

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Health and Human Services, Health Insurance Reform, Economic Development and Senior Citizens convened a public hearing on **Thursday, October 17 at 9am** in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room.

- Appointment packet forwarded to *I Liheslatura* on September 27, 2013;
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on October 3, 2013.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:04AM.

Chairman Rodriguez: We'll start out with the executive appointment of Ms. Guadencia Burns. We have here, who have signed up to provide oral testimony is Mr. Craig W. Burns, Ms. Carmelita M.B. Calvo, Ms. Cathy Illarmo, Ms. Hope Pangelinan and Lisa. So we'll start off with them.



Carmelita Calvo: Good morning Senators. My name is Carmelita Calvo, I am a retired United States Army Master Sergeant and a former employee of WestCare Pacific Islands under the Early Intervention and Transition Program for the veterans.

I am here today to testify in favor of the appointment of Guadencia Palomo-Burns. I've only known her for several months but I know she cares, she's compassionate and she's committed. On the village outreach that we had conducted, she's there during her off time hours to support her program in the Veterans Affairs Office. So, I think she will be a great asset to this program. Thank you.

Cathy Illarmo: Please read written testimony, attached.

Lisa Jensen: Please read written testimony, attached.

Craig Burns: Good morning Mr. Chairman, Co-Chairman, Senators. Thank you for the opportunity this morning to testify in favor of appointing Gaudencia as a Member of the new Social Work Licensing Board. In the interest of full disclosure, our last name is the same, so I have the pleasure of calling her my wife for the last 13 years. So, I've known her for a very long time. But I'm here to testify as a colleague today, and I've known her and have worked with her and aside her I am also a social worker, a licensed social worker at the Department of Veterans Affairs, I am a veteran myself. I have worked with her in different capacities as well as when we were in Hawaii. And in everything that she has done and everything that I have seen her do, in her position as a social worker, she operates with the highest ethical standards and always has the best interest of her clients, patients, consumers at the heart of everything she does and is one of the strongest advocates for her patients, her consumers and for the underserved populations.

In Hawaii she worked in the Waianae area in the Community Health Center as a social worker, and when we saw the opportunity to come to Guam, we both took that and she has immersed herself in the community in the year we have been here and has worked with different non profits and just to become, to get involved in the community here. Also, her experience in the licensing process in Hawaii, I think will make her strong advocate for the profession of social work here on Guam and a very effective member of the board. Thank you.

Amy Sue Santos: Please read written testimony, attached.

Alex Silverio: Good morning. The last time I sat here before you I was here as a candidate to be confirmed, and since then I have been confirmed. I can for the interest of identification, my name is Al Silverio, I work with the Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services for the Guam office of Minority Health. And the things we do there is we remove and reduce health disparities which is one of the complex Social Worker targets here on Guam. I have attended every of the last 4 meeting of the Guam Licensure Social Work Board and a I have found it to be a fascinating process. I am proud, am glad to be on this board.



I am also here to testify in favor of Gaudencia Palomo-Burns. I have found her to be exceedingly conscientious. She's with the Guam Non Communicable Disease Consortium and she's very active in her pursuits in social justice in social work here on Guam.

I want to also echo Amy Sue's sentiments that we need to support and your help to ensure that these folks are on board. It is a dynamic process, one that is very necessary and you will soon see the benefits of having a formalized social work licensure board here in the very near future. But we're working very, very hard, very quickly, we need your support. And I'm sure that Gaudencia will be an excellent addition to this board.

Chairman Rodriguez: We will now turn over to the appointee Ms. Gaudencia. First of all, I want to congratulate you on your appointment. We are able to work closely together, you are the person in charge of the Medical Foster Care Program at the Veterans Office, and so we know, it was last year when you came and did your presentation here in the legislature, and since then we have been working closely with you, my office has been working closely with you and we feel that you are very qualified to be in this position, so you have my full support.

Gaudencia Palomo-Burns: Thank you. Good morning, thank you for accepting my paperwork. I have to say I'm very nervous and I'm very glad to be here, also just hearing the support from my co-workers and my husband which I have never heard him talk about me like that, so, that was, that really touched my heart, so, I totally appreciate his support. You never know what they're thinking behind, but...

