funding sources such as the Manpower Development and Federal Grants for GCC.

Senator Muna Barnes: Just for the record, Section 9107, it should encourage and support the employment of local residents in job opportunities as it relates to the tourism industry. This is in all fairness in what is discussed here. It will be noted for the record.

Senator Ben Pangelinan: I'm not surprised and I'm not here to debate on what the TAF is here to support or not support. However I have debated in the past, appropriations that are not related to the TAF and expenditures that are not related to tourism that the Board has spent on. However this bill supports the operations of the GCC in providing the programs to our community. I feel very comfortable that GCC would put this money to good use. If GVB wants to go down that road to make sure that the monies are spent they way there are supposed to be spent, I would be happy to do that during this budget season. I want to make sure that every expenditure is used for what it's suppose to be used for. We may go into a line item budget to make sure that GVB complies as well. So, once again, the GCC needs the support of this legislature due to the shortfall in funding that has inhibited its operations and needs the money to support the programs that support our economy and support our tourism industry. I don't see anyone would debate any other wise, I know it will and ask for support from my colleagues as well.

Senator Frank Aguon: I certainly respect GVB and its respective. I believe is one of the entities that has stepped forward to try and ensure and protect its TAF. But I have to concede to the good Speaker Pangelinan and his statements. Being that you were the former Executive Director of the Guam Economic Development Authority certainly you understand the entire spectrum of supporting and providing training of the workforce to meet the demands of tomorrow and today. With your combined background, that's the component that I don't understand. I just want to make that statement. Sometimes we have to make decisions that ultimately benefit the general community and the tourism industry indirectly benefit the



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tourism industry. I understand GVB's perspective and appreciate your testimony and I stand in support of this legislation.

Senator Respicio: Is this the position of the Board or is this your position as General Manager of GVB?

Karl Pangelinan: We certainly have some of their input but this is GVB's position. I could get the Board's position if that's what the committee requires?

Senator Respicio: If this was the position of the Board, it would be unfortunate that the Board would take the position that GVB believes that supporting the apprenticeship program is not consistent with the TAF.

Karl Pangelinan: Let me just clarify GVB's position. We are not in opposition of the entire bill, just the funding source. I am a complete and firm believer in reinvestment and human capital, that has always been my position since my years in private sector. Once again, from GVB's standpoint, we don't oppose the intent of this bill, just the funding source and we are asking if the legislature could look for a different source of funding besides the TAF.

Mary Okada: She gives numbers of students in the apprenticeship program, which is attached for the Committee's review.

Senator Chris Duenas: Karl, you started by saying that your analysis that the TAF is in a shortfall and not a surplus.

Karl Pangelinan: Yes, this is just an internal analysis.

Senator Chris Duenas: So if you go back and clarify that, so then there is just no money to appropriate, if that's the case.

Karl Pangelinan: Yes, that's correct.

Senator Chris Duenas: My second question is this, should there be that surplus, I think that this is a wise decision and should be debated. I would only add and question the President, in the last legislature, you were a party to legislation that was passed in creating scholarships for individuals supplemental particularly those in their last year of college?



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Mary Okada: If they are participating in the apprenticeship program, it's free. So the courses they take are free already, through the MDF. Other opportunities for scholarships that are available from Japan Travel Bureau, but we do have a few that support scholarships. We have specific scholarships and some general scholarships.

Senator Chris Duenas: This is the same discussion we had with UOG. When the analysis of the staffing pattern and operations is designed to support the curriculum, as much as possible that benefit goes to the student in achieving that goal and not operations. I'm sure you have articulated this as well.

Speaker Won Pat: I know at one time we were having concerns with taxi drivers dealing with the tourist, we ran to GCC to get support. So, there is definitely a connection. I understand Mr. Pangelinan, where GVB is coming from, we are looking at training our workforce. Last but not least, there are very specific programs or projects that the monies are used for, but Speaker Pangelinan is correct, that the ultimately decision would be the legislature whose created this particularly fund. That could be easily solved by adding another subsection. Overall, it definitely speaks to what GCC would use these monies for.

Senator Tommy Morrison: Thank you Mada'am Chair. Mr. Pangelinan, what would all this mean for developing new tourism markets or preserving your markets?

