COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Health and Human Services, Health Insurance Reform, Economic Development and Senior Citizens convened a public hearing on **Wednesday, February 20, 2013 at 5:30pm** in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room.

Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of **Ms. Lorilee T. Crisostomo to serve as Director of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans**, and whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by Governor Edward J.B. Calvo on January 7, 2013.
- Appointment packet forwarded to *I Liheslatura* on January 31, 2013;
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on February 18, 2013.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 5:32pm.

Chairman Rodriguez invited those who signed up to provide testimony:

Albert Perez: Read written testimony in favor of Lorilee T. Crisostomo.

Monte Mesa: I am here in favor of the nomination of Lorilee Crisostomo to serve as the Director



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of Bureau of Statistics and Plans. From my personal experience from her administrative skill as the Director of the Guam Energy Office as well as the Environmental Protection Agency, I see that she possesses good qualities as a leader and establishing rules and regs for businesses to grow on the island. I see what the department has done and that she will continue the trend to help businesses grow to make the best and highest use of the businesses trying to grow using this information consistently on island. So, there is confidence I ask the committee to consider her nomination to continue this trend.

Senator Yamashita: Thank you for your dedication Mr. Perez. I appreciate your work to our island.

Chairman Rodriguez: I would like to recognize those members of the Bureau who are here and recognize that you carry out the services of your department.

Lorilee Crisostomo, Appointee: Read written testimony, attached.

Speaker Won Pat: it appears that your bureau is assisting other departments and agencies and I think it would be beneficial for you to explain with an overview and of what it is your bureau is doing. I find it interesting and if you can please explain in the testimony where you indicated assisting the special needs of our community in particular the Guam developmental disability council by providing utility assistance. Can you explain how you were able to do that? Is that within the different grants?

Lorilee Crisostomo: Grant is awarded to council and what it needed was general funds for rental and it was stated under public law that the disabilities council would be under the bureau and that the bureau will take it from the General Fund.

Speaker Won Pat: You've also indicated that you have a total of 12 million but you have 1 million from the general fund. Can you explain?

Lorilee Crisostomo: There are 3 main areas that give us grants, Department of Interior, NOAA, and Department of Defense, which makes the total of 12 million. Last year we had 14 million but the grant is already expiring.

Speaker Won Pat: Have you gotten break down of villages from the census because GHURA is waiting to know which are eligible for federal grants?

Lorilee Crisostomo: We are still requesting for updates. I have mentioned that the US Bureau is also going through cutbacks. Because it is a US program, we follow the program and they give it to us little by little. We are looking at whether there is additional money and see can we ask them if they can hire more money in order to release the information. The program doesn't release it all at once. In a couple of months another section will be released.



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Senator Tony Ada: thank you and I look forward to voting on your confirmation.

Senator Morrison: I appreciate that you came by the office to work on your transition. You have very qualified people behind you. You have a lot of projects happen and I hope you will continue the pig hunting derby with the Department of Agriculture and the clear water summer camp. The one project, the centralized data project you work very closely with Monica who is here. We worked very hard to get Governor Calvo to approve and DOI approved and I would like to know the status.

Lorilee Crisostomo: We just received the notice and we are meeting as division heads. It is \$300,000 that we received. For the pig derby, we have the Ordot Chalan Pago mayor requesting that we focus there.

Senator Yamashita: I echo senator Ada's statement me thank you for coming up to bat. I see that you were at the GEO for two years and in two years you are just getting started, why are you agreeable to move to the Bureau?

Lorilee Crisostomo: I've been the director for two years but I've actually served for six years. The Governor had asked me to go to the Bureau and make sure that the grants are secured. Don't say no to the boss. I was excited to go back and I knew it would be challenges with limited resources in regards to the general fund because that is what pays to the cost. I knew there is some reserve to not being able to increase our funding to have more staff.

Senator Yamashita: As you move to BSP, we know the range of their mission, what is your experience and background in Land Management?

Lorilee Crisostomo: In GEPA, we have done various permits such as water division receives 200 reviews a week. A lot of it we discuss with supervisors and engineers to discuss options on how to move forward. With natural resources, I was in GEPA I did chair the environmental/natural resources committee for the civilian military task force, which is now separated, where we addressed Military buildup. Guam EPA addressed the issues of military infrastructure.

Senator Yamashita: What is the importance of employee morale and how do you address it as an organizational leader?

