COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation reconvened a public hearing on October 22, 2013 at 1:00 pm in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Mr. Francisco G. Santos to serve as a Member of the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Authority of Guam's Board of Directors, whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by Eddie Baza Calvo, Governor, on October 8, 2013;
- Appointment packet forwarded to *I Liheslatura* on October 8, 2013;
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on October 9, 2013.

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Tuesday, October 15, 2013 (5-Day Notice), and again on Friday, October 18, 2013 (48-Hour Notice).

TESTIMONY

Chairman Ada invites those who signed up to provide testimony on the appointment of Mr. Santos to the Port's Board of Directors.

Mr. Juan T. Limtiaco

Provided Oral and Written Testimony (See Attached)

Mr. Limtiaco states he is in support of the appointment of Mr. Santos and urges the committee to confirm his appointment. Mr. Limtiaco goes on by stating that he and Mr. Santos grew up together in Sinajana where Mr. Santos was known as a very good baseball player before he joined the Navy and eventually retired honorably as a Chief Boatswain's Mate. He clarifies by stating that the Chief

Boatswain's mate runs the ship and is the right hand man of the captain and that if there is anyone that wants to know about ships, they should ask Mr. Santos. Mr. Limtiaco states that Mr. Santos joined the Port low on the totem pole and eventually retired as the harbormaster and if Mr. Santos is confirmed at the Port, it would be a *plus to the people of Guam*.

Mr. Jess Torres Provided Oral Testimony

Mr. Torres states that for the last almost 24 months, he has had the privilege of serving with Mr. Santos at the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport. He states that though he left the Airport, it is not a big loss as both the Port and Airport are the top-notch agencies of the Government of Guam. He further states its not a loss to the Airport, but it is a gain to the Port Authority in that they are getting a heck of a good leader. Mr. Torres further states that he asks on behalf of his [Mr. Santos'] employees of the airport that they please confirm him because these are the qualified people that we have, citizens who have the expertise in the past, whether in military, church or community activities, that bring the total package to the agencies they're appointed too and the island community of ours would be a lot better when they have quality people like 'Frank G. Santos.'

Ms. Joanne Brown (General Manager, Port Authority of Guam) Provided Oral and Written Testimony (See Attached)

Ms. Brown states that she is testifying in support of the appointment of Mr. Santos on behalf of the Port Management team who is present with her (DGM – Administration & Finance and DGM – Operations). She further states that Mr. Santos was at the Port for many years and helped develop the Port to where it is today. Ms. Brown goes on by stating that Mr. Santos' coming back to the Port as a policy making member of the Port will be beneficial as he brings 36 years of experience back to the Port. She hopes the body (Guam Legislature) will support his nomination and confirmation and also that the body will give the nomination of Mr. Ilao a vote as that is what she states she believes the public expects.

Mr. Eloy Hara Provided Oral Testimony

Mr. Hara states that he is testifying as someone who knew Mr. Santos as a boy scout, baseball player and even in their time together in the navy. Mr. Hara states that most recently, he has been familiar with Mr. Santos and his 36-year tenure at the Port Authority of Guam. Mr. Hara goes on by stating that he has had hands on experience when he was the project manager for hotel wharf, when it was a fishing facility. During his five years there, Mr. Hara states he worked closely with Mr. Santos to make sure that he complied with all safety regulations and statutes in building an operational fishing facility up and running which unfortunately never happened. He further states that consequently, he gives Mr. Santos his 100% support and asks the Body to confirm his nomination.

Mr. Francisco G. Santos Provided Oral and Written Testimony

Mr. Santos begins by thanking those who testified in support of his testimony. He further states that the Port Authority of Guam's mission is to load and unload cargo and improve service not only for the Port, but for the people of Guam. Mr. Santos goes on by stating that he served in the navy, where he learned and gained most of his experience. He further states that though it was not in his packet, he was also an advisor in Vietnam, helping those on the waterfront there to develop their operations. Mr. Santos states that while cargo is a big concern, personnel is his biggest concern and that a serious concern was that employees followed the safety related rules and regulations. He states that he helped the Coast Guard formulate the rules and regulations for the harbor. Mr. Santos states that while at the Port, "... during my 36 years down there, we don't have really any major accidents in the vessel movement because we really conformed to the safety standards of all the vessel movements in the Harbor." He closes by stating that the Senators give him the opportunity to serve because the Port was his home.

