Rodriguez, Jr.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Appropriations, Public Debt, Legal Affairs, Retirement, Public Parks, Recreation, Historic Preservation and Land convened a public hearing on May 14, 2013 at 2:00 pm in *I Liheslatura's* public hearing room.

II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: On Bill 97-32, I have signed up for oral testimony: Ms. Concepcion Viray, Mr. Carl Dominguez, Mayor Melissa Savares, Mrs. Amanda Santos, Ms. Naomi Saenz, and Mr. Camacho.

Senator Dennis Rodriguez is the author of the bill, and it is an act to appropriate available funds from the Territorial Highway Fund, to designate and prioritize certain capital projects, purchase heavy equipment needed for DPW for flood mitigation, and to fund Department of Revenue and Taxation's Transaction Processing System. We're going to ask the author to please give a short synopsis of the bill.

(a) Bill Sponsor Summary

Senator Rodriguez: Thank you very much, Mr. Chair. Thank you very much for your patience. I'll make this very brief. This legislation is similar to an earlier legislation we introduced, which is Bill 25, which we withdrew officially from the legislature. What this does now is it identifies funding from the Territorial Highway Fund. Recently, the Public Auditor released an audit, and it indicated that there was about \$3.9 million available for use. And the Highway Fund is used primarily to improve our roadways on Guam. We've identified, and in consultation with the Department of Public Works, looking at some of the areas that have been flooding due to man-made errors or from perhaps, and I don't mean to offend anyone, but nonproper planning around the area. We understand we have other areas around the island that have flooding problems, are caused from natural erosion, and we've got to take care of those as well. So we've identified several projects here in this bill; we've also identified an item to fund, which is the Department of Revenue & Taxation's Transaction Processing System. This system will allow Rev & Tax to record and post all payment transactions on a real time basis. There was a recent audit that came out stating that the Department doesn't have an efficient system in place that would allow them to post these transactions in real time. I know this is deviating from the purpose of the Territorial Highway Fund, however, in the past, it has been done and if it is the

pleasure of the body, then hopefully we're able to incorporate this and have it funded by this legislation too.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much. Mayor Savares?

(b) Testimony

Mayor Melissa Savares: Thank you, Mr. Chair. For the record, my name is Melissa Savares, Mayor of Dededo, and I'm here in support of Bill 97-32. A portion of this bill allows for flood mitigation for the roadway, as we know, the Machanao area, where Perez Garden and UR Market, the Piga Subdivision, Ironwood Estates and, for those cock fighters, the Cockpit all areas where people go. Since the development of Ironwood, the original road on Chalan Balaku is a two lane road that was fit for the Perez Gardens area, a little over 800 homes. Now the outskirts of the area, Ironwood Manor, Ironwood Development were constructed to allow families to rent affordable homes. There were no alternate roads in the design, however, when Ironwood put their sewer line in there is a road that goes from Chalan Lamaso, in front of the cockpit out to Route 3. They were able to connect their sewer line through that area. Right now, it is a gravel road, used by buses and residents of the area to eliminate some of the traffic that goes out onto Chalan Balaku and onto Ysengsong Road. Mr. Dominguez had an opportunity to see the area. We even have residents from Chalan Matagua using the Chalan Kotda area to come out onto Ysengsong Road to get onto the main thoroughfares. Both sides of the traffic on Chalan Balaku and Kotda are over a mile long in the mornings as well as in the afternoons. So of course, with the flood mitigation and paving that will be done from Chalan Lamasu, where Ironwood comes out of, in front of the Cockpit area to Route 3 will definitely ease some of the traffic pains for the residents exiting in the mornings and entering in the afternoons. We were hoping that this money will be enough for flood mitigation; this road actually travels behind the Fern Terrace area up above Finegayan Elementary, so it takes you right out to Route 3. If we do this right, with Public Works, we can spare some of the money to make repairs along Chalan Balaku. There are over 2000 cars that run through there in the mornings and evenings, including buses. Businesses are growing. There is only one market in that area, so for families to go out and get food and supplies, they do need to travel through these areas. Thank you.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much, Madame Mayor. Mr. Dominguez?