Karl Pangelinan: Before I answer that directly, I want to say once again that we support GCC and its functions and we do support everything that provide to the industry. If we have a windfall of cash, I can certainly see that being able to spread. I understand that our mandates are very wide. If this project were to go through, I think it would all come down to, after paying the bond market, it comes to prioritizing that extra dollar. I think the Bureau and the Board would unanimously say that it go back into the product and what exactly it is that we sell. I'm sure down the line, we would support this reinvestment back into human capital such as this. That would be conditional if there were excess dollars available.

Senator Pangelinan: This legislature has provided over 55 million dollars into the tourism industry through the hotel occupancy tax funds, so this legislature is not deaf or ignorant of what it needs to improve our product. I think we are just a little bit ahead of the curve. Secondly, in your review of the appropriation level, I'd ask you to read carefully, because the appropriation that you're thinking are from balances and not from this year's revenue projections. So, they are not really from this year's revenues, so some of them are from fund balances. I don't believe that we have a deficit in that case. I would look very carefully in this case.



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Senator Muna Barnes: Noted for the record, that Department of Labor has submitted a written testimony and reads it. A copy of the testimony is attached for the Committee's review. They are in support of Bill 84-32 (COR). If there is no one else wishing to speak on this legislation, you have ten (10) days to submit your testimony to my office at 155 Hessler Place, Hagatna, Guam. I state that Bill 84-32 (COR) duly heard.

Mark Baldyga: Good morning, my name is Mark Baldyga and I am the Chairman of the Board for the Guam Visitors Bureau. We strongly support GCC in all its matters, especially the culinary program and we appreciate them very much, however, we applaud the intent of the bill. At the same time the Board unanimously and strongly took a position at the last board meeting that the TAF is critically needed for GVB to perform its mandate particularly in the upcoming year. There are critical areas that are not being addressed in Tumon and the 2/12 incident is a clear at this point. The security and infrastructure in the Tumon area really needs to be fixed. GVB cuts the grass all the way down to Merizo and it comes out of our operating budget. We strongly support GCC and its mission, but we humbly ask that the legislature find an alternate funding source for this legislation. Thank you very much and I apologize for being late this morning.

Senator Muna Barnes: With that said, I publicly state that Bill No. 84-32 (COR) is duly heard. Thank you!

Senator Muna Barnes:

The Public Hearing was adjourned at **11:01 a.m.**

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

Honorable Senators Tina Muna Barnes, Vicente Pangelinan, and Committee Members,

I would like to thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony in support of Bill No. 84-32, "relative to the appropriation to the Guam Community College Apprenticeship Program."

For the past several years, the Guam Community College has been increasing the number of apprentices that participate in the apprenticeship program. In 2006, our enrollment was at 98 apprentices. Today, we are at 443 apprentices. As you can see, the college has worked aggressively to get our local workforce trained in many different areas, from diesel mechanics, line installer repairers, air conditioner mechanics, maintenance building repairers, to police officers and more.

In preparing for this morning's testimony, I researched to see how the funding source from the Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) would justify or support the college's apprenticeship program. Although there are 20 GHRA apprentices currently enrolled in our program, there are other government and local businesses that also support our tourism industry in various ways. The Guam Power Authority, Department of Land Management, Port Authority of Guam, Nissan Motors, Lamlam Tours, JWS, and Atkins Kroll, just to name a few. All of these organizations participate in our Apprenticeship program and are to be commended for continuing to support our local workforce.


As pointed out in the proposed legislation, GCC has not been receiving its FULL appropriation from the Manpower Development Fund (MDF) for the past several years. Under current law, the college receives 70% of the collected revenues. Although this funding mechanism has been in place for quite some time, collections have not been coming in as anticipated. In the current fiscal year, the college has an appropriation of \$1,435,181. However, as of today, the college has only collected \$324,708 from the MDF.

The provision of Bill 84-32 that allows GCC the authority to use TAF funding to support the operations of other programs at GCC, as approved by the Board of Trustees and the college administration after the Apprenticeship program requirements and obligations have been fully funded, is of equal importance in this proposed legislation. These funds are needed to carry out the

critical services that support our students. On May 17, GCC will grant 355 students their certificates, degrees, high school diplomas, or GED certificates. Included in this group of students are 56 apprentices that have successfully completed their respective journey worker programs. This is a significant milestone for these students. The funding support that we have received through the Guam Legislature has helped them achieve this goal.

