- Appointed by Eddie Baza Calvo, Governor, on January 09, 2013;
- Appointment packet forwarded to *I Liheslatura* on January 09, 2013;
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on January 10, 2013.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 3:01 pm.

Lorraine Okada

Senator Michael Limtiaco

Provided oral and written testimony (See Attached)

Ms. Okada is currently President of Okada Management Consulting Services and supports Ms. Iriarte's appointment to the GSWA Board of Direcotrs. She worked with Ms. Iriarte for 12 years with the law firm of Carlsmith Ball at the Guam office. Says the Law Firm saw value of Elyze and entrusted her with the title of administrative partner.



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Andrew Gayle

Provided oral testimony

Mr. Gayle is currently a member of the Guam Solid Waste Authority Board of Directors and supports Ms. Iriarte's appointment. She states there are currently four (4) members on the board and Elyze would be the 5th member to constitute the final member. Says GSWA is in a very interesting position compared to other government boards. The Board and GSWA are in a limbo state because partially in a receivership, which means the Board directing the GSWA today is a federal court. GSWA board has the duty, as written by the Legislature, to the people of Guam and government of Guam to re-establish government control of GSWA. States GSWA board has to work in this transition phase, establish its own policy and procedures pursuant to public laws that guide the GSWA and form a foundation that will serve the Authority and the island for many years to come.

He states Elyze will be instrumental in helping the board members craft this foundation in conjunction with what the district court is mandating during the transition, and it's going to be a rigorous transfer from receivership. GBB the receiver are the management group. So it's that transition that is going to be critical. The Authority will need to have rules and procedures in place for management to take over when the receivership ends. States her legal background, work ethic, and demeanor will contribute immensely to the task at hand.

Atty. Fred Horecky

Provided oral testimony

Mr. Horecky is here not in the capacity as PUC attorney, but as a private attorney in support of the appointment of Ms. Iriarte. States his knowledge of Ms. Iriarte does stem from a PUC matter where he served as administrative judge. It was a telecommunications matter involving Metro Ethernet Services for the Government of Guam. Miss Iriarte represented one of the parties. Thought she did an excellent job in representing her client and also explained some of the intricacies, issues involving intra-state and interstate commerce. Mr. Horecky was not familiar with Ms. Iriarte's legal performance until that proceeding but was quite impressed with the way she represented her client who eventually prevailed. Mr. Horecky states that she would be a very good choice to be a Board Member of the GSWA. Further states having a person on the authority with her legal background and discerning judgment is really going to be very important. States she would be the person to make hard decision involving legal considerations that will be necessary for that authority.

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Elvze McDonald Iriarte:

Provided oral and written testimony (See Attached):

Thanks the committee for convening the hearing. Practices locally for Carlsmith Ball. Civil Litigation specialty with an emphasis in employment and maritime law. Also practices in Palau, CNMI and FSM. Also non-profit involvement in American Cancer Society and other non-profit entities. Devotes her skills to the public sector where possible. Ms. Iriarte states she cares deeply for the island and the impact the current generation leaves for the next. Because of her new son, she states she holds a vested interest in ensuring the island is properly maintained with a solid waste system. As a private citizen of Ordot, she has kept watch over the events that led to the dump's closure. She further states, she hopes to be more acquainted with the lawsuit and tasks facing the new GSWA Board. States she is prepared for the challenges and mission to ensure smooth transition from receivership back to government within confines and compliance of the District Court Consent Decree, as well as environmental protection laws.

Reminds the committee of the rationale announced by the District Court in appointing the receiver. States she attributes lack of progress in closing Ordot Dump and opening a new landfill to the inefficient system that was in place before. She further states she recognizes that a the Board will be under watchful eyes as it begins to assume responsibility. Also states the Board should work not to regress back into old system. Believes she is qualified for the Board. Will follow law that empowers Board. States she hopes to address the three actions: the closure of the Ordot Dump and secessions of pollutant discharge, the construction and operation of a new landfill and third, the financing of the first two measures. States because she lives near the Ordot Dump, she has a personal interest in how the Authority mitigates the harm that's been done. Believes the Board must run as a business. Further states, the Authority must be self-sustaining and do better than the previous government performance of collecting thirty(30) cents on the dollar. Authority must stress collection in order to be self-sustaining. States GSWA must urge recycling and properly maintained facilities so waste disposal is not an inconvenience for the community. States legal experience will be an asset to the board particularly experience in procurement law and the laws that affect government agencies, civil service, and administrative adjudication laws that are important for forming regulations and general board reporting requirements for the public and the legislature. States she can work with the authority's attorney to ensure the board fully understands its legal obligations under the consent decree and under federal and local environmental laws and regulations, as well as public law PL31-20 establishing the authority of the board.