Mr. Carl Dominguez: Mr. Chairman, I failed to identify myself in the last bill I testified for, Bill 95. I'm Carl Dominguez, the Director of the Department of Public Works. Again, thank you for the opportunity to testify on Bill 97-32. [read written testimony – see attached]

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much. Mrs. Santos?

Mrs. Amanda Santos: My name is Amanda L.G. Santos. I am in support of Bill 97 for the flood mitigation of residential unit of Lot 4, Block 10, Route 10 Barrigada. This flooding problem was never solved since 1985. My son and family encountered a horrible and dramatic experience during the flooding season. If this bill passes, it will lessen or ease the nightmares of

my son and family. It would also allow them to sleep good at night, especially during the rainy season. I hope and pray that in the future, they will live a better life. I thank you all.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much, Mrs. Santos. Naomi?

Mayor Joanna Margaret Blas for Mrs. Naomi Saenz: Good afternoon, Mr. Chair and Senators. On behalf of Mr. Alfred Saenz and Mrs. Naomi Saenz, they are in support of Bill 97, but would also like to submit additional information. I am fully in support of Bill 97 for DPW as I am one of the many that has been made clear by Mr. Santos (GHURA), that it is a matter of time when someone will be injured fatally in my property and property damaged because of the existing water flow easements that is endangering the life of my family and property. My family has been living in fear for life and property for more than two years. I am requesting that if this bill is passed, that DPW will add my residence with the following: retaining wall; clean out the easement behind our house to include the water flow that is prevented from encroaching our property and endangering our safety and further damage to our property, and to include the property of Asan Maina Consalacion, which is not addressed in your Bill 97. Please understand that our lives are at stake. We have pictures to prove that the erosion is really going through our property.

Mrs. Saenz has lived on that property, and we have taken a field trip up there, to include Mrs. Linda Tolan's house. It is ready to just go down with the erosion and they are asking that we add this to Bill 97-32. Thank you.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much, Madame Mayor. Mr. Camacho?

Mr. John Camacho: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee. My name is John Camacho, Director of Revenue and Taxation. I'm here in support of Bill 97, specifically on the TPS, the Transaction Processing System. [read written testimony – see attached].

Currently, we are updating our records. We are interfacing right now as we move forward. This TPS, once we get the appropriation, and we have the software, it will take over the interfacing that we are doing currently. We support Bill 97. Thank you.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much, Mr. Camacho. Any questions for this panel?

Senator Rodriguez: Thank you very much, Mr. Chair. And thank you for your testimony. Carl, I understand and thank you for informing us about the road repairs on Route 4.

Mr. Carl Dominguez: It is a routed road, so it's eligible for federal funding.

Senator Rodriguez: That's right. And perhaps in working with the Chair and the Committee, these are things we can highlight and look at the other areas where flood mitigation is needed, and leave it to you to decide where these funds are needed best.

Mr. Carl Dominguez: Senator and Mr. Chair, just to put things into perspective, the 2010 Guam Stormwater Master Plan identified these various flooding areas in the 19 villages, and in 2010 dollars, the estimate to mitigate flooding was \$170 million. In the Village Street Master Plan, which can be viewed on our website (www.guamtransportationprogram.com), the estimated cost to address non-routed roads and tertiary roads (small roads) is \$700 million. So that puts things in perspective. Your bill is for \$3.6 million to help solve some problems. It's a very small percentage, but it is much appreciated. The people who have come to testify are badly affected by road, flooding and erosion situations.

Senator Rodriguez: On the DOI grant that you talked about, \$2 million, we talked about this a few months ago. When do you anticipate this coming in?

Mr. Carl Dominguez: Based on an email this morning, I really am hoping that we have some positive written news from them by, not this Friday, but the following Friday.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much. Senator Ada?

Senator Tom Ada: First of all, you mentioned needing flexibility on how you move monies around. So from a formatting standpoint, and maybe Mr. Chairman, would it give more flexibility if the language was just to appropriate the \$3.9 million for the purpose of funding flood mitigation at the various sites, because you don't even have the designs? Where do these figures come from, like \$146,000 for Taitano Street?

Mr. Carl Dominguez: From one of my engineers. It was strictly for construction; he did not include design.

