I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 122-33 (COR) was introduced on June 8, 2015 by Senator Tina Muña Barnes, and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Historic Preservation on June 8, 2015.

The Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Historic Preservation convened a public hearing on Bill No. 122-33 (COR) on Tuesday, July 14, 2015 at 9:00 AM in I Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:22 A.M.

Chairperson: This public hearing by the Committee on Municipal Affairs, Tourism, Housing and Historic Preservation is now called to order. <u>Chairperson</u>: Ladies and gentlemen first on the agenda this morning is Bill No. 121-33 (COR) "An act to appropriate funds from the Fiscal Year 2014 Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) surplus fund to the Guam Museum Fund" and then Bill No. 122-33 (COR) "An act to appropriate funds from the Fiscal Year 2014 Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) surplus fund to the Guam Visitor's Bureau". Joining me here this morning is my Vice Chairman, Vice Speaker B.J. Cruz and to my left is Senators Tony Ada and Mary Torres. Good morning everyone and thank you for joining me once again this morning. Here to testify this morning is Mayor Robert Hofmann. Mr. Mayor?

Mayor Robert Hofmann: Hafa adai and good morning, my name is Robert Hofmann and I am the Mayor of Sinajana as well as the Mayor's representative to the Guam Visitors' Bureau Board. I am also a big supporter of what we're trying to accomplish to get the Museum funded. So, let me read the testimony provided by Mr. Jon Nathan Denight. Mayor Robert Hofmann reads the written testimony, of which a copy is provided.

Chairperson: Thank you Mr. Mayor!

<u>Mayor Robert Hofmann:</u> Sure...wait is this also for the murals? It was a wonderful project and I'd like to thank Steph from your office. The Mayors were wondering if they could get some of them refurbished and done. The Mayors really like them and people take pictures with them. This will kind of give it a fresh new look and we could be ready for FestPac too. We are thankful for the HOT bond and if we could them to our area, we really appreciate it.

<u>Senator Mary C. Torres:</u> Hi Mr. Mayor..l'm looking at Bill No. 122-33 and in the bill it mentions that \$200,000 is appropriated for improvement, refurbishment, restoration, repair and/or maintenance of one park or attraction per village, including village murals. That seems like a tall order? How many murals are there?

Mayor Robert Hofmann: There are 18.

Senator Mary C. Torres: 18, so that includes all the paint.

<u>Mayor Robert Hofmann:</u> I believe so and I know Benson's has all the paint and all the color schemes. I know they've given a huge discount.

<u>Senator Mary C. Torres:</u> I'm very concerned about the state of our parks. GVB has put in a lot of money into refurbishing certain restrooms and a lot of key areas, but it never seems to be enough. A lot of the problems attributed to poor leadership or poor management or that sort of thing, but it's the community's responsibility too to keep these parks in order. Sometimes we second guess whether it's enough to just throw money at things when there's not a plan to keep people from vandalizing.

Mayor Robert Hofmann: I know what you're getting at Senator and we've actually had some discussions with GVB about how we can look at this year and the next year. Like how we do the school maintenance, small businesses to come in and cut the school and keep it maintained. We're looking at businesses near the parks and basically keep it cut and maintained, kind of like an adopt a park program but they would also get compensated as well. We're trying to identify funds for that and I'm not sure how it became GVB's problem, but we're working on it. It is a struggle, but a lot of the Mayors like Merizo and Umatac, they're doing a great job. We don't have a park patrol to watch the park overnight or are able to secure the park like other park areas. So, you have people coming in late at night or early mornings and vandalize and dump their trash. We wake up to trash in our parks and that's why we don't even put out trash bins anymore. It hurts us but you know!

Senator Mary C. Torres: I was gonna bring up that point. I personally would like to see more trash bins out. We don't want people to litter but we make it very difficult for them to put trash where it belongs in the receptacles and we also don't do a good job at removing the trash on a timely basis so it falls into a problem. When you think about what we can do to make things better, people have to be more responsible. I think we could help them be more responsible by making it easier for them to discard their trash by providing receptacles. I would ask that you revisit the trash issue and I know that dumping is a problem here on Guam. In as far as \$200,00 for 19 villages, that doesn't go very far. When you're talking about buying paint and stuff, I would really GVB to come up with a plan on how to maximize that \$200,000 and take into consideration the trash collection. It really is a horrible site in the parks and we've got to get a system.

