I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 144-33 (COR) was introduced by Senators Frank B. Blas, Jr. and James V. Espaldon on July 13, 2015, and subsequently referred to the **Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication** on July 14, 2015.

The Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication convened a public hearing on Thursday, September 17, 2015, beginning at 9:30AM in the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room. The hearing for Bill No. 144-33 (COR) began at 10:51AM and ended at 10:54AM.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Benjamin J.F. Cruz announced Bill No. 144-33 (COR) and recognized the legislation's sponsors for their statements.

Senator Frank B. Blas, Jr. thanked the Chairman and began his sponsor statement:

"Bill No. 144-33 (COR) simply is an act that would basically provide or start to establish a means of being to able to not just record and recognize the federal funding that we receive through a number of different sources and a number of different means, but then also to recognize, one, what that money is used for or where that specific funding source is at, but most importantly, it would provide for us, for lack of a better term, emergency management or basically continuity of operations. [This would be a contingency] plan if we were to lose this funding, or if this funding were to be decreased. What does that decrease, or what does the elimination of that funding mean to the operations or to the services that are being provided as a result of this funding? It gives us that opportunity to be able to plan forward on contingency should something occur to that funding.

"That said, Mr. Vice Speaker, is basically a summary of what this bill entails. One of the things that I just noticed is in the bill itself it goes from Section 1 and Section 2, then straight to Section 4. I'd just like to make sure that Section 4 actually be recognized as Section 3. Okay? Other than that, that is what this bill is for. We've had conversations with the Guam [State] Clearinghouse. My preliminary indication is that they are in support of this bill. They will be providing the Committee with testimony to that effect. I'm just hoping that if there is anybody here to listen and any contributions they may have. I don't know if my co-sponsor would like to speak, but I'll give him that opportunity as well, sir."

Senator James V. Espaldon remarked:

"Not much to say except that after discussion with the main author and as he posed it to me, basically it's a good idea for tracking federal grants and federal expenditures. So, as we go forward for each budget cycle, we have a clearer and more accurate picture of where we are. Like what the prime sponsor mentioned, [if there's] indicat[ion] that we see any kind of federal decrease in funding at least we'll know what projects [those] federal funds are being spent on, how we spent it so far, and how much more we need to be able to sustain those federal projects. Thank you, Mr. Chair."

Chairman Cruz thanked the sponsors and noted that the Committee received an e-mail notification that the Guam State Clearinghouse will be submitting testimony (appended to this report), which the Committee awaits to receive. On account that there were no individuals present to testify, Chairman Cruz considered Bill No. 144-33 (COR) heard.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Appropriations and Adjudication made minor changes to the general style and format of the original measure for clarity and consistency as prescribed by the Legislature's drafting practices.

Moreover, the numbering for the third section of the bill was changed, from "Section 4" to "Section 3", to follow the follow the preceding section.

Dear Vice-Speaker Cruz:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on Bill 144-33, relative to establishing federal receipts reporting requirements.

The Guam State Clearinghouse lauds the intent of this Bill, which seeks to bring transparency to the receipt and expenditure of federal funds by our government entities. We are in agreement that federal funds must be spent in accordance with their intended, authorized use and in a timely manner; should federal funds be revoked or reduced for any reason, agencies should have a mitigation plan to prevent delays in service delivery to our community.

While we agree with the intent of the Bill, it contains redundancies of current processes already in place. The reported information that this would mandate is already available at anytime on the AS400 accounting system online. The Office of Finance and Budget, which has full view of these receipts and expenditures, is the mechanism to review this information and ensure checks and balances to the Bureau of Budget Management and Research. During the budget process, these reports are submitted as a specific section in the budget act. As we interpret this Bill, we are mindful that the Legislature does not appropriate federal funds; the process prescribed requires the collection and compilation of reports by individual agencies and BBMR, on information that is already transparent and readily available in various forms to include the AS400, DOA financials and in the Federal Programs Inventory submitted with the Executive Budget Request. The time and resources required to produce an additional report, on information already available, would require additional government time, resources, and potential funding, that may not speak to government efficiency.

Because we know the intent of the Bill's author is both government transparency and government efficiency, we ask that you revisit the Bill with these concerns in mind.