Senator Tom Ada: So you probably really need to be able to identify the eligible projects that will be funded under this appropriation without necessarily putting dollars to it. That is something I would recommend, Mr. Chairman. The other part you have here is \$2.2 million for road repairs. Now you indicated that Department of Interior is going to provide some funds for road repairs, but they can only do that on those segments of road that Government of Guam has full title to, and we do have roads that need to get repaired which GovGuam does not have title to, and so until it does, those roads will continue to erode and get worse. At some point, we're going to need to put money to it. So your suggestion to take this money and roll it into flood mitigation work concerns me. Given that, do you still want to roll in that \$2 million dollars into flood mitigation projects and just leave those road segments unrepaired?

Mr. Carl Dominguez: No. I testified that the verbiage in the bill states the \$2.2 million dollars is for road repair and what I said is that I'd like to be able to use some of that money for additional flood mitigation work where required.

Senator Tom Ada: And finally, I do have some concerns, quite frankly, and John, I'm very supportive of your operation and know you have your own shortcomings up there but at some point the Territorial Highway Fund was established for the purpose of making repairs to highways. Even the recent OPA indicated that we're starting to dip into that fund for non-

highway projects, of which this would be one of those. Just to let you know ahead of time, I certainly will try my best to get \$400,000 put into road repairs and flood mitigation and we'll need to find more escheated funds to get you your system.

Mr. John Camacho: Well, we do a lot of work on motor vehicles. [laughter] We cater the streetlight funds, the white goods. There's a relationship with our computer system.

Senator Tom Ada: Ok, I get your point. [laughter].

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much, Mr. Camaho. Senator Muña Barnes?

Senator Muña Barnes: Si yu'us ma'ase, Mr. Chair. For Carl, based on the flood mitigation and the road repairs, I understand that many constituents approach their village mayors about the road concerns in their villages. The mayors do have a system with DPW to stay informed about these road concerns, right?

Mr. Carl Dominguez: Yes, I get faxes or emails on particular situations. Mayor Jessy Gogue has asked me on several occasions if I could do something to repair Maimai Road—either repair it or rebuild it. But it's not on our short term, four year radar screen right now. It's a funding issue, but yes, I get faxes and emails regarding certain flooding issues. In the bill, there's flooding in Yigo. Residents call personally, stop by the office, and request assistance. I remember going up to Yigo many months ago to see a certain flooding situation, and have not been able to help the resident at this point in time, but have not forgotten it. It's not on the list, but there are plenty of requests

Senator Muña Barnes: Does DPW today have a list based on all the requests that come in from the village mayors and residents listing those concerns?

Mr. Carl Dominguez: Not all of them. I have folders on those that are most persistent and appear to be most serious. For example, Mrs. Amanda Santos, I have witnessed her son's house flooding. Mr. & Mrs. Saenz from Asan, I have personally been to their property and Mrs. Tolan's house. I have seen the physical condition of the drainage easement between their two houses. Their properties are in peril, and I haven't been able to help them so far. Just the design work for Asan would be in the amount of \$25,000-\$30,000.

Senator Muña Barnes: My concern, Mr. Dominguez and Mr. Chair, is that our offices have been receiving concerns. From Barrigada, before the road where Tan Amanda lives was upgraded, there were no problems. Flooding and problems started after the upgrade and repair to the roads. One constituent is using sacks to block the water from coming into her house. The house was bought at the appraisal value, and now because of all the damage, the appraisal has gone down. This constituent works at Naval Hospital, has gone through the Mayor's Office and has seen the letters written from the Mayor of Barrigada to DPW, and yet to no avail. Maybe what we need to do is if you can provide us a listing of all those constituents needing assistance? We want to address all the areas, both serious and also those needing repair, before the situation is really bad. Our office has received a number of requests for repair. I thank the author for

allowing me to be a co-sponsor. In the last week, our office received a request from the Mangilao area, the Barrigada and the Maimai area.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you Senator.

Mr. Carl Dominguez: Senator, if I may. Perhaps if the Mayor's Council could come up with a list and we could sit down with the Mayor's Council – maybe the President and prioritize based on immediate need or high risk. We can evaluate the risk to the property owners and we can go forward in that regard.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you. I think that would be a good idea, Carl.

