

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 4:02pm.

Chairman Rodriguez: The next item on our agenda is the executive appointment of Mr. Theodore M. Lewis to serve as the member of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority Board of Trustee. Mr. Lewis if we can please invite you. Hafa Adai and good afternoon. Congratulations to you as well for your appointment to serve as one of the board that is always challenges and always good to see people who are nominated and appointed to this board and so I open the floor to you. If you have any opening statements and after that we turn it back here to this panel if there's any question for you.



Mr. Theodore Lewis: Sure, well I grew up in Michigan and the Mainland and was bless to have some very good parents that thought me a lot of good things. I wasn't a perfect child but they raise me in the right direction. And throughout my life I have develop a sense of God's provenience and His put me in different places different times to help me gain experiences. So I come to, my favorite text is proverbs 3:6, I thy ways acknowledge him and He will direct you to right path direct me to different places and allowed me to have very great diverse experiences. This is my first health care work after school in Dayton Ohio and a large teaching facility I learned planning skill and I had the opportunity then to go to Washington DC and work to health system for many years first in inner City Hospital then larger community hospital facility. I almost when to work in the Philippines 10 years ago and I was offered a position to be the first CEO in an Asian hospital in 2002. And God directed my path at the time, up to Maine where I served as CEO of a hospital there for 10 years and then God wanted me over here on Guam. And so he directed my path here and I've been here a little bit over a year and I've fallen in love with community and the people here and the needs. And I must say, that there are wonderful people on Guam and they are very good people but, I think they're a bit too tolerant because they don't have the resources they deserve here. There are not enough physicians. We need more doctors here on Guam. There are too many people that I think, leave the island for service. And I am hopeful, in a small way, that the work that I do, I can help provide better service here and help us get to the point of a greater portfolio of greater services available to us here.

Chairman Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr.: Alright, thank you very much. I just have a few questions here and I'll pass it on. I know, and I thank you for your work over the SDA as a CEO there. We know that there has been progress ongoing there. You are over seeing a huge expectation, which is going to be good for the community, good for our people, with expanded services, right? So, as a board member in the hospital, to see any, and it's coming as well, I want to ask it, do you see any conflicts in perhaps, some services that need to be introduced in the hospital? Maybe it would be beneficial in the hospital? And of you being the CEO of a clinic, I'm sure it's not a hospital so there is no direct competition, right? But I ask this because it was brought up to the committee. And so, I just want to be able to hear your response.

Mr. Theodore Lewis: First thing, within health care, there always things that sometimes overlap. By and large, it's physician practices that bill hospitals. And a hospitals greatest need is for more physicians to support them. So by and large, the services that Guam Memorial or any other acute care hospital would provide care services where they look for clinics, like SDA, to feed and support them. And so yes, there are times that we are doing some of the same things but, in my past experiences, generally, the hospitals welcome the support they have from



outpatient private physician organizations. Even though sometimes, they're doing some imaging things, they're the same and yet to the extent that those physicians can send patients to the acute care hospital. That's the most important thing. For my experience in the past, as a hospital CEO, I love to get clinic and physician people in the outpatient getting involved with the hospital board. Because it will help them identify more and support the hospital more.

Chairman Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr.: Okay, great. Thank you. One thing I always commend is the thing for, you're one of the people who have implemented your E-records, right? So a lot of these upgrades need to happen in our hospital. And so I am hoping we move forward in your confirm. That these are some of the things you can bring forward onto the table. We know that they're billing and the collection department their needs a lot of help. And hopefully, maybe with a new set of ideas and eyes, it will be beneficial to them and to the community, in general. Okay, so thank you. Mr. Vice Chair.

Vice Chair Senator Tony Ada: Mr. Lewis, thank you for accepting the governor's call to serve the people of Guam. I was looking at your packet here and I noticed that you have just been here since last year. And for you to take an active part in the community, I take my hat off to you and applaud you for that. It is not very often that you see CEO's for clinics that have just arrived on the island that would take a board role in the local hospital. And I think with your knowledge and expertise and handling the clinic. You may be able to bring that knowledge to the hospital to where they may be lacking. Like what the chairman said billing and things like that and hopefully, we'll be able to help our hospital to grow into a better hospital for the people of Guam. And it may be able to work together with the private hospital and not against each other. And that's what I think will be beneficial with the people of Guam and for both GMH and the private hospital. But again, I thank you for stepping up to the Governor's call to serve on this board. Thank you Sir. Thank you Mr. Chair

Chairman Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr.: Thank you . Senator Duenas

Senator Duenas: Thank you Mr. Lewis, I also want to echo my colleauges congratulations to your willingness to serve. Having went to school and grew up for a little while in Michigan, myself. My decision will be made if whether you are a Spartan or a Wolverine? Just kidding, you don't have to answer that one. Go wolverines! That a hint?