Mayor Robert Hofmann: We agree...even when we do community clean ups, we pay. All the trash we pick up along the road. We are allotted one free load a day as a Mayor and that's one pick up load. That's enough to take the trash at the community center and what we find at the bus stops, and here and there. Right now the way the law is



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written no one has been successfully been prosecuted or fined for illegal dumping or littering, but yet you have 90 days to appeal it nobody takes it seriously! Just like the abandoned vehicle process, you have 10 different agencies that have to come in and process a vehicle. We've argued this with Mr. Manning and everybody else..how do you expect us to keep this place clean? So it becomes nobody wants to do it because no one wants to assume the bill, and we understand. But at the end of the day, the government pays for it. Take for example, the pipeline in Sinajana, we found 14 loads of trash in that area. It was a partnership between the Navy, GPA and us. It is a major issue and it is something that we want to address in the littering law. In one week Senator, we dump so much trash, 70 to 80 loads. As for the murals, we put the clear lacquer to preserve it and it kinda turned a little yellowish. On destination management we do 6 days a week of trash. It is a delicate balance on how to deal with the trash issue.

<u>Senator Mary C. Torres:</u> Well, you can't give up on the effort because I know that if you consider what GVB has done to maintain for example the shoreline in Tumon..if GVB didn't take that and fund that we wouldn't have that pristine beach in Tumon that is so critical for our tourists so this is so critical for our tourism industry.

<u>Mayor Robert Hofmann:</u> We've asked Chamber of Commerce to assist by asking some of those companies that we buy the products from if they could take some of the cardboards back. Why can't we go back to the companies that we bought soda from give them back their cardboards back, but we didn't get much of a reception from that.

<u>Senator Mary C. Torres:</u> Mayor, if you could crack that code, more power to you. Thank you!

Mayor Robert Hofmann: Thank you Senator!

<u>Chairperson</u>: Thank you Senator Torres. Mr. Mayor, I'd like to ask you one question with reference to Bill No. 122-33. If a private company were to donate funds, match or exceed, to the Mayor's, how would you feel about a public-private partnership? This is in preparation of FestPac 2016 as well.

<u>Mayor Robert Hofmann:</u> We are huge supporters of that. We've known of some supporters that are supportive of that as well. I know several people are supportive of



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the museum as well. On the Mayors side, we are working on preserving the WW history as well.

<u>Chairperson:</u> Thank you very much Mayor Hofmann for your testimony on behalf of GVB as well as the Mayors. I will call this public hearing on Bill Nos. 121-33 (COR) and 122-33 (COR) duly heard. Thank you!

The public hearing was adjourned at 10:16 A.M.

Bureau of Budget and Management Research Comments on Bill No. 121-33 (COR)

The proposed legislation seeks to appropriate funds from the Fiscal Year 2014 Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) Surplus Fund to the Guam Museum Fund.

The intent of the proposed legislation is to appropriate the sum of \$500,000 for the specific purpose of purchasing cameras and other related collateral equipment necessary for the theater that will be housed within the Guam Museum.

It should be noted that there are three (3) public laws that were signed and passed on June 10, 2015, making appropriations from the HOT Surplus Fund. Public Law 33-44 appropriates to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (\$1,600,000); Public Law 33-49 to the Guam Visitors Bureau (\$900,000); and Public Law 33-50 to the Hagåtña Restoration and Redevelopment Authority (\$300,000). Presently, proposed Legislative Bill Nos. 114-33 (COR) and 122-33 (COR) intends to appropriate to the Guam Museum (\$750,000) and to the Guam Visitors Bureau (\$200,000) respectively. Furthermore, Bill No. 114-33 appropriates \$50,000 more than the \$700,000 projected balance of the Fund while passage of Bill No. 122-33 would increase the over-appropriation balance to \$250,000. Should the subject appropriation measure be signed into law along with the aforementioned (2) Bills, the Fund would be over-appropriated by approximately \$750,000.