Mr. Carl Dominguez: I would be open to that.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: You can pull out that file at DPW from me.

Mr. Carl Dominguez: Yes, with the others.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: There being no further questions for this panel, we still have Mr. Carlos Camacho. Also for the record I want to assure everyone that is here who signed the sign up sheet in support of the bill, although you are not providing oral testimony, the committee report will reflect you are supporting the bill. For example, I have Christina Santos, Talen Santos, Tara Santos... if any of these individuals wish to provide oral testimony, you are welcome to come up. But, you only indicated that you support the bill. If you want to present oral testimony I will be happy to accommodate your desire.

But signing up for oral testimony I have Mr. Carlos Camacho and Ms. Linda Tolan.

Mr. Carlos Camacho: Good afternoon, Speaker Pangelinan, Senators, Speaker Won Pat. Thank you for allowing me to testify in support of Bill 97-32. As I was sitting in the back I was listening to all the other speakers and they said a lot of things to make this bill more flexible. I wanted to speak on behalf of the Ironwood Development in the Machanao area that Mayor Savares mentioned.

That easement she is talking about is parallel to Fern Terrace fronting the cockpit coming into the Machanao housing development. We are at the tail end of that project and yes, she is right – when DPW and the Mayor's Office tried to re-do some strategic planning... Carl and Mayor can remember, it was miles and miles of cars just trying to avert traffic out of UR Market up to Ysengsong Road. When we were asked by the Mayor to see how we could assist when we were doing our development, we found out through doing some land research that there was a 50' easement parallel to Fern Terrace - as we said - that was still boonies and parallel to Chamorro Land Trust properties. So, when we found out there was a 50' easement, we offered to open that easement and also offered to bring in the sewer line through that easement to benefit the government property, which is Chamorro Land Trust coming in to the left and also the other property owners that are in the Machanao area.

When we did that, we also found out from GTA before they became private that the telephone lines were not sufficient to support the growth in that area. So, we brought in the first fiber optic lines on behalf of GTA and we allowed them to station their fiber optics in one of our community centers. Now all our homes have fiber optics. The other thing we did was we hired TG Engineers when we opened up that road to design the road according to DPW's specs and easement and road design. We paid for that design – I am not sure Mayor if you told this to DPW yet – our designs have been paid and we are willing to transfer that design over to the government since it is a government easement at our cost, which was paid many years ago and give that to the government to assist them to lower that cost of the design and just doing the pavement.

Many times on that particular road, we have been using government assets – we paid for our own equipment that we hired companies to bring in the gravel road when we opened it. During the master plan – during DPW's time through Parson's we thought that that would connect to the new Route 3 road that they can pave that in, but again it was not a route road as we have learned and basically that is why that road was never paved. But every rainy season the road gets dilapidated and two times of the five times the Mayor fixed it, we assisted twice and the other three times the Mayor did it with her own resources. At least for that particular site and the thousands of families who live there, we wanted to say that we became a good community partner and would like to transfer our designs that we paid for – it was many years ago, there may be updates, so hopefully DPW can update it. We support Bill 97. Thank you.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much, Mr. Camacho. Mr. Santos?

Mr. Anthony Santos: Thank you Mr. Speaker and members of the 32nd Guam Legislature. I thank Carl Dominguez - for the years that we have been going through with a lot of this flooding situation and sleepless nights and mornings – this is the only Deputy Director, now Director that would come out to the house and entertain any kind of issues we had due to the causes of mother nature and because of the lack of engineering that they did to cause this problem or just natural disasters. But I thank Mr. Dominguez and the Mayor of Barrigada for coming to – not only myself, but the people of the island and villages to assist us, but they are only limited to certain things, but just themselves to come out to show their concern. I support Bill 97. This is the first step of helping those on the island that are suffering because of the flooding situation – whether it be erosion or mother natures way.