Mr. Theodore Lewis: Only one thing in the year that they play each other, it's a problem. Other than that.

Senator Chris Duenas: Other than that then the family is back together.



Mr. Theodore Lewis: And I have been searching the tickets to pass the theme up.

Senator Chris Duenas: I have a 2 - part question for you. It's kind of a don't tell form of question from what Senator Ada was talking about. Obviously, as a chairman, you are a member of and CEO of a health care provider institution. Recently, I won't say criticize. It, just to give you a little background, took a board that got together out of the goodness of their heart, about 5 years to have the vision to build the new hospital and set up the footprint, if you will, to do that. My thing in the last year and a half, in the construction of the new hospital, in which we are going to welcome, is that a transition board or some sort of Ad hoc committee at least, be put together or maybe generated from the hospital or a board position to put together as much as possible a seamless agreement so that we don't have despaired care, two levels of care here. So I'll just jump to my 2 - part question: How do you see your role, should you be confirmed, in which I see you have a great chance at, in January session coming up? How do you see your role and how much activity do you think the board should take in terms of getting some movement in, towards at least sitting down the new hospital and some key areas to ensure, maybe some relationship?

Mr. Theodore Lewis: I think it would be very important to have a close relationship with the new organization. I haven't been here long enough to know if there are good relationships or to know what dialogue may or may not have taken place, but we're all in this together, we're serving the same community. There are not enough resources to go around. And I think with the unique situation that we have that so many fellow islanders having to go elsewhere for care. I think it creates the situation that can be a win - win that the Guam Memorial Hospital, the new organization and the community can all benefit. We can all work together and have a better delivery system. Obviously, things are never perfect in life but, there some basic ingredients there that give us the great opportunity to work together more than other markets I've seen. Or could be cut - through competition and so, I am very hopeful, especially with the kind of people that we have here, they are really good people that have lived their lives and want wants what's best for the community. So, I am hopeful that I will be able to add to that. I have always, in any place I have been, I try to be the bridge builder and not one that creates despaired situations. I mean there are always challenges, of course, to make business. But if I had the opportunity to facilitate a better work facility, that would be my desire.

Senator Duenas: So I'll preference my second question, I have been to almost ever briefing that the new hospital folks have put on and Ms. Benzon and her team have been very, very transparent about their need for GMH to succeed as well. So with the work that I know I just want you to know that the relationships are good. They are all good people, I believe and all have



the right intent in mind and in heart. In that being, with your experience as current position right now, this is something physicians have asked me, some on the side, in order to create that kind of sort of moving - forward equity in terms of services. Do you think, in your board position, do you see anything, even in your current position, to see GMH to expand? In terms of other areas of care that are even included with the new hospital structure?

Mr. Theodore Lewis: Well, I am not familiar with the plans for the new hospital, other than that, it's a general acute care facility that will have up to date equipment in services. But I see many opportunities for the current hospital. Right now, there is not a pulmonologist on the island and while that hurts all of us as citizens, it most affects the hospital because of the intensive care unit is where you need the pulmonologist the most. One of the things that I can help at all, would be, that there are several areas Guam Memorial Hospital can build on the service. That to me would be highest priority. Because I know there are deaths and situations that don't have to be, if we have. It's not rocket science. It's not an exotic specialty. We had a patient at our clinic die because we didn't have a (inaudible) on our island. I know that. I know, I don't want to see that happen again. The thing of it is, it could be a real benefit to the hospital. Not only providing the service, but it could generate revenue. There is a lot of revenue that go off the island because we don't have a pulmonologist. That's just one particular area I am familiar with.

Senator Chris Duenas: You've convinced me. You sound like a wolverine. Mr. Chairman, in closing, I didn't want to go down the road of finance since you're a CEO. I am just going to assume that the financial part is something you don't bring to the table. I wanted to kind of, dig a little deeper to see how operationally the opportunities will be for the hospitals. As a chairman in closing, barring any discoveries that you've certainly has my support and I appreciate for your commitment to the island. Thank you Mr. Chairman

Chairman Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr.: Thank you, senator. Senator Morrison.

Senator Morrison: Thank you, Mr. Chair. Mr. Lewis, thank you for wanting to share your expertise and support to our hospital and people of Guam. I certainly know that there is an interesting time for the hospital and I've seen much progress, I appreciate the chairman's work and candid ting the prude for hospital. But again, I want to echo the statements of my colleagues. I am very encouraged the appointment the Governor and the expertise level you bring to the table during these very challenging times of the hospital. So, thank you and you have my full support.

