# II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 5:30 pm.

Chairman Ada states for the record, throughout the week his office has been receiving written testimony regarding Mr. Ilao's appointment. The committee received written testimony from Ms. Christine Baleto, who is currently a board member of the Port Authority's Board of Directors. He states her testimony is generally in support of the appointment of Mr. Ilao to serve a second term, but she did not ask to have her testimony read into the record. Chairman Ada further states the committee received written testimony from Mr. Daniel J. Tydingco, but he did not ask to have it read into the record, but generally the testimony is in support of Mr. Ilao's appointment to the Board. Chairman Ada states the committee also received written testimony from Ms. Mary C. Torres and she specifically asked that it be read into the record.

## Ms. Mary C. Torres – Private Citizen

Written Testimony (Read into the Record by Chairman Ada - See attached)

Ms. Mary Torres' testimony states she submits written testimony as a citizen of Guam in opposition to the confirmation of Mr. Ilao. Ms. Torres states she considers Mr. Ilao a goodnatured individual and family man with a "good natured chuckle." Ms. Torres' testimony further

states that during her time as the General Manager of the Port Authority of Guam she observed Mr. Ilao as "aloof" and "a complicit participant who blatantly disregarded the Legislature's policy that the formation of public policy should be transparent and not conducted in secret." Ms. Torres's testimony further states the confidence lost by Mr. Ilao in her management of the Port "pales in comparison to the confidence she lost in Mr. Ilao as a professional and a thoughtful human being." She further states, "Ed endorsed the ruin of good people's lives and sits idly by and does nothing to stop the port from being steered in a perilous direction..." Ms. Torres' written testimony states in closing, "I do not support the re-nomination of Mr. Ed Ilao and I call into question his integrity and ability to effectively serve as a member of the Board of Directors of the Port Authority of Guam."

**Chairman Ada** states the committee received written testimony from Port Employee, David G. Teixeria. Chairman Ada states Mr. Teixeria asked that his testimony be read into the record and Chairman Ada goes on by stating that he will read the parts that are pertinent to the hearing.

Mr. David G. Teixeria - Equipment Operator II & Union Steward, Port Authority of Guam Written Testimony (Read into record by Chairman Ada - See attached)

Mr. Teixeria's testimony states his submission of testimony is to bring the committee's attention to "a situation that is on the verge of imploding at the port, under the current leadership of the new general manager and this board of directors, laws are being broken, procedures and policies that protect the safety of us on the dock are not being followed and there is such a climate of fear and intimidation and retribution that people are scared to speak up." Further, Mr. Teixeria's testimony states Mr. Ed Ilao is aware of all these things and they are brought before him during the Board's monthly meetings in the reports provided to him. Mr. Teixeria's testimony closes by asking that before Senators confirm Mr. Ilao, they question him about the issues raised.

## Ms. Bernadette Meno – Private Citizen

Oral and written testimony – (See attached)

Ms. Meno provided written testimony in opposition to the re-confirmation of Mr. Eduardo llao to the Port Authority's Board of Directors. Ms. Meno states, for full disclosure, that she is an employee of Senator Rory Respicio, but her testimony is in a personal capacity. Ms. Meno further states that there will be many people testifying about what a great man, volunteer and brilliant and successful businessman Mr. Ilao is. But she states, "Mr. Ilao is not here to be reviewed on those matters, rather, this time around should be focused on a review of his time as a board member and she is here to speak his actions or inactions as a board member." She goes on by stating, "that she is one of many Port employees illegally and wrongfully terminated in one of the biggest political witch hunts and she was the main target. Before she speaks to that, she wants to speak to several other matters at the Port. Ms. Meno alludes to an issue recently brought to the Port Authority Board of Directors regarding payments made to a company without a contract. Ms. Meno states there are also issues with the Port's Legal Services Contract. Ms. Meno further states that Mr. Ilao destroyed the lives of several former employees of the Port in a politically motivated attack and that Mr. Ilao attended numerous board meetings in violation of the Open Government Law and even allowed a tape recorder to be turned off during a board

meeting. Ms. Meno also states that Mr. Ilao and other Board Members approved the release of Ms. Meno's son's medical records 29 times in violation of the law. Ms. Meno questions what the medical records had to do with her accident seven months after his birth. Ms. Meno poses the question of whether Mr. Ilao or any of the Senators present would wish that type of treatment on their children. Ms. Meno closes by stating, "I certainly hope that you don't allow your inaction on matters [to act] as a defense for why you allowed illegal and wrongful acts to move forward under your watch because your inaction is in fact an action, and your silence is deafening. Senators I humbly ask that you reject this nominee for consideration of a second term on the board for the Port Authority of Guam. We need individuals with the courage and integrity to do what is right fair and just for the Port and for all the people of Guam. Our island and our people deserve nothing less.

# Ms. Maria Taitano - Acting General Manager, Port Authority of Guam Oral and written testimony

Ms. Taitano states for the record that she will read her written testimony (see attached) and that she will also read Ms. Joanne Brown's (General Manager, Port Authority of Guam) testimony and that of Mr. Felix Pangelinan (Deputy General Manager, Port Authority of Guam)

Ms. Taitano reads her written testimony in support of Mr. Ilao's reappointment to the Port Authority of Guam's Board of Directors. Ms. Taitano goes on by stating that though she only worked with Mr. Ilao for a short time at the Port, she has known him elsewhere as a professional. Ms. Taitano further states Mr. Ilao "brings to the table experience and lessons learned that will not only further assist the port in its efforts to efficiently and effectively service its customers and stakeholders but will also improve and address the needs of the Port's most important asset, its Port-strong employees."

# Ms. Joanne Brown – General Manager, Port Authority of Guam Written testimony (read into record by Ms. Maria Taitano – See Attached)

Ms. Brown's testimony states she is in support of the re-nomination of Mr. Ilao stating. "Mr. Ilao has provided his experienced private sector perspective to improving the management, operations and accountability of the Port Authority of Guam to serve our island community." Ms. Brown's testimony closes by stating, "we wholeheartedly support his reappointment and ask this Committee and the Guam Legislature to also support his reconfirmation."

# Mr. Felix Pangelinan - Interim Deputy General Manager, Port Authority of Guam Written testimony (read into record by Ms. Maria Taitano – See Attached)

Mr. Pangelinan's testimony states he is in favor of Mr. Ilao's nomination. Mr. Pangelinan's testimony further states, "during his tenure as Board Member, he has made excellent strides in continuing the endeavor of moving the Port Authority closer to modernizing its facilities and improving upon its infrastructure." Mr. Pangelian states Mr. Ilaos's experience and first hand knowledge of Port projects is beneficial and would continue to make him a valid asset to the agency and asks for the Senators' favorable consideration of his re-nomination to the Board.

# **John B. Santos - Operations Manager,** Port Authority of Guam Oral Testimony

Mr. Santos states that he has been at the Port for 27 years, all in operations. Mr. Santos goes on by stating that he and Mr. Ilao have been through a lot and that Ed [Mr. Ilao] has been there, working on the protocol manual and SLE and has specific knowledge of those things among other items that would allow for continuation on the Board. He states because of Mr. Ilao's experience from being already on the Board, he is supportive of him coming back.

# Ray Vega – Private Citizen

Oral Testimony

Mr. Vega states he is in support of Mr. Ilao's nomination to the Port Authority of Guam Board of Directors. Mr. Vega further states he finds Mr. Ilao to be very disciplined and that he has utmost confidence in his decision-making. He continues saying, he has previously worked with Mr. Ilao's company for five years and that further, Mr. Ilao's public contributions speak for themselves. Mr. Vega cites Mr. Ilao's involvement with the American Red Cross and the Guam Community College. Mr. Vega states Mr. Ilao is a man of conviction with strong family values and that he goes to work with that in mind. Mr Vega further cites Mr. Ilao's education and calls for the Legislature to allow Mr. Ilao to return to the Port Authority Board of Directors.

# Ms. Mary Okada – President, Guam Community College Oral Testimony

Ms. Okada states she is in support of the appointment of Mr. Ed Ilao to the Port Authority Board and that she will submit written testimony after the hearing. Ms. Okada states Mr. Ilao served on the Guam Community College Board of Trustees in past years and currently serves on the GCC Foundation's Board of Governors. She further states the trustees and governors have really moved the college forward with capital improvements and the college's overall vision.

# John Ilao – Private Citizen

Oral Testimony

Mr. John llao states that he has worked with his brother for twenty-five years. Mr. John llao further states that he and his brother have agreed on some things, and disagreed on other things and his brother does not care about where solutions come from as long as they improve the company. Mr. J llao closes by stating if Mr. Ed llao is confirmed to the Board, he believes he would bring that same approach to the Agency.

# Mr. Eloy Hara - Private Citizen

Oral Testimony

Mr. Hara states he met Mr. Ilao years ago by recruiting him as a partner of a corporation to do business as power savers. Mr. Hara further states that he also worked with Mr. Ilao on the Guam Power Board and is aware of his performance as a GCC Board Member. Mr. Hara

continues by stating he came to testify about his years of public service, education, experience and his successful career as a businessman. Mr. Hara states that the other testimony regarding proceedings at the Civil Service Commission should include that that matter is presently under review by the proper authorities and he states he wants to reiterate that he is a Consolidated Commission on Utilities member and is only one out of five. States the testimony that said "Ed Ilao did this or that" does not take into account that Board action requires majority of the Board. States that member's voices are only one voice and that Boards have no authority over the employee, as their authority stops at the General Manager level. Mr. Hara states that any board action cannot be attributed to just one member. Mr. Hara closes by stating that having known Mr. Ilao as a business partner and knowing of his personal demeanor and integrity, supports his appointment.