But, my situation was because of the fact of the raising of the road, lack of engineering that was done – I do believe that my situation should be looked at and be taken seriously. It would be different if it was caused by Mother Nature's way of saying, hey you bought a house, I am just going to flood your house – poor planning of drainage. I do support Bill 97 and thank Senator Rodriguez for following up on our issue because the past years my father has voiced his concern to the Legislature and the past Governors about our situation. I see now it is a step forward. I hope and pray that we do look at this and take it seriously because everyone on this island is going through a lot. I am not sure if you have gone through this before or if you have ever been through it, but I came back because this is my home. Then to find out that my house is being flooded because ... I left in 2000 because of my job in the Navy. So I came back after five years to find out that the house that I had given my deceased brother was flooding even back

then. So now I am encountering it, my family is encountering it – at times we have sleepless nights, sleepless mornings because we have to worry about water coming in.

I do believe this is a step closer to resolving other issues around this island. I support Bill 97. Thank you.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much, Mr. Santos. Ms. Tolan?

Ms. Linda Tolan: Good evening Mr. Chair and members of your Committee of the 32nd Guam Legislature. We were made aware that there is a bill – Bill 97-32 – there was a round table meeting last Friday at the Asan Community Center. Mr. Carl Dominguez attended it from DPW, EPA, the Mayor of Asan-Maina, Ms. Lori Crisostomo of Bureau of Planning and the Executive Director of GHURA and the engineer Albert Santos. Our problem in Asan at the Consolacion Court is erosion – big time – that threatens the property and the lives around there. We have talked to Mr. Carl Dominguez about this since 2011. Our communications are emails and he tried. He even tried getting a hold of Department of Agriculture to plant different kinds of trees, which we did. The property owners at the bottom also planted trees and put some plastic or rubber to prevent erosion. I planted coconut trees and mango trees and all kinds of trees. I even hired a backhoe and bought four truckloads of base course from Hawaiian Rock thinking it would help with the erosion. But it didn't. Every time it rains – right now every time the way we see it, it is about 5' down from its original elevation.

Also, the falls, the valley – that is no longer a valley right now because it is covered by all greens. Mr. Carl Dominguez is aware of this and I have also approached Senator Tom Ada on this issue. I echo Senator Tina Muna Barnes said about the flooding. I have that problem on Route 6. When they elevated the road, our property is like a swimming pool every time it rains. This started in 2009 when I started knocking the doors of Public Works. Right now if you look at my building there, I have sand bags in all the entrances in case it rains so it won't be a swimming pool. In the office, you know what we do when it rains so hard? All we do is bail out water and mop. That's how bad it is in our situation. Our village mayor can attest to that. She is now taking care of 20 years of problems in the Asan-Maina village.

I do support Bill 97-32, but please include the Asan-Maina village in your appropriations. Thank you.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much Ms. Tolan. Mayor?

Mayor Joanna Margaret Blas: Good afternoon. I am Joanna Margaret Blas, Mayor of Asan-Maina. Buenas Senadot and Mr. Chair. My residents have contacted me since I have been here – I have been elected into office since January. I have sent a letter of concern to GHURA because GHURA in 1995 took over Asan to redevelop it. I have a list of twenty problems in Asan to include the erosion, the flooding – not only in Asan but also in Maina; Snake road. To this date, it still floods. We ask that you – I thank you Senator Rodriguez and Senator Tina Muna Barnes for introducing this bill. We need to add to add the villages of Asan and Maina and I take care of Adelup, also, besides the Governor's Office.

So, please we have flooding concerns and erosion in Asan-Maina, Nimitz Hill. Right now I fear for the life of some families because if that water goes up, it will go into their homes and they have a generator right behind their home. With due respect, I would like to go ahead and say we met with the agencies: DPW, GWA, EPA, GPA and also Planning and Research, the Director Ms. Crisostomo. I have a village meeting during my first three months in office to address all these village concerns. Senators, the village of Asan-Adelup, minus the Governor's Complex, Maina and Nimitz Hill do have heavy flooding and erosion problems. I have taken the directors and their representatives, whom I have addressed these concerns on a field trip to see for themselves and they have looked at it and they shook their heads. I don't know how, but it has gone this long. We need to fix it before a life is taken. Flooding is not every day. Erosion is not every day. But when the storm – knock on wood, it has been twelve years – if something comes up this thing, the erosion, the flooding will affect the village of Asan and Maina, to include snake road.