Chairman Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr.: Thank you very much senator. Senator Limtiaco?

Senator Limtiaco: Thank you Mr. Chair. Thank you Mr. Lewis for your willingness to take on a



very tough challenge being on the hospital board. I too, prior to being an elected official, was served on the hospital board for some time. I've experienced firsthand and several multitude of challenges that the Board of Trustees has in addressing issues. A couple of questions that I have, with no shortage of challenge, where do you see yourself in the sub-committee setting within the hospital? Where would you want to focus your energy on? Because obviously, you need to spread out where the area of expertise are and where you're comfortable being. Where do you see yourself in being in a specific area?

Mr. Theodore Lewis: Probably, just out of the top of my head, just strategic planning. Maybe quality, but wherever the needs are. It depends on the portfolio of the folks they have. If they have some folks with particular expertise in certain area and then maybe you have a weakness in a certain area. Then you have to consider, not just my background, but I am willing to serve wherever would be the most sense.

Senator Limtiaco: Oh, okay.

Mr. Theodore Lewis: I do want to say one thing, in that regard, going to back to some earlier comments about my expertise. And I say this with humor, when the board at SDA interviewed me, before they hired me, one of them asked me, "Well, Mr. Lewis, tell me about your expertise in finance and what is the level you have in health care?" And my response was that, "I have absolutely no expertise, whatsoever, in finance or any other specific area of the hospital. But, what I have developed an expertise at is, learning that it is important that you associate with the people that do have the knowledge and the expertise. So I gave an example, when I went up to Maine. They had the worst IT program out of the 39 hospitals in Maine. It was atrocious. I'm the least to know about computers, but I do know if you're going to have an IT program, you need to have people do have that knowledge. So, I got the right person in place, and within 3 years, we rebuild the program and won an international award. I know nothing about it, but the key in the health care industry as well as any other industry is to get the people in place who do have the knowledge. Hopefully, one of the things I could bring to the board is not to be someone who knows it all for myself but someone that I know someone that does have that expertise in that particular area and hopefully, I could bring them to the table and connect them up.

Senator Michael Limtiaco: I'm glad you segregated to financing, the finance portion of it because we have tried as much as we can in this legislature to get the funding to the hospital that they need to address the long standing problems. I know they are about to go out and re-finance and that is going to help them fix some of their immediate cash flow issues. And that is one of the legislations that came out of this legislature. But having said that, have you experienced that in the prior history that you have listed here? Have you worked with industries that have



struggled with finances?

Mr. Theodore Lewis: Very much so. You do have to develop a certain amount of expertise. Primarily, it's in the area of common sense, but I do know some basic things without spending a lot of time in the hospital here. I do know that their challenge, the reimbursement they're getting from Medicare. That's an area that needs to be worked at and I don't know if people I know watch NBC. Somehow, we need to go higher up with Guam to have the federal government understand that this is an important issue. I mean, this is territory here and I think it's pathetic the federal reimbursement that's been there for three hospital. I know in the IT and in billing there has been lots of challenges and I've only have heard and entailed stories of how many missed opportunities there are because there aren't proper billing processes or maybe not have electronic billing. Those are things, the way I like to look at is, the glass is half full so, wherever I've gone, and there's always been opportunities. I think there are opportunities for them so rather than talking about what has been a shame that we haven't done better in the pass, the way I like it look at it is, there are opportunities for the future. And how can we find us opportunities and have the most potential and realize them.

Senator Michael Limtiaco: Well, I'm glad you have mentioned the medical reimbursement and that's one of the roots of the problems at the hospital. But having said that too, you have a lot of good people up there, a lot of good trustees to work with, a lot of which have expertise in the quality side, in the nursing side, and doctors as well. So, I think you're going to make a great addition to it and I thank you for your service. I thank you for your testimonial, as well.

Chairman Senator Dennis Rodriguez, Jr.: Thank you, Senator. Again Mr. Lewis, I want to congratulate you and thank you again for your commitment to serve our community. This now concludes your public hearing. We'll move forward and keep the record open for any additional testimonies that the public may provide, for you and for Ms. Hope Pangelinan. Again, thank you so much and good luck. Thank you. Before we recess and get into the second part of the hearing, I would like to make a correction. Notice for this public hearing, we sent the first notice on December 5th, 2013, second notice on December 10th, 2013. There were other dates I had mentioned earlier and these are the correct dates. Okay, so we're at recess until 5:30. Thank you.