Lorilee Crisostomo: Morale means that we are the employee believe that they are public servants and make sure they are happy with their jobs. I have an open door policy. I feel the bureau has a good moral and we are about to sign the Hafa Adai pledge and bring the culture in.

Sen. Yamashita: It looks that we are going to be getting millions of cuts. Have you thought about how you will address that?



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Lorilee Crisostomo: Costal won't be affected until 2014. We only get 10% for administration, paying for supplies and salary. There are grant mandates and the sub-recipients are affected. We do the reports online as well as looking at grant conditions and looking at mandates so we would not lose grants if we do not comply.

Senator Yamashita: What do you think the role of the legislature is with the agencies? There was an incident where you didn't provide document for the FOIA request?

Lorilee Crisostomo: At the time I was with the Guam Energy Office. We were short staffed because we did not received ARRA grants. The staff looked all over for the document and did not find it. I did not want to provide an insufficient document. However, it was eventually found and was provided as requested.

I believe that the role of the legislature is to support the agencies to move forward. Of course, the legislature also allocates the funding. In regards to FOIA, I ask that maybe you can look at the time period because sometimes it is short for us to provide the information.

Senator Yamashita: We request for these information because sometimes we do not have access in acquiring the files and data. What is your policy on this? I understand you mentioned a website?

Lorilee Crisostomo: We do have a website where some reports are available; however I do understand that it is not user friendly. We are trying to gain access on the website because it is currently being controlled by BIT and hopefully getting it up to date. We try to send email about the information requested as we understand it is difficult to look for it on the website.

Senator McCreadie: congratulations on appointment. What is your long term mission statement and what type of problems have you encountered and how will you fix those?

Lorilee Crisostomo: We are receiving a new ceiling with the budget and we have to live within that level. Our general fund allocation is general fund that has been cut. Long term goal is to move forward and that's why I would like a round table to hear what you want to see. Let people know what we are doing and how we can help you to better plan projects. Work with census and try to get more information on a contractual basis.

Senator Duenas: I do look forward to supporting your confirmation. I worked with you during the Camacho administration and your request for a round table is indicative of what quit want to do. Harness the group that you have and support them. I'm looking forward to a more interagency work with all your experience and I look forward to the round table.



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Senator Limtiaco: you're still active in the coast guard reserve? Your resume suits the position you are appointed to, and you have my support.

Senator pangelinan: Thank you and congratulations on your appointment. I like your idea that the legislature's job is to support the agencies and I hope that is reciprocal and in this support we have access to each other's resources. Would you say that you have the same open door policy for the legislature are your staff. Is that a reciprocal philosophy that you have?

Lorilee Crisostomo: Yes, I would expect for us all to talk about it and be on the same page.

Senator pangelinan: You would say that we can freely exchange info between us and our staff?

Lorilee Crisostomo: Yes

Senator pangelinan: I say this because it's important that the people at the top have to have this philosophy. In the last administration, the staff was required to sign confidentiality agreements on issues that were to be publically discussed. Would you support something like that?

Lorilee Crisostomo: Yes and no, if it's preliminary data I would be cautious and I wait for more finalized data. At that time with the military, we all had a problem with the form. So, we wanted to review the EIS and see how many permits GEPA would have to give out.

Senator pangelinan: Would you say that signing that agreement and then that final decision that emerged which was way over inflated, knowing how that turned out and how you mentioned that you just won't say "No" to the boss, if the same issue comes up, would you say or recommend what you think would be best interest of the people of Guam or something like that, if you felt something like that?

Lorilee Crisostomo: Yes

Senator pangelinan: The Bureau has linkages and can you share your challenges? You mention that you look forward to taking it to the next level and using these resources are effectively use for the growth of our island community. Would you be able to give me some kind of idea that you are struggling with that now in regards to finding consistency among the various plans that exists out there that link with other departments and agencies as they move forward in their mission for usual economic activity and growth versus this impending this growth that we are all being promised in regards to the military presence here on Guam. What are some of the inconsistencies in ensuring the economic plans in the normal level versus in the enhanced level? Where are we in those struggles? Are we going to win? Lose? Do you need our help?