I also issued a list of concerns to GHURA because when the redevelopment was done, GHURA took this – a lot of problems were caused from their engineering plans.... and not Albert, Albert is a good engineer. It was back in 1990, 1995. Now they said they gave it to DPW. So therefore we do not have any authority to take care of the problems. But we include them in our meetings. We are pleading with everyone to please take care - not only Asan and Maina, Adelup and Nimitz Hill, but the other villages, like Dededo, like Barrigada. Last July, the water was flowing down and cars were swaying on Halsey Drive that is towards Nimitz Hill. Right now, I still have water flowing from Santa Ana St. down to Nino Perdido. Last year, we had a death in the Leon Guerrero family – a motorcycle that flipped because of the water flowing.

Please, I urge you support to Bill 97-32 and with what Senator Tina Muna Barnes stated to revisit the villages and our concerns. Thank you very much and I appreciate Bill 97-32 authored by Senator Rodriguez and Tina Muna Barnes. Thank you, Chair and all the Senators for having us here today.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you. Mr. Santos?

Mr. Anthony Santos: I wanted to also thank Senator Muna Barnes for being co-author.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much. This panel is dismissed.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan. Thank you very much. This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 97-32. There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. - *Road across the gym, direct entrance to Taigigao Street
- -Whenever it rains, the road always floods.
- *Road further in Taigigao Street, going to the pipeline (residence of Augusto Delgado)
- -Due to road being low water huild up during rainstorms are really quick to fill and high flooding. It makes it impossible to drive through the road.

-Run-off from Joseph Cruz Avenue and Faha Drive need to be diverted away from private property (Antonio Chaco)

With regard to the flooding in our District, please note that our TOP FIVE (5) priorities are as follows:

- 1. Maimai Road (Route 15): Between the Apusento Gardens entrance and the Taijeron Family residence, flooding gets as high as 5(+) feet during heavy rainfalls and even worse during a typhoon. This prevents many of the Maimai residents from gaining access to Route 4 and on occasion, many residents have become completely "land locked" because of similar flooding that occurs in front of the Department of Corrections (Dairy Road).
- 2. Route 4 (Pago Bay): [Not listed in the Storm Water Drainage Master Plan] Between the GWA Waste Water pump station and the Pago Bay Bridge.
- 3. Chalan Nganga & Famha Road (Famha Area): During heavy rainfall, roads are washed out and homes are flooded. Much of this flooding can be attributed to the growing development in this area which has allowed the rate of flow of rainwater to sheet across this area.
- 4. Ramirez Drive: Road in front of the elementary school continues to flood along with flooding in the homes across the street from the school. Much of the flooding can be attributed to the ineffectiveness of the ponding basins surrounding the school. Additionally, flooding seen this area has adversely affected the functions of GWA's Waste Water pump station and has, on occasion, allowed sewage to seep out from the sewer lines in this area.
- 5. Manibusan Lane: Currently the flow of water along Manibusan Lane are NOT properly channeled through this area, which has resulted in the flooding of the road an homes in this area







Thank you for giving the Department of Public Works the opportunity to review Bill 97-32, "An act to appropriate available funds from the Guam/Territorial Highway Fund to designate and prioritize certain capital improvement projects, purchase heavy equipment needed by the Department of public Works for flood mitigation and fund the Department of Revenue and Taxation's transaction processing system."

The DPW supports the bill to mitigate flooding conditions and improve the safety of our roads at various locations around the island. These flooding and deteriorated road conditions are hazardous to motorists and cause property damage to residences or businesses.

Because the dollar figures for the flood mitigation work listed in Section 2, Item No. 1 of this bill, e.g., \$146,000 for Taitano St., Harmon, \$210,000 for elevation of the residential unit on Lot 4, Block 10 in Barrigada, \$300,000 for Lot 6-1, Block 10 in Barrigada (fronts Route 8, not Route 10 as shown in the bill), etc., are just "rough" cost estimates and the actual costs will be established by engineering design and competitive bidding, the Department recommends verbiage be added to the bill which will allow the DPW some leeway with the funding to complete the projects.