## Mr. Eduardo R. Hao - Nominee

Oral Testimony

Mr. Ilao thanks the committee and states that he is currently the president of JMl Edison and ER Ilao and Associates. Mr. Ilao states he believes his collective education, work knowledge and experience, community service experience, and government board service familiarity give him unique qualifications to exercise his fiduciary responsibilities as a board member. Mr. Ilao further states it would be a privilege to continue to support the people of Guam and thanks those in attendance, especially the Port-strong employees who support his confirmation.

# Discussion, Question and Answer

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks Mr. Ilao whether or not the major responsibility of a board, like the legislature, is to approve a budget?

Mr. Ilao responds ves.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks how long Mr. Ilao has been on the Board at the Port?

**Mr.** Hao responds a little less than two years.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks when the budgets were approved for the two fiscal years Mr. Ilao was on the Board?

**Mr. IIao** responds that, during his first term, he thinks he got confirmed in February 2011, the budget was approved already so they did not have much say in that. For the fiscal years 2012 or 2013 they went through the process of budget presentations for management and of course approval of the budget.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** states he went onto the website and in the last two years, eighty percent (80%) of the resolutions on the website are about people's retirement or untimely passing or in congratulations. Further states that he has not found one resolution to approve a budget. Asks where is the public to find the resolutions approving the budgets so that they could find where the Directors had discussion regarding the budget?

**Mr. Ilao** responds by stating he thinks it should be in the minutes. Mr. Ilao further states, for example in this fiscal year, we approved the budget one quarter at a time because of a lot of issues moving forward, one being the tariff, and it should be in he minutes.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks as a businessman and former government board member whether or not there should be some sort of resolution, because he has spent many hours looking for discussion regarding the budget and asks how familiar Mr. Ilao is with the budget when he approved it?

**Mr. Hao** states he was part of the working sessions but cannot speak to the details at this time because he does not remember much about it.

Vice Speaker Cruz states one of the major contracts is the legal counsel and asks if he remembers the caps for the legal counsel?

**Mr. llao** states he cannot.

**Vice Speaker-Cruz** asks if Mr. Ilao remembers when the board approved the amount or if he recalls being advised by management of problems with the legal counsel budget and the need to address it?

**Mr. Hao** states he recalls a discussion about billing delays and that the Port may be exceeding the budget of the Legal Counsel, but beyond that he does not remember the numbers being presented.

**Vice-Speaker-Cruz** asks whether or not Mr. Hao reviews the documents the Board is given?

Mr. Ilao responds yes.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** states that he looked at the Board minutes in November where he found that Alma (Port Authority of Guam Procurement Manager) had a written document explaining the need to address the ceiling and the need to procure a new contract and asks Mr. Ilao if he believed they needed to procure a new contract having reached the max?

**Mr. Hao** states he does not remember what he did and states what happened was they amended the contract.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks when did the board approve the amendment of the contract?

**Mr. llao** states he does not remember.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** states he has gone through the minutes and cannot find a board motion approving the amendment to the contract. States he has a copy of the FOIA showing the amendment deleting [section] 3.7 of the contract, but after going back to the periods before, he cannot find the board action giving the General Manager authority to sign the contract.

Mr. Ilao states he is sorry, but does not remember, further states that it was ten months ago.

Vice-Speaker Cruz clarifies it was four months ago.

Mr. Ilao asks Vice-Speaker Cruz if he said November.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** states it was April fifth that Ms. Brown approved the amendment of the contract and that he cannot find any minutes or a board motion giving her the authority to do that. Asks if this is the way the board acts and whether or not Mr. Ilao believes this is important?

Mr. llao answers yes it should be.

Vice-Speaker Cruz asks did you understand the import of the deletion of what that section was?

**Mr. Ilao** asks on which one?

**Vice Speaker Cruz** states the amendment, [clarifies the date of the amendment] it was April fifth. Asks if Mr. Ilao understands the import of what that amendment was?

**Mr. llao** asks was there a board meeting before that?

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** states that is what he is trying to find out. When did the Board authorize the General Manager to remove section 3.7 in the contract?

Mr. Ilao states he does not remember.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** clarifies whether he [Mr. llao] does not remember the discussion talking about the legal contract and the need to amend it.

Mr. llao responds yes.

Vice-Speaker Cruz states he believes it because he read all the minutes and is trying to find the motion that authorized it.

**Mr. Hao** states he is not sure if he was still attending the meetings because he stopped attending in April because his term expired.

**Chairman Ada** interjects he believes Mr. Ilao's term expired in May on the ninety plus three-day rule.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** states but even so, even if it was April, asks whether before his term expired, does he remember giving Ms. Brown the authorization to delete section 3.7 of the contract.

Mr. Ilao states he does not remember that.

**Vice Speaker Cruz** asks if he realizes the import of that?

**Mr. Ilao** states he does not.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** states it lifts the cap and that he is trying to figure out how Ms. Conway certified the availability of funds and asks how much the Board budgeted for Legal contract for this fiscal year?

Mr. Ilao states he does not remember.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if it would surprise Mr. Ilao that by lifting the cap, the Port could run a legal fee in excess of three quarters of a million [dollars] if not more?

**Mr. Hao** states considering all the cases that they have given the legal counsel, the right thing to do would be to put a cap but temporarily so that the legal counsel to do everything in the interest of the Port.

**Vice Speaker Cruz** asks Mr. Ilao about his private companies and how his legal services' outstanding items are billed and audited?

**Mr llao answers** our auditors would ask our legal counsel if there are any lawsuits pending, but nothing about money.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks as a member of the board, do you review any of the documents transmitted to the auditors?

**Mr. Ilao** states he thinks in the past few years the board has not been given the chance to see the numbers before they go to the auditor.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks do you believe that it is the Board's [duty to show] due diligence of what they are doing and how they vote on during the meetings.

**Mr. Hao** states he reads all the documents presented to him.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if Mr. Ilao has seen any of the billings provided by the legal counsel?

Mr. Ilao states not that he can remember?

Vice-Speaker Cruz asks whether or not in November when Ms. Torres or Ms. Javier brought up the issue, did he see it as due diligence to determine whether or not they were exceeding the cap?

**Mr. Ilao** responds that he thinks they tasked the GM with looking into it.

Vice-Speaker Cruz asks if Mr. Ilao remembers a report coming back to the Board on the issue?

Mr. Ilao Answers no.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if it would surprise Mr. Ilao that the Legal Counsel sent a letter in November saying the Port had about \$100,000 in outstanding invoices with the Port that had not been billed?

**Mr. Hao** states it would not surprise him because the Board was aware that his invoices were delayed.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** aks whether Mr. Ilao felt as a Board Member that he could or should insist that he provide those invoices so the Port could adequately close its books?

**Mr. Ilao** responds our Chairman and GM asked our legal cousel to provide those invoices as soon as possible.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if it would surprise Mr. Ilao that in April of last year, the Board Chairman wrote to the legal counsel and wanted timely invoices and that in November, the GM and the Chairman requested timely billing and that from April to December, no invoices were submitted to the Port?

**Mr. Ilao** responds our Chairman and GM were given the directive and whether or not he complied our GM would have taken care of that.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if as a board member whether or not Mr. Ilao thought it was his fiduciary responsible to follow up of the issue?

**Mr. Ilao states** the board was unanimous in asking the legal counsel to submit billing on-time, the board's voice was the chairman.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if Mr. Ilao would be surprised that the Legal Counsel wrote to the auditor in January stating the November figure was still accurate, yet in the months that followed the Port was billed over \$270,000, did any of the Board think that was something they needed to address?

**Mr. Ilao** states that based on everything that was happening at the Port during that time period of October on then we understood that they would be billing more during that time period.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if Mr. Ilao saw any of the invoices when they came in starting in February for the services performed in October, November and December 2012?

Mr. Ilao answers no.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if Mr. Ilao would be surprise that he was billing about \$65,000 a month?

Mr. Ilao answers, for that period, no.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks if Mr. Ilao would be surprised that by authorizing the GM and the Acting Financial Officer to sign that there are certified funds available for this amendment of the contract, that with all the civil service hearings and all the preparation that the monthly billings but would probably be closer to eighty (\$80,000) if not ninety (\$90,000), if not one-hundred thousand dollars a month because of all the additional work that was being done?

Mr. Ilao states it would not surprise him.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** asks did you authorize them to sign this to say that there was a budget approved for up to one million dollars in legal fees?

**Mr. Hao states he** is not sure of the dates, but he states believe he believes the board amended the budget to accommodate the legal fees.

**Vice-Speaker** Cruz states the meeting to deal with the budget was April 10<sup>th</sup> and the signing of the amendment was April 4<sup>th</sup> and thanks the Chairman and states that he's had enough with that.

Senator Yamashita thanks Mr. Ilao for once again being willing even with the "merry-goround" of issues at the Port. States the Vice Speaker is attempting to address attention to detail and that's what is expected of Board Members but she also sees the fine line between policy and management. Also states its clear the Port's people are tired and she can see it. Further states that when she sees someone like John Santos testify on his behalf, she states that is meaningful because she knows he is boots on the ground and is about getting work done. Closes by thanksing Mr. Ilao for his willingness to serve.

**Senator Morrison** thanks those who testified and invites Mr. Ilao to share some of the progress and challenges being faced at the Port.

**Mr. Hao** states that there is a knowledge vacuum because one of the key employees, among others was let go. Further states as far as progress in the next two years, the Modernization Plan will transform the Port into a modern facility. Alludes to the Cranes and the upcoming PMC and the closing of the Loan with a Bank to carry out very much-needed repairs and purchase equipment and upgrade the financial management system. Mr. Hao closes by alluding to several ongoing projects such as the emergency operations center and the warehouse demolition.

