COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Transportation convened a public hearing on Tuesday, October 22, 2013 at 9:00 am in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Dr. Jeffrey Johnson to serve as a Member of the Public Utilities Commission, and whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by Eddie Baza Calvo, Governor of Guam, on October 14, 2013, for a term of six (6) years, to begin on November 1, 2011 and expire on October 31, 2017;
- Appointment packet forwarded to *I Liheslatura* on October 14, 2013;
- Appointment packet forwarded to this Committee for public consideration on October 15, 2013.

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via email to all Senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Tuesday, October 15, 2013 (5-Day Notice), and again on Friday, October 18, 2013 (48-Hour Notice). Announcement of such Public Hearing was also published in the Pacific Daily News and Marianas Variety on Monday, October 21, 2013.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The Public Hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:00 am. Following a scheduled recess, the Public Hearing was Called-back-to-Order at 1:00 pm to consider, among other items, the appointment of Dr. Jeffrey Johnson to serve as a Member of the Public Utilities Commission.

Opening Testimony

Attorney Fred Horecky

Senator Michael Limtiaco

Provided written testimony (see attached)

Attorney Horecky is the Legal Counsel for the Public Utilities Commission, and states his support for the appointment. He notes that he is off-island at the moment, but he is submitting his written testimony to support Dr. Johnson, whom he feels has demonstrated exceptional dedication and attentiveness over his seven years of service on the PUC. He goes on to say that Dr. Johnson was the primary catalyst for reorganizing the Commission five years ago; the resulting use of on-island consultants for the Administrative Law Judge, Legal Counsel, and

utility experts has led to cost savings to the PUC. Over the past five years, the PUC's regulatory supervisory responsibilities have also expanded to include the Port Authority of Guam and the Guam Solid Waste Authority. Dr. Johnson's role in managing these improvements and expansion, including revamping the PUC website, has been instrumental in guiding the Commission to where it is today. Attorney Horecky goes on to highlight Dr. Johnson's knowledge and policy leadership that has driven a number of positive outcomes, including the creation of GPA's Fuel Risk Management Program, and navigating the creation and updating of GPA's net metering program. Looking forward, he notes Dr. Johnson's efforts to promote transparency and the broader flow of information with the utilities, and his focus on implementing a GPA demand side management pilot project to improve customer energy efficiency. Attorney Horecky closes by noting Dr. Johnson's tireless commitment to the Commission, particularly admirable given his busy professional life, and emphasizes that his reappointment is essential to ensure that the Commission continues to effectively set rates and carry out its utility regulatory functions.

William H. Hagen

Provided written testimony (see attached)

Mr. William "Bill" H. Hagen provided written testimony in support of the nomination of Dr. Jeffrey Johnson to the PUC. He states that he has known Dr. Johnson for a number of years in different capacities, and has always been impressed with his depth of knowledge and attention to detail. He also highlights that Dr. Johnson's integrity is beyond reproach. He closes by sharing the it is not unusual to find that Dr. Johnson conducts extensive research on his own, and he is often the most informed individual in the room during PUC meetings. He states his support to keep Dr. Johnson as Chairman of the PUC.

Jeffrey Johnson

Provided oral testimony

Dr. Jeffrey Johnson provided testimony to support his reappointment to the Public Utilities Commission. He shared that he first came to Guam in 1984 on a two-year contract; after meeting his wife, they settled in Guam and raised a family. He notes that he has served in the Government of Guam in a couple of different capacities; he was appointed by Governor Gutierrez to the Guam Board of Dental Examiners, appointed twice to the PUC by Governor Camacho, and is now being again reappointed to the PUC by Governor Calvo. He is humbled by the honor, and enjoys working with his fellow Commissioners, as well as the PUC's Administrator, Legal Counsel, and ALJs. He closes that he is available to answer any questions that Senators may have, and he thanks them for the opportunity.

Question & Answer

Chairman Tom Ada: Opened the floor to questions and comments by the Committee Members and other Senators present.

