COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 1-33 (LS) was introduced on January 5, 2015 by Speaker Judith T. Won Pat and was subsequently referred on January 6, 2015 to the Committee on Transportation, Infrastructure, Lands, Border Protection, Veterans' Affairs and Procurement (Committee) The Committee convened a public hearing on January 29, 2015 at 9:00 am in *I Liheslaturan Guahan* Public Hearing Room.

Public Notice Requirements

Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on January 22, 2015 (5-Day Notice) and again on January 27, 2015 (48-Hour Notice).

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

Chairperson Ada: Called the Hearing to order at 9:07am. Senator Tom Ada yields to Speaker Won Pat, author of bill 1-33(LS).

Speaker Won Pat: Explains bill 1-33(LS) that it transfers Title of Lot 5397 to the University of Guam, which would be an essential component for the university. Currently, the property is jointly controlled by the University of Guam, Department of Agriculture, and Department of Parks and Recreations. The transfer would allow the university to stay on track to increase revenue sources, foster sustainability, and build capacity. Speaker Won Pat indicates that the university will be the responsible owner of the property and any development of the land will compliment it with the intent of the conservation reserve. She acknowledges suggested recommendation for amendments on bill 1-33(LS) and informed the Chairman she would submit amendments to the Committee.

Chairman Ada: The committee will receive and incorporate the amendments on the bill. He now calls on the people who have signed up to testify to please approach the table.

Celestino F. Aguon, Chief, Department of Agriculture Aquatic and Wild Life Resource. (Oral and Written Testimony) The Department of Agriculture opposes bill 1-33(LS) as introduced. The main concern is that the property consists of a pristine forest, which the Department of Agriculture is mandated to manage on all conservation lands. Once the bill is passed the Dept. of Agriculture is concerned they may loose control of the conservation land because of the change in ownership. They would like to see the designation of property kept for conservation purposes.

Chris Felix, Regent, University of Guam (Oral Testimony) Is just here as a Regent for the University of Guam speaking in favor of Bill 1-33(LS). He believes there is no one better in protecting the property than the University of Guam.

Michael J. Borja, Director of Department of Land Management (Oral and Written Testimony) Explains there is a lot of detailed work that needs to happen in order to transfer property. Mr. Borja explains, that in order for the Title transfer to occur there has to be a concurrence with Department of Land Management, Department of Public Works and Department of Agriculture. A written letter of concurrence has been submitted to the Department of Land Management by the Department of Public Works agreeing to the transfer of Title. The Department of Agriculture will concur with the transfer of title as long as the provisions that were discussed earlier are honored in regards to the land remaining as conservation area. He explains that with all 3 concurrences in place, the Department of Land Management would have the ability to transfer the ownership of land to the University of Guam.

Dr. Robert A. Underwood, President of University of Guam (Oral and Written Testimony) Explains that he had met with the Department of Land Management, Department of Agriculture, and Department of Parks and Recs about 3 years ago. They reviewed the entire history of this issue and the original intent was to grant the land to the University of Guam, but with some understanding of pristine areas and conservations be put in place. He believes that if the legislature feels these caveats are needed in the bill, then certainly the University will wholeheartedly support it. Dr. Underwood does want to assure all parties that there is no intent of building a whole new school or campus of any sort that will destroy pristine forests. He believes they have the academic resources and appreciation for the environment, which would help in making the conservation area more useful and available for research to the public. So, the University of Guam does support the intent of bill 1-33(LS) and will do their part in making sure that other agencies concerns are dealt with in regards to conserving the pristine forest.

Chairman Ada: Opens the panel up for senators to speak.

Senator Aguon: Asks what would happen if the leadership 5-10yrs down the road changes and they want to disregard the pristine conservation area to maximize total usage of the property. Would it be appropriate to incorporate a more highlight of this property that is being utilized by U.O.G. with the conservation area being a major feature.

Dr. Underwood: Explains the intent of the bill is clear, but they still have to look at the specific language. The University had the opportunity to buy the whole property, but failed to do so at the time. So, now these areas have a lot of development with intrusions in them, which the University has to deal with. I certainly endorse any covenant, that if violated will reverse the transfer of land.

Senator Anthony Ada: Asks Celestino Aguon how much of this lot is considered pristine forest.

Celestino Aguon: Did not have the exact numbers of the pristine forest, but explained that the property is fairly defined around the marine lab area and further north its topography is much greener. His initial thought was they were removing pristine property and that was their main concern. They can partner with the University of Guam multiple ways to get this thing to the next level.