The Office of Insular Affairs of the Department of the Interior has recently approved a grant of \$2 Million to DPW for the purchase of heavy road repair and maintenance equipment. The grant award is still subject to the DOI's appropriation being passed into law by Congress. If and when it comes through, the DPW intends to use the DOI grant to purchase an excavator, dump trucks, a grader, a roller compactor and other equipment which will allow us to clear rivers, drainage ditches and ponding basins as well as repair roads. Thus, if the DOI grant comes through, We would request that the \$200,000 listed in this bill for the purchase of a long-reach excavator instead be used for badly needed road repairs or additional flood mitigation work.

With regards to Item No. 3 in this bill, I am pleased to inform you that the DPW will be going out to bid by mid-June to re-surface the stretch of Route 4 from the Togcha bridge past Jeff's Pirate

Cove and on to the Ipan beach park. This re-surfacing project, 100% will greatly improve the traction vehicles will have as they traverse that section of Route 4, especially in wet conditions. This project is 100% funded by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). The DPW recommends, that in addition to road repair and improvements, the \$2,189,000 listed be used to mitigate flooding and erosion problems in the villages.

The Department of Revenue & Taxation (DRT) hereby submits written testimony regarding the aforementioned proposed legislation. DRT would like to thank the sponsors of this legislation for the following reasons:

- 1) DRT currently faces the challenge of updating and correctly posting to taxpayer accounts payments, credits and assessments since the discontinuance of the former point of sale system in November 2011.
- 2) The integrity of data at DRT since that discontinuation has been deemed unreliable resulting in numerous inaccurate billings and assessments to taxpayers of Guam.
- 3) The present point of sale system currently used by the Department of Administration does not allow for interfacing of payments made at the Treasurer of Guam. It only allows for the posting of general ledger accounts at DOA but not taxpayer subsidiary ledgers at DRT.
- 4) DRT would like to implement a Transaction Processing System that would correct the interface issues, prevent duplication of work, and post to the general and subsidiary ledger accounts while protecting taxpayer information.



Hafa Adai Chairman Rodriguez and Committee Members:

This written testimony is provided on behalf of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans in regards to Bill No. 97-32(CS) and offer the following comments:

Over the last several years, the Guam Coastal Management Program GCMP of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans and its networking agencies specifically Guam Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Agriculture's Forestry and Soil Resources Division, and United States Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service have put forth significant efforts to improve water quality and the overall health of watersheds on Guam. Several projects including reforestation and streambank stabilization have been undertaken to avoid adverse impacts.

There is a direct link between land alteration and the health of streams, coastal waters, and even Guam's sole source aquifer. The alteration of vegetated areas to buildings, driveways, parking lots, roads and other surfaces that prevent water from filtering into the ground to our landscape greatly increases the runoff volume created during storms. This alteration changes surface and groundwater drainage processes affecting our environment, our local economy, and our residents due to increased runoff volumes, waterway velocities, erosion, and flooding.

We support the intent of this bill and commend you on addressing flood mitigation and providing financial assistance to Department of Public Works. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above-mentioned bill. Si Yu'os Ma'ase.



Tried planting trees to slow down erosion; bought 4 big truck loads of base coarse from Hawaiian Rock Products and rented a backhoe to backfill the

I have also sought assistance from GHURA, Senator Tom Ada and Governor's Chief of Staff Frank Arriola for remedies on the ongoing problem that threatens the safety and security of our lives and homes.

Last several weeks, Asan-Maina Mayor Joana Margaret Blas and I have met with the Ghura board members, Executive Director Mike Duenas and Engineer Albert Santos. Lat Friday, May 10, a meeting was held at the Asan Community Center which was attended by some property owners in Asan, DPW Director Carl Dominguez, GHURA Executive Director Mike Duenas & Engr. Albert Santos, Bureau of Planning Director Lorie Crisostomo, GWA John Quidachay, Mayor J.Margaret Blas and a Guam EPA.

As GHURA asserted the Asan Redevelopment project was already deeded to DPW; that they do not have contingent funds to help solve the problem and that DPW has not maintained the village's infrastructure: roads, valley, street lights, to name a few as preventative measures. The particular issue is the land erosion that has been occurring and lately we were told by GHURA of spring water underneath our homes which has been dropping the soil elevation especially when it rains.

