COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The nomination of Franklin P. Leon Guerrero to serve as a member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board was made by Governor Edward J.B. Calvo on November 27, 2013. The appointment packet was received by the Office of Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D., on November 27, 2013. The appointment of Franklin P. Leon Guerrerro was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Aviation, Ground Transportation, Regulatory Concerns and Future Generations on November 29, 2013.

The Committee on Aviation, Ground Transportation, Regulatory Concerns and Future Generations convened a public hearing on December 10, 2013 at 10:05 a.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the hearing agenda was the nomination of Franklin P. Leon Guerrero. The hearing was adjourned at 11:40 a.m.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Michael San Nicolas convened the hearing called the nominee, Mr. Franklin Leon Guerrero, forward to provide an opening statement.

Mr. Franklin Leon Guerrero stated that his inclination to accept this nomination was so that he can help give back to the community. He mentioned his experience as a commanding officer in the military and as a former controller at the Port Authority of Guam. He pointed to the fact that the current Board was unable to meet at times because they lacked quorum and, if confirmed, he can help fill that void. He stated that his understanding of transportation, finances, policy, and regulations will help him contribute to the overall function of the Board in serving the community.

Chairman San Nicolas thanked Mr. Leon Guerrero for his willingness to serve our island and thanked the Governor for the nomination. He spoke about the responsibility of the Board, and how they have made tremendous progress addressing already existing problems with the issuance of licenses and compliance with existing laws. He mentioned that Mr. Leon Guerrero's background, especially his military experience, would be a good addition to the current Board.

Senator Tommy Morrison thanked Mr. Leon Guerrero for his willingness to serve on the Board. He expressed support for the nominee's confirmation.

Chairman San Nicolas mentioned that one of the problems the Board was faced with is that current law limits the number of establishments that can open based on the population of the villages, and that no new establishments can open in Hagatna and Tamuning. He stated that, on one side, the position is that limiting the number of establishments limits the alcohol exposure on the island; the other side of the argument is that prohibition, even in the form of limiting the number of establishments within municipalities, is not a truly effective measure to curtail alcohol abuse. He asked Mr. Leon Guerrero his stance on the issue.

Mr. Leon Guerrero stated that the information and knowledge he has on the issue is based primarily on local media outlets. He mentioned that when applicable laws were first passed, no one could have imagined that Tumon Bay would have developed into what it is today. He mentioned thinking of an idea similar to the past practice of carbon credits; laws were in place that limited the amount of carbon that can be emitted into the air. Companies that were in more industrialized areas would "purchase" carbon credits from companies in non-industrial areas thus allowing an additional amount of carbon emission. Mr. Leon Guerrero mentioned that a similar model could be used to allow villages meeting the quota to purchase beverage licenses from other villages which haven't met the maximum number allowed by law. He further mentioned that no one issue has an easy solution and this is one example.

The nominee also stated that he was able to review minutes from past Board meetings and that he was unable to find any discussion that addressed violations with current law. He mentioned that he has seen violations take place. He questioned if everything is being done to enforce current laws. He stated that he isn't in favor of creating new laws or policies but enforcing existing laws and policies. Mr. Leon Guerrero wants to ensure that no person or business is hurt and commerce isn't interrupted but at the same time making sure that the community is better served. He stated that if rules or laws are bad or hurting someone, change the law.

Chairman San Nicolas stated that his office will provide Mr. Leon Guerrero with information they have compiled with regards to the number of licenses issued by village.

Senator Morrison asked Mr. Leon Guerrero his thoughts about business owners who are having difficulty obtaining licenses for their establishments subsequent to their initial investment to said business.

Mr. Leon Guerrero mentioned that he personally would have drawn up a business contract that would not keep him beholden to the purchase of a business if he was unable to obtain a

reissuance of the alcohol license. He also stated that he would like the Board to find a better way to keep records of alcohol sales per establishment.

Senator Tony Ada lauded Mr. Leon Guerrero's past experience with the federal government. He stated his support for the nominee's confirmation.

Chairman San Nicolas stated his support for the nominee and concluded the confirmation hearing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Aviation, Ground Transportation, Regulatory Concerns, and Future Generations hereby reports out the nomination of Franklin P. Leon Guerrero to serve as a member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, for a term of two (2) years beginning from July 1, 2013 until June 30, 2015, with the recommendation CONFIRM.