Vice Speaker Cruz: States that he was dismayed with the PUC's decision to purchase the Port cranes. He notes that it has been 14 months since the PUC Order regarding the cranes, and he asks if the PUC has followed up with the Port to find out if they have complied with the order.

He further asks if Dr. Johnson was aware that the cost of the refurbishment is around \$2.1 million, and if the PUC was concerned by the cost. Vice Speaker Cruz stated that he learned of the cost through a FOIA request. [At this point, Vice Speaker Cruz distributed a document compiling the data compiled from his FOIA request – a copy is included in the supporting documents portion of this Committee Report, with the notation in the header stating "Document Provided by Vice Speaker Cruz during Public Hearing"].

Dr. Jeffrey Johnson: Answers that he believes they are nearly complete with the refurbishment of the cranes as per the guidance of the PUC and Port consultants. The PUC was not aware of the final costs and they were certainly concerned about it, but a very clear directive was established by Public Laws 30-57, 30-100, and 30-145. Due to those laws, and a 2012 budget bill requiring acquisition of cranes within six months, the PUC did not have the ability to go outside of the framework for refurbishing the cranes.

Vice Speaker Cruz: Asked if, in Dr. Johnson's opinion, the PUC should not have approved the deal had they determined that the crane deal was extremely bad for the people of Guam.

Dr. Johnson: Answers that yes, the PUC could disapprove anything. But both the PUC and Port consultants reported that the existing cranes were feasible for refurbishment, and that purchasing new cranes would take at least two years. The only option the PUC saw was to refurbish the cranes. He says that if the Vice Speaker is asking whether the PUC should have approached the Legislature and requested that they change a directive that had been established by three previous public laws, he does not believe he or the other Commissioners would have been comfortable doing that.

Vice Speaker Cruz: Asks whether Dr. Johnson was surprised that the Port budgeted \$630,000 for crane maintenance, or whether he would be shocked to find that that amount was underbudgeted, and ended up being \$1.5 million extra.

Dr. Johnson: Said it is common for utilities to spend significant amounts on the maintenance, and that they often under-budget and have to return to the PUC for further support.

Vice Speaker Cruz: Asks about the threshold for the size of contracts to be reviewed by the PUC, and offers to forward to the PUC all information and contracts his office has that should be reviewed by the PUC.

Dr. Johnson: Replies that for PGA the threshold is \$1.5 million, and for GWA and Port it is \$1 million, regardless of whether that amount is in one year or over a number of years. He adds that he would be appreciative of getting the documentation offered by Vice Speaker Cruz.

Vice Speaker Cruz: Asks if the PUC has received a plan from the Port Authority of Guam for upgrading marina facilities, as per an Order by the PUC with a deadline that is now one year overdue.

Dr. Johnson: Answered that he is not sure but he will check with his legal counsel. He knows they are in the process of upgrading the Agana marina, and work is probably also being

undertaken to repair recent damage incurred at the Agat marina, with assessments of such costs being conducted as well.

Vice Speaker Cruz: Asks if Dr. Johnson is aware that container arrivals have dropped significantly of late, with amounts of 100k in 2008, 94k in 2009, 98k in 2010, 96k in 2011, and 93k in 2012.

Dr. Johnson: Replied that that would not surprise him. After hearing the listed amounts by Vice Speaker Cruz, he emphasized that the numbers, while fluctuating, are still between 90k-100k.

Vice Speaker Cruz: Asks when the PUC will be hearing the PAG tariff increase case.

Dr. Johnson: Answered that he does not believe that date has been set yet, but it will likely be later in 2014.

Vice Speaker Cruz: Asked whether, as per an August 2012 PUC Order, the PAG has filed a financing plan for completing Phases I and II of the Port Master Plan by a deadline of November of 2012. If not, does the PUC ever implement penalties for non-compliance with its Orders.

Dr. Johnson: Answers that he believes that deadline was missed due to delays in developing the plan. He adds that, regarding punitive action, it depends; on cases when the utility requires and requests for additional time in order to gather more information, the PUC allows for that.

Vice Speaker Cruz: Asked whether he was disappointed that the consultant's report initially advised against refurbishing the cranes, only to change its recommendation on the last day before it was due.