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Question & Answer

Sen. Respicio: Stresses the District Court's recent order of about twenty-five million dollars (\$25M) for condemnation fees and a balance owed to landowners that is still outstanding, especially since original transmission to legislature was five million dollars (\$5M). Also discusses current capacity and the receiver's attempt to borrow in excess of forty million dollars (\$40M) to build new cells and increase capacity. Asks when the transition will be made from the receiver to solid waste authority?

Ms. Iriarte: answers that public law outlines a certain time period subject to the approval of the court. She is not certain of what phase the transition is currently at.

Sen. Respicio: asks if she believes the government has the capacity to manage its own solid waste?

Ms. Iriarte: stresses the way the receiver runs the landfill seems satisfactory to the consent decree and is in compliance with environmental laws. But she's confident with the new board when it takes over and moves forward. Recognizes there are financial challenges and realizes the uncertainty in how to address such financial challenges, but she is confident the Board is up to the task.

Sen. Respicio: cites past violation of Clear Water Act because of leakage into river and improvement in water quality that was recently tested. Because solid waste on island is politically charged, the sooner the government takes over the solid waste management, the cheaper it will be because they will not have to pay the receiver. Asks Ms. Iriarte if, because her appointment completes the GSWA Board of Directors, there is an opportunity to petition the Court for the government to retake control?

Ms. Iriarte: answers, receivership is an extraordinary remedy and district court is waiting for the board to be composed and ready to takeover and believes the court is willing to receive that petition that outlines the measures to ensure the transition is smooth.

Sen. Respicio: believes the board has the ability to petition the court directly and would not have to do it through the administration.

Ms. Iriarte: is not entirely certain but notes the possibility that the AG represents the authority.

Sen. Respicio: expressed concern that the AG previously did not want to represent the people and only the executive branch. He asks that upon confirmation, if she believed she and the board have the authority to petition a federal judge to takeover its responsibility?



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Ms. Iriarte: she is certain it's going to be in the agenda and it's a priority.

Sen. Respicio: repeats the AG and the administration have shown no interest in the past of petitioning for the transition and challenging the receivership. Wants assurance that the Board will exercise its power to petition if the AG and administration continue that position.

Ms. Iriarte: is uncertain if the agenda of the board is in conflict with AG's goal but according public law the board can retain its own legal counsel to present the petition because of the imminence of the transfer of authority.

Sen. McCreadie: supports Ms. Iriarte because of her resume, and the quality of people speaking in favor of her appointment. Congratulates Ms. Iriarte and states full support.

Sen. Limtiaco: asks Ms. Iriarte's opinion of the receiver's performance?

Ms Iriarte: believes performance is satisfactory to District Court and has no criticism of the receiver.

Sen. Limtiaco: asks Ms. Iriarte if her residence receives service from the receiver?

Ms. Iriarte: replies that she does not receive service because there is no service in Ordot.

Sen. Limtiaco: states the receiver is doing an excellent job including: service on time, new vehicles and RFID technology. Asks if operations should go back to government or outsourced to a third party or private entity to continue running efficiently?

Ms. Iriarte: responds that it definitely can't go back to the way it was operated before. Has read receiver report and the important facts and data. Their collection rate and the employee retention rate have aided their efficiency. States the government can run the same operation and offer the community a very valuable service while complying with environmental laws.

Vice-Speaker Cruz: is confident in Ms. Iriarte. States for the record that Mr. Gayle's and Ms. Iriarte's expertise could be used on other Boards as he thinks the GSWA Board will just become a caretaker.

Chair Ada: Adjourns public hearing at 4:27 pm.