Discussion, Question and Answer

Chairman Ada thanks Mr. Santos for his testimony and opens the floor for questions.

Vice-Speaker Cruz thanks Mr. Santos for his 36 years of service and opens by alluding to a recent legal fight the Port had with WATTS and cargo operations on the SRF side. Vice Speaker Cruz states that Mr. Santos was present at the Port at the time of the events and asks what part, if any, Mr. Santos had in that discussion?

Mr. Santos replies that from what he recalls that management and the operations manager met and discussed the type of Cargo that was being discharged and if the Port could accommodate that type of Cargo and the answer was no. He further stated that they requested to go to the other side, but that he mentioned to them that there were rules and regulations regarding the discharge of cargo requiring permission or an agreement from the Port but would still be charged *wharfage* by the Port.

Vice-Speaker Cruz asks whether or not they got that authorization?

Mr. Santos responds that he does not know, only that he attended the meeting and only the vessel movement was his participation in the meeting.

Vice-Speaker Cruz asks if at the end of his 36-years whether or not he was acting General Manger for the Port Authority?

Mr. Santos states that he was acting at one point for six months.

Vice-Speaker Cruz asks if during that period if there was an issue with the lease of navy land on the family beach side?

Mr. Santos responds that was commercial, in that once the land was leased, he would confront the owner and brief them on the safety rules and regulations applicable to their operations.

Vice-Speaker Cruz asks if Mr. Santos had any part in that lease?

Mr. Santos states he had no part in the lease, but would be happy to provide information.

Vice-Speaker Cruz thanks Mr. Santos and yields the floor back to the Chairman.

Senator Duenas thanks Mr. Santos for his willingness to serve. He further alludes to the US Coast Guard 100% clean finding of the Port and looks forward to voting on Mr. Santos' confirmation.

Senator San-Nicolas states that as a new Senator, the issues at the Port are a learning experience and that his experience with Mr. Santos' work at the airport were very pleasant. He mentions a conversation with Mr. Santos where Mr. Santos stated that there are ways things have to move forward and need to be done. He further states that type of thinking is needed. He continues by stating that he believes Mr. Santos would make a great Board member, but asks if he is confident he will be able to put his personal relationships and experiences at the Port as a former employee aside if he serves on the Board and how will he do it?

Mr. Santos states that he will listen to the employees because when you listen to the employees, their suggestions, problems, and if you can solve them then you can help them. He closes by stating that is his first priority, people, the employees, you have to take care of their problems.

Senator Morrison thanks the people who spoke in favor of Mr. Santos and thanks Mr. Santos for his willingness to serve.

Senator Limtiaco thanks Mr. Santos for his public service and on his agreeing to lend his years of experience at the Port to the Port as a Board Member. He further states that usually its hard for Board members early on to get caught up, but as a former employee, that curve will be short. He further states Mr. Santos has his full support.

Chairman Ada asks Mr. Santos for his thoughts about the Master Plan Update and the need for its transmission to the Legislature?

Mr. Santos responds by stating that the vision for the future shows something's coming, maybe the buildup or passenger vessels, and when it comes Guam will have to have the facilities. He further states that he believes that if Guam has the facilities, the passenger vessels will come. Mr. Santos closes by stating that the Port should not wait and should do it now.

Chairman Ada states that the update reflects the growth expected without the original buildup, and that the update will be the basis for the tariff update. He asks Mr. Santos for his opinion on tariff increases?

Mr. Santos states that there is pushback from tariff increases, but there has to be increases to maintain equipment. He goes on by stating the salt spray 24/7 at the Port that hits the gantries and its going to cost money on to preserve those gantries. He further states he recalls there are time limits on the master plan.

Chairman Ada clarifies whether Mr. Santos agrees that tariff increases are important decisions that need to be made?

Mr. Santos states that of course, there is a need for tariff increases to support the operations at the Port.

Chairman Ada states that the Port has a lot of real estate and that there are certainly revenue generators, he states he is concerned that there are a number of tenants that have been going on a month-to-month lease for as long as five years. He asks Mr. Santos if he thinks that is something that he believes should be addressed at the Board level?

Mr. Santos responds by stating that he will look into it. He further states that if there is a need for investment for up to five, ten, or twenty years, then they would have to come to the Legislature for approval.