**Senator Morrison** thanks Mr. Ilao for sharing because he states that even though what is out there about the Port are negative issues, he can balance what's out there as well. Further states that though the Vice Speaker raised some issues, he thanks Mr. Ilao for his willingness and praises the support he has for his nomination.

**Senator Tony Ada** thanks Mr. Ilao for stepping up to the plate again and accepting a nomination to the Port Board. States that for Mr. Ilao to come back with everything that is going on speaks a lot to his willingness to face the consequences. Further states that because of the ongoing CSC issues and other things that are going on, there are probably questions Senators can not ask he states he just hopes that moving forward issues brought to issues brought to him and the board

are taken wholeheartedly so that we don't have to keep going through this time after time. Closes by stating that he knows the challenges at the Board are faced by all members of the Board. Asks how many members are on the Board.

**Chairman Ada** states Mr. Benito and Mr. Tydingco are on there ninety (90) days plus three (3) [legislative days].

**Senator Tony Ada** closes by stating it's important to keep continuity and again thanks Mr. Ilao for his willingness to serve.

**Senator Duenas** states despite the issues brought up, he thanks Mr. Ilao for his willingness to serve. Wants to afford Mr. Ilao the opportunity to discuss his career of public service so the committee and the public can glean more into Mr. Ilao's "longevity and depth rather than focus more on the bumpy roads that he's traversed."

Mr. Hao states he will give the highlights and that during his time at GPA, he was given the opportunity to serve on the task force tasked with creating more generation. Further states because of the rolling blackouts in the mid-90s, they were tasked to procure more generation for GPA and had to sign a contract by September. States they were able to sign 88 Megawatts of power with ENRON and 40 Megawatts with TEMES. States that was the major highlight of his GPA Board Membership. Goes on to state that with GCC Board of Trustees, the biggest highlight for him was hiring Mary Okada as president, because although there were two very qualified candidates, they considered who could move GCC forward with everything GCC was facing at the time. Further states, the rest is history, she [Ms. Okada] got a lot of money from the feds and we are continuing to build GCC into the institution it should be to serve Guam in the next twenty years.

**Mr. Hao** states that with the Port, moving forward. even with MARADs control of everything the Port will be moving forward.

**Senator Duenas** thanks the chair and states Mr. Ilao is a big thinker.

**Senator Limtiaco** thanks Mr. Hao for his testimony and states that he and all his colleagues respect the CSC proceedings. Asks with all his previous board experience and the time out of family life, why he would he put himself through all of the public service and time requirements again?

**Mr. Hao** responds stating that question has been asked by his wife and friends but states that he has a passion for doing what he can for Guam and helping it to address. States he does not want to be a complainer telling people about the problems on Guam. Further states he wants to be part of the solution.

**Senator Limtiaco** states that though it is extremely difficult to keep up with every detail with a board is difficult, but asks what are some of the tough decisions faced by the Board and in the past?

**Mr. Hao** states the toughest decisions are the personnel actions and the easiest decisions are the business-related decisions.

**Senator Limtiaco** states that, as a private businessman Mr. Ilao must know the ramifications of personnel matters and asks Mr. Ilao about his experience?

**Mr. Hao** states that he has the unfortunate experience of firing those close to him and states that he brings that to the board, that if someone is not performing, he has no problem letting them go.

**Senator Limtiaco** thanks Mr. Ilao for being willing to face the scrutiny he is facing.

**Senator Barnes** thanks Mr. Ilao for his willingness to serve and states it gives her pause in thinking about the amount of respect Mr. Ilao is willing to serve Guam with. States she noticed as Mr. Ilao spoke about previous experience that he did not acknowledge himself and the work he has done. States that she shares some of the same sentiments of her colleagues and thanks Mr. Ilao for stepping up to the plate.

**Senator McCreadie** thanks Mr. Ilao for his service to the community but states that there are some things brought up in testimony that he would like to ask questions about. States that Ms. Torres` testimony alleges Mr. Ilao and the Board violated the open government law on four occasions and asks Mr. Ilao to speak whether Mr. Ilao thought that was improper

Mr. Hao states he denies any allegations of wrongdoing by Ms. Torres or Ms. Meno

Senator McCreadic asks about the allegation of a tape recorder being turned off at a meeting

**Mr. Hao** states there may have been a recess or the Board may have taken a break

**Senator McCreadie** asks about Mr. Ilao's answers to Vice Speaker Cruz's questions and whether he didn't remember the conversations or if he didn't remember if the conversations ever happened

**Mr. Hao** states if he stated he didn't remember, he just did not remember

**Senator McCreadie** states that Mr. Ilao stated he had unique qualifications and asks Mr. Ilao to speak to what his unique qualifications are

**Mr.** Hao cites his engineering background, his company's status as a general and specialized contract and his experience with government boards and the business he has done with the government.

**Senator McCreadie** states that Mr. Ilao claimed he was a shy and silent guy and asks whether Mr. Ilao considers himself a strong member of a five-person team

**Mr. Hao states** though he may be silent, it does not mean he does not know what is going on. Further states that other board members sometimes voice the concern he has and he speaks with his vote.

**Senator McCreadie** asks what Mr. Hao's main priority is as a board member

**Mr. Hao** states as a policy maker, his number one policy is to make sure management follows the law. States that with a lot going on at the Port, with less key employees they are having trouble doing that. Closes by stating that his experience will be valuable to the Port in the modernization program in the next few years.

**Senator McCreadie** asks about the state of the Port from and insider's perspective, specifically as a director and a divide that exists between the Port employees and management.

**Mr.** Hao responds by stating management has communicated to employees they mean business and that they will do what they must to move the Port forward and that some employees will resist change and other will not.

**Senator McCreadie** states that obviously there is some sort of divide and that the Board may need to get creative and make the employees better rather than having to fire them.

**Mr. Hao** states the board can certainly task the general manager to do that and that the board can participate in more programs to socialize with employees, but further states that they are policy makers and that they don't fire employees and are not even consulted when that happens.

**Senator McCreadie** clarifies if they can make recommendations

**Mr. Hao** states they do not even make recommendations, they just give the GM the report and were just as shocked when she came back with the lay offs

**Senator McCreadie** states thanks Mr. Ilao and the chairman and states he looks forward to the confirmation when it hits the floor.

**Chairman Ada** asks Mr. Ilao to describe his awareness of the work climate at the Port.

**Mr. Hao** states that he has not gone there and tries to stay away from the grounds of the Port because of the business he does with the Port and does not want to give the perception that anything is going on so he states he stays on a management level at the Port interacting with the GM and the assistant GM.

Chairman Ada states that one of the testimonies that came in reads, "laws are being broken, procedures and policies that protect employees on the dock are not being followed and there is such a climate of fear, intimidation and retribution that people are scared to speak up." Asks Mr. llao if he is not aware of that climate?

**Mr. Hao** states no he is not.

**Chairman Ada** clarifies stating you are absolutely oblivious of that climate.

**Mr. Ilao** states that is a surprise to him as that has not been communicated him by anyone.

**Chairman Ada** asks if Mr. Ilao would be surprised that many of the employees on the docks have not complied with the OSHA safety requirements?

**Mr. Ilao** responds that he is not aware and states he believes they have budgeted money and even have contracts with companies who would do that for the Port.

**Chairman Ada** states he is concerned that there is a big divide and that the Board only goes to management. Further states that he is taken aback that anything that happens beyond the GM, the Board is oblivious too.

**Mr. Hao** states though it may not look right and further states he welcomes suggestions on how to address those issues. Closes by stating, they are policy makers and if those issues are not communicated to the Board, how are they to correct it?

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** clarifies that with the comments Mr. Ilao has made about doing business with the Port he asks when the last ethics course Mr. Ilao has taken.

**Mr. Ilao** states a long time ago.

Vice Speaker Cruz clarifies that by law he should have taken an ethics course within six months of being confirmed in 2011.

**Mr.** Ilao states he does not remember taking the course and asks if it was at GCC or UOG and states he does not know if it has been offered.

**Vice-Speaker Cruz** states that he would like to request the certificates provided at the ethics course from the Port Board of Directors.

**Chairman Ada** states that a memo was sent to the Board in the last two weeks requesting that information.

**ViceSpeaker Cruz** because he did not realize Mr. Ilao was doing business with the Port and on the Port Board.


**Mr. Ilao states** he believes he knows where to tow the fine because he has been through it at GCC and at GPA.

#### Hafa Adai Senators,

My name is David G. Teixeira and I am a proud member of the Port Strong team. I am a Equipment Operator II and I also serve as the Union Steward for our employees. I am submitting written testimony tonight as I have to be at work this evening so I respectfully request that this testimony be read into the record at this hearing tonight.

I am here tonight to bring to your attention a situation that is on the verge of imploding at the Port. Under the current leadership of the new General Manager and this Board of Directors, laws are being broken, procedures and policies that protect the safety of us on the docks are not being followed and there is such a climate of fear and intimidation and retribution that people are scared to speak up. In fact, speaking up about wrongdoings which is considered Whistleblowing can even lead to you being physically assaulted.

I know Mr. Ed Ilao is aware of all of these things as more as these matters are brought forth to him via the General Manager in all monthly meetings and are contained in her confidential employee and human resources report that she gives to them.