Senator Anthony Ada: Asks does the Department of Agriculture look at instead of transferring the whole lot of land to just cut out that pristine forest section and keep it within the Dept. of Agriculture.

Celestino Aguon: As far as ownership goes they are not in disagreement with the University. They are only concern with the pristine portion of land and are open to working with the University of Guam.

Senator Anthony Ada: ok he is glad to hear that.

Chairman Ada: Closes by thanking everyone.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslatura* finds that Lot No. 5397, Municipality of Barrigada is registered in the name of the Government of Guam as owner in fee simple, subject to a reversionary interest of the United States in the event the lot is used for other than its intended purposes. Lot No. 5397 is commonly known as the "Cliff Line Property". Title in the name of the Government of Guam was granted by the Superior Court of Guam on March 29, 1999, pursuant to a Petition for Registration of Title to Land.


I Liheslatura notes that historically in January 1966 the Director of Land Management of the Government of Guam filed and approved the establishment of Conservation Areas. The administration of Lot No. 5397 is stated as follows: "This area will be administered and controlled by the College of Guam in conjunction with the Departments of Agriculture, Land Management and Public Works." I Liheslatura further finds that Public Law 22-18 designated Lot No. 5397 as Reserved Land to be managed jointly by the University of Guam, the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Park and Recreation for the Marine Lab Expansion, Conservation

Reserve and Prehistoric Site. Lot No. 5397 holds perhaps the best preserved tract of limestone forest on Guam, resulting from the inaccessibility of the area due to the difficult tower karst terrain that pervades it. Since January 1966 Lot No. 5397 has been in the control of the University, where it has been a biological conservation site for the purposes of advancing the conservation, protection and study of the natural soil and water conditions and of all native plants, animal and water life. Further, Lot No. 5397 holds the University of Guam Marine Laboratory, Marine Laboratory Visitors Housing Facility, and the Water and Environmental Research Institute (WERI). The lot is used extensively by University classes for field trips and by University faculty in the natural sciences for research. Future plans by the University include continued use of the natural features of this lot in education and research, and accommodating constructions of new facilities at the Marine Lab and WERI.

I Liheslatura finds that if title to Lot No. 5397 were transferred to the University, the University would be free to proceed with specific projects and plans to address these concerns. Inasmuch as the University has maintained administrative control of Lot No. 5397 since January 1966, transfer of title of Lot No. 5397 to the University would play a vital part in increasing the University's revenue sources, fostering sustainability, and capacity building. It is for this particular reason that I Liheslatura finds it is now appropriate and fiscally responsible that title of Lot No. 5397 be transferred to the University.

The use of Lot No. 5397 shall be consistent with the original intent of the 'expansion of the Marine Lab, [as a] Conservation Reserve and Prehistoric Site" and for the specific use of the Water and Environmental Research Institute (WERI) or succeeding organization, and as related to the advancement of the conservation, and the protection and study of the natural soil and water conditions and of all native plants, animal and water life. Any plans to construct facilities for the expansion of the Marine Lab and WERI or change from the intended use shall require the concurrence of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* by statute.

Section 4. Zoning. Lot 5397 shall be split-zoned and multi-use.

(1) The area of Lot 5397 that is east of Lot 5397-R/W (otherwise known as the road to the Marine Lab) shall be a Conservation Reserve Zone and Use (for education and research of the soil, water, plants, and animals of the Reserve). Top areas of cliffs will absorb the zone and use of the next contiguous lot inland,

- 1 (2) the area of Lot 5397 that is west, north and south of Lot 5397-R/W shall be
- 2 a School/Public Facilities Zone and Use for the expansion of the Marine Lab and
- 3 WERI). Top areas of cliffs shall absorb the zone and use of the next contiguous lot

Corners six and nineteen are six-inch by six-inch concrete monuments found. Corner seven is a three-fourths inch iron pipe found with concrete collar. 



- Lot No. 5397, Mangilao, has gone through the Land Registration Title Act with a decree establishing title filed with our office as Instrument No. 600683 in favor of the Government of Guam.
- 3. Lot No. 5397 was established as a conservation area to be "administered and controlled by the College of Guam in conjunction with the Departments of Agriculture, Land Management and Public Works." This tract is free from any clouds unless the departments noted above object to the transfer in favor of the University of Guam.
- 4. In consideration of the Chamorro Land Trust Commission's defined course of action with reference to the transfer of properties, we request that the following reversionary clause be incorporated in its legislative presentation:

"Title and ownership of the transferred property remain with the University of Guam for a period of ten (10) years. In the event that the title and ownership for the property be conveyed or otherwise transferred to another entity, such title and ownership of the property shall revert to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission"

Department of Land Management supports the University of Guam with the realization efforts of their plans, goals, and objectives while focusing on the enhancements and

protection of the natural resources, and does not object to the title transfer in favor of the University of Guam.