Dr. Johnson: Answers that he was not disappointed, because he recognized the impending tight deadline and budgeting restrictions. They had until the end of the calendar year to have two functioning cranes on the rails, and only \$14 million. It was the best option left, and he feels the Legislature agreed, as it passed three public laws supporting the approach.

Senator Yamashita: Thanked Dr. Johnson for his service to the people of Guam, particularly when he first arrived and worked with disadvantaged communities. She then asks what the Government of Guam could do to address leaking waterworks infrastructure, and to extend water to families without current connections.

Dr. Johnson: Replies that, of all the utilities falling under the oversight of the PUC, GWA is the most complicated and the one he has the most interest in. He thinks the GWA management is wonderful, but they are dealing with decades of issues. And given the past decade of legal issues with the federal government, it is very important that all parties work closely together to improve the system and not risk receivership, all while not raising rates too high. He notes that this is a very difficult balance, and he and his fellow Commissioners struggle with it continuously.

Senator Yamashita: Asked if farmers could get discounted water rates.

Dr. Johnson: Answered that he believes farmers already have a discounted rate, and that the PUC welcomes everyone in the public, including farmers, to come to PUC meetings to discuss further changes that may be needed.

Senator Yamashita: Thanked him for the clarification, and added that she would look into the matter further.

Senator San Nicolas: Shared his concerns about utility rates, and asked what Dr. Johnson anticipates rates will look like in the future. He is concerned by the possibility of significant upcoming rate increases for GWA, and the continued unpredictability and increase of GPA rates.

Dr. Johnson: Replied that GPA has recently promised, in their most recent rate case, that they will not be requesting another base rate increase for at least five years. He notes that water rates will likely increase significantly to cover court-ordered system improvements, but the PUC will be reviewing that request shortly and hold a public hearing on it. He emphasizes that it is imperative that they not risk receivership, because then the government of Guam will lose all control over the ability to set rates.

Senator San Nicolas: Stated that he is concerned about back-billing regulations on Guam, particularly given increasing rates. He asked for Dr. Johnson's thoughts, and whether the PUC would possibly revisit the back-billing practice in the future.

Dr. Johnson: Answers that the law stipulates a very definitive 4-month maximum on backbilling. He agrees with Senator San Nicolas that the new smart meters will be able to reduce occurrences of back-billing. He also said that the smart meters will also benefit the system in terms of promoting energy conservation, and possibly toward introducing time-of-use rates in the future.

Senator San Nicolas: Replied that he would like to work with Dr. Johnson to develop legislation to tighten the law regarding back-billing. He then asked how the PUC addresses requests for rate increases that are driven by loss of revenues from conservation.

Dr. Johnson: Answered that the PUC has an obligation to meet fixed costs. As the people of Guam own the utilities, we are collectively involved in these decisions. He acknowledges that it is frustrating, but they have to ensure that the rates are fair, just, and reasonable for both ratepayers and the public, and that debt obligations must be met.

Senator San Nicolas: Highlighted an increase in operational expenses of \$7 million at GPA over the last four years. He asks if the PUC will actively look to contain costs.

Dr. Johnson: Answers that the PUC always focuses on costs containment. And, in reference to the \$7 million GPA increase, he shares that GPA has recently had to fund a working capital requirement in their monthly budget. While it costs additional money in the short term, these funds have lead to GPA's improved rating in the bond market, and saves ratepayers significantly in improved borrowing costs.

Senator San Nicolas: Stated his support for net metering, and asked if the PUC will be limiting the ability of net metering customers to be fairly compensated for utilizing renewable energy.

Dr. Johnson: Replies that he does not see the PUC hindering the development of renewable energy alternatives on Guam, and, in fact, he is himself a recent net metering customer. He notes that the PUC recently rejected a request by GPA to change the one-for-one kwh exchange of power for net metering customers. He notes challenges in finding ways for lower-income individuals and families to be able to afford the upfront costs associated with becoming net metering customers. He also recognizes the concerns GPA has, but the PUC does not plan to change net metering policy until GPA is able to provide more information and studies regarding the impact of the process on the system and its revenues.