Senators, recently the GM with board approval suspended more than 20 employees for following a policy in place with the port. Joanne Brown suspended us for falsifying time sheets because our supervisor had secured us that night under the cancellation completion policy. Most decided not to fight this suspension because of the fear of retribution ongoing. Then, on July 20, 2013 I inquired of the leader on duty that day why port employees, many of them my union brothers, were being paid to work on a ship at 1.5 hours which is overtime but instead were forced to go up to the marina to set up canopies for liberation day and work on a float on the clock on government time. This supervisor became so angry that I would dare question anything being ordered by him and the GM that I was physically assaulted by him. I immediately went to Port police to report the assault and even had witness statements to verify what had happened. Obviously he was upset because I am a subordinate and I questioned what was happening but I am a Union Steward at the Port and it is my right and duty to question and protect the employees. As a Union Steward I am protected by local and federal laws. Senators I wholly and completely support the Liberation Day Festivities. I am the great grandson of Augeda Johnston, who helped create the very first Liberation Day parade in commemoration of our being liberated from the Japanese. However, I have a duty to make sure that public funds are not being abused in preparation of these activities.

Instead, the higher ups decided to trump up charges against me and just yesterday I was served an adverse action based on the incident. Senators this is just more evidence of the

corruption, lies, fraud, double face actions of those currently in power at the Port. The employees at the port, especially those working the docks, work in extreme conditions under difficult pressure without any regards to safety and the appropriate manpower to do what we do. But every day we pull off miracles. But it is getting harder and harder to do this as this climate of fear and intimidation continues to move throughout the Port.

I would like to point out that this latest Adverse Action I received is undoubtedly in retaliation for an ongoing grievance that nearly 100 employees have filed against management and also because on July 17, just three days before I was assaulted, myself and two other employees filed an Ethics Code of Conduct Complaint with the Civil Service Commission against John and Ray Santos the top management of the Port Operations underneath Joanne Brown.

So I am sure that after tonight I will face even more retribution and harassment for coming forward and doing the right thing. Standing up and speaking out isn't always easy. I sure wish there were more who could do it.

Senators I ask that before you confirm him that you first address all the concerns brought forth and review the documents in question that I am submitting with this testimony.

# BRIEF SUMMARY OF THE DIFFERENT APPEALS OR COMPLAINTS

<u>Type of Appeals</u>: Appeals involve a classified employee and management or their representatives arguing the matter before the Commissioners to render a decision in their favor. The burden of proof is on management on Adverse Actions and on other appeals, the burden of proof is on the employee.

- \* Adverse Actions Is an action taken by management to suspend, demote or dismiss an employee from the classified service.
- Grievance Normally include, but not limited to, such matters as employee-supervisor relationships, duty assignments not related to job classification, shift and job locations assignments, hours worked, working facilities and conditions, policies for granting leave and other related matters.
- Equal Employment Opportunity Is an action taken by management or another employee discriminating in employment matters against any person on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, national origin, age, marital status, disability, or political affiliation, except for a bona fide occupational qualifications or legal requirements.

<u>Type of Complaints</u>: Complaints involve the CSC staff to prepare an Assessment Report to be presented before the Commissioners for their approval into a formal Investigation. The burden of proof is on the employee.

- Post Audit A written request to review an action that is improperly applied in personnel matters.
- Notice of Personnel Action A review of a Personal Action that is improperly applied pursuant to rule or law.
- Public Employee Protection Act, "aka whistle blower", (applicable to classified & unclassified employees) An action by any government of Guam employee that was done in retaliation because you reported waste and mismanagement of public funds, abuse of government authority, and illegal or unethical practices. Disclosure is required to your immediate supervisor, appointing authority or member of the Guam Legislature, before filing a complaint.
- Lay Off Is an action taken by management, that is either improperly applied pursuant to the Lay Off procedures, or taken in bad faith.
- Priority Placement Is an action taken by management, that is either improperly applied pursuant to the Priority Placement and Lay Off procedures, or taken in bad faith.
- Furlough Is an action taken by management, that is either improperly applied pursuant to the Furlough procedures, or taken in bad faith.
- Political Activity, "aka mini-hatch", (applicable to classified & unclassified employees) An activity by any government of Guam employee that is prohibited by the Political Activity law.
- Ethics in Procurement An action in violation of procurement practices pursuant to 5 GCA §5625 §5633.

#### **PREAMBLE**

The Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Board of Directors, hereinafter referred to as the "Port," and the Guam Federation of Teachers, Local 1581, hereinafter referred to as the "Union," enter this Agreement in conformity with the Public Employee-Management Relations Act, Title IV, Chapter 10, Guam Code Annotated, and Title 2, Chapter 5, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations, including the Rules and Regulations for the Port Operations and Maintenance Division Employees.

#### ARTICLE I - RECOGNITION AND DEFINITIONS

The Port recognizes the Union as the exclusive Employee representative, subject to and in accordance with Public Employee Management Relations Act of Guam (Title 4, Chapter 10, GCA) and Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Personnel Rules and Regulations (Title 12, Chapter 10, GCA) and those Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder, for Operations and Maintenance Employees (full-time or part-time status). Operations and Maintenance Employees include but are not limited to Stevedores, Winch Operators, Riggers, Cargo Checkers, Planner-Work Coordinators, Equipment Operators, Crane Operators, Mobile Equipment Dispatchers, Carpenters, Plumbers, Painters, Electricians, Refrigeration Mechanics, Heavy Equipment Mechanics, Crane Mechanics, Welders, Preventive Maintenance Mechanics. The Employees filling these positions are members of the Bargaining Unit covered by this Agreement. Supervisors, Superintendents, Manager and Clerical employees are not members of the Bargaining Unit and this Agreement does not cover such Employees.

The Union agrees to represent equally and without prejudice all members of the Bargaining Unit for purposes of:

- (1) Consultations and/or negotiations with Port Management officials concerning terms and conditions of their employment not otherwise fixed by law; and
- (2) The settlement of grievances and disputes.

#### **ARTICLE II - UNION RIGHTS**

#### 2.A. WORKSITE VISITS

The President of the Union or designated representative, or full-time Union members may visit member worksites to examine complaints pertaining to this



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Agreement, provided the representative(s) inform(s) the General Manager and Port Police Division prior to such visits and provides the purpose of the visit. All Union visits shall be subject to any and all applicable statutes, rules, regulations, and procedures including but not limited to procedures of the Port Police, TWIC, safety rules and federal or maritime security procedures.

#### 2.B. BULLETIN BOARDS

The Union may provide a bulletin board of up to three feet by three feet (3' x 3') in size and protruding no more than one and one-half feet (1.5') in each break room of a recognized collective bargaining unit for the purpose of communicating normal and usual Union business to the membership subject to OSHA regulations regarding fire and walkway access. Specific placement of such boards within a station shall be subject to the approval of the Division Head. The officially designated Union representative(s) at the worksite shall be responsible for maintaining such board. The bulletin board may be enclosed with a plexiglass cover to prevent damage.

#### 2.C. PRE-SHIFT OPERATIONAL MEETINGS

Management representatives shall conduct brief pre-shift operational meetings at or near the start of each shift. These meetings should not last more than a few minutes and should cover operational and safety matters. The designated Union representative may speak during such briefings and must limit any comments to one (1) minute.

#### 2.D. NEW MEMBER ORIENTATION

The Port agrees to distribute to new Operations and Maintenance Employees, upon appointment, a package of informational material provided by the Union. The informational material may include, but is not limited to: (a) cover letter from the Union; (b) information about the Union history and structure; (c) membership information; (d) contact information of the Union officers and Port Stewards and (e) information regarding Union meetings and events.

#### 2.E. UNION STEWARDS

The Port agrees to recognize Union Stewards, duly appointed by and acting as agents of the Union. The duties of a Union Steward within the Port include receiving and investigating complaints, and processing grievances in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and applicable laws, rules and regulations. The Union shall provide the Port with a written list of such Stewards and alternates, if any.

The Port shall permit Union Stewards to utilize a reasonable amount of work time with pay, approved in advance by the General Manager (which approval will not be unreasonably denied), for the purpose of handling and processing grievances.

Stewards or their alternates shall obtain permission from their immediate supervisors before leaving their worksite to perform duties as a Steward (which approval will not be unreasonably denied). Upon resuming their normal duties the Steward or alternate shall notify their supervisor.

#### 2.F. MEETINGS

The Port or Union may request a meeting with the other to discuss matters pertaining to this Agreement. A party shall respond to any such request for a meeting within seven (7) calendar days of receipt of such request. Such meeting shall occur within fourteen (14) calendar days of the response.

The designated Union Representative shall have the right to meet with the Fort's General Manager or designee(s) to discuss matters on how Management and Labor can better work together to help further the mission of the Port to serve the people of Guam. The Port General Manager shall have the same right to meet with the designated Union representative for this purpose. All meetings shall occur during normal working hours (8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.) Mondays through Fridays, excluding weekends and holidays, and shall occur within a reasonable amount of time from the time and date the request is received by either the General Manager or the Union.

During any meeting between Port management and the Union, each side will be allowed the same number of participants. Said number shall be by mutual agreement at the time of scheduling but not less than two (2) per side. The latitude of either side to provide the agreed upon number shall not delay or cancel the meeting and none of the members of the other side shall be required to leave. All meetings with Port Superintendents and/or Supervisors shall occur when the members are in duty status.

The Port agrees to grant up to 2 (two) hours administrative leave for one (1) Employee Representative (to be selected by the Union – likely their Union Chair at the Port) to attend Board meetings. The Union shall provide the Port twenty-four (24) hours notice or more of who will be attending if not their designated rep. The Port will designate a slot on the Agenda for Employee Participation where the designated Union rep may speak and contribute.

#### 2.G. UNION DUES

The Union is the only Member organization for which the Port may deduct Union dues from a Member's wages. The Union shall provide the Port with signed membership forms from each Member authorizing said dues deductions from the Member's wages. No later than the first day in September of each year, the Union shall provide the Port with the Union's Dues scale for that fiscal year. The Port shall deduct the appropriate amount of Dues from the Union Members' pay checks and then transmit such Dues to the Union no later than seven (7) days after the relevant pay day.

