COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Resolution No. 379-32 (LS) was introduced on May 8, 2014, by Senator Michael F.Q. San Nicolas and Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D. The resolution was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the resolution's primary author on May, 2014.

The Committee on Aviation, Ground Transportation, Regulatory Concerns and Future Generations convened a public hearing on June 4, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the hearing agenda was Resolution 379-32 (LS). The hearing was adjourned at 11:13 a.m.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Michael San Nicolas stated that there federal statute prevents the government of Guam from exploring the option of Social Security for its employees, specifically Subsection B(1) of Section 218 of the Social Security Act, which excludes Guam and other territories. He stated that the resolution seeks to request Congresswoman Madeleine Bordallo to put that option on the table for the government of Guam. Chairman San Nicolas stated that the resolution makes reference to a funding stream if Guam were allowed to participate in Social Security - Section 30 funds in excess of the amounts necessary for debt service. He stated that because Section 30 money, which is traditionally given toward the end of a given fiscal year, is usually used to cover budgetary shortfalls for that current year. He suggested an idea that funding for contributions to the Social Security program should come from the Section 30 funds before being used for other purposes. Chairman San Nicolas further stated that members of the current defined contribution plan may not have adequate savings upon retirement which may cause them to seek assistance from various social programs. He stated that this issue will cause a ripple effect in our community. The resolution will move us in the direction of being able to address this issue and include the government of Guam defined contribution members into the Social Security system. He stated that it needs to happen first at the federal level with our congresswoman being able to get Guam included in the state exemption for participation in Social Security.

Doris Flores Brooks spoke in support of Resolution 379-32 (LS). She read a section from the Citizen Centric Report, issue by the Office of Public Accountability, which we issued last August. There is an inequity between the defined benefit plan and defined contribution plan. The retirement fund closed the defined benefit plan because it was too costly. She agreed with the Chairman that individuals on the defined contribution plan may find themselves with not enough income when they retire and may be using public assistance programs. The OPA report recommended that individuals on the defined contribution plan be allowed to enroll in the Social Security system so that they may have some form of retirement annuity. Ms. Brooks stated that the government of Guam should be given the option to enroll with Social Security. It is important that members of the retirement fund need to have some sort of annuity. She again reiterated her support for Resolution 379-32 (LS).

Senator Vicente Pangelinan wanted to clarify which government of Guam employees would be eligible for Social Security because some are on the defined benefits plan while others would be on the defined contributions plan.

Mrs. Brooks stated that she envisions members on the defined contribution plan becoming members of Social Security. She stated that, at the very least, the government of Guam should be allowed to consider membership into Social Security.

Senator Pangelinan stated that contributions rate are different and have to be taken into consideration. He stated that the resolution allows dialogue to occur on the issue and different options to be considered.

Mrs. Brooks stated that private sector employees, who are members of the Social Security plan, will be better off after retirement than the government employee who retires and will only have their savings, which she stated will likely be inadequate. She stated that members of the defined contribution plan need a safety net.

Senator Aline A. Yamashita brought up the issue of a military member who is having difficulty with his retirement. She mentioned that she would like to continue the dialogue on Social Security and retirement issues.

Chairman San Nicolas clarified that his Committee does not have oversight of the Retirement Fund and stated that the conversation on retirement issues can be brought up with the proper legislative committee. Chairman San Nicolas thanked his colleagues and the Public Auditor before adjourning the hearing.

WHEREAS, employees of the government of Guam who are currently enrolled in the government of Guam Defined Contribution Plan would have a more competitive total compensation package if, in addition to joint contributions with the government of Guam to their retirement plan, they are also contributing to Social Security, which would have cost approximately eighteen million dollars (\$18,000,000) to the government of Guam in fiscal year 2012; and

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Resolution seeks Social Security for GovGuam employees

Guam - Senator Michael San Nicolas is hoping for Congresswoman Madeleine Bordallo's assistance in ensuring that thousands of Government of Guam employees under the Defined Contribution Plan be included under Social Security. Resolution 379 introduced earlier this month calls on Guam's delegate to introduce federal legislation to allow GovGuam employees this opportunity.

"We want to make sure that our defined contribution employees, we have 7,000 of them and their retirement is limited only to what they put in and what it grows to but there is no Social Security element to it which means it is no social safety net and if they retire and their money gets depleted they're not going to be anything to backstop them and then that puts them at risk of having to go on welfare, the government having to subsidize their living in other ways," he said.

San Nicolas says the reason Guam doesn't have a Social Security option in the Government of Guam plan is because federal law explicitly excludes the island from being able to participate at the state level. An Office of Public Accountability report from 2011 meanwhile concluded that GovGuam employees under the DC plan will not have enough to sustain themselves when they plan to retire.

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Officials press GovGuam on retirement

The government of Guam faces urgency to enroll almost 8,000 government of Guam employees into the U.S. Social Security program, some of the island's elected officials said at a legislative hearing yesterday.

Without Social Security, the retirees, who were hired on or after Oct. 1, 1995, under GovGuam's Defined Contribution plan, won't have a monthly pension. The only money they'd get at retirement, if GovGuam was their only employment, is what they've saved, plus GovGuam's contribution of 5 percent of their base pay.

With \$40,000 as the average amount saved by Defined Contribution members, future retirees in the plan could run out of money in less than three years, the officials acknowledged.

Public Auditor Doris Flores Brooks, who was the only one who testified at the hearing on the issue yesterday, said it's important for GovGuam to give the retirees the "dignity of retirement." Without a better safety net, they'd end up on the public welfare rolls, officials said.