Senator San Nicolas: Stated his concern about the idea of privatizing GPA, GWA, or the Port of Guam, particularly given the lack of potential competition in those areas. He asks for Dr. Johnson of his thoughts on the issue.

Dr. Johnson: Answered that he believes the utilities should remain under the ownership of the people of Guam. He added that GPA has entered into a number of public-private partnerships which have benefited the utility, and he believes the PPP approach would be useful to consider rather than overall privatization.

Senator Tony Ada: Stated that his questions have already been answered, and he thanks Dr. Johnson for his continued service. He states his support for the reappointment.

Senator Duenas: Shared that he has known Dr. Johnson for a number of years, and that he shares his colleagues' support for the reappointment. He goes on to say that he feels compelled to clarify, for the record, the Legislature's decision-making process in regards to the Port cranes. He notes that the antiquated rails at the Port limited options when it came to purchasing cranes, which made the option of refurbishing the existing cranes that much more necessary. He appreciates that Dr. Johnson and the PUC work well with the utilities falling under their oversight, and that they protect the public's interest without micromanaging decisions.

Senator Morrison: Thanks Dr. Johnson for his service, and asks whether the PUC is aware of any possible improvements to wells in Ugum to aid the system in the southern part of the island. He also asks about southern wastewater treatment plants.

Dr. Johnson: Replied that he is somewhat aware of the matter. He has asked GWA about utilizing the springs in the south. The issue, he learned, is that because these sources are derived from surface water, the EPA guidelines for chlorination and cleaning make their development cost prohibitive. They are primarily working with Ugum and Fena, and more improvements are planned for the former. In regards to improvements to the wastewater facilities located in the southern part of the island, he shares that GWA is aware of the issues, they are planning significant improvements that will be funded with an upcoming bond issuance, and they are working with the federal EPA to negotiate a long-term timeline to come up to secondary treatment standards.

Senator Morrison: Thanked Dr. Johnson for his response.

Senator Limitaco: Thanked Dr. Johnson for his continued service. He adds that he too does not necessarily agree with the purchase of the Port cranes, but he respects Dr. Johnson's knowledge and hard work, and he supports his reappointment.

Chairman Ada: Said that a number of his questions have already been answered. He notes that he has observed Dr. Johnson chair a number of meetings, and he appreciates his dedication and professionalism. He supports the reappointment and hopes to see him continue on the PUC, and asks if there is anything Dr. Johnson plans to changes in his third term on the Commission.

Dr. Johnson: Answered that the PUC faces a number of challenges, including system reliability at GPA. Recently, the PUC has started a docket on system performance for GPA. While smart grid and upgrades are good, he would like to know whether work on these other projects has distracted from focusing on the performance of the core work of the utility. He is uncertain whether or not performance has actually declined, but he believes maintaining this information will help measure it. The PUC is also beginning to explore promoting demand-side management for smaller residential customers.

Chairman Ada: Thanked Dr. Johnson. He then stated that, as there are no further questions or comments, the Committee will consider the matter of Dr. Johnson's appointment to the PUC as having been duly heard.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee notes that the precedent set by recent AG Opinion LEG 13-0193, regarding the staggering of terms for the Board of Directors of the Port Authority of Guam, was followed by both the Governor's Office and the Committee when addressing the term of Dr. Johnson on the Public Utilities Commission.

On May 5, 2009, Dr. Johnson was reappointed by the Governor to serve a term of six years on the PUC, and he was subsequently confirmed by the Legislature on Sept. 11, 2009. However, in applying the methodology used in AG Opinion LEG 13-0193, in which set expiration dates are extrapolated out from the date the PUC was created (Nov. 1, 1984), it was determined that the seat filled by Dr. Johnson should have expired on Oct. 31, 2011. As he was confirmed in 2009, both the Committee and the Office of the Governor agree that it is necessary for Dr. Johnson to be reappointed and confirmed for the new term running from Nov. 1, 2011, until Oct. 31, 2017.