The Department of Agriculture submits testimony not in favor of Bill 1-33, An Act to transfer Title of Lot No. 5397 Municipality of Barrigada, Guam, to the University of Guam. This lot has historically been under the University of Guam's administrative control. The department is not in favor of this transfer for the following reasons:

- 1. The area contains undisturbed limestone forest that is a rare and valuable habitat on Guam that is necessary for the survival of many of Guam's native species. The recent increase in development on Guam has diminished habitat necessary for the recovery of locally and federally listed endangered species;
- 2. Guam has made conservation commitments to the US Department of Interior in order to avoid Critical Habitat (CH) designation. The conservation of this land could provide the necessary support for Government of Guam to avoid the designation of CH and the associated land restrictions;
- 3. The Department of Agriculture's, Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources is in favor of preserving as much of Guam's native limestone forest habitats, it recommends placing the property under its control;

Dear Speaker Won Pat:

Buenas yan Hafa Adai. Thank you for forwarding the inquiry from the Department of Agriculture. Please find below our response to their questions.

1. What is the University's long term goal for the property once transferred?

Response: The University intends to maintain the intent of the law that identifies this land as Reserved Land for the purpose of Marine Lab expansion, Conservation Reserve, and Prehistoric Site. The University also intends to continue to keep appropriate government and environmental agencies informed of any actions that may change within Lot No. 5397. As the Marine Laboratory and Water Environmental Research Institute (WERI) mission grows, their area will also change and expand. accordingly, to include the faculty and research housing area located there. The area will also be used to further efforts to conserve, protect, and study native plants, animals, and marine life, as well as natural soil and water conditions. Trails that are currently used today by faculty and researchers may be better developed with additional native and endangered species plants strategically placed in a protected area for student learning and research. Some of these trails extend past George Washington High School (GWHS) up to the Guam Community College (GCC). GCC programs are also using parts of the area for research and education. The current University Vision 2025 Physical Master Plan continues to keep the area generally the same with only informal trails and guided tours to limit damage to key specimen floraand fauna. Area of potential renovations will be in the Marine Laboratory, WERI, and faculty research housing areas and along the boundaries existing with the main campus.

2. Would they safeguard existing possible habitat areas?

Response: Yes, within the extent of University responsibilities. The University does not intend to encroach into other government and environmental agency responsibilities, but will assist, as it has been, in the safeguarding of these types of

areas. Areas identified as habitat areas will possibly be marked better and documented for the purpose of research and education as funding permits. Where additional improvements or protection measures are considered, it will still be the intent of the University to continue coordination with appropriate government and environmental agencies for information and documentation. The University is already in dialog with the Northern Soil and Water Conservation District and GCC on how to coordinate research and education activities in the area. The Northern Soil and Water Conservation District has also expressed interest with UOG on planting the endangered Serianthes nelsonii to perpetuate the species as well as make it accessible for student and community awareness along with other native species.

3. Property highly erodible for development.

Response: The University understands the complex geology of the parcel and will conduct geological assessments of any areas that would be constructed upon prior to any development. The University will build in areas that are suitable based upon those assessments and implement best management practices to proven erosion mitigation techniques during and after any construction.

4. Would they safeguard indigenous trees and plant material?

Response: Yes, within the extent of University responsibilities. The University does not intend to encroach into other government and environmental agency responsibilities, but will assist, as it has been, in the safeguarding of these types of natural resources. Areas identified with indigenous trees and plant material will possibly be marked better and documented for the purpose of research and education as funding permits. Additionally, with the pending official establishment of the University Landscape Committee, part of their oversight can be to identify and strategically place additional indigenous and endangered trees and plants within the conservation area for research and education purposes. Included in the proposed committee is an ex-officio member appointed by the Guam Department of Agriculture Division of Forestry, Urban and Community Forestry Program Coordinator. This representative currently attends the ad hoc Landscape Committee meetings.

Be assured that the University of Guam will continue to be great stewards of Lot No. 5397 as it has been in the past even after Bill 1-33 is passed into law.