The Port may charge the Union the actual cost of making Dues decuctions, and if the Port elects to charge a cost it must provide the Union with justification of the actual costs within thirty (30) days of incurring such additional expenses. The Union, upon receipt of the Port's explanation of actual costs, must either dispute the billing or pay the charge within thirty (30) days of receiving the bill. If the Port passes on any cost associated with deducting Union Dues such charge shall not exceed two and one half percent (2 ½%) of the total amount deducted.

#### 2.H. UNION MEMBERSHIP LISTING

Management will provide the Union via email, in excel format, within thirty (30) days from the effective date of this Agreement and on the start of each fiscal year thereafter, an alphabetized list of employee names subject to this Agreement, position title, pay grade, step & sub-step, mailing address, union membership deduction and division and department.

### 2.1. ASSIGNMENTS, TRANSFERS AND REASSIGNMENTS

Assignments, Transfers and Reassignments shall be consistent with the Personnel Rules and Regulations as passed by Public Law 30-43. To the extent the Port maintains discretion over Employee assignments, Port Employees (classified, unclassified, or contract Employees) not covered by this Agreement shall not perform any work or operation normally performed by an Employee covered by this Agreement except in temporary cases of emergency. The Port shall not permit Employees covered by this Agreement to work outside their position except as required under P.L. 30-43. The Port may require Employees to perform functions relating to their scope of work and in support of their work role as long as the Employee is qualified to perform such work or it is part of a training program. The Port and Union agree that the Port may only assign Employees to perform support services when such assignment is in furtherance of the Employee's assigned duties and such assignment may only be for positions covered by this Agreement.

#### 2.1. SHIFT WORKERS

Shift workers will work a minimum of eight (8) hours a day, five (5) days a week. The Port will provide shift workers with schedules for two (2) week periods, and will do so two (2) weeks ahead of the start of that schedule. The Port will set shift workers' regular schedules to reflect workdays/nights of Monday through Friday.

The Port may require shift workers to work overtime on days/nights the shift workers are scheduled to work, for a maximum of fourteen (14) hours of work per day. The Port may require shift workers to work overtime hours on weekends and holidays and will utilize a rotation system so that all shift workers are provided an equal apportunity to volunteer to work the overtime hours. If the Port is unable to secure sufficient number of workers to satisfy the Port's work requirements on a weekend or holiday voluntarily, the Port may require employees to report to work.

#### APTICLE III - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

#### 3.A. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

The Port shall provide all Employees covered by it is Agreement with any recessary personal protective equipment required by applicable local and federal patery rules and regulations. All such equipment shall remain Port property.

#### 3.B. POSTING OF AGREEMENT

Occides of this Agreement shall be posted on both the Port and the Union web sites and on the Union bulletin boards within the Port.

#### A.C. EFFECTIVE DATES OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall become effective upon the signing of all parties and shall remain in effect until midnight five (5) years from the date of the Board Chairperson's signature below. The parties through mutual agreement may reopen all or any part of this Agreement for renegotiation. This Agreement shall be renewed automatically for an additional five (5) years unless one of the parties shall have notified the other, in writing, of intent to allow the Agreement to expire at the end of its first five (5) year term one hundred twenty (120) days or earlier prior to the expiration of the current Agreement.

#### 3.D. SEVERABILITY

If any of the provisions of this Agreement or the application of such provisions snall be found to be contrary to law, the validity of the remainder of the provisions or the validity of the application of such provisions shall not be affected thereby.

In regards to port operations personnel scheduling, currently port operations employees have a posted 10-hour workday schedule which is illegal and inappropriate and in direct violation of Public Law 30-43 (Port's Personnel Rules and Regulations) and Port Policy Memorandum No. 04-88. Current methods of scheduling are 10 hours a day and clearly being posted to evade overtime requirements and policies.

In the Port's Personnel Rules and Regulations defined on page 179 line 86, "Workday: a regularly reoccurring period of eight consecutive hours exclusive of a lunch hour". This defined workday is for all port employees, port-wide, and does not differentiate between administrative personnel or operations personnel. Currently with the operations 10 hour workday it looks as if operations personnel is being discriminated against.

Port's Rules and Regulations General Provisions Chapter 8.000 (page 77): 8.001 Work Week

A. "The basic work week is (40) forty hours. Alternatively, a work week is a regular recurring period of 168 consecutive hours – seven (7) consecutive 24-hour periods. The workweek need not coincide with the calendar week. It may Begin any day of the week and any hour of the day, but it must in each case, <u>BE ESTABLISHED IN ADVANCE. THE WORKWEEK MAY BE CHANGED, BUT ONLY IF THE CHANGE IS ENTENDED TO BE PERMANENT AND IS NOT MADE TO EVADE OVERTIME REQUIREMENTS OR POLICIES."</u>

(Page 78) 8.004 Work Week Schedule

- A. "The schedule of workweek for shift workers shall be prepared and prominently posted at least two (2) weeks in advanced so that the employees affected will be informed. Such schedules shall not be less than two (2) weeks and shall not be changed except for good cause and provide affected employees are given at least 24 hours prior notice. Whenever possible, work schedules should permit an employee to enjoy a holiday on the day it is observed.
- B. The General Manager may permit flexible work schedules as may be appropriate."

The only time flexible schedules are appropriate is during acts of natural disaster or imminent threat to the Port. Outside of these two items, flexible scheduling would be considered inappropriate.

In reference to Policy Memorandum No. 04-88 (page1)

"1. <u>PURPOSE</u>: To provide standard procedures and guidelines for utilization by payroll and timekeeping personnel to properly record, compute and/or process payments to employees for their worktime and premium pays.

II. SCOPE: The provisions of these guidelines shall be utilized by those employees who are responsible for timekeeping or payroll functions."

Currently this would reflect that the Operations Manager is not following Public Law 30-43 Port's Personnel Rules and Regulations; this also would reflect that the Port's Payroll Administrator is not following current Port Policy 04-88 in regards to employees scheduling, overtime, compensation, and premium pays as outlined in this policy.

# Policy Memorandum No. 04-88 (page 11) "XIII. DEFINITIONS OF WORKWEEK AND WORKDAY Chap. 8 applies to certain emp., not all.

B. Shift Workweek: Shift workers have a defined administrative workweek, depending on scheduled shifts. The workday is either 0700 to 1500, 1500 to 2300, or 2300 to 0700 hours.

C. Operations Workweek: The workweek of personnel directly involved in the loading and unloading of cargoes is normally dependent upon vessel arrivals/departures. The workday of employees under this category normally consists of twelve (12) hour shift during vessel operations.

Normally, shift hours are from 0700 to 1900 hours, or 1900 to 0700 hours. *In the event there are* no vessels in port, the employee's workday shall consist of eight (8) hours, normally 0800-1700 hours in order to complete the scheduled forty (40) hour workweek."

(Page 13) In reference to overtime

#### "XV. OVERTIME

<u>Definition of Overtime Work:</u> Authorized and approved hours of work performed in excess of eight (8) hours in a day or in excess of forty (40) hours in a workweek to which employees are entitled for payment."

(Page 14) Procedures and Guidelines for Payroll and Timekeeping and Personnel

- C. "Posting of Overtime Hours: The posting of overtime work for employees shall be administered in the following manner:
  - Work in excess of eight (8) hours in a workday shall be posted at overtime rate.

Example: Monday 0700 - 1900

Total:

3 hours overtime"

8 hours straight time

In light of all the guidelines put forth by Public Law 30-43 Port Authority's Personnel Rules and Regulations and Port Memorandum No. 04-88, it clearly reflects that Port's Management is currently providing Operations Personnel scheduling that is evidently being made to evade Overtime Policies. Currently our scheduling is supposed to reflect eight (8) hours a day. Any hours worked beyond the scheduled eight (8) hour day shall translate to overtime for the employees' scheduled forty (40) workweek.

In regards to funding availability for employees' overtime compensation, we would like to point out that the shipping carriers are being billed at the rate of national average for all employees directly involved in the loading and unloading of cargo. Straight time rates, overtime rates, holiday differential, and nighttime differentials are all being billed to the shipping carriers. See attachment Section VI – LABOR, EQUIPMENT & OTHER CHARGES TARIFF Item #80 (Page 51) of the Port's Tariff.

This would also reflect that the shipping carriers are indeed currently being billed directly for the employees' overtime compensation; and the employees that are directly involved in the loading and unloading of these vessels are not receiving that compensation as a direct result of the ten hour day straight time scheduling.

See attachment (page 55) Item 86 EQUIPMENT UTILIZATION CHARGES. This shows that the shipping carriers are also being charged for the utilization of all cargo handling equipment being used in the movement of its cargo in addition to fuel surcharge.

When the employees asked the Operations Manager why the scheduling was changed from eight (8) hours a day to ten (10) hours a day, they were told that the board instructed him to cut back on overtime expenditures so that they can divert the funding up into the administration. The Operations Manager at this point should have informed the board of its rules and regulations and its current policies that he is mandated by law to follow.

See Chapter 3 (page 7) of Port's Rules and Regulations 3.000 ETHICAL CONDUCT AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF EMPLOYEES

A "Public Service is a public trust. Employees are expected to be loyal to the U.S. Constitution, the Organic Act of Guam, and to perform their duties and responsibilities ethically and in accordance with laws."

We would also like for you to recognize that currently Port Operations employees have a Union Contract in place that has been signed off by the Acting General Manager, Anisia B. Terlaje; Port Board of Directors Chairperson, Daniel J. Tydingco; President for the Guam Federation of Teachers, Timothy R. Fedenko; and currently awaiting the governor's signature. (See attached as agreed upon in Union Contract on page 5.2.J. SHIFT WORKERS) "Shift workers will work a minimum of eight (8) hours a day, five (5) days a week. The Port will provide shift workers with schedules for two (2) week periods, and will do so two (2) weeks ahead of the start of that schedule. The Port will set shift workers' regular schedules to reflect workdays/nights of Monday through Friday." This language is consistent with

Port's Rules and Regulations and also in compliance with Port Policy Memorandum No. 04-88. Also see attached, Grievance being filed by Port employees in regards to scheduling and overtime compensation.

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Response to Proposed Adverse Action against David G. Teixeira for official documentation received on April 23, 2013 at 20:36.

This is my official statement that is submitted in addition to my testimony anticipated in the called meeting from Joann Brown on April 29, 2013 at 14:15 at the Port General Managers Office.

In regards to the following alleged charges, I stated a response as follows:

- 1. (B) REFUSAL OR FAILURE TO PERFOM PRESCRIBED DUTES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.
  - a. I was acting on what I was instructed to do as informed and directed by my immediate supervisor/person-in-charge, Peter Tenorio. At this point, if I failed to follow the instruction it would be considered as insubordination and grounds for my immediate termination as indicated in the Ports Rules and Regulations under Chapter 11 Adverse Action, section 11.402 under conduct B. First offence, Minimum: Reprimand, Maximum: Dismissal.
- 2. (D) FALESIFICATION OF RECORDS, SUCH AS, BUT NOT LIMITED TO REPORTS, TIME RECORDS, INFORMATION SYSTEMT RECORDS, LEAVE RECORDS, EMPLOYMENT APPLICATION OR OTHER OFFICIAL AUTHORIY DOCUMENTS.
  - a. I was instructed by my immediate supervisor/person-in-charge, Peter Tenorio to time in and out on the time sheet as 19:00 time in; 24:00 to 01:00 lunch; 06:00 time out. At that point I was following orders as I am prescribed to do.
- 3. (H) UNAUTHORIZED ABSENCE
  - a. I was then instructed to secure by my immediate supervisor/person-in-charge, Peter Tenorio.

In support of my decision on the date in question, I am presenting the following verbiage to support my action from the **Port Authority of Guam Policy Memorandum No. 04-88, pg. 6 Item VII. CERTIFICATION OF TIMECARD, Section A, B, and C.** It is not my position as a subordinate to question the legal validity of my immediate supervisor/person-in-charge, Peter Tenorio actions. Whether he is aware of Port Policy No. 04-88 and the Rules and Regulation established, I shall not be held under gross negligence for his or managements neglect or ignorance. Failure to communicate or act on these established policies is well beyond my pay grade to question his authority.

Furthermore, the posted 10 hours scheduling for my division are illegal in ref to Port Authority of Guam Policy Memorandum No. 04-88, pg. 11 Item XIII. DEFINITION OF WORKWEEK CATEGORIES. Section C, Par 2 Normally, shift hours are from 0700 to 1900 hours, or 1900 to 0700 hours. In the event there are NO VESSELS IN PORT, the employee's workday shall consist of eight (8) hours, normally 0800 to 1700 hours in order to complete the schedule forty (40) hour workweek. This section will also point out that us being scheduled for 10 hour is in violation continuously. Continuing, Referring to Pg. 14 of the memorandum presented shows an example of how Port operations employees are to be compensated under Section D Example: 0700 to 1900 Total 8 hours straight time, 3 hours overtime. As a result of our current scheduling, scheduling would reflect that they are intentionally being made to evade the Port overtime policy therefore violating Payroll Policy. I would like to add that a WORKDAY as defined in

the Port Rules and Regulation, Pg. 179 also reflects a **regular recurring period of eight consecutive hours exclusive of lunch hour.** Recognizing that this defined workday is Port Wide and doesn't differentiate between the different departments at the Port.

Also, everything the Port employees are entitled to receive by law is not being provided by management.

- 1. Appropriate scheduling.
- 2. PPE and safety Equipment
- 3. Overtime compensation
- 4. Percentile increments in the Alan Serial Compensation Plan.

Finally, I am pointing out that our supervisors, superintendent and operations manager do not seem to follow or practice laws and policies/Rules and Regulation at the Port of Guam. All evidence will show they are continuously violating our rights of employees and also the very laws that they upheld to follow.

The result of Management actions to this unfortunate misunderstanding has created a CLIMATE OF FEAR amongst operation employees, bottom line is "Listen to your boss, You will get punished or Fired because they don't know what they are doing".

This is to officially inform you that a proposed adverse action is being taken against you which may result in disciplinary action in accordance with the Port Authority of Guam Adverse Action Rules and Regulations. This is only an alleged and not a matter already decided.

This action is taken in accordance with Chapter 11, Rule 11.303, governing Authorized Causes for Adverse Action, of the Personnel Rules and Regulations as shown below:

1. On April 23, 2013, you were issued an official proposed adverse action for violating the Authority's Personnel Rules Regulations, Chapter 11, Adverse Action Procedures, Rule 11.303, governing Authorized Causes for Adverse Action, specifically (B) Refusal or Failure to Perform Prescribed Duties and Responsibilities, (D) Falsification of records, such as, but not limited to reports, time records, information system records, leave records, employment applications or other official authority documents and (H) Unauthorized Absence. In that notice you were advised that future violations of established rules, regulations and policies would result in a more severe disciplinary action taken against you.

Despite this, you again violated established rules as indicated below:

- (B) REFUSAL OR FAILURE TO PERFORM PRESCRIBED DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

Crane Operator Leader, and asked to see the timesheet that Mr. Tenorio was holding. After seeing the timesheet you began to yell and complain to Mr. Tenorio that you should get paid overtime, because the crew that is assigned to Gantry 17 was not even on the premises. Mr. Tenorio tried to calm you down, but you became more violent and started to call Mr. Tenorio to fight. You also started to punch and kick the lockers that were in the office. Mr. Tenorio filed a Workplace Violence report with the Human Resources office.

As an employee of this organization, it is your responsibility to ensure that you display respect and professionalism toward your superiors. Your conduct in this matter is unbecoming of an employee and this type of behavior will not be tolerated by this office. With regard to the foregoing, I am therefore serving you this notice of proposed adverse action for suspension, demotion or dismissal.

In accordance, with the Port Authority of Guam Personnel Rules and Regulations, Chapter 11, Rule 11.307, Employee's Answer, you are entitled to seek reconsideration of the proposed adverse action by answering the charges within 10 calendar days after receipt of the notice. The answer may be made orally or in writing or both. During this notice period, you will be retained on pay status.

My designated representative or I shall be available during the notice period to meet with you at the designated date and time requested by you. I may also designate a committee to hear your answer. I will consider your answer to the charges in the proposed adverse action notice. If you fail to answer during the notice period, your inaction shall construe as an answer and this office may proceed with the adverse action upon expiration of the notice period.

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



- 8. Whenever an "unsatisfactory" or "marginal" rating is given on any of the performance factors, the rater must state in Section IV just what action is planned to correct the situation.
- 9. Whenever an "outstanding" rating is given on any of the performance factors, the rater must state his/her justification for this rating in the respective comment section.
- 10. After completing the rating on the individual performance factors, the supervisor assigns one of three overall ratings to the employee i.e., unsatisfactory, satisfactory or outstanding by checking the appropriate block.
- 11. Employee signs and dates form only after the evaluation, comments, recommendations and rating have been explained and discussed by the rater/reviewer. The employee's signature does not denote concurrence with the rating. It merely signifies that the contents of the completed form were discussed with the employee. If the employee refuses to sign the form, the rater should note on the form that employee refused to sign and then sign the notation.
- 12. Upon completion of the report, forward on or before the due date to the Personnel Services Office.



My name is Bernadette Sterne Meno and I appear before you this evening to testify against to reconfirmation of Mr. Eduardo llao to the Port Authority of Guam Board of Directors. In an effort to provide full disclosure I do want to state for the record that I am an employee of Senator Rory Respicio but my testimony tonight is my own personal testimony.

I originally had planned on bringing my husband and children with me tonight so Mr. Ilao could see the faces of the people whose lives he has destroyed. My boys all picked out their clothes to wear tonight to sit by me as I testify. But just a few hours ago I changed my mind and I told my husband that the kids have already been through enough because of the actions of Mr. Ilao and his fellow board members so I asked that they all stay at home.

Senators I am sure you will hear a lot of testimony tonight from very important and powerful people about Mr. Ilao. I am sure they will talk about what a nice man he is, what a great volunteer he is, what a brilliant and successful business man he is and I am sure they are all correct. I am sure he is all of those things and more. Obviously he is a clever businessman because his packet will show just how many businesses he owns and we know how successful his companies are because they are making millions of dollars off of government contracts.

But Mr. Ilao is not here tonight to be reviewed on those matters. You heard this same testimony during his first confirmation hearing. This time around the focus should be on his record as a board member and what he has and has not done while serving in his capacity as a member of the board of directors. I am here tonight to speak to his actions or inactions if you will.

Senators, as most of you know I am one of many port employees illegally and wrongfully terminated in what is one of the biggest and most explosive political witch hunts in the history of our government. I was the main target as has been stated and all others - all of those innocent people - were what Adelup considered collateral damage. All of this was done with the direction and approval of Mr. Ed llao and his fellow board members.

But before I get into that matter, I want to discus Mr. Ilao's record on other matters. Mr. Ed llao has allowed significant illegal matters and criminal acts to go unpunished and unaddressed at the Port. Specifically, it was brought to the Board and legal counsel's attention at a recent board meeting that the port had been paying monthly invoices - 10 months to be exact - to a company that has no legal contract with the Port. Knowing all of this, Mr. Ilao stayed silent.

Then there is the issue of the controversial legal services contract which has exceeded its cap and the fraudulent overbillings admitted to publicly by the board's legal counsel. As

the owner of many companies with significant government of Guam contracts, Mr. Ilao should know that a Stop Work Order is the best way to ensure that no further harm comes to the Port or the people of Guam by this law firm. Again - silence.

Maybe he will tell you he is shy. In his 2008 confirmation hearing before the legislature he was asked by Speaker Judy Won Pat what his biggest weakness is. He said it is that he is shy and not being assertive enough to get his point across. Well I've thought long and hard about that but I find it hard to believe that a successful business man who can wheel and deal to get those government bids to make millions for himself and would agree to sit on all these boards such as GPA, GCC and the Port could consider himself shy. Maybe he just chooses to be silent to avoid making angry the political powers that would upset any business deals he has with the government. That's not being shy, that is being self serving.

Sadly one thing Mr. Ilao chose to speak up about was his twisted and clearly politically-motivated views of the character and integrity of the Port's former General Manager Mary Torres. Mr. Ilao was aware of the immense political pressure being placed on Mrs. Torres to fire me and others as a part of this pathetic and cowardly political witch hunt, yet he did nothing to stop it and to give Mrs. Torres the protection and support she so rightly deserved from her board. Instead, after Mrs. Torres refused to give in to the pressure and chose to stand up for her integrity and character, Mr. Ilao personally took part in the attacks on her character and her work ethic. When Mary Torres refused to fire me and others and pleaded with the board to reject the legal counsel report which she informed them was filled with false statements, inaccuracies and poorly researched legal opinions, Mr. Ilao chose to fire Mrs. Torres. It was Mr. Ilao who, according to executive session transcripts, helped conspire to come up with a reason to publicly explain why they were firing her because the truth would have been just be too shocking for the public.

Mr. Ilao said those things and then stayed silent when the chairman and the board's legal counsel continued to attack Mary Torres for having the integrity that they so sorely lacked the integrity to stand up for what was right, fair and just. Mr. Ilao said those things about a woman well respected in this community who is known for her candor, hard work, strength and integrity. How sad Mr. Ilao that you chose to destroy the reputation of a woman and her family that you have known for years and to do this despite, I am sure, believing in your heart that Mary Torres is NOT corrupt and NOT a criminal as you and your fellow board members have portrayed her to be.

Mr. Ilao, Mary Camacho Torres and her family are not the only people whose lives you have destroyed and whose character you have defamed publicly all in order to protect and aid and abet in this deceitful and criminal attack against innocent people.

Vivian Castro Leon. Jose Guevara, Francine Rocio, Frances Arriola Cepeda, Josette Javellana Javelosa, Leonora Leon Guerrero. These are just some of the names of the individual's whose lives you have destroyed. You attended illegal board meetings to discuss how to bring us down and you know that the Chairman recommended you all bring a "grave digger" to those illegal meetings. You broke numerous Open Government laws, agreed to

turn off recordings of some executive session meetings all in order to further this political witch hunt. Let me remind you Mr. Ilao of the jokes and laughter you and your board members shared in that day when ordering us to be fired one week before Christmas. In those secret Executive session transcripts, which I'm sure you never dreamed would eventually become public, you all laughed at what you were doing to us and our families --- through the laughter you all kept saying "Merry Christmas!" "Merry Christmas!" to the employees who you had just ordered to be fired and their lives destroyed. Merry Christmas indeed Mr. Ilao.

Mr. Ilao you were made aware, along with other board members, your new General Manager and your legal counsel that you illegally released the private medical records of my 2-year-old son. Despite having these warnings, you approved the release of his medical records for a total of 29 times in violations of numerous federal and local laws. For what reason Mr. Ilao? My son was born 7 months prior to my accident at the Port. He has nothing to do with this matter nor does his medical condition. You and your fellow board members via your incompetent legal counsel were so desperate to paint me as a liar that you released his medical records to prove, in your mind that I am a liar because and I will quote directly from your report prepared and approved by you where you legal counsel relays the conversation I had with the Port's doctor about my previous medical conditions. It mentions that I told the doctor about my previous medical issues and that I told him that I had in addition quote "three cesarean section and an appendectomy. There is no mention of her giving birth on February 21, 2011." End Quote. As such, in order for you Mr. llao and your Port lawyers to prove to everyone that I am a liar you released my son's medical records as an Exhibit in this report to back up this statement that I lied and withheld information about having a baby. Three cesarean sections Mr. Ilao. I told the doctor I had three c-sections. Are you and your Port lawyers so inept that you are not aware that having a cesarean section is in fact a form of birth? And what does his birth and medical condition have to do with anything that happened seven months later when I fell at the Port? Have you no decency at all Mr. Ilao? Are you so blinded by your eagerness to do the political dirty work of this administration to protect your personal government contracts that keep you so wealthy that you will illegally invade the privacy of a child? Have you no limits at all? No imaginary like that you won't cross? Is everyone including my innocent child fair game to you? Do I sound angry? Well you bet I am. How would you feel Mr. Ilao if someone did that to one of your children? How about you Senators? Is this the type of actions and public service you had in mind when you confirmed him to this board? Unfortunately my 2-yearold son is not the only one who has suffered through this ordeal. My husband and my other children have watched me suffer physically from my injury and emotionally from the devastation you have brought upon our family.

Mr. Ilao, I'm note quite sure what you thought would be expected of you as a board member. I'm not quite sure what went wrong with you in this process but clearly and sadly, somewhere along the way, you lost your humanity and your moral compass.

Serving as a public official whether as an employee, a board member or an elected leader comes with a great deal of responsibility. You must have the courage to do the right thing at

all times, the wisdom to know how to do it and the integrity to stand up and speak out when you know that something is wrong. Sadly you have not displayed these characteristics during your tenure as a member of the Port Authority of Guam Board of Directors. Dear Senator Ada:

I respectfully submit this testimony in connection with the Legislative confirmation of Eduardo R. Ilao to the Port Authority of Guam Board of Directors. For the record, my name is Mary C. Torres and I submit this in my personal capacity as a citizen of Guam and as the former General Manager of the Port from February to December 2012.

Since the early 1990's, Ed Ilao has been a person well known to me and my family. I considered him a successful businessman, a supportive family man, and a good natured individual with a ready chuckle. He was a client of the law firm I previously worked for and I had many occasions to interact with him in a professional capacity. My husband also coached his children in sports for many years and I witnessed the care and attention he invested in his children and family. We were by many accounts, friends, and I was confident that we would work effectively together when I was hired at the Port Authority in February 2012 as the General Manager, and while he served as a member of the Board of Directors.

Based on past experience. Ed llao has extensive knowledge of good business practices and of government board policy. Yet while a member of the Port's Boards, I observed that he was rather aloof and did not exhibit those same qualities that I know he possesses. Instead, he was a complicit participant who permitted the Port's Board to blatantly disregard the legislative policy that the formation of public policy should be transparent and not conducted in secret. There were at least four meetings held by the Port's Board that were clearly in violation of the open government law that he participated in. Ed did not raise objections to these meetings which he should have known were improper and contrary to law. Moreover, he allowed a tape recorder to be turned off for a portion of the December 5, 2012 executive session board meeting, as evidenced in the minutes of that meeting.

What is most disconcerting to me is his inaction and poor judgment in dealing with obvious problems with the Port's legal counsel. I had raised concerns about the poor quality of work

product, the slow delivery of services, the untimely billing practices, and the suspicious invoices that were submitted. I specifically reached out to Ed, trusting that he was a long- time friend and would hear me out, expressing my frustration with legal counsel and the need for the Port to engage a commercial attorney who could work on outstanding matters that required the expertise of a commercial attorney. He acknowledged the legal firms shortcomings, joking at one time that he found no logic in Phillip's long winded recitations (and poor legal reasoning), but did nothing to address the issue. In fact, he remained silent when the other board members were dismissive of me every time I raised concern about Phillip's performance.

In reviewing the transcripts of the December 19, 2012 executive session board minutes, Ed expressed that he has lost confidence in me as a manager. At that meeting, I delivered my defense to the allegations by Phillips that I committed six misdemeanors and three felonies. My defense was based on thorough legal research, and adequately supported my request to the Board to delete all references to me in Phillip's erroneous report. Ed simply dismissed and mocked me. You can't imagine how it feels to be disrespected and thrown out of a position in such a callous and unfair manner. The hurt is magnified when it is inflicted by a person who knows my upstanding character well and has a long standing history with me, my husband and my brothers. We previously supported Ed and his family and we did a lot together throughout the years.

Ed, along with other board members, has caused great pain and hardship on the Port family. Perhaps it's true that Ed lost confidence in me as a manager, but that pales compared to the loss in confidence I have of him as a professional and as a thoughtful human being.

I hope, dear Senator that you will ask Ed Ilao what his understanding and views are of the open government law and whether he participated in any illegally convened meetings. Please question him about what he intends to do about the bloated legal billings which are not in accordance with the contract. Please also ask him about his thoughts in amending the legal services contract, contrary to Guam procurement law and the plain unambiguous language of the contract. Further ask him why he sanctions the libelous and slanderous actions of the board and legal counsel towards me. It is in fact a disappointment that someone like Ed Ilao, who should know better, has failed to speak up as a board member, and stand up for what is right.