Senators, in order to continue our mission to provide our people with the training and education they need to become successful, productive members of society, GCC needs your support. The passage of Bill 84 helps us all of us achieve this goal. Every milestone that we assist our residents in reaching brings them one step closer to achieving their dreams, and helps to provide Guam with a more educated, competitive workforce.

Si Yu'os Ma'ase and thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony relative to Bill No. 84-32 titled, "AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (F) to SECTION 2, PART III, CHAPTER II OF PUBLIC LAW 31-233, RELATIVE TO THE APPROPRIATION TO THE GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM."

After careful review, the Guam Visitors Bureau is not in support of this Bill. Please allow us to explain our position.

First, the Bill finds that TAF revenues for Fiscal Year 2013 are projected to exceed appropriations by \$1,708,488. This excess is based on a projection of \$25,596,688 and an appropriation of \$23,888,200. However, according to PL 31-233, total appropriations from the Tourist Attraction Fund are \$25,835,080, and therefore, there will be no surplus, but in fact a deficit. The Bureau also did not receive its full allotment for FY12, with an \$82,000 shortfall in GVB's Special Projects, which is used for vital maintenance projects such as Island Road Maintenance and Tumon and Hagtaña Bay Beach and Road Maintenance.

Second, the Guam Community College (GCC) was appropriated \$24,154 from the TAF for its training programs, and has been receiving a TAF appropriation since FY08. Currently, it is our understanding that there are 26 students in the tourism related programs, and an additional \$2,000,000 appropriation would average \$76,923 per tourism student, which seems excessive.

Third, Guam law is very specific in how TAF funds can be expended. §30107 Creation of the Tourist Attraction Fund states, "All proceeds from taxes collected under this Chapter shall be deposited in the TAF and shall be expended exclusively for purposes authorized in §9107 and §9113 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated," which is GVB's enabling legislation.


§30107 goes on to state: "The TAF may also be used to fund the following projects: (a) The creation, improvement or beautification of roads, avenues, boulevards, parkways, intersections, bicycle paths, motor bike trails, footpaths, biking trails, stairways, rivers, streams, estuaries, lagoons, or other means of access and transportation; (b) The development and restoration of points of natural beauty or historic social or cultural significance, including means of access, parking, safety devices, concessions, restrooms, view points and information pavilions; (c) The construction of monuments, memorials, statues, fountains, arches, and similar projects;

(d) The construction of buildings to be used for public purposes including zoos and aquariums, museums, athletic facilities, cultural centers, and performing arts complexes; (e) Landscaping, provision of decorations or the enhancement of beauty of any of the projects listed in this Section; (f) Accessory projects reasonably necessary to projects listed in this Section; (g) Projects and programs identified in the Tumon Bay Master Plan.” In our reading, GVB does not suppose that the \$2 Million dollar appropriation for GCC qualifies under the TAF law.

GVB believes GCC is a vital institution and a key partner in developing Guam’s workforce. In fact, the Bureau works together with GCC on our Tour Guide Instructor program, and we believe that the College deserves adequate funding to deliver on their mission. We humbly ask the Legislature to consider more appropriate funding sources such as the Manpower Development and Federal Grants for GCC.

Once again, Si Yu’os Ma’åse’ for allowing GVB to submit testimony on this Bill.

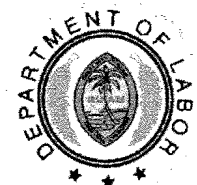

In general, the Guam Department of Labor (GDOL) is in support of Bill 84-32. However, we would like to participate in the distribution of this funding stream for the following reasons:

1. Guam has recently been designated as a State Apprenticeship Agency to take over the duties and responsibilities of the Hawaii Office of Apprenticeship, U.S. Department Labor, which was closed upon the retirement of the State Director, Mr. Alfred Valles. We are currently working on legislation, through the Governor's office, to designate GDOL as the Guam State Apprenticeship Agency.
2. Through 22 GCA Chapter 7 §7120, seventy percent (70%) of the Manpower Development Fund (MDF) has been the source of revenue for the Apprenticeship Training Program at the Guam Community College (GCC) with the remaining 30% allocated to GDOL.
3. GDOL collects monitors, and administers the Alien Labor Processing Program which processes over 1,000 currently employed H-2 workers on Guam, through 40 plus Guam-based employers who need this skilled labor force to build a better Guam.
4. Furthermore, \$100,000.00 from MDF is reserved to produce the quarterly "The Unemployment Situation of Guam" report.
5. It is only fitting that GDOL receive 30% of the proposed 2M Dollars which will ensure the establishment of the Guam State Apprenticeship Agency which will enhance the workings of apprenticeship on Guam and contribute to its continued growth of its skilled workforce.