Lorilee Crisostomo: As far as the plans that I've seen, there are existing plans and working plans. Department of Public Health is working on their health assessment plans and we are a part of the stakeholders to help improve the assessment. For the military, with the Natural Resources

Committee, we met last month with Randy Sablan regarding ongoing projects with other agencies. Some of them are being funded by Japan such as utilities infrastructure. I am not sure if the community is aware that the military is still working on what Japan has given them and to work on those infrastructures. We are still asking questions as to whether it is part of the EIS to make sure that projects have conducted Environmental Assessment to answer questions.

Senator pangelinan: To their satisfaction?

Lorilee Crisostomo: yes and no. There are some things that need to be clarified because we felt like they did not answer all our questions.

Senator pangelinan: So, it would be correct to say that there are some inconsistencies in priorities or approval on what we have developed within those plans?

Lorilee Crisostomo: Yes

Senator pangelinan: and we are saying No to those?

Lorilee Crisostomo: Yes and how much is being funded for this and which funds are being used?

Senator pangelinan: I know you are able to work with the linkages with the agencies and you are going to be able to develop that, I think, which I am glad. Since, you have only been in the position for a month, I might have some other questions that I do not have right now, will you or your staff be able to assist me with future questions.

Lorilee Crisostomo: I have set up to meet with your Chief of Staff about the concern on the expenditure's report.

Senator pangelinan: Yes, I am concern. I thought I was trying to get the report as required. When the report was submitted, the information provided was pretty much the same as the year before and it was very clear in the statute that was passed by Governor Calvo when he was chairman on the committee of appropriations and finance and taxations that those kinds of reports for forecast were very necessary to assist the legislature in the case for the committee to receive that forecast for the next fiscal year, And so, Governor Calvo felt that that bill was important and when we got that report under his administration, it wasn't much initiative in trying to comply with this law and so I wrote back to you and asked you to look for the areas that will allow you to update the data.

Lorilee Crisostomo: On the second letter, I didn't want to respond until we meet. That report for the law says that it must be certified by the Special Economic Committee which the Director is not a member of. So, I did ask for the report from other agencies for yourself and the two chief economists from BSP. I did ask what exactly the certification and did you guys certify on that



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template because I'm supposed to provide a certification report and I was not part of the committee meetings. I was not comfortable in reporting things that are not submitted but that are what the Committee certified and for the law, I must file that. I do not even have a role to be a part of Committee, maybe we can take a look at the law to maybe including the director in the Committee.

Senator pangelinan: I am definitely open to that and we are setting the meeting to meet with you.

Chairman Rodriguez: Congratulations and your confirmation has been duly heard. Thank you very much.

**Confirmation Hearing on
The Executive Appointment of Lorilee T. Crisostomo
as Director of Bureau of Statistics and Plans**

Buenas Noches and Hafa Adai, Mr. Chairman Rodriguez and Senators of the 32nd Guam Legislature. I am here this evening humbly seeking your confirmation of my Directorship of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans.

Here with me this evening, I have brought my parents, Lydia and Ramon Topasna, both public servants for over 35 years as classified employees working up the ladder and then retiring as a Director and Administrator of their prospective agencies. For the past 20 years now, my parents are enjoying their retirement years by volunteering their time serving the community whether it be leading the parish church with rosaries, lecturer at masses, raising money for a specific cause, going to pilgrimage abroad, heading up the masters basketball league and Chuukese basketball association, and much more while they still make time for their 5 grown children, their children's spouses, and their 20 grandchildren. It is with their examples of being public servants and continued commitment to helping the community that I have dedicated my professional career to be a public servant as well and to be involved in helping our island community continue being a better place to live in.

Of the 20 years of my career, I've dedicated myself to the people of Guam. This could not have been achieved without the support of my husband, Jerry, for over 20 years and

my three children, Gino, LyAna, and Gary. I would like to thank them for believing in me and for always being by my side. The first 11 years, I worked as a classified employee then became a supervisor at the Guam Energy Office. The remaining years, I served as a cabinet member of Governor Felix Camacho and Governor Eddie Baza Calvo taking the role as Administrator of Guam EPA and Director of the Guam Energy Office.

In April 2011, I was invited by Senator Tom Ada for an informational briefing about the status of the ARRA energy grants of over 25 million dollars. Senators, I am pleased to inform you that as of the ending of December 2012, almost all of 19 million dollars have been spent to upgrade public buildings with energy technologies under the State Energy Program grant that expired recently. Another 166,000 dollars to assist with funding appliance rebates were spent appropriately and over 800 households benefitted from the energy appliance rebate grant. Under the Weatherization Assistance Program for low income, GHURA and Guam Energy Office are at the last phase for installing energy efficient appliances at public and qualified private houses. Lastly, the Energy Efficiency Conservation Block grant of 9.5 million dollars is more than halfway spent and all on-going projects are to be completed by summer, ahead of grant expiration early September 2013.