Ed endorsed the ruin of good people's lives. He sits idly by and does nothing to stop the Port from being steered in a perilous direction because of political retribution, a faulty investigation and poorly reasoned legal conclusions. A true leader and compassionate human being would know when and how to act, particularly when it affects the livelihoods of career employees and the well-being of the agency. I do not support the re-nomination of Ed Ilao and I call into question his integrity and ability to effectively serve as a member of the Board of Directors of the Port Authority of Guam.





Presumably, the complaints were filed with your office on or about the same date. As Chairman of the Legislative Committee with oversight on Mr. llao's appointment, it is my duty to ascertain the disposition of these complaints.

I would greatly appreciate if your office can confirm if these, or any other complaints against Mr. llao, were formally filed with your office; and, if so, the status or resolution of such complaints. Additionally, I would be grateful if you could confirm that Saipan law explicitly prohibits the "rubber-stamping" of plans, similar to the following provisions in Guam law:

...the registrant's licensee seal and signature shall constitute certification that the work thereon was done by him or under his responsible control. §32116(d)(4), Ch. 32, Title 22, GCA

The seal and signature and date shall be used by registrants only when the work being stamped was under the registrant's complete direction and responsible control, provided, that if the work was performed at an office outside of the locale in which the registrant permanently resides, then the seal may be used only if the registrant supervised the work on a full-time basis. §32116(d)(5), Ch. 32, Title 22, GCA

The Board shall have the power, duty, and responsibility [to punish]... any individual and/or business firm who is found guilty of... signing, affixing or permitting his seals to be affixed to any specifications, reports, drawings, plans, plats, design information, construction documents or calculations, surveys, or revisions thereof, which have not been prepared by the licensee or under the licensee's responsible control. §32120(b)(11), Ch. 32, Title 22, GCA





Dear Senator Ada:

This letter is in response to your letter to the CNMI Board of Professional Licensing dated August 26, 2013. Commonwealth law expressly provides that the Board's investigation files are confidential and cannot be disclosed to the public. See 4 CMC § 8216(i). Thus, the Board cannot provide you with information regarding complaints made to the Board.

In regards to your inquiry about "rubber-stamping," please see the following excerpts pertaining to the use of seals in the Board's regulations for engineers, architects, land surveyors and landscape architects, codified at NMIAC § 125-20.1-001 et seq.

Part IX, Section 9.2, codified at NMIAC § 125-20.1-705, states:

- C. Whenever the seal is applied, the licensee's original signature and date of the signature shall be written adjacent to or across the seal. A facsimile signature or electronically digitized signature will not be acceptable.
- D. The seal shall be signed and dated by the licensee in such a manner that the seal, signature and date will be legible when reproduced.
- E. Authorized use of the prescribed seal is an individual act; therefore, the licensee shall personally inscribe the seal. The licensee is responsible for its security at all times. The licensee shall permit no other person or entity to use the prescribed seal.

Part IX, Section 9.3, codified at NMIAC § 125-20.1-710, states:

- C. The seal or stamp shall be prima facile evidence that the work was prepared by or under the direct supervision or control of the licensee named on the seal and the licensee accepts full responsibility and liability for the professional work represented.
- D. Licensees shall approve and seal only those design documents and surveys which are safe for public health, property and welfare in conformity with accepted engineering, architectural and land surveying standards.
- E. It shall be unlawful for anyone to seal or stamp any document with such seal or stamp after the license has expired or has been revoked or suspended unless such license has been renewed or reinstated.

Furthermore, the Board has the authority to take disciplinary action for "signing, affixing or permitting the licensee's seal or signature, or permitting the licensee's seal or signature to be affixed to any specifications, reports, drawings, plans, design information, construction documents, or calculations, or revisions thereof, which have not been prepared by the licensee or under the licensee's responsibility or his or her direct personal supervision." NMIAC § 125-20.1-1001(4).

Dear Senator Ada:

Although the period to submit testimony in connection with the nomination of Ed Ilao to the Port Board of Directors has passed and a confirmation hearing was conducted by the legislative committee on August 8, 2013 on the matter, I am not aware that the matter has been reported out of committee or entertained by the entire legislative body at any subsequent session. Because this matter may still be under consideration by your committee, I respectfully submit additional information to substantiate concerns raised in my testimony that were refuted by Ed Ilao.

With regard to violations of the Open Government Act,

Senator McCredie asked Ilao: "On the third paragraph, it said you violated the Open Government Act, or the Board violated the Open Government Act on 4 occasions. Are you aware of that? And in your mind you are aware of that and it happened did you consider it improper?"

*Ilao's response was*: "Senator, I deny any and all, any wrongdoings in regards to any and all allegations that were brought forward here before this committee by Mrs. Torres and Ms. Meno."

For your information, the four specific meetings I referenced were convened as follows and I am aware there are e-mails between the board members about these meetings:

(1) April 4, 2012 at 12 noon at Ruby Tuesdays. The topic of discussion was USDA financing;

- (2) June 22, 2012 at 8 a.m. at Shirleys Coffee Shop in Agana, The topic of discussion was the PUC/Crane Purchase;
- (3) July 23, 2012 from 10 a.m.-12:30 p.m. at Phillips and Bordallo Law Offices. That meeting was held to discuss the YTK matter; and
- (4) October 19, 2012 at 11:00a.m. at the Phillips and Bordallo Law Offices. The Workers Compensation claim of B. Meno was discussed at that meeting.

As you may recall, I testified that in further violation of the Open Government Act Ed allowed a tape recorder to be turned off for a portion of the December 5, 2012 executive session board meeting, as evidenced in the minutes of that meeting. During the August 8, 2013 confirmation hearing,

Senator McCredi asked Ilao: "My next questions would be on December 5 testimony where the tape recorder was turned off, or a portion of the tape recorder was turned off and she said that the executive session Board meeting as evidenced in the minutes. Can you expand on that?"

Ilao's Response: "We probably decided to take a recess or go to the restroom or have some coffee, I am not sure. You know, I mean a lot of times in our Board meetings we take at least 2 hours and we go into executive session, we take, we just need to take a recess. And of course when you take a recess, you turn off the recording."

It is disingenuous of Ilao to make such comment when the minutes of the executive committee meeting of December 5, 2012 (that was approved by the board) records this occurrence as I've presented to your committee. A portion of those minutes are copied below for your convenience:

Regular Board Meeting -November 28, 2012

Reconvened December 3 & 5, 2012. Page 58 of 64.

Transcript -- Personnel Matters re Workers Compensation Claim: Report/Exhibits; Civil Service Commission.

Ms. Gibson: ... want this one off. - [Whispered]

Mrs. Baleto: What are you doing?!

At this time and for unknown reasons, the recording was stopped during discussions with Mr. Pangelinan.

At this time, the Deputy General Manager Anisia B. Terlaje was present in executive session.

A read of the transcript will show that the board was not recessed when the tape recorder was turned off and there is no official record of the discussion with Mr. Pangelinan, the Harbor Master, or the discussion that led up to Anisia Terlaje being summoned by the Board to sit in the December 5, 2012 reconvened executive session.

Another point made by Ilao on August 8, 2013 regarding employee adverse action that is contradictory to action taken by him at the December 5, 2012 board meeting, is as follows:

*Ilao:* "We don't necessarily direct employees and we don't fire employees—it was the GM's prerogative to do that. We don't—we are not even consulted when that happened.

McCredie: "But you would be able to make recommendations, correct?"

Ilao: We were just as surprised when we found out about the layoffs."

The December 5, 2012 executive session transcripts contain lengthy discussion about taking adverse action against employees. See one of these comments below:

Regular Board Meeting -November 28, 2012

Reconvened December 3 & 5, 2012.

Page 52 of 64.

Transcript - Personnel Matters re Workers Compensation Claim: Report/Exhibits; Civil Service Commission.

Chairman: "That the only route we have at this point unless somebody can find a different route. We have to get, if we want to proceed with this then we have to get at GM in place that's not going to challenge the findings of facts, not going to do the issuance of it that's conflicted on it. We're going to have to get a GM in place in an acting capacity and say – this is what the, these notices of proposed adverse action has to go out today and you're from the start to finish on this."

The discussion with Felix Pangelinan was not captured and transcribed as the tape recorder was turned off during that time, however, the direction of the board was made clear to Anisia Terlaje, who was summoned to the meeting after Felix Pangelinan. See record below:

At this time, the Deputy General Manager Anisia B. Terlaje was present in Executive Session.

VC: We basically had through their investigation and came up with adverse action going to be done on a number of employees. Today is the last day of that timeframe to do the adverse action. Mary is, now you should understand that you and Mary are both listed in this report that you're signing off okay. However, Mary contested to a great degree, but that means that we still need a General Manager to issue the notice of adverse action. So that means if Mary's, upon Mary's leaving, then we can appoint you as General Manager and then you're going to sign off can sign off on the notices of proposed adverse action and bring them in. You willing to do that?

DGM: Yea.

VC: Well, that's what's going to have to happen then, you're going to have to, we'll have a meeting after this. The proposed adverse action it's all geared up ready to go. You're going to have to serve today and then that's when the clock starts ticking with regards to [DGM: For the response.], for the response. Now because you're in it if there may be, we may have to have you designate somebody else to do the, just the hearing of it right. Just to ensure nothing gets muddled up. Right, as General Manager she can do that?

This personnel matter was well orchestrated by the board and the minutes of the November 28, 2012 meeting (reconvened on December 3rd and 5th, 2012) shows that the board did not afford the General Manager the prerogative of whether to take adverse action. It was clear from the minutes of the meetings that the board directed the adverse actions and for Ilao to suggest that the board was "not even consulted" is untrue.

Please consider this as an addendum to the testimony previously submitted to your committee. I have no interest other than to set the record straight and to substantiate my original testimony by referencing those matters of fact contained in public documents. Thank you for your attention.