The Committee on Public Safety, Infrastructure and Maritime Administration hereby reports on the nomination of **Jeffrey Johnson** to serve as a Member of the Public Utilities Commission, for a term of six (6) years, as defined by §12001 of Chapter 12 of Title 12 Guam Code Annotated, in a seat reserved for a member "from the business community of Guam", beginning on Nov. 1, 2011, and set to expire on Oct. 31, 2017, with the recommendation **TO CONFIG. M**





Dear Chairman Ada:

I am presently off-island and unable to attend the hearing on Dr. Jeffrey Johnson's reappointment. I therefore submit this written testimony in support of the reappointment of Dr. Jeffrey Johnson as a Commissioner to the Public Utilities Commission.

As Legal Counsel to the Commission, I have had the opportunity and pleasure to work closely with Dr. Johnson regarding Commission matters over the past five years. Dr. Johnson has carried out his duties with the Commission with dedication and attentiveness. He is a hard working, experienced Commissioner. Dr. Johnson has served on the Commission for over seven years.

Dr. Johnson was the primary moving force in reorganizing the Commission five years ago. This reorganization has resulted in the use of on-island consultants for ALJ, Legal Counsel, and utility experts. This reorganization has resulted in cost savings for the PUC. The Commission, as a result of the structure created by Dr. Johnson, has also been able to handle the expanded work load. Within the past few years, the regulatory supervisory responsibilities of the Commission have been expanded to include the Port Authority of Guam and the Guam Solid Waste Authority.

He has initiated measures to ensure the smooth and effective functioning of the Commission's contract review and rate making processes, including:

ŧ:

- A. The scheduling of monthly meetings of the Commission to conduct its business, with two meetings a month being scheduled when necessary;
- B. The expeditious resolution of Guam Power Authority, Guam Waterworks Authority, Port Authority, Guam Solid Waste Authority, and Telecommunications matters;
- C. Initiatives to streamline the rate making process, through the establishment of a collaborative working relationship between the Commission and the utilities with the goal of ensuring that rates are just and reasonable;
- D. Efforts to make the rate making process more cost effective;

The substantial body of work undertaken and completed by the Commission can be viewed at the PUC website, www.guampuc.com. It was under Dr. Johnson's leadership that the PUC website was updated and revised to provide the public with more up-to-date information on the rate making process.

Dr. Johnson has also provided the intellectual and policy leadership for initiatives undertaken by the Commission. He has a broad knowledge of the various utilities and a working knowledge of technical aspects of power and energy generation. He has pushed the creation of a Fuel Risk Management Program at GPA. He has ensured that the Legislative initiatives concerning net metering have been implemented.

Recently, Dr. Johnson has requested the creation of new GPA Dockets that will examine the system reliability of the GPA power system and the outage reporting protocols of GPA. The goal will be to ensure a broader flow of information from GPA to the public announcing each power outage, indicating its duration (if known), and explaining the underlying causes of such power outage. Also, Chairman Johnson wishes to further require GPA to implement a demand side management pilot project which will improve customer energy efficiency.

Chairman Johnson has carried out his PUC duties in a committed and devoted manner. Despite being a busy professional, he has worked tirelessly, on an ongoing and daily basis, to address pending PUC matters and to ensure that the Commission's work is done in a timely manner. Dr. Johnson's reappointment to the Commission is essential to ensure that the Commission continues to effectively set rates and carry out its utility regulatory functions. I urge the members of the Committee to support the reappointment of Dr. Johnson as a Commissioner to the Public Utilities Commission. Thank you for your consideration of this testimony.





Council nixes closure expansion near test site

THE Western Pacific Fishery Management Council has reiterated the concerns raised by fishermen in the Northern Mariana Islands, who are opposed to the Navy's plan to expand the closure around the Farallon de Medinilla testing range.

CNMI fishermen expressed concern that the Navy's plan would cut their livelihood as the area planned to be closed is a prime bottom-fishing

During the four-day meeting in Honolulu which concluded Friday, the fishery council noted that the military's plans for the expansion of activities around the islands of Tinian and Pagan may hurt fishing in those areas as well.