DPW Director Carl Dominguez claims he has no funds to address the emergent community problem. He tried in the past seeking guidance from Dept of Agriculture and other agencies, to no avail.



Dear Senator Pangelinan:

Good Afternoon Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee. My name is Domingo S. Cabusao, a retired Environmental Engineer at Guam EPA and long time resident of Perez Garden Subdivision in Machanao, Dededo. I thank the committee for giving me the opportunity to testify in favor of Bill 97-32 which provides funding for the paving and flood mitigation of Chalan Lumasu Ext. (also known as Ironwood Access Road) in Machanao, Dededo and I would like also to thanks Senator Rodriguez and Senator Tina Muna Barnes for sponsoring proposed Bill 97-32.

For your information, there are now five subdivisions within the area and utilizing only one entrance and exit road, the Chalan Balaku in Machanao Subdivision. In case of an emergency and/or an accident at the entrance road, we can't leave or exit the area. The traffic is getting worst especially in the morning and afternoon. The asphalting of the Chalan Lumasu Ext (Ironwood Access Road) through the available funding of the Guam/Territorial Highway Fund will surely alleviate the traffic congestion in our area. We estimated that more than one thousand vehicles traverses the Chalan Balaku Road everyday, which has deteriorated badly due to the constant used by heavy equipments during the construction of the new three subdivision and the increase in numbers of cars using the road. The road which was paved during Governor Paul Calvo's term was not designed and built for heavy loads. We have requested DPW through the office of the former Director, to repair Chalan Balaku and pave Chalan Lumasu Ext. but according to her funding is not available to do repairs of the secondary roads.

The people of Machanao and I are also a tax payers, paying fuel tax and property tax and it is only right that the government of Guam provides the necessary services due to its people, especially to the people of Machanao. We are grateful that our beloved Mayor has volunteered to use her available village funding for the repairs of Chalan Balaku.

Mr. Chairman and members of the committee, I won't be here pleading and asking for your help in passing Bill 97-32, appropriating funding for the paving and flood mitigation of Chalan Lumasu Ext, if only the developer of the Ironwood Manor had paved the road as conditioned in their TLUC approval, which requires them to open the road, make it accessible and connect it to Route 3 prior to DPW approving the subdivision map. The subdivision map has been approved, houses have been built and occupied and the road was opened but not asphalted. We don't know what transpired between DPW and the developer.

Mr. Chairman and members of the committee, I 'm appealing to you, please consider Bill 97-32 and approve and pass it as soon as possible.

Comments on Bill No. 97-32 (LS)

The bill is seeking to appropriate \$3.9 million from the unappropriated fund balance of the Guam Highway Fund, to Department of Public Works (DPW) to fund costs for certain capital improvement projects, to purchase heavy equipment for flood mitigation purposes, and for road repair and improvement work; and to Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT) to fund the Transaction Processing System to upgrade and facilitate certain functions.

Section 2 of the proposed legislation lists the items to be funded as follows: 1. To DPW for flood mitigation purposes: (A) Taitano Street, Harmon installation of 680 lineal ft. inlet catch basin to Route 16 - \$146,000; (B) Residential unit, Lot 4, Blk 10, Barrigada (Route 10) - \$215,000; (C) Lot 6-1, Blk 2, Barrigada (Route 10) - \$300,000; (D) Offsite Ironwood access road, Dededo, to include pavement - \$300,000; (E) Yigo, various flood mitigation work - \$150,000 2. To DPW for acquisition of a long reach excavator, with maintenance agreement - \$200,000 3. To DPW for road repair and improvement work primarily to improve traffic safety along Route 4, Ipan adjacent to Jeff's Pirates's Cove, and other areas islandwide with emphasis on the improvement of traffic safety - \$2,189,000 and 4. To DRT for the Transaction Processing System to improve and facilitate program functions - \$400,000.

Section 3 states that the Department of Public Works and the Department of Administration shall submit a status report on on all capital projects initially authorized under bonds, prior to this proposed legislation under § 1504 of 5 GCA and § 22427, Division 2, 5 GCA (see Attachment). The Section also requires DPW and DOA to report on the status of capital projects and others as per the proposed legislation.

Sections 4 and 5 pertain to Severability and Effective Date under the proposed legislation.

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

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

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