When I was approached by the Office of the Governor to become part of this board, I was... One of the things you need to know about me is, I was like sure, why not, let me see what I can do. And that's what I did, and I'm glad that they approached me and that they asked to be here because I want to help out, and that is who I am. I want to help and support the profession of social work. I also want to keep ties with all the social workers here on Guam, so I'm very glad to be here. Thank you.

Chairman Rodriguez: Thank you very much. Mr. Vice Chair?

Senator Tony Ada: Thank you Mr. Chair. Good morning and I just want to thank you for taking this position on the board. I think its important that we get this board filled and start moving along so that we would be able to achieve the goals that they seek out to do. I would like to thank you for accepting the Govenor's call to serve on the board and your husband for coming up to testify in favor of your being on this board and that's always important to have the support of your family, your kids. Once you have the support of him, everything else is downhill from there and welcome aboard and you have my vote for your confirmation.

Gaudencia Palomo-Burns: Thank you Senator Ada.



Senator McCreadie: Thank you Mr. Chairman and thank you for being here. I know you're nervous and I can tell you something, everybody up here, when they speak, they get nervous. And that's a good thing. But your nervousness is a good thing in the fact that you are actually here and you're doing this and you're not afraid to step up and lead, so I thank you for accepting the nomination from or the appointment from the Governor and I'm sure from the testimony today and from the Chairman, the Vice Chairman, I think you will get full support from this body and you have my full support. Thank you very much.

Senator Aguon: Thank you very much Mr. Chairman and good morning. First and foremost, congratulations on your appointment by the Chief Executive, and more importantly, thank you very much for accepting the opportunity to serve our community in this capacity. I think its always wonderful when I see individuals when they want to extend themselves above and beyond their work environment, their familial environment, but most importantly their community family, so thank you very much in regards to that.

Perhaps you didn't hear, this is in defense of a fellow veteran, but perhaps you have not heard publicly, you husband say some very good things about you, but I'm sure you have heard it privately on many occasions. And finally, let me close with this Mr. Chairman, I've had the opportunity to be able to discuss some issues with regards to veterans, just in the last year, with Ms Gaudenica Palomo, and I just want to assure the community of Guam that not only does she to provide some excellent service to our veterans in need and that her credentials speak for themselves, but just as importantly, thank you for recognizing and servicing our veterans here on Guam, because certainly, with the impending of our Guardsmen, there's been an estimated anywhere from 10 to 13% of our men and women who return from combat zones, that they may need additional assistance, above and beyond, one they return and hopefully you will be able to continue to extend your service in that regard. But thank you very much again, for your support to our community and as a supporter of veterans obviously, enough said in terms of having my support. Thank you, thank you Mr. Chair.

Senator Limtiaco: Thank you Mr. Chair. Mrs. Burns, thank you very much for accepting the request to publicly serve on the board. We can tell by the testimony and especially your resume, that you have more than the requisite experience to make a great contributing member to the board and you have my full support.

Gaudencia Palomo-Burns: Thank you.

Senator Duenas: Thank you Mr. Chairman, I join the chorus of folks on congratulating you on stepping up to the plate and also, while I expect and even though you mentioned it's unexpected for your husband to say wonderful things about you, and he did, you also have a number of members of the community who stepped forward who are also well respected, so having those folks coming forward for you, is really a testament of what your service will bring to this board.



First of all, what I want to say is that because of your studies at Western Michigan University, you have my vote. My other half of my life was in Grand Rapids, Michigan, so I always root for Michiganders, so. And in looking over your resume, it really is very impressive, and in closing, in terms of your nomination, what really, first of all I was the director of the Department of Youth Affairs for almost 7 years and I don't, in a lot of careers, people say how do you do it, I don't know how social workers do it. They are amazing people. And they deal with so much in the community that I don't even know how they keep the home front. Taking care because its so taxing, so I'm so proud to have someone like you step forward and take this as an additional duty, but also to bring, in looking over your resume, also to bring a different perspective and that's why I congratulate the administration for really looking outside the cadre of people that we have here, because I know you know we have great social workers here, excellent social workers. And to have, reading through your resume, your extensive experience off of Guam, I think, especially for licensure, it's really going to bring an added perspective. So I thank the administration and thank you for accepting, and I know your plate is full but, thanks for accepting I look forward to voting on the affirmative on your nomination. Thank you Mr. Chair.

Gaudencia Palomo-Burns: Thank you.