Farallon de Medinilla, which forms part of the Marianas

Land-Based Operational Range Complex, is an uninhabited island that is approximately 1.7 miles long and 0.3 miles wide (approximately 206 acres). The island is part of the CNMI and is leased for use by the U.S. government.

The island is located approximately 50 miles north-northeast of Saipan and approximately 150 miles north of Guam. FDM's operational training activi-ties generally consist of aerial bombardment, naval surface fire support, and raiding craft fire.

During the meeting, the fisheries council decided to conduct a review of the current CNMI bottom-fish fishery and its existing management regime and develop an options paper for council consideration that would remove the large vessel area closure for bottom-fish in the southern portion of the archipelago.

Man dead, woman shot in Yigo

A MAN has died and a woman is now on life support at the hospital following an alleged domestic violence incident in Yigo on Saturday night.

The man, in his 60s, was found lifeless at a residence on Chalan Emsley, Yigo when officers from the Dededo Precinct responded to a reported shooting at around 8:06 p.m.

According to Officer A.J. Balajadia, Guam Police Department spokesperson, the woman was immediately rushed to Guam Memorial Hospital and was still in critical condition as of press time.

Both identities were withheld pending the notification of their relatives. They were both initially identified as Yapese. According to GPD, the woman

is about 25 years old. Initial findings by criminal investigation officers indicated the man died from a selfinflicted gunshot wound.

Balajadia said the sched-uled autopsy this afternoon is expected to reveal more information on the cause of the man's death.

Adelup files new appeal on solid waste

THE legal counsel of the Office of the Governor has filed another appeal before the Minds Circuit Court, asking the state of the Atlorney Central in the solid waste case.

Attorney Sandra Miller, the legal counsel of the Office of the Governor, is bringing the issue to the Court of Appeals while District Court Judge Frances Tydingco-Gatewood is still reviewing a July 1 court order denying Adelup's motion to halt the procurement process of all consent decree projects.

On Sept. 26, Adelup also filed an appeal before the Ninth Circuit regarding the May 16 order of the chief judge denying the substitution of the Office of the Attorney General with a private law firm and appealing the district court's denial of their motion for reconsideration dated Aug. 13.

Since April 26, the Office of

the Governor has been attempting to remove the OAG as its counsel, raising several issues which include conflict of representation and differences in litigation strategy with respect to the payment of Layon land with Section 30 bond funds.

The court had denied the substitution of the OAG and only allowed the Cabot Mantanona LLP law firm to represent GovGuam on the issues raised in the former land-

owners' motion to intervene. Motion for clarification

During her decision on the motion for clarification, Tydingco-Gatewood firmed the OAG's role, explaining that although the OAG has cooperated and assisted the federal receiver with a variety of issues, the government of Guam remains the actual client.

The Office of the Governor repeatedly stated their loss of confidence in the OAG's legal representation, accusing the government attorneys of taking sides against GovGuam in favor

of the U.S. government and the federal receiver.

Pending motion

In a separate filing, attorney Miller asked the court to decide on the motion to stay and for further relief which she filed on Sept. 13.

According to Miller, the first motion to stay is still pending and the decision of the court could avert the need for a stay pending before the Ninth

Miller raised concerns over the lack of GovGuam representation by the counsel of its choice since the Cabot Mantanona law firm had no further role in the solid waste case with the court's denial of the former landowners' motion to intervene.

"Even if the chief legal counsel of the governor or Cabot Mantanona LLP were asked by the court to appear at the Oct. 25 hearing, their appearance would be on behalf of the Office of the Governor not the government and would be clearly inadequate given their uncertain status and role,' Miller said.

On Friday, at 9:30 a.m., the court will hear a motion to unscal and a motion regarding the request for order directing the federal receiver to participate in a mediation process before the presentation by Gershman, Brickner & Bratton Inc. of its quarterly report.

Velasquez landed a left and took Dos Santos down headfirst to the mat, causing refer-ee Herb Dean to stop the bout



"He beat me up. What can I say?" Dos Santos said in the ring after the fight. "He's a great fighter, I just want to

give a good fight to the fans." Dos Santos was not in the post-fight press conference.

Velasquez landed several lefts to start the second round and a kick to the head as well,