At issue at the hearing was legislative resolution 379, which calls on Guam's lone voice in Congress, Delegate Madeleine Bordallo, to seek congressional authority to allow GovGuam into the Social Security system.

Encouraged by CNMI

GovGuam employees are specifically barred from opting into Social Security membership, said Sen. Michael San Nicolas, but he wasn't clear on why that's the case. He's the resolution's chief author.

The Guam officials are encouraged by the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands government's experience with Social Security.

When the CNMI's retirement fund went bankrupt a few years ago, after the local government stopped making contributions to the fund, Social Security allowed the CNMI government to opt in.

GovGuam's retirement fund isn't near bankruptcy, as the local government continues to make payments into the fund, but it faces a possible \$1.4 billion shortfall on the amount it will owe future retirees, previous audit reports have shown.

"The situation in the CNMI was dire, but when you think of the Defined Contribution members,

they're in very dire straits also," the public auditor said.

Sen. Ben Pangelinan, chairman of the legislative committee with oversight over the GovGuam budget, said he agrees that Defined Contribution members face a dire retirement future.

The older GovGuam retirement plan, called Defined Benefit, which had an October 1995 membership cutoff, guarantees retirees a monthly pension and a cost of living allowance for as long as they live. Their surviving spouse also will receive some economic benefits.

San Nicolas said he hopes Bordallo will pursue the Social Security option "with the same tenacity" she has shown for her support of the military buildup.

Clock is ticking

The urgency to provide a solution for the Defined Contribution members, specifically to provide them with Social Security coverage, gets more pronounced as months pass.

It takes at least 10 years of contributions into Social Security, and next year is the must-enroll year for Defined Contribution members who face retirement in 2025, the officials said.

The Government of Guam Retirement Fund also is proposing to provide the Defined Contribution members enhanced benefits by giving them the option to raise their contribution from 5 percent of pay to 8 or 9 percent of pay, the fund's board chairman, Joe T. San Agustin has said.

The fund wants GovGuam to match employees' higher contribution. Pangelinan said he doesn't support expanding the GovGuam share of contributions for the Defined Contribution members, so the two sides will try to iron out their differences.

- 4 was signed into law by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt on August 14,
- 5 1935; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the Social Security Act granted money to states to provide
- 7 unemployment insurance, aid to families with dependent children, public
- 8 health services, assistance to aged individuals, assistance to the blind,
- 9 maternal and child welfare, and is most widely known benefits to retirees and
- 10 survivors; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the Social Security retirement security program did not
- 12 originally include any state or local government employees, but currently

- 1 there are voluntary agreements between states and the Social Security
- 2 Administration authorized under Section 218 of the Social Security Act which
- 3 determine which employees in state or local government service are covered
- 4 or not covered by Social Security; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Guam is specifically excluded from entering into a
- 6 voluntary agreement for establishing the scope of coverage of employment
- 7 under the Social Security retirement program with the Social Security
- 8 Administration by Subsection (b)(1) of Section 218; and
- 9 **WHEREAS**, the provision of an adequate retirement security program
- 10 to government of Guam employees ensures that once employees intend to
- 11 retire, they are able to; and
- 12 WHEREAS, before 1995, all government of Guam employees were
- 13 enrolled in the Government of Guam Retirement Fund's Defined Benefit Plan;
- 14 and
- WHEREAS, since 1995, new hires in the government of Guam are
- 16 enrolled in the defined contribution program, which provides individual
- 17 accounts similar to private sector 401K retirement accounts and matches
- 18 mandatory contributions of five percent (5%) of employees' gross pay; and
- 19 WHEREAS, most private sector employees also contribute to and
- 20 become eligible for the benefits provided under Social Security, but since
- 21 government of Guam employees do not contribute to Social Security, their
- 22 retirement income from this source is usually little to none; and

WHEREAS, since they and their employer do not contribute to Social Security, employees who are eligible only for the government of Guam Defined Contribution Plan do not have a retirement plan that is competitive with that offered to most private sector employees and thus their retirement income may be inadequate to support a good quality of life for our government of Guam retirees; and

WHEREAS, employees who first entered government service when the Defined Contribution Plan was initially offered are rapidly approaching the age of retirement; and

WHEREAS, in order to avail themselves of the benefits of both their Defined Contribution Retirement Plan and Social Security, since the minimum period of covered employment to receive basic benefits under Social Security is forty (40) calendar quarters, coverage under Social Security must be made available to them as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, employees of the government of Guam who are currently enrolled in the government of Guam Defined Contribution Plan would have a more competitive total compensation package if, in addition to joint contributions with the government of Guam to their retirement plan, they are also contributing to Social Security, which would have cost approximately eighteen million dollars (\$18,000,000) to the government of Guam in fiscal year 2012; and

WHEREAS, covering employees of the government of Guam who are currently enrolled in the government of Guam Defined Contribution Plan should increase Social Security payments to the pockets of our people by about one hundred seventy-five million dollars (\$175,000,000) annually in twenty-five (25) years with no risk of accumulating any local unfunded liability; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that I Mina Trentai Dos Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, on behalf of

the people of Guam, respectfully requests that Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo introduce legislation to include all government of Guam employees not enrolled in a government of Guam Defined Benefit Plan to contribute jointly with the government of Guam to Social Security, by allowing the government of Guam to enter into a Section 218 agreement with the Social Security Administration, and to set up a system by which Section 30 revenue, in excess of amounts necessary to service existing debt for which Section 30 revenue is pledged, shall be provided to the Social Security Administration to directly and reliably fund the government of Guam's employer contributions on behalf of its employees; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam Delegate to the United States Congress; and to the Honorable Eddie B. Calvo, I Maga'lahen Guåhan.

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