6. Additionally, two employees supporting apprenticeship are funded by the Agency for Human Resources Development and are administering the Guam Registered Apprenticeship Program created by Public Law 28-142. It is anticipated that these employees will be absorbed by the Guam State Apprenticeship Agency.

Ergo, in addition to submitting our support of Bill 84-32, I am also seeking your support in GDOL's pursuit for a portion of the funding that GCC is soliciting through Bill 84-32.

Thank you for the opportunity to present additional information in support of Bill No. 84-32, "relative to the appropriation to the Guam Community College Apprenticeship Program."

During my oral testimony, I provided additional information on the numbers of students that participate in Tourism courses both at the Secondary and Postsecondary levels. I am providing a copy of the GCC Fact Book for AY 2012-2013 that indicates the numbers of students in Tourism (Lodging Management and Pro-Start Culinary). It shows 369 and 246 respectively. I am providing a copy of the enrollment by program for Spring 2013. This report indicates the numbers of declared students in our Associate of Science in Tourism and Travel Management and Associate of Science in Travel and Tour Management. The numbers show 184 and 100 respectively. Additionally, I am providing the statistics on our Apprenticeship program for the first quarter of 2013.

I have also extracted appropriations from prior years (1992, 1997, 1998, and 1999) that show that the college had received appropriations from the Tourist Attraction Fund. These funds were used to support employees in the tourism-related fields. Currently, the college employs 15 faculty in Tourism for both secondary and postsecondary.