Chairman Ada states that was the case for Cementon Micronesia. He states that finally, Mr. Santos has come full circle, after serving as a Board Member at the Airport. He asks what Mr. Santos' thoughts are now that he is up to bat, and no one asked him for his opinion then [when at the Port]?

Mr. Santos states that he recalls in 1975 or 76 that the late Governor Ricky Bordallo told him never look North, look to Cabras, this is where investment is going to come. He continues by stating that he is going to try to get some investors to invest in the property at the Port as he would rather see an investor developing property rather than a tongan tongan tree. He adds that will be additional revenue to support the operations.

Senator San Nicolas states that with that last answer, he is concerned as he believes the Port is a key legacy asset as the Port is the lifeblood of Guam. He states he does not agree with privatizing the Port and asks Mr. Santos if he would support privatizing the Port?

Mr. Santos responds that as long as he is down there he will not support privatizing the Port.

Senator San Nicolas states he hopes Mr. Santos stays down there for awhile.

Chairman Ada states there are no further questions and the nomination has been duly heard and adjourns the hearing at 2:36pm.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Administration hereby reports on the executive appointment of Mr. Francisco G. Santos to serve as a member of the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Port Authority of Guam's Board of Directors, for a term commencing on the date of his confirmation and expiring on June 30, 2016, to fill the seat left vacant by Mr. Michael T. 



Hafa Adai and Good Afternoon Chairman Ada and members of the Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure, Maritime and Transportation. I am honored and privileged to be before you for this confirmation hearing in my offering of public service as a member of the Board of Directors for the Port Authority of Guam.

The Port Authority of Guam is the main lifeline of consumer goods into the island, and as such, recognizes its responsibility to deliver these goods in a timely and efficient manner. It is the Port's mission is to provide full services in the loading and unloading of cargo in Guam and Micronesia. I believe my background and experience will allow me to contribute to this mission.

I honorably served our Country for 20 years and retired from the United States Navy as a Chief Boatswains Mate. I worked and retired from the Port Authority of Guam for 36 years, and during my 36 years, I oversaw the Division of the Harbor Master, the Safety & Security Divisions. 

Adelup files new appeal on solid waste

THE legal counsel of the Office of the Governor, has filed another appeal before the Michaelical Colon asking the Minhaelical Colon asking the Minhaelical Colon in the solid Attorney General by the solid waste case.

Attorney Sandra Miller, the legal counsel of the Office of the Governor, is bringing the issue to the Court of Appeals while District Court Judge Frances Tydingco-Gatewood is still reviewing a July 1 court order denying Adelup's motion to halt the procurement process of all consent decree projects.

On Sept. 26, Adelup also filed an appeal before the Ninth Circuit regarding the May 16 order of the chief judge denying the substitution of the Office of the Attorney General with a private law firm and appealing the district court's denial of their motion for reconsideration dated Aug. 13.

Since April 26, the Office of

the Governor has been attempting to remove the OAG as its counsel, raising several issues which include conflict of repre-sentation and differences in litigation strategy with respect to the payment of Layon land with Section 30 bond funds.

The court had denied the substitution of the OAG and only allowed the Cabot Mentanona LLP law firm to represent GovGuam on the issues raised in the former landowners' motion to intervene.

Motion for clarification

During her decision on the motion for clarification, Tydingco-Gatewood reaffirmed the OAG's role, explaining that although the OAG has cooperated and assisted the federal receiver with a variety of issues, the government of Guam remains the actual client.

The Office of the Governor repeatedly stated their loss of confidence in the OAG's legal representation, accusing the government attorneys of taking sides against GovGuam in favor

of the U.S. government and the federal receiver.

Pending motion

In a separate filing, attorney Miller asked the court to decide on the motion to stay and for further relief which she filed on Sept. 13.

According to Miller, the first motion to stay is still pending and the decision of the court could avert the need for a stay pending before the Ninth Circuit.

Miller raised concerns over the lack of GovGuam representation by the counsel of its choice since the Cabot Mantanona law firm had no further role in the solid waste case with the court's denial of the former landowners' motion to intervene.

"Even if the chief legal counsel of the governor or Cabot Mantanona LLP were asked by the court to appear at the Oct. 25 hearing, their appearance would be on behalf of the Office of the Governor not the government and would be clearly inadequate given their uncertain status and role." Miller said.