Hafa Adai Chairman Ada and the members of the Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation. I thank you for considering my nomination to the Board of Directors of the Guam Solid Waste Authority. I'd also like to thank those who have submitted testimony on my behalf.

My name is Elyze McDonald Iriarte. I am a local attorney and have been practicing here for 11 years with the law firm of Carlsmith Ball LLP. My practice focuses on civil litigation, with particular emphases on employment and maritime law. I also practice in many of our sister island jurisdictions such as Hawaii, Palau, the Federated States of Micronesia and the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands. Over the last several years, I have devoted many of my non-working hours to educational and non-profit causes such as the American Cancer Society, but now wish to contribute my skills and experience to the public sector.

I care deeply about Guam - my home - and the impact that we are leaving behind for the next generations, which includes my two month old son. To that extent I have a vested interest in ensuring that the island is properly maintained when it comes to solid waste disposal.

As a private citizen, for years I kept watch of news reports on the lawsuit which led to the appointment of a receiver over the DPW Solid Waste Division and the closure of the Ordot dump. Since my nomination to the Solid Waste Authority Board of Directors, I have become more acquainted with that lawsuit and the tasks facing the Authority and its new Board. The challenges and mission of the Board are to ensure a smooth transition from the receivership back to the Government, within the confines and complete compliance with the District Court of Guam's Consent Decree, and environmental protection laws. In doing so, the Authority - and the island's leaders - must not forget the rationale announced by the District Court when Judge Gatewood explained why she appointed a receiver. She attributed the lack of progress in closing the Ordot Dump and opening a new landfill to a "highly dysfunctional, largely mismanaged, overly bureaucratic and politically charged solid waste system." No doubt a microscope will be placed on this Board as it assumes responsibility from the Receiver. The Board must undertake the duties of the island's waste system in a way that does not regress into dysfunction or

mismanagement. Qualified Board members are the starting point of this process, and I believe I am up for the job.

My priority as a Board member will be to follow the roadmap provided by Public Law 31-20 and to demonstrate to the District Court that the Authority is fully capable of complying with the mandates of the Consent Decree and the environmental laws. The Board must also specifically address the three actions outlined in the Consent Decree: first, the closure of the Ordot Dump and the Cessation of Discharge of Pollutants from the Ordot Dump; second, the construction and operation of a new municpal solid waste landfill; and third, financing these measures. On the closure of the Ordot Dump, the newly formed Board must continue to enforce regular testing to comply with the Consent Decree's mandate that all discharges have ceased. I live about a mile from the Ordot dump so I have a personal interest in how the Authority mitigates the harm caused by years of non-environmentally-friendly waste disposal.

On the operation of the new landfill, with the completion of the Solid Waste Board, it is time for the Government to assume operations. In conversations with sitting Solid Waste Board members, I understand that they are initiating the process to accomplish this in what may be the first phase of taking over from the receiver.

Finally on the finances side, it is important that the Authority run as a business when it comes to collections. In the District Court case, it was noted that at one point the Solid Waste Division was collecting thirty cents on the dollar. When the Board gains control of the Authority's finances, it must continue to stress collection as having foremost importance. The Authority must strive to be self-sustaining and not rely on the General Fund to fund its operations.

There are obviously other issues besides the imminent transfer of authority back to the Government of Guam. The Solid Waste Authority must continue to encourage recycling as a means to alleviate waste disposal, and to address the resources of our environment. The Authority must also tackle illegal dumping, by building and maintaining proper facilities for disposal so that waste disposal is not an inconvenience or overpriced for the community, and by working with EPA when appropriate to deter illegal dumping by imposing fines.

I see my experience in legal matters to be an asset for the Board of Directors. One of my main areas of practice is in procurement law, which will be important as the Board develops major facilities such as Household Hazardous Waste and transfer stations. As legal counsel to the Retirement Fund for the past eleven years, I am also versed in laws affecting government agencies such as the Open Government Law, the civil service law, and general Board reporting requirements. This experience can assist the Board as it begins this endeavor as a new agency. Finally, I can work with the Authority's attorneys to ensure that the Board fully understands its legal obligations under the Consent Decree, federal and local environmental laws and regulations, and Public Law 31-20 establishing the Authority and the Board.

I humbly thank you for your consideration of my nomination and am ready to serve.