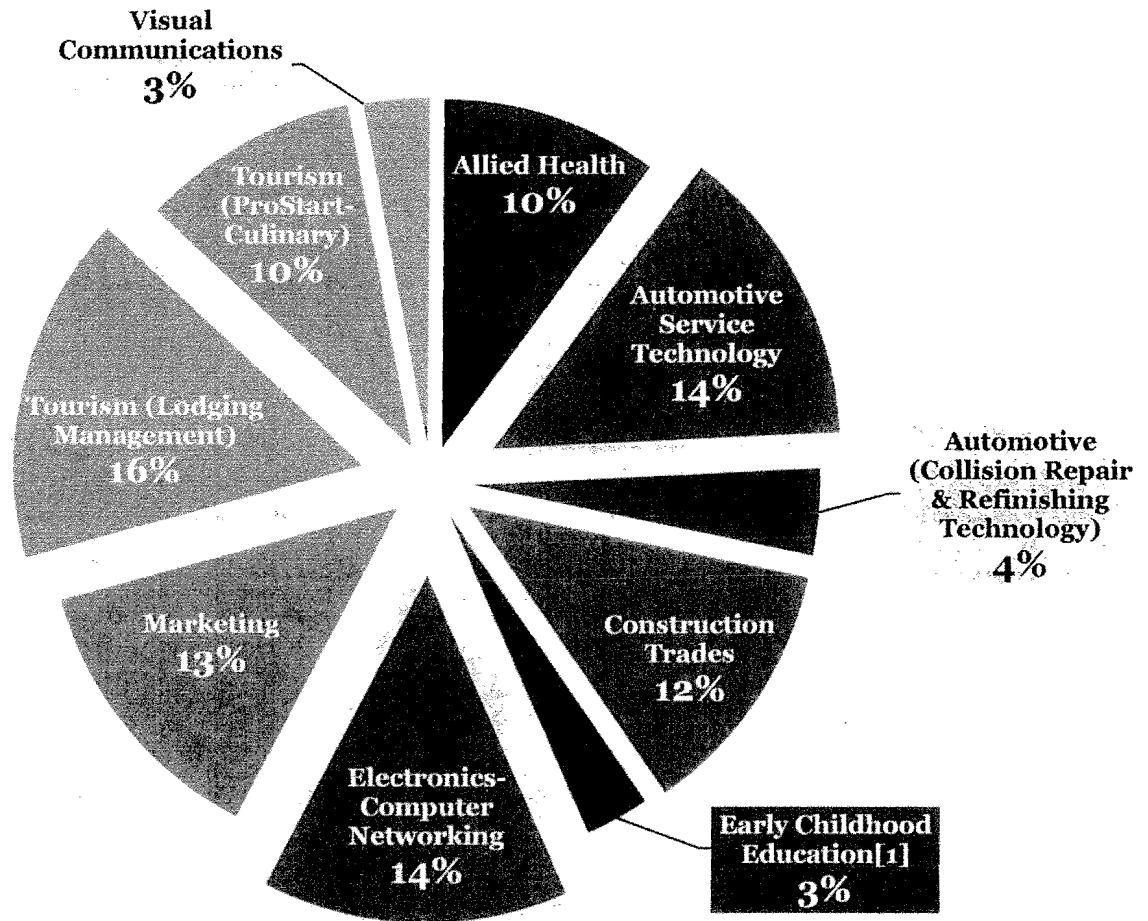

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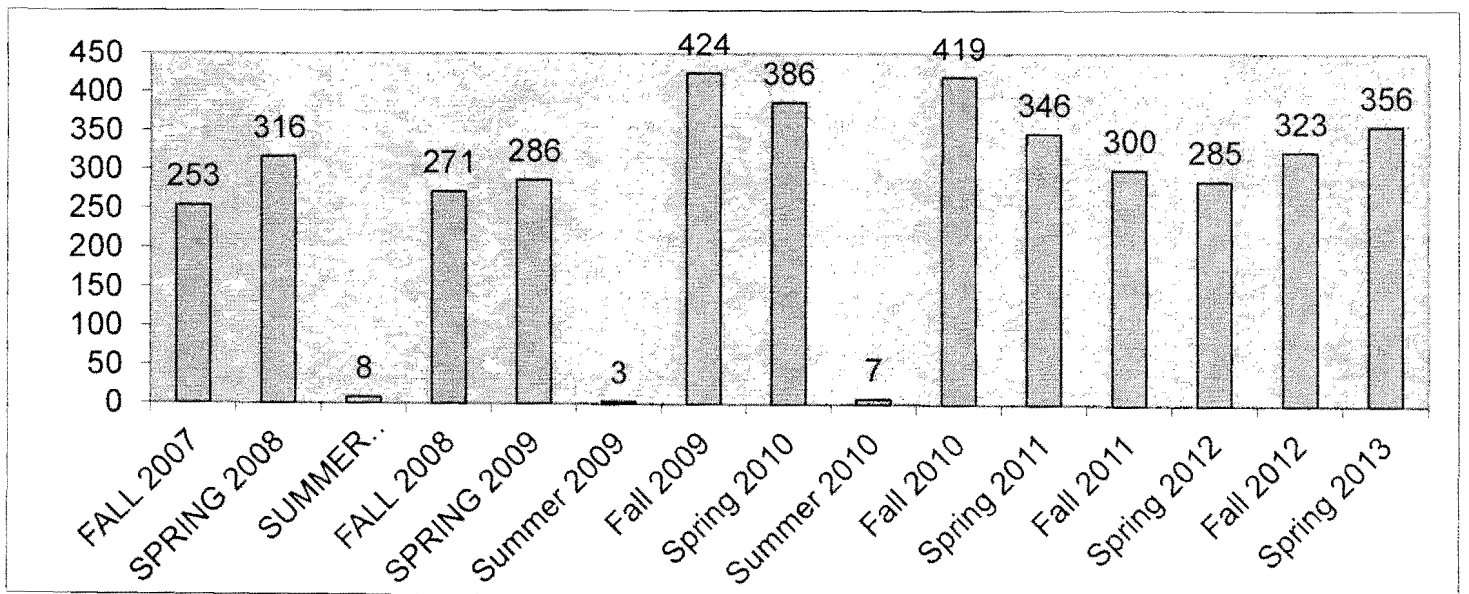

Comments on Bill No. 84-32 (COR)

The bill is seeking to add a new Subsection (f) to Section 2, Part III, Chapter II of Public Law 31-233, relative to the appropriation to the Guam Community College Apprenticeship Program.

Section 2 provides the appropriation of \$2M from the fund balance of the Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) to GCC for the GCC Apprenticeship Program for FY 2013. Additionally, the bill provides that in addition to § 7120 of Chapter 7 of 22 GCA relative to the Manpower Development Fund, GCC is authorized to use the appropriation in Section 2 to fund the operations of other programs at GCC, as approved by the Board and Administration of the College, after all Apprenticeship program requirements and obligations have been fully funded.

Section 3 pertains to Severability under the proposed legislation.