On Friday, at 9:30 a.m., the court will hear, a motion to unseal and a motion regarding the request for order directing the federal receiver to participate in a mediation process before the presentation by Gershman, Brickner & Bratton inc. of its quarterly report.

Like a previous order, the court wants the attendance of Gov. Eddie Calvo (or Lt. Gov. Ray Tenorio), Speaker Judith Won Pat (or Vice Speaker Benjamin Cruz), Guam Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Eric Palacios, and all members of the Guam Solid Waste Authority board.

The court is also encouraging members of the 32nd Guam Legislature to attend the status

Velasquez defends UFC title

HOUSTON (AP)—Cain Velasquez stopped Junior Dos Santos in the fifth round Saturday night at UFC 166 to retain the heavyweight title.

Dos Santos came out firing to start the final round, but Velasquez (13-1) worked him down to the mat only to have Dos Santos (16-3) get back up against the Octagon walls.

The two traded lefts before Velasquez landed a left and took Dos Santos down headfirst to the mat, causing referee Herb Dean to stop the bout at 3:09.


Th was a pretty tough fight." Velasquez said. "It was very difficult. It was a tough night. I give him a lot of credit, he is a tough fighter. We were ready for everything. It trained hard in camp and prepared for everything. I tried to get him down this time. I was trying to throw crisper punches this time. I love the competition."

The fight was third between the two. Dos Santos beat Velasquez in 1:04 in the first meeting in 2011, and Velasquez won the second by manimous decision in 2012.

"I'm definitely satisfied,"
Velasquez said. "I just hope

his part. That's it. We don't

more pressure on and when it
happens, it happens."

In the co-main event, Daniel Cormier (13-0) unanimously outpointed Roy Nelson (20-9) in a heavyweight bout, with all three judges_

scoing it 30.77. Velastice took Dos Santos down twice in a row midway through the third round with several rights and pounced on him on the ground, but Dos Santos was able to make it to his feet.

In the post-fight press conference Dana White said he thought the fight should have been stopped in the third round.

"I've been around this sport and boxing for a long time and seen men who are too tough for their own good," White said. "I think Junior Dos Santos is one of them in the last Cain fight and this Cain fight. I think that fight should have been stopped, I don't think he should have

taken more punishment." Velasquez remained on the attack, landing several rights with Dos Santos up against the wall, opening up cuts on Dos Santos left car and mouth.

Velasquez continued the attack to begin the fourth round, landing several combinations in the first 40 seconds of the fourth round, and he continued the assault up against the Octagon wall. Dos Santos was able to break free and land a left.

However, Velasquez landed more combinations, including a left that opened up a cut above Dos Santos' right eye that stopped the fight for a moment before it was determined he could continue. Pollowing the restart, Velasquez continued to land combinations, with Dos Santos getting in a left once.

"He beat me up. What can I say?" Dos Santos said in the ring after the fight. "He's a great fighter. I just want to give a good fight to the fans."

Dos Santos was not in the post-fight press conference.

Velasquez landed several lefts to start the second round and a kick to the head as well,

cutting Dos Santos on the bridge of his nose. Velasquezhad Dos Santos locked up, against the walls of the Octagon several times in the second round, but Dos Santos landed a right at the end of the second round.

Velasquez took Dos Santos to the mat midway through the first round, but was unable to land any hard shots, and Dos Santos got to his feet. The two went after it from the start, with Velasquez landing a couple lefts, and Dos Santos hitting an uppercut to go along with two lefts.

The crowd was firmly in Velasquez's corner throughout the fight, yelling "Si, se puede" numerous times for the Mexican.

In the co-main event, Cormier took Nelson down in each of the three rounds, including less than a minute into the bout, but he could not keep Nelson down. Cormier controlled the bout, landing more strikes than Nelson, but Cormier was not able to land combinations.

Gilbert Melendez (22-3) carned his first UFC win, defeating Diego Sanchez (26-6) by unanimous decision — 29-28, 29-28 and 30-27 — in a lightweight bout. Melendez opened up a cut over Sanchez's left eye with a right hook with two minutes left in the first round.

The referee stopped the fight midway through the second and third rounds when the cut reopened but in both instances, the fight was continued. Sanchez came back with an uppercut and a flurry in the third round as the sellout crowd chanted "Diego!".