During my short time at the Bureau of Statistics and Plans, I am proud to say that the Bureau has dedicated employees to serving the people of Guam. They exemplify professionalism as they carry out the Bureau's mandates, goals and objectives. The Bureau is comprised of the Administrative Office of the Director, the Social-Economic Planning Program, the Planning Information Program, the Business and Economic Statistics Program, the Land Use Program, and the Coastal Management Program. With the 35 employees working at the Bureau, I look forward to improving the Bureau and take it to the next level as we ensure Guam's resources are effectively used for the benefit of present and future generations by ensuring consistency among various plans, policies, and programs for a balanced economic, social, environmental and physical growth of our island community.

The Bureau of Statistics and Plans for the past years have been allocated with about a million dollars of General Fund to cover majority of the personnel costs. However, it is operating with a total budget of about 12 million dollars of federal grants within a given period, most of those federal funds are past to sub-recipients, Government of Guam agencies, to help them better serve the island community.

For example, the Bureau is the designating State Administering Agency to receive federal funds from the Bureau of Justice Assistance, U.S. Department of Justice and then those funds are sub-awarded to local entities, like Guam Police Department, Office of the Attorney General, Guam Customs & Quarantine Agency, Judiciary of Guam, Department of Corrections, and Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse. Federal funds were provided to support different components of the criminal justice system, from drug task forces to prevention, from treating victims to enhancing

collection of forensic evidence in sexual assault cases, and from improving criminal records integration to upgrading informational management systems. Other federal monies were secured by the Bureau to fund the Gang Resistance Education and Training program and fund the Police Forensic Laboratory in regards to purchasing DNA equipment and licensing, supplies, and much more.

We continue to work with the U.S. Bureau of Census as it provides us with more specific data obtained in 2010 other than Population such as Demographic Profile and Housing Units at designated places. We have teleconference calls on a monthly basis with the U.S. Bureau of Census to follow up on further updates that we are requesting to be released.

The Coastal Management Program, 100% federally funded, is quite a large division and has majority of its activities performed in-house by the Administrator and staff and is able to federally fund partnerships with Department of Agriculture, Guam EPA, and University of Guam to assist with its projects. Also, it has contracted Non-Governmental Organizations to further its outreach activities and capture better funding leverage when applying for federal grant dollars to continue improving ways to protect the environment, land, ocean and coral reefs. I applaud this division of continuing to have the natural resources committee meet on a monthly basis to share information and address concerns with the construction phases on-going in the military bases.

Yes, the Bureau has extensive programs supporting various needs of the island community. In fact, we even assist the special needs of the community. I am pleased to share with you that the Bureau has been housing the Office for the Guam Developmental Disability Council for the past years. The Bureau provides administrative support such as setting up the accounts and submitting federal reports as well as setting aside dollars within our General Fund budget to pay for rental and utilities for the Developmental Disability Council to continue operations.

These are just some of the highlights of the Bureau.

Speaker Won Pat has stressed the importance for a better communication with the Executive Branch and the Guam Legislature. With that in mind, Mr. Chairman, I look forward to having a roundtable discussion with your committee and allow the Bureau's management and staff to share with you and the Senators what the Bureau has done, where it is now, and where it will be tomorrow. For instance, we recently were awarded federal dollars under the Compact Impact to improve our management information system. With funding now available to the Bureau, we like to start with revamping our website to be user friendly. We want the information we have compiled and published to be transparent through on-line accessibility. While we are working on the details of improving our transparency with the use of technology, please note that we are posting meetings, published reporting schedules, and other information at the

www.calendar.guam.gov . There's so much I like to share with you, Mr. Chairman, and Senators and look forward to an upcoming roundtable discussion at your convenience to get your input and how the Bureau can better assist all your committees too.

I humbly ask for your support to serve as the Director of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans and I stand committed to serving the people of Guam and I will give you my very best. Thank you for giving me this opportunity to speak before you and for making the time to hear my family, friends and colleagues speak on my behalf. Si Yu'us Ma'ase hamyu todos.


Dear Senator Rodriguez and Members of the Committee:
